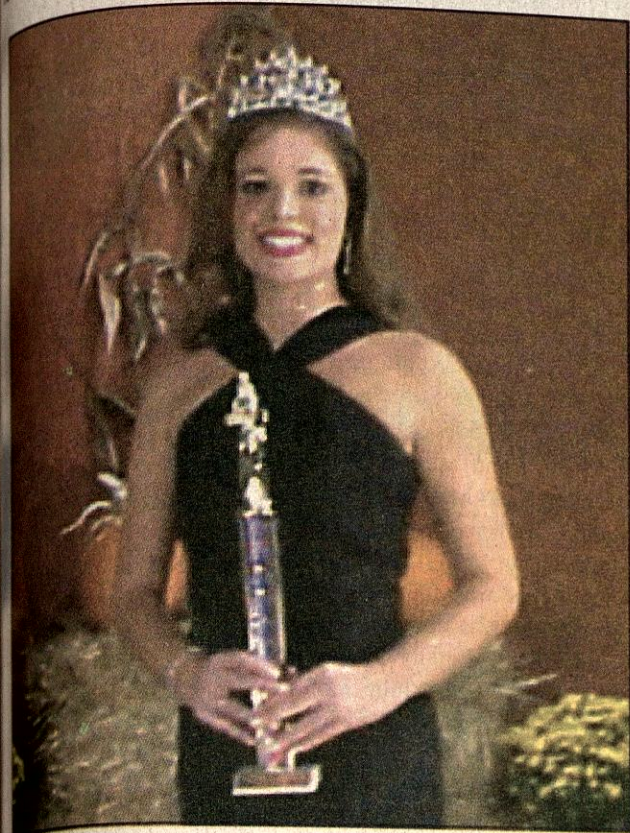

Friday Accident Claims Life Of Iuka Businessman, David Bonds

Approximately 600 mourners from all walks of life, including Governor Ronnie Musgrove and other dignitaries, crowded into the sanctuary of Iuka Church of Christ to mourn the tragic loss of David William Bonds.

During the services held on Monday, September 22, David's life was remembered and honored by Bro. Billy Pearson, his friend Nick Phillips, and his nephew Ben McAnally.

David Bonds was the victim of a tragic automobile accident that occurred on Friday night, September 19. According to a spokesperson from the Mississippi Highway Patrol, the one vehicle crash occurred at approximately 7:45 p.m.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff David Smith, Bonds was traveling north on Highway 25 when he apparently lost control of his Denali SUV approximately two miles north of Tishomingo. His vehicle left the roadway, apparently hit a culvert, and rolled several times. Bonds was thrown from the vehicle. Some witnesses stated that Bonds had his emergency flashers on at the time of the accident.

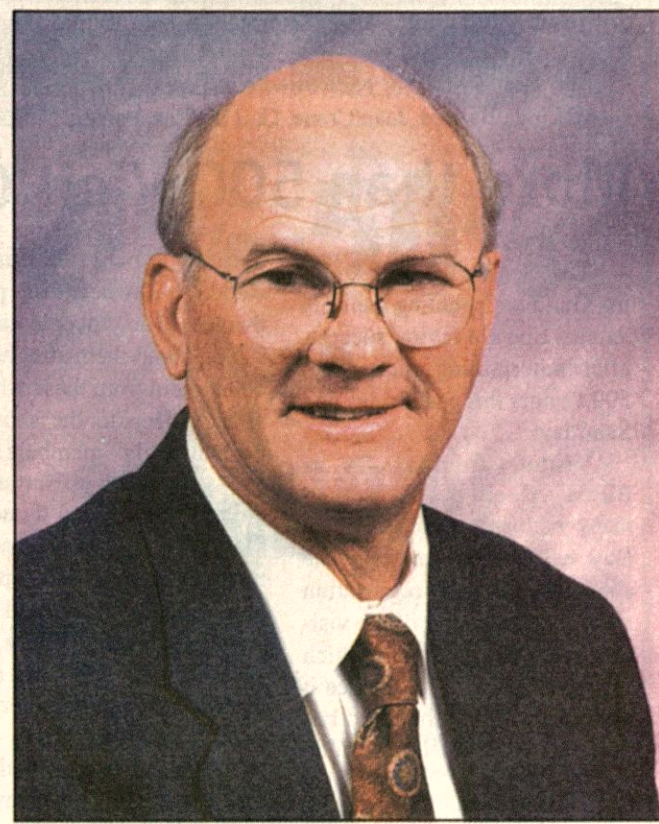
Mississippi Highway Patrol Reconstructionist, Allen Lyles, said his crew will be in the county later this week to reconstruct the accident.

