## It's Official!!!!!!!!!!!!!! Yellow Creek/Tri-State Commerce Park Is Back Home - Presentation Ceremonies To Be Held in August

Yellow Creek/Tri-State Commerce Park is officially back home in Tishomingo County. The office of the Attorney General of Mississippi has made it official. Land in the original tract and buffer zone of Yellow Creek/Tri-State Commerce Park that has been overseen by the MDA (Mississippi Development Authority) since 1996 will be transferred back to Tishomingo County.

Mississippi MDA's Executive Director Steve Hale has notified Mississippi District I, Representative, Ricky Cummings, and the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors that the official ceremonies to present the land back to Tishomingo County will be held at the site in early August.

Representative Cummings

authored a bill in the 2003 Mississippi Legislative-session that would return the approximately 3,800 acres to Tishomingo County. Rep. Cummings worked very hard to get this land, appraised at \$90 million dollars, returned to the people of Tishomingo County.

According to both Representative Cummings and Danny Ryan, president of the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors, a major benefit of the transfer of the land back to the county is that the State of Mississippi can now offer incentives to prospective industry that it was not able to offer as owners of the property.

Cummings added, "This is a great opportunity for Tishomingo County." He also added that over \$2 million dollars in working capital will

come with the transfer of the land.

Danny Ryan, president of the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors, speaking on behalf of the Board said that the Board is looking forward to working with any industry that might be willing to locate in Tishomingo County. He also added that Tishomingo County can now promote the site to the full extent. He also added that the Board will now be able to make important decisions concerning those employers/companies/industries interested in the site.

According to Hale, Cummings, and Ryan, all the people of Tishomingo County will be invited to take part in the presentation of the Yellow Creek-Tri-State Commerce Park back to Tishomingo County in early August.

## Dr. Kelly S. Segars Retires After 43 Years Of Family Practice

Dr. Kelly S. Segars, Sr. officially retired from his position with The Segars-Glynn Clinic on June 26, 2003.

After 43 years as "family doctor" to the residents of Tishomingo and the surrounding counties and states, Dr. Kelly is now enjoying a much deserved rest.

He came to Iuka in 1960, fresh out of Medical School and opened his practice of family medicine with Dr. Lewis George and Dr. Bobby King. The Iuka Clinic was opened by the three young doctors on Pearl St. in Iuka where the main office of the First American National Bank is now located.

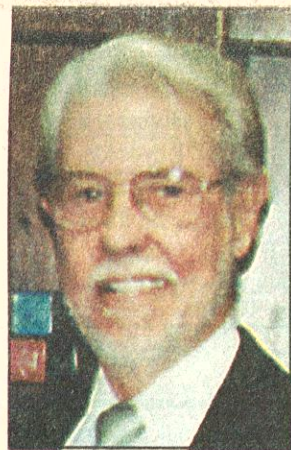
It was a time when doctors made house calls, set up all night with sick patients, delivered babies (Dr. Kelly delivered over 500 babies in his career), and sometimes took payment in fresh vegetables. The hard-working young doctors soon established trust and loyalty with the people of the area and the beginning of Dr.

Segars' career as local doctor and community builder began.

In the early years of his career, Dr. Segars was not only devoted to his patients, but he was also interested in the community. In 1964 he was instrumental in the establishment of the First American National Bank in Iuka. He had seen the need of a lending institution that could help the people of Tishomingo County to build homes, finance automobiles, start new or rebuild businesses, and attract new industry. His dream of a bank that could help hard-working people soon became a reality.

In 1982 Dr. Kelly started his own private practice as The Segars Clinic at the location now occupied by The Segars-Glynn Clinic on Quitman Street. During the past twenty years at this location Dr. Kelly has built the clinic into a diagnostic facility that is unheard of in a small town.

It is evident that the past 43 years have been busy ones for Dr. Kelly. He and his wife,

## David Smith Seeks Re-election As Tishomingo County Sheriff

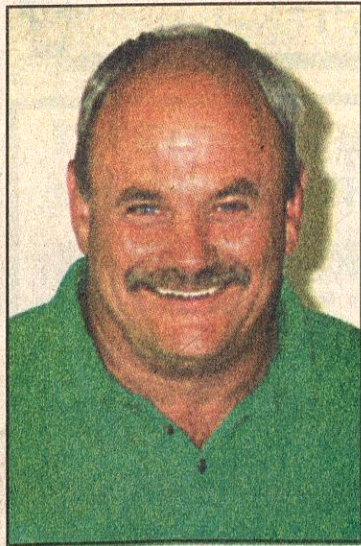
I, Sheriff David Smith, would like to take this opportunity to ask each and every voter for your support as I seek re-election to the office of Sheriff of Tishomingo County.

