Judge Appointed To Hear Boyd's Case Hearing Date Set For October 20 & 21

Circuit Court Judge Kenneth Thomas, of Cleveland, Mississippi, has been appointed by the Mississippi Supreme Court Justice to hear the case of Jerry "Ten Speed" Boyd who has brought allegations of violations of voting procedures during the August 26, 2003 Democratic Primary election in Tishomingo County.

In early September Boyd petitioned the Democratic Executive Committee requesting a reversal of the winner or a new election.

The petition, prepared by

Boyd's attorney, Dennis Horn, said that Boyd should be named the true winner of the second primary or that, as an alternative, a special election should be held. The petition also addressed many alleged discrepancies on absentee and affidavit ballots cast on August 26.

The Democratic Committee voted to abide by their August 27th decision, which declared Glenn Whitlock as the winner by 40 votes.

Boyd then filed a petition in the Tishomingo County

Circuit Clerk's office requesting that a judge be named to hear the case.

On Wednesday morning, Oct. 1, the Circuit Clerk's office announced that the hearing date had been set for October 20 & 21 at the Tishomingo County Courthouse with Judge Thomas presiding.

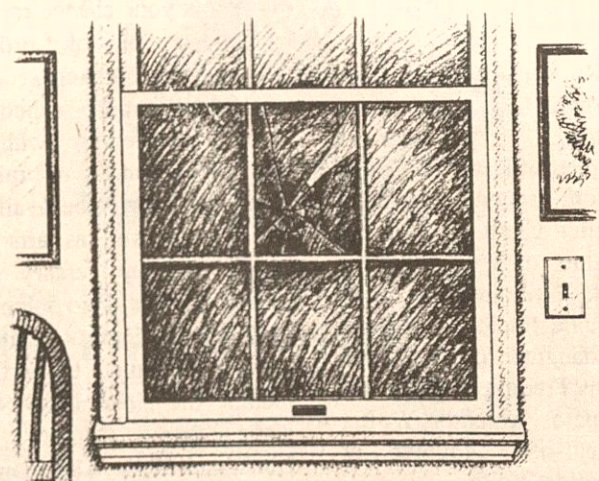
CARPE DIEM

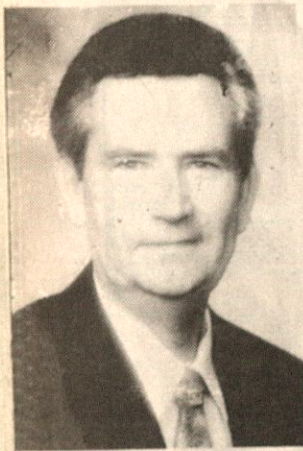

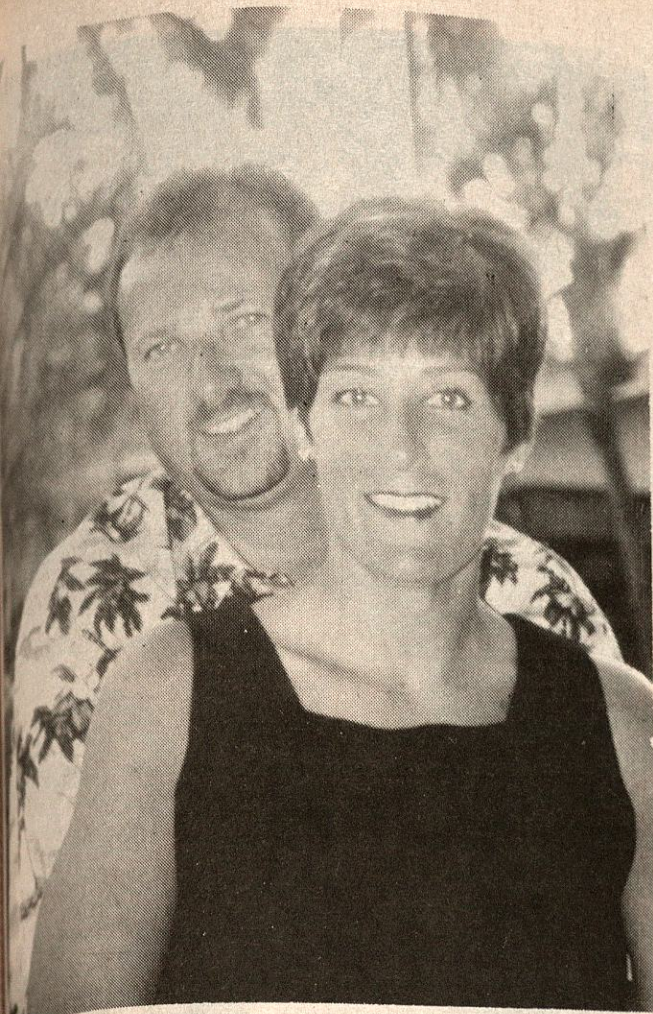