David Bonds was a businessman, a citizen who loved Tishomingo County, and a friend to all. Bonds played a valuable part in not only Tishomingo County's daily activities but in Mississippi's every day activities.

David Bonds will be dearly missed by his wife, his daughters, his granddaughter, his other family members, and his many friends.

Mr. Bonds was a member of Mt. Gilead Missionary Baptist Church. He was an Air Force veteran of the Vietnam Conflict and a Mason. The president of Bonds Paving Materials and vice president of Bonds Company, he was the past-president of the Mississippi Road Builders Association. He was also a member of Mississippi State Contractors' Licensing Board. Mr. Bonds served as the chairman of the Tishomingo County Democratic Committee, a member of the State Democratic Committee and the Small Business Advisory Board. He was a member of the Farm Bureau Board, the Tishomingo County Development Foundation, and he had served on the Yellow Creek Port Board. He was a supporter of the Boy Scout Foundation. Bonds also regularly attended the Down-

town Iuka Men's Coffee Club.

Bonds was preceded in death by his parents, William Russell and Tressie Adams Bonds.

His survivors include his wife, Cathy McAnally Bonds of Iuka; his daughters and their husbands: Anna and David Kessler of Santa Rosa Beach, FL; Sandy and Adam Wyers of Iuka; his brother Larry Bonds of Iuka; his sisters Jean Crane of Iuka, and Joan Ferguson of Hernando, and one grandchild, Ellie Catherine Wyers.

Pallbearers were Brandon McAnally, Phillip Bonds, Dennis Bonds, Beau Gross, John Ferguson, and Jay Linley. Honorary pallbearers were the Downtown Iuka Men's Coffee Club.

David Bonds will be remembered as a man of unfailing integrity, loyalty, and honor. He was beloved and will be greatly missed.

Services Held For Retired Newspaper Owner, Mrs. Christine Holtsford

Lillie Christine Tucker Holtsford, 87, retired co-owner of a newspaper and Iuka's first commercial radio station, died Saturday, Sept. 20, 2003.

Mrs. Holtsford was a native of Murfreesboro, Tenn. She moved forward on the girls' basketball team in high school and had an after school job in the late 1940s doing typing for Jean Fairchild MacArthur, wife of Gen. Douglas MacArthur. Mrs. Holtsford, with her husband, purchased The Vidette & Belmont Tri-County News in 1951. She was the secretary and bookkeeper and wrote society articles for the newspaper. The business sold in the late 60s. In September 1960, she

and her husband established the first commercial AM radio station in Iuka. She was a member of the Lucy Rowe Study Club. She was a member of the Iuka Church of Christ where she was very active in the ladies' class.

Survivors include daughters, Judy H. Green, Ocala, Fla., Anne Holtsford and Bennie H. McBride, both of Iuka; a sister, Abbie Wallace, Washington, N.C.; three grandchildren, Beth Brock and David Coleman, Jr. both of Memphis, Lillie McBride of the University of Mississippi and one great-grandchild, Tucker Brock, Memphis.

In 1999, Mrs. Holtsford was preceded in death by her husband

Two Vehicle Crash Near Old Central School Injures 3

Three people were injured in a two-car collision on Highway 25 North near the Old Central

School turn-off on Thursday, September 18, at approximately 3:00 p.m. Two differ-

ent sets of Jaws of Life equipment were used to free two of the victims who were trapped in their vehicles.