## Tishomingo County Electric Power Association Now Taking Nominations for Board of Directors

In accordance with the Bylaws of Tishomingo County Electric Power Association, nominations for positions on the Board of Directors are now being accepted. There will be five positions open for election. One director is to be elected for a three (3) year term for each of the following supervisors' districts: First, Second, Fourth, Fifth and an area-at-large position.

Members of the Association may make nominations by either of the following methods:

1. By petition bearing the

signature of at least fifteen (15) members: Petitions must be received by the Secretary of the Board of Directors at least seven (7) days prior to the day of the Annual Meeting. Petitions may be presented for qualification at the Main Office of the Association during regular business hours, Monday thru Friday from 7:30 a.m. until 4:30 p.m.

2. From the floor of the Annual Meeting to be held August 9, 2003: The Bylaws

require that five (5) percent of the membership be physically present in order that nominations may be made from the floor.

Nominees must be residents of the supervisor's district which they will represent. Any member, regardless of place of residence, may be nominated for the area-at-large position; provided, that the nominees for the at-large position may not be residents of the fourth or fifth supervisors' districts. These districts presently have a resident serving in an at-large position.

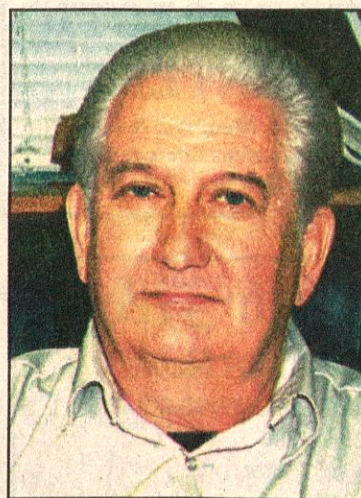
## Jerry Don Keith Announces For 4th District Supervisor

### What Is The Dental Pulp?

The pulp is the soft tissue that contains the blood vessels, nerves and connective tissue of a tooth. It lies in a canal that runs through the center of the dentin - the hard tissue on the inside of the tooth that supports the outer layer of tooth enamel.

The crown (the portion of the tooth visible above the gums) contains the pulp chamber. The pulp extends from this chamber down through the root canal to the tip of the root in the bone of the jaws. Teeth have only one pulp chamber but may have more than one root and several root canals.

#### Too Much Sun Affects Night Vision

Exposure to ordinary sunlight has been found to produce both temporary and cumulative effects on night vision. Daily exposure to bright sun without the protection of sunglasses has been proven to cause some deterioration in visual acuity at night.

Persons engaged in tasks where night vision is critical should wear sunglasses when in bright sunlight. Boat and plane pilots, truck and auto drivers, can all benefit from protecting their night vision mechanism from too much sun during the day. When very dark lenses are used, the improvement may be as much as tenfold.

Care should be taken when choosing sunglasses. An alarming number of inferior glasses are on the market and it is not always easy to tell the difference. While cheap and substandard lenses will probably not ruin your eyesight - unless you rely on them to absorb harmful rays - there are risks. ### Ana & Semma Gardner-Harris Rabies In Cats

What is rabies?

Rabies is a virus disease that can infect all warm-blooded animals, including cats and people, although some species are somewhat naturally resistant to the disease. When signs of rabies occur it is an almost invariably fatal disease.

Rabies has been recognized and described since as early as 2300 BC. How widespread is rabies?

Rabies occurs on every continent with the exception of Australia and Antarctica. Most countries have Rabies as an indigenous disease with the exception of a few islands such as Great Britain and Japan. These rabies-free countries have relied on strict quarantine laws to keep the disease out, and particularly to stop the virus getting into the wildlife of those countries. Britain and some other rabies-free countries are gradually relaxing quarantine regulations for fully vaccinated and microchip identifiable cats and dogs, but only from certain countries. These do not currently include the United States or Canada.

How is the virus transmitted?