Cosmetics And Contact Lenses

If you wear contact lenses, you should avoid contaminating them with cosmetics. They can cause discomfort and irritation as well as impair your vision. Here are some tips:

If you use a cosmetic soap before applying makeup, rewash your hands with a mild soap that has no additives. Soaps often contain lotions or deodorants that may coat or smudge your lenses. By the same token, if you shampoo while wearing your lenses, be sure to keep your eyes tightly closed. If you get soap or shampoo in your eyes, rinse them thoroughly with saline.

A water-proof makeup system is the best for lens wearers since it is less likely to run into your eyes. It is also important to place your lenses on before applying any eye or face makeup.

On the other hand, false eyelashes should be applied before placing your lenses in your eyes. Be sure the adhesive is completely dry before placing the lenses on.

Mr. Dale Wadkins is a 1986 graduate of Iuka High School. He is presently employed at Interstate Brands Companies as a Route Salesman.

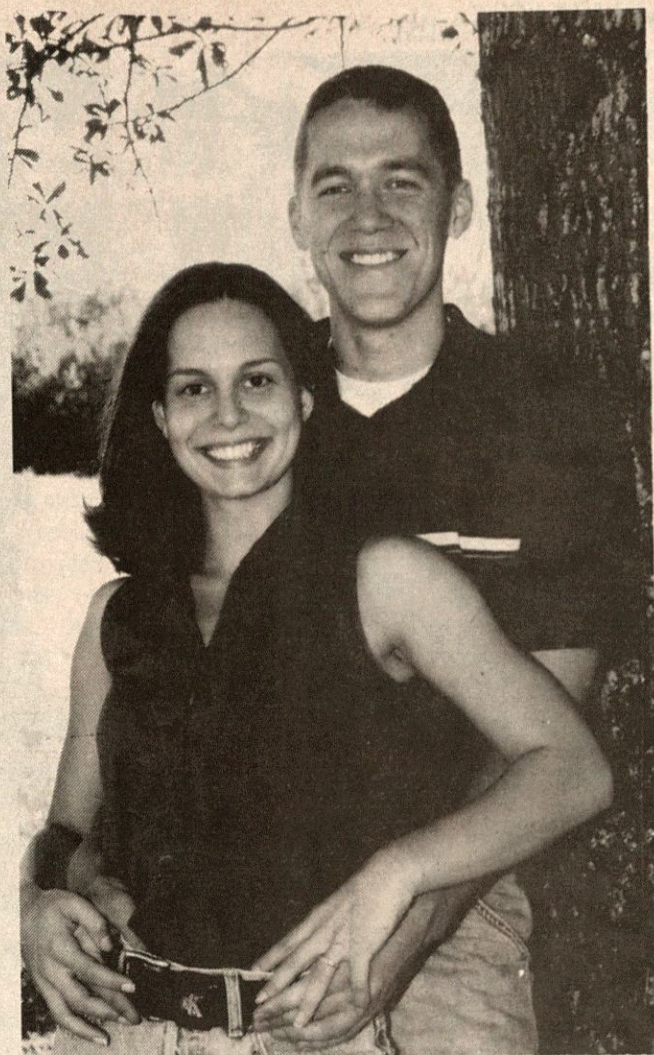

The state of Mississippi has been allocated CDBG funds that will be made available to cities and counties on a competitive basis to undertake eligible community development activities. These funds must be used for one of the following purposes:

1. to benefit low and moderate income persons;
2. to aid in the prevention or the elimination of slum or blight; or
3. to meet other community development needs having a particular urgency because existing conditions pose a serious and immediate threat to the health or welfare of the community where other financial resources are not available to meet such needs.

The activities for which these funds may be used are in the areas of public facilities and economic development. More specific details regarding eligible activities, program requirements, and the rating system will be provided at a public hearing, which will be held at the Tishomingo Town Hall on October 17, 2003, at 12:00 p.m. The purpose of this hearing will be to obtain citizen input into the development of the CDBG application.

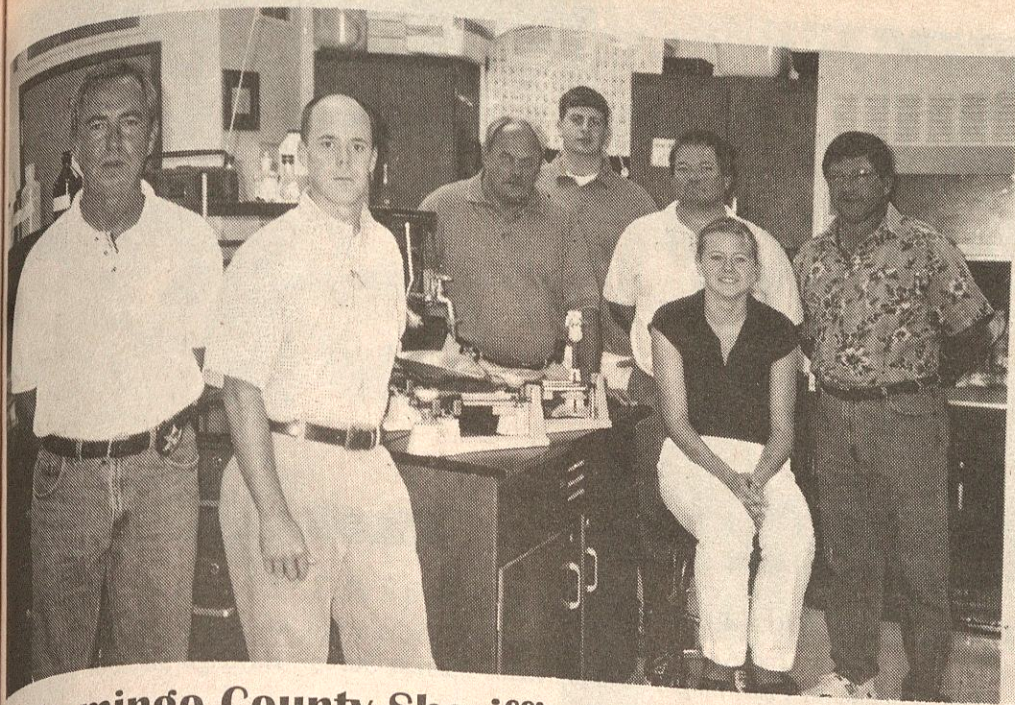

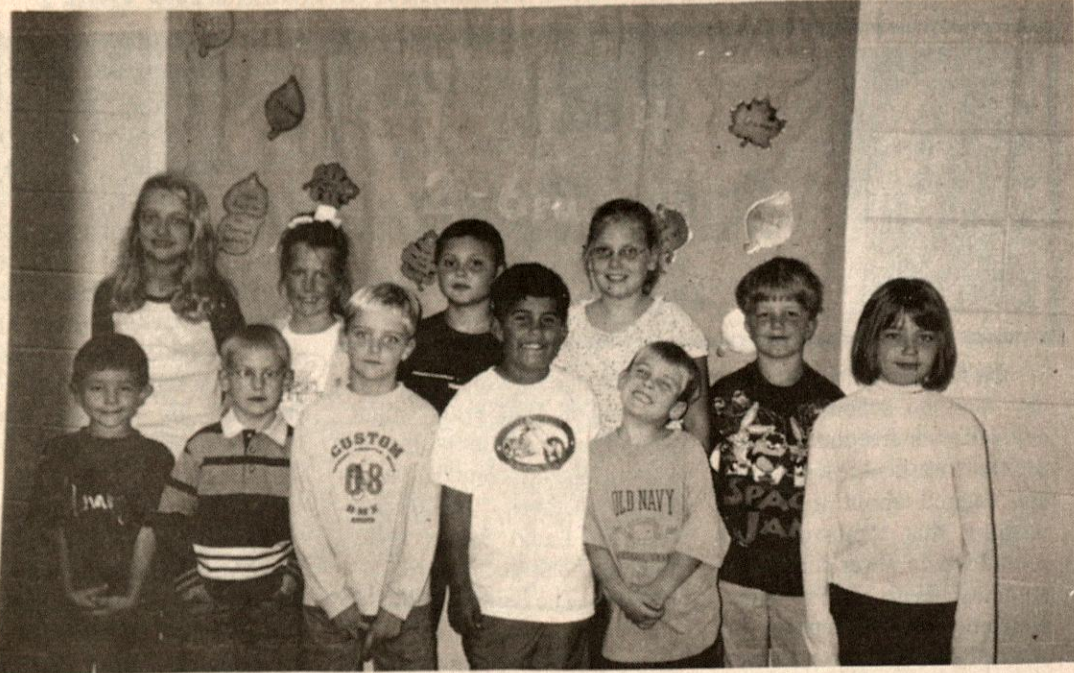

ABSENTEE BALLOTS NOW AVAILABLE FOR NOVEMBER 4TH PRIMARY ELECTIONS

Donna Henry Dill, Circuit Clerk, announces that absentee ballots are now available for the November 4th General Election.

All eligible absentee voters may cast their ballots in the Circuit Clerk's Office through Saturday, November 1st, which is the last day to vote an absentee ballot. The office will be open 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, and 8 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturday, October 25th and November 1st for those wishing to vote an absentee ballot.

The following categories of registered voters are eligible to cast absentee ballots in Mississippi elections:

1. Members of the Armed Forces or spouses or dependents of such members.
2. Members of the Merchant Marines or the American Red Cross, or spouses or dependents of such members.
3. Disabled war veterans who are patients in any hospital, or spouses or dependents of such veterans.
4. Civilians attached to any branch of the Armed Forces, the Merchant Marines, or the American Red Cross and serving outside the United States, or spouses or dependents of such civilians.
5. Persons temporarily residing outside the territorial limits of the United States and the District of Columbia.
6. Students, teachers, or administrators whose employment or studies necessitate their absence from their county of voting residence, or the dependent or spouse who maintains a common domicile outside the county of voting residence with such student, teacher, or administrator.
7. Persons who will be outside their county of residence on election day.
8. Persons required to be at work on election day during the times at which the polls will be open.
9. Persons temporarily or permanently physically disabled.
10. Persons sixty-five (65) years of age or older.
11. Parents, spouses, or dependents of persons having a temporary or permanent physical disability who are hospitalized outside their county of residence or more than fifty (50) miles away from their residence if the parents, spouses, or dependents will be with such persons on election day.
12. Members of the Mississippi Congressional delegation, or spouses or dependents of such members.

