### Boyd Asks For Examination & Review Of Election Boxes Outcome of Wednesday Morning's Review Could Lead To Recount Of Votes

According to Tishomingo County Circuit Clerk Donna Dill, Jerry (10-Speed) Boyd, a Democratic candidate for Sheriff of Tishomingo County in the recent primary elections, filed a petition on Friday, August 29, 2003, requesting the examination and review of the boxes from the August 26 run-off election.

Boyd, in requesting the petition, said, "The election was just so close, and I just wanted to look at the ballots and boxes for myself. Forty votes is so close."

An article in an Alabama paper indicated that Boyd is asking for the review on the grounds that a power failure during the counting of the votes could have effected the outcome. He also added that racial discrimination might be involved.

When contacted Wednesday morning, Boyd said he did not want to comment any further until after the examination and review of the boxes.

In the extremely close race, Boyd received just 40 votes less than Glenn Whitlock in

the race for sheriff. The Tuesday voting totals were combined with the results of 61 affidavit votes validated on Wednesday morning. Of the 61 affidavit votes only 34 were validated and counted. Boyd received 20 of these votes while Whitlock received 12 of the votes. On two of the ballots, there were no votes for sheriff. With this tally the final vote showed Boyd with 3,558 votes and Whitlock with 3,598 votes, a difference of 40 votes.

Glenn Whitlock was declared as the winner of the Democratic primary run-off election.

As a result of the petition, Boyd can examine and review any or all of the ballots from the voting boxes. This examination was scheduled to take place on Wednesday morning, September 3, 2003, at the Tishomingo County Courthouse. If Boyd should see a sufficient number of irregularities in the boxes, then he has 10 days to request a recount of all the boxes.

At press time the outcome of the examination of the votes was not available.

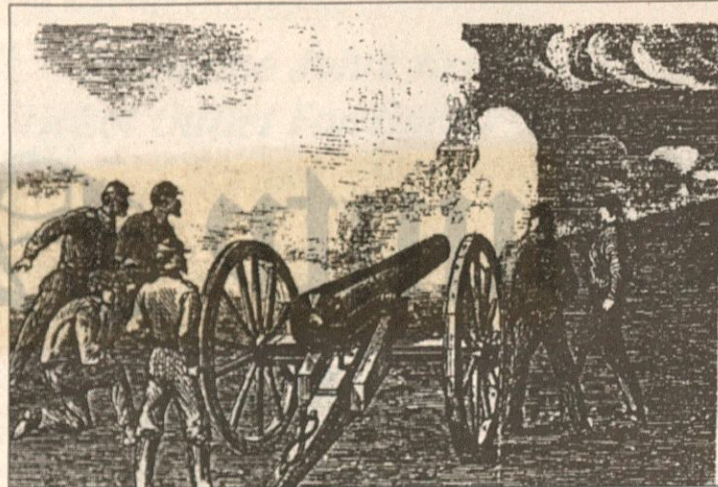

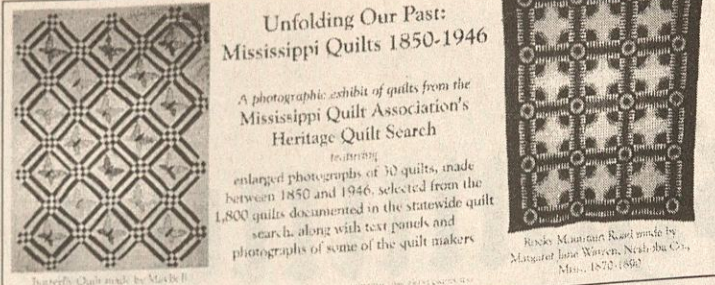

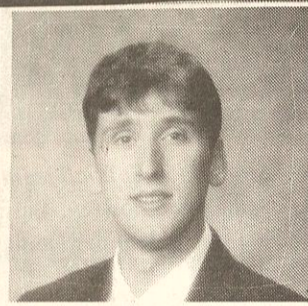
The 4-H Sewing Club has changed its regular meeting dates from Tuesday to Mondays. Their first meeting for September will be on the 8th at the Extension Office.

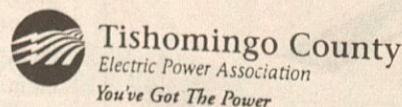

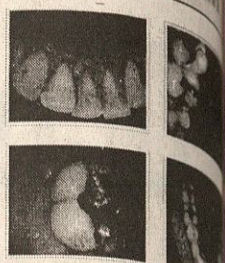

**Cat Scratch Disease**  
What is cat scratch disease and what causes it?

Cat Scratch Disease is a disease of humans, not cats. However, a scratch is often associated with the disease, although this is not believed to be the means by which infection occurs. The disease is caused by a bacterium, an organism called *Bartonella henselae*. The typical symptoms of the disease are mild fever, chills, lethargy accompanied by enlarged lymph nodes (glands) and skin conjunctival lesions.

These symptoms last for a few days only, but the enlarged lymph nodes may persist for weeks or months. In a minority of people a severe disease can develop with various combinations of high fever, weight loss, arthritis, enlarged liver, spleen, pneumonia, nervous signs. These serious forms of the disease are often associated with underlying immunodeficiency, such as in HIV (AIDS) infected people.

**How common is cat scratch disease?**

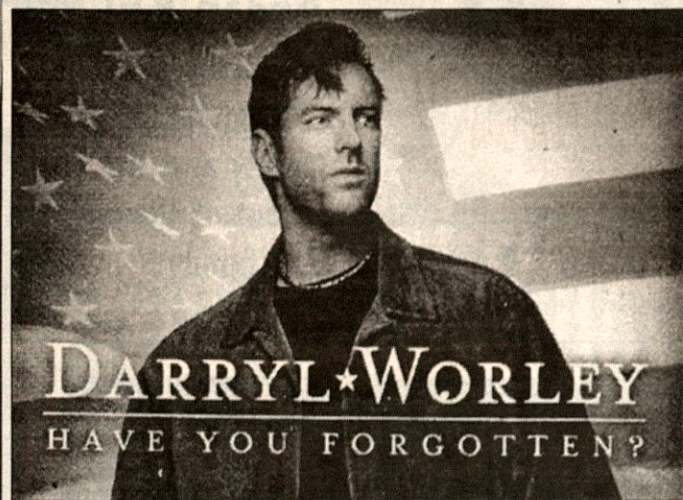
It is not possible to get accurate estimates of the prevalence of Cat Scratch Disease but it is probably a fairly rare disease. Studies carried out in the United States indicate that about 5% of the population have been exposed to infection.

Only a small proportion of these reported having the disease. It is likely that many infections are asymptomatic and go unnoticed, or are of a mild nature, seemingly a 'cold'.

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors will hold a public hearing on its proposed budget for the fiscal year 2003-04 on 9-8-03 at 10:00 a.m. at the Tishomingo County Courthouse in the Chancery Clerk's office. At this meeting, a proposed ad valorem tax revenue increase in the proposed budget will be considered.