Injured in their 1989 Cadillac were Joe and Wendy O'Neill. Joe O'Neill, 70, trapped for approximately an hour before he was freed by the Jaws of Life, was airlifted from the scene by AirEvac and taken to North Mississippi Medical Center-Tupelo. Mrs. O'Neill, 58, was taken to NMMC-Iuka by ambulance. She was treated for minor scrapes, bruises, and abrasions, and later released. Mr. O'Neill remains in Tupelo in very serious condition at press time.

Injured in the other vehicle, a Ford Tempo, was Susan Rushing, 22. Ms. Rushing, also trapped, was also freed by the Jaws. She was transported to NMMC-Iuka by ambulance. Her condition was not known at press time.

Harmony-Central, North Cross Roads, and Burnsville Volunteer Fire Departments, along with the Iuka Fire Department responded to the accident scene to aid in freeing the victims and controlling traffic.



Tishomingo County Taxes To Increase Slightly in 2004 City of Iuka Taxes Unchanged

Although Iuka City taxes will remain the same, Tishomingo County taxpayers will see a slight increase in taxes for the 2004 fiscal year.

The county millage rate will rise from 1 to 1.5 mills beginning October 1. The additional millage was levied county wide and will benefit the general fund.

Tishomingo County's budget for 2004 was set at \$8,517,943 up \$539,301 over last year's \$7,978,642 by the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors.

County landowners who also live in the City of Iuka in Supervisory Districts 1, 2, and 3 will be taxed at 69.5 mills. Those who live outside the city will pay 71.5 mills. This difference is due to the cost of solid waste disposal in the county.

All county taxpayers in District 1, 2, and 3 will also pay an additional half-mill to fund a matching grant to upgrade the Iuka Airport. Districts 4 and 5 will not be taxed this half-mill because they are in the Belmont Airport district.

City residents who live in Belmont, Golden, and Tishomingo in Supervisory Districts 4 and 5 will be taxed at 69 mills while Districts 4

and 5 taxpayers, outside the municipalities, will be taxed at 71 mills.

According to Iuka City Clerk, Benny Gray, the Iuka Board of Aldermen adopted a 14.25 millage rate, the same as for the last several years. The total Iuka budget is \$1.243 million, which is down from the fiscal 2003 amount of \$1,385 million.

Lynn McBride, Tishomingo Deputy Chancery Clerk, said the increase shown in this year's county budget amount is due to the inclusion of the Tri-State Commerce Park facilities in the Tishomingo County budget. Both revenues and expenses for the facilities now have to be shown in the Tishomingo County budget reports. McBride added, "Tri-State Commerce Park will be self-supporting, but we do have to show the revenues and expenses that will come through the park."

McBride also added that the county did incur an increase in county property, health, etc. insurance and that this absorbed expense is included in this year's county budget. Also, all full-time county employees will get raises averaging \$600-\$1200.

Update on Jerry Boyd's Petition for Election Reversal

According to Tishomingo County Circuit Court Clerk, Donna Henry Dill, Jerry Boyd filed a petition around 4:45 p.m. Friday afternoon, September 19, seeking reversal of the August 26 Second Primary election.

Ms. Dill said that the Circuit Court's office had notified the Mississippi Supreme Court of the petition. The Mississippi Supreme Court will now appoint a special judge from outside this district to hear the appeal. According to Dill, the appointment of the judge should be in a timely manner.