Rabies virus does not survive long outside the body. Virus can be shed in the saliva of infected animals and bite wounds are the usual means of transmission of infection. In North America the skunk, raccoon and bat are important reservoirs whereas in Europe foxes are the main source of infection for people and other animals. In Asia, Africa and Latin America the main reservoir is not wildlife but stray, free-living dogs. In these areas infection of man is more common.

How long is the incubation period between a bite and symptoms?

This can vary from 10 days to 12 months or longer. Incubation in the cat is generally less than in the dog and is typically 3 to 8 weeks. Death usually occurs within 10 days from the first onset of signs. The speed at which clinical signs develop depends upon:

- The site of infection, the nearer the bite is to the brain and spinal cord, the quicker the virus reaches nervous tissue

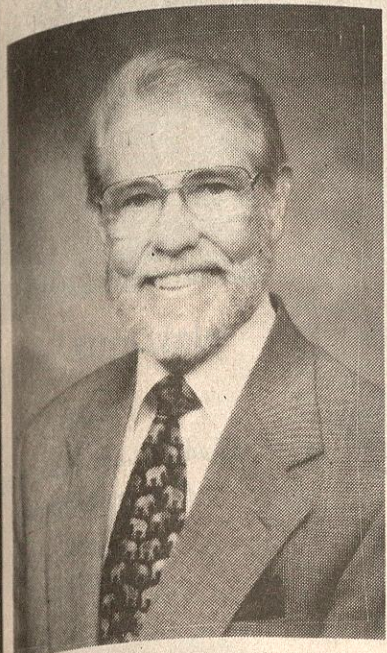

# Local Physician Retires



Dr. Kelly S. Segars, Sr.

After 43 years of service to Iuka and northeast Mississippi, Dr. Kelly S. Segars, Sr. of The Segars-Glynn Clinic retired on June 26, 2003.

The son of the late Doc and Ora Segars of Red Bay, AL, Kelly Segars graduated with honors from high school, pharmacy school and medical school where he was a member of the AOA honor medical society.

His education was interrupted by a stint in the U. S. Army during the Korean War for which he was awarded the American Defense Medal, Korean Service Medal, United Nation Medal and the Army Commendation Medal.

On graduation from medical school in 1959, he entered the practice of family medicine in Iuka with Dr. Lewis George and Dr. Bobby King of the Iuka Clinic. Because of a desire to advance his practice and provide more services for his patients, Dr. Kelly started his own private practice as The Segars Clinic in 1982. The clinic has been known over the years for providing most all services in-house—including full service laboratory, x-ray and ultrasound thus allowing the patient to go one place for everything and not have to go out of town, travel several miles and lose time from work. Dr. Scott Segars, Jr. joined the practice in 1985 and Dr. Margaret Glynn joined in 1990.

The clinic began with 5 employees and has grown to 30 in the last 20 years. The community has benefited not only from his medical expertise but also from his impressive civic involvement. He chaired Iuka Municipal Library Committee, initiating the project, obtaining the funds, and overseeing the construction.

A real mover and shaker, Dr. Segars, who just happens to have more than a passing interest in aviation, initiated a Municipal Airport Project.

He founded the First American National Bank of Iuka in 1964 and has continuously served as president of the home-owned bank since that time.

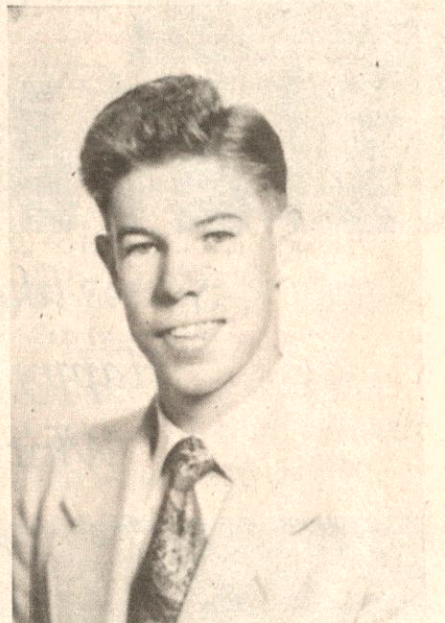
As a charter member of the Board of Directors of the County Development Foundation and the Industrial Park, he was instrumental in the acquisition of the Lockheed-Aerojet office building. In 1992 the Aerospace Business Center was named in his honor, and he was named Citizen of the Year by the Chamber of Commerce.