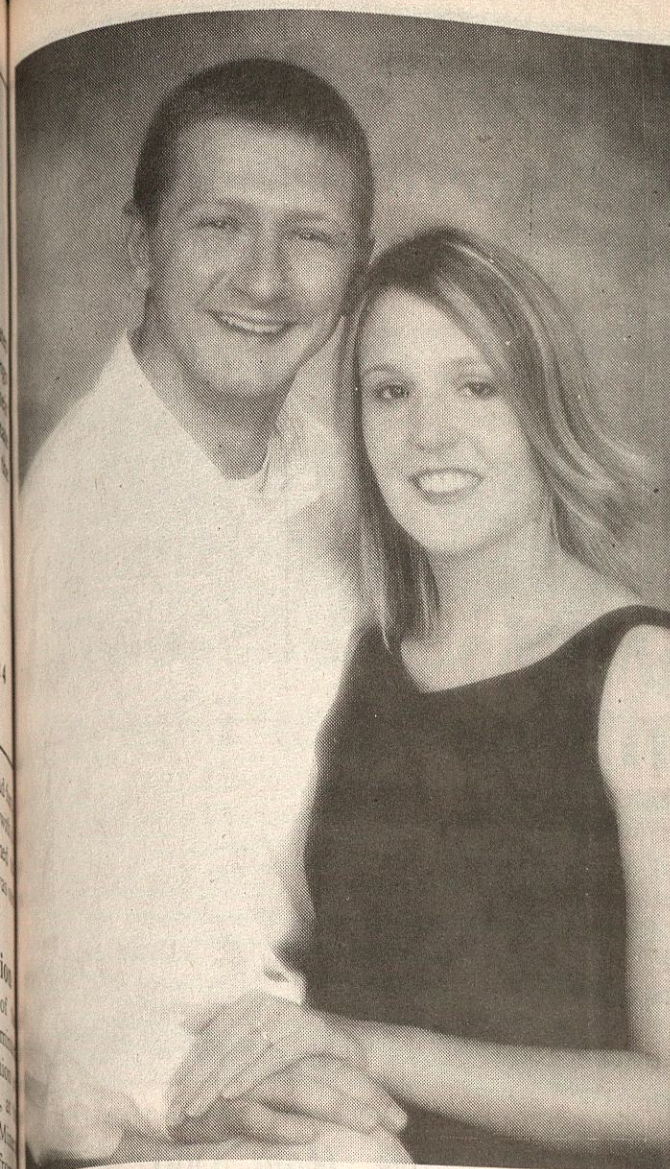


Bifocals For Children

Bifocals are lenses that contain two different corrections. They are prescribed to help patients see clearly and comfortably at different distances. Most often, they are prescribed for a correction for presbyopia, a natural change in vision that begins as we age.

In that case, what can they do for a child? One time, it was believed that whatever prescription corrected a child's vision problem, farsightedness, nearsightedness, astigmatism, automatically correct for distances and all purposes. Today, however, distinctions are made. A thorough examination by your optometrist will evaluate your child's vision to see well at all distances.

In some cases, a child requires both correction for near vision and distance. Bifocals are usually the most convenient way to provide both prescriptions in one pair of glasses. Not surprisingly, most children become accustomed to bifocals with little difficulty.

Tishomingo County School Recipient Of A 21st Century Grant

John B. Moore, Tishomingo County Superintendent of Education, was recently notified that the school district had been chosen to receive a 21st Century Community Learning Center grant. The selection process was very competitive with eighty-one organizations applying for the available funds with only nine grants being awarded. The district will receive this grant for three years and if significant academic progress is evident the school system can request funding for two additional years.

The purpose of the 21st Century Community Learning Center Program is to provide academic enrichment opportunities for children and their families when school is not in session. Through this grant a comprehensive, research based computer software program has been purchased to assist students in the after school tutoring program. PLATO Learning will serve as a powerful tool for teachers to provide instruction, which is individually and developmentally appropriate to each student. The system's de-

tailed assessments ensure that each student is appropriately challenged, and its interactive multimedia instructional presentation support students' varied learning styles. PLATO has been developed and continuously refined to correlate with the state performance objectives.

Each school in the district provides after school tutoring and will utilize this computer program. ALL students can benefit from attending these tutorial sessions. They are designed to identify and strengthen deficient skills as well as help students who are proficient proceed to more advanced levels.

Parents of these students are also encouraged to utilize this computer program. Almost all courses offered K-12 are included in this program. In addition, parents may use this program to prepare for taking the GED. A parenting skills section is also an added feature of this courseware. Labs are available at Belmont High School and at Families First Resource Center (TCHS campus) for parents who wish

to access this resource. Call 423-7318 for more information.

Individuals who are limited English proficient are encouraged to use this program. It is specifically designed to help the non-reader as well as the ESL (English as a second language) individuals learn to speak and read in English.

In the past few months, as I have been out talking and visiting in the county, it has been brought to my attention that

there are men, women and children who fall victim to mental and physical abuse. Today, I would like to share my thoughts and feelings concerning domestic violence.

Although this issue may not affect everyone, I am sure you know a family member or friend who has been victimized. It is a bigger problem than most of us realize. People of all ages, race, and economic levels feel its effects. The statistics of domestic violence are alarming. One of every four American women reports being physically or sexually abused at some time in her life.

A problem facing victims of domestic violence is privacy. Many victims are reluctant to call law enforcement because they don't want their problems broadcast over the airwaves. I believe people should be allowed to keep some issues personal and private. One of my goals will be to work with the 911 coordinator and dispatchers to keep you from being embarrassed. My door will be open to anyone who has been a victim of domestic violence. Your case will be handled discretely, professionally, and in accordance with the law.

During my campaign, I have talked with a few people who could direct me in handling these issues after being elected. I believe the people who really want to see a change will support ideas such as a safe house and a domestic violence hotline. As your next sheriff, I would work hard to make this a reality. I realize there is no possible way I can be on duty 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and no one person can make these ideas successful. However, I have found there are good, caring citizens of this county who would be willing to help.

Local Educators Present First Mississippi Character/Abstinence Curriculum At International Abstinence Conference

Carolyn Gowen of Glen Pat Trainum of Corinth presented their PowerPoint abstinence/character curriculum "To Your Dreams, at the International Abstinence Conference held at the J.W. Marriott Resort in Las Vegas, Nevada this summer. This is the first program out of the state of Mississippi and the three-day program has been presented to over 6,000 Mississippi students. It has been endorsed by the National Abstinence Clearinghouse in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, whose mission is to promote the appreciation for the practice of sexual abstinence (purity) until marriage through distribution of age-appropriate, factual and scientifically-accurate materials. The Governor's office in Mississippi has endorsed the curriculum and the Department of Health and the MS Department of Human Services have also endorsed the curriculum to be used with federal grant funds.

acter early in life by being responsible, having integrity, and exercising self-control in order to be empowered to fulfill their dreams and to become anything they desire in life. The program includes the written text in notebook form with slides on CD for PowerPoint presentations and/or 42 color transparencies for overhead projectors. Also included are true stories for examples, ice breaker activities, games, and handouts. Trainum, a writer and potter, incorporates writing and pottery in the presentation. A potter's wheel is used to emphasize that pressure is applied both inside and outside the vessel as she brings up the walls to determine the shape the vessel will take. If a good foundation is not laid in the vessel, the walls will collapse. Much like the inside pressures of low self-worth, need for acceptance, or outside pressures such as media, peer pressure etc., young people need a good foundation

to withstand those pressures and are taught they may have to stand alone instead of trying to "fit in" or follow the crowd. A pottery video is also included for people who do not have access to a potter's wheel.

The program has been pre-

sented at the Annual Mississippi Permanency Partnership Network Conference for the past two years and the Mississippi Social Welfare Conference just last week. Gowen started teaching abstinence/character education in 1995 in Tishomingo and Alcorn Counties and now is traveling the southeast region of the U.S. speaking to schools, parent groups, and youth groups in churches. A segment of the program has been written for singles groups in churches as well.

Gowen will be in Iuka Middle School the remainder of September and the first of October 2003. For information about the RISE program the websites are aiming4abstinence.org or risetoyourdreams.com.

These programs are funded by Title V through the MS. Dept. of Health.

Letter to the Editor

We, the staff and residents of Magnolia Estates, are writing in regard to last week's petition to the Democratic Executive Committee from Jerry "10-Speed" Boyd which appeared in our local paper. We at Southern Magnolia Estates Assisted Living Home (not NURSING HOME) are upset.

Number 1, the residents at Southern Magnolia Estates have always had the right to vote absentee ballots if they wanted to. They are not illiterate as the petition indicated, they are just unable to vote at precincts because of physical disabilities.

We as citizens read the paper believing what is stated in our local paper. However, this petition, which was paid for by supporters of Jerry Boyd, was not completely true. It was very upsetting to the residents when someone accused them of not expressing their true right to vote.