Dr. Segars has served as chair of the University of Mississippi Guardian Society, president of the Medical Alumni Association and member of the Dean's Advisory Committee, UMC School of Medicine.

He is a member of the Iuka United Methodist Church where he is Health and Welfare representative and a member of the Administrative Board.

Dr. Segars and his wife Martha, have three children, K. Scott Segars, Jr. M.D., physician with The Segars-Glynn Clinic, and his wife Diane and children, Tyler, Jake and Thompson; Mark Segars, Tishomingo County Prosecuting Attorney; and Leigh Segars, an attorney in Florida.

Dr. Kelly has been called a "true renaissance man-pharmacist, doctor, soldier, banker, businessman, teacher, pilot, community servant, and farmer. A very impressive guy to talk to, a great role model for family docs, he shows us that we can and should be doing it all" (David Clippinger, M.D. Mississippi Academy of Family Physicians)

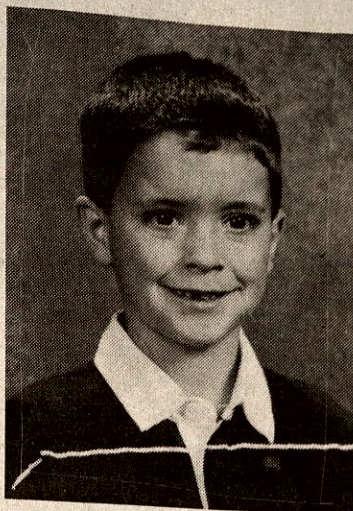
## Christian Bonds Receives 1st Grade Everyday Math Award

ners our citizens age 55 and older with our local law enforcement officials to help eliminate crimes against this age group through education and safety information. In addition to monthly meetings this program also sponsors a yearly "Quality of Life" fair focusing on the needs of our older resi-

dents. Also, we are presently working with the local health care leaders to provide a device to our elderly and handicapped citizens which will alert the appropriate services in case of an emergency.

Another service to our communities implemented during my tenure in office has been the creation of a work program for inmates. A crew

of inmates is taken out each day to pick up trash from along side our county roadways. These inmates are also used to clean up our children's ballfields after games and do other community services. As well as using inmates for community service, during the summer months, the inmates plant, tend and harvest much of the food they will be eating for the next year from a large garden planted at the jail. I believe these work programs are helpful in saving money for the county, as well as being helpful to the rehabilitation of our inmates. I also believe that rehabilitation of those arrested is assisted greatly through education and that is why I have given inmates who did not complete their education the

opportunity to complete the GED program while incarcerated so that they may gain the knowledge needed to be productive citizens when they are released. I have also allowed area churches and religious organizations to work with our inmates to help with their moral and spiritual needs.

During my time in office, my department and I have continued to see that our county is protected from crime. Our war on drugs is a priority with an ongoing list of drug dealers being arrested and convicted and literally hundreds of thousands of dollars worth of property and illegal substances being seized from these individuals. Presently my department has two K-9 units used extensively to locate these substances so that they can be removed from

the streets.

I am also committed to the investigation of crimes which are committed in the county. We now have two investigators who handle cases both day and night. We have made and will continue to make arrests and locate property involved in burglaries and theft cases throughout the county. This diligence to uphold the law also includes investigation and arrests in cases dealing with homicide, domestic violence, assaults, driving under the influence, possession of drugs and alcohol as well as many others.

In addition to the job of fighting crime in the county, we will continue to provide

other services to the residents. We will continue to provide funeral escorts, school programs for our youth to prevent drug use and participation in community fund-raising events such as the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life and the American Heart Association's Cardiac Arrest.

Our county is made up of mainly law-abiding citizens, who may rarely have dealings with the sheriff's department, but when help is needed for whatever reason, it is important to have a full-time Sheriff you can turn to with a full-time staff to assist you with your needs. I have always been - and will continue to be - that full-time Sheriff. As in my past reelection bid, I asked all the residents of our county to join with me in my efforts to catch lawbreakers - to help rid the county of crime and put the criminals behind bars. You have continued to support me and because of this support, my job as Sheriff has been much easier. Without your help and support, I could not do my job and I want to let all of you know how much your assistance has meant. Thanks to our combined efforts, we continue to make our county a safe and pleasant place to live and raise our families.

I ask that when you go to the polls in August, that you vote for and re-elect me, David Smith, Sheriff of Tishomingo County. As in the past elections, your vote and support will be greatly appreciated.