Procedure for Absentee Balloting

1. Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-625 et. seq. (1972) contains several requirements for absentee voting. These requirements include:

- Absentee ballot applications shall be furnished by the Circuit Clerk to a person upon the oral or written request of the elector who seeks to vote by absentee ballot;
- The parent, child, spouse, sibling, legal guardian, those empowered with a power of attorney for the elector's affairs, or agent of the elector may orally request an application on behalf of the elector;
- An absentee ballot application must have the seal of the registrar affixed to it and be initiated by the registrar or deputy registrar in order to be utilized to obtain an absentee ballot;
- A reproduction of an absentee ballot application shall not be valid unless it is a reproduction provided by the office of the registrar of the jurisdiction in which the election is being held and which contains the original seal and initials of the registrar or deputy registrar;
- Third parties procuring applications for others must complete and sign a new section of the applications designated "Certificate of Delivery" on each application the third parties are procuring, identifying themselves and the voters for whom they are acquiring the applications;
- If the third party person acquiring an application for a voter cannot read or write, the Circuit Clerk or deputy clerk must complete the form

eral requirements for absentee voting. These requirements include:

- Any voter who is blind, temporarily or permanently physically disabled, or cannot read or write, is entitled to request and receive assistance in the marking of his/her ballot. The voter may have the assistance of anyone except his/her employer, an agent of the voter's employer, or an officer or agent of the voter's union.
- Any person who provides assistance is required to sign and complete the "Certificate of Person providing Voter

Assistance" on the absentee ballot envelope disclosing the date and time assistance was provided and family relationship to the voter (if any).

- A candidate whose name appears on the ballot cannot be an attesting witness for an absentee ballot.

2. Voting in the Circuit Clerk's Office: All eligible absentee voters may cast their ballots in the Circuit Clerk's Office by completing the appropriate application form in the Circuit Clerk's Office.

3. Voting by Mail: Eligible absentee voters may request an absentee ballot by calling the Circuit Clerk's Office at 423-7026, if they will not be able to come to the Circuit Clerk's office to vote because they are:

- A. Temporarily residing outside the county;
- B. Temporarily or permanently physically disabled;
- C. Sixty-five (65) years of age or older; or,
- D. The parents, spouses, or dependents of temporarily or permanently physically disabled persons who are hospitalized outside of their counties of residence or more than fifty (50) miles away

from their residences if the parents, spouses, or dependents will be with such persons on election day.

Once you request the absentee ballot, an application will be mailed to you. You must complete this application and mail it back to us. When we receive your completed application, an absentee ballot will be mailed to you.

Applications and absentee ballot envelopes must be notarized or sworn and subscribed to by another official authorized to witness absentee balloting. However, applications and ballot envelopes of the temporarily or permanently disabled are not required to be notarized but must be witnessed and signed by a person eighteen (18) years of age or older. This person does NOT have to be a registered voter.

HAND DELIVERY OF ABSENTEE BALLOTS PROHIBITED

It is illegal to hand deliver absentee ballots in Mississippi. Unless an absentee ballot is being

properly voted in the Circuit Clerk's Office, it must be delivered by the Circuit Clerk to the voter and the voter must return the absentee ballot by mail to the Circuit Clerk. (Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-735 (1972).

In Memory of Rev. Tate Presley

Tribute written by Christian Evans in 1999



Tate & Vetress Presley

"Never do today what you can put off until tomorrow" is an unwilling motto I tend to unwillingly put off. I put off little things, like writing an article, until it is a big thing at the last minute. Sunday nights after church are pretty hectic at our home. I have procrastinated writing my article due Monday morning. Sometimes, that deadline pressure with edits and rewrites still comes. We all put off doing things or making decisions for weeks, even years.

"I know all about putting off a thing," said Rev. Tate Presley, "I know all about putting off a thing." I put off calling to preach for years. He said as his wife once invited me to have a warm cup of homemade potato soup and talk about their life with each other and serving the Lord.

Tate Presley was born in Tishomingo in the mid 1930's. He was a member of the Citizens Conservation Camps, popularly known as the "C.C. Camps". "I had been a member, worked on the railroad and done other jobs but that was during the Depression when work was scarce," he noted. While at the Tishomingo camp, he met Vetress Belue, a local girl from Tishomingo. The couple married in July 1959.

Tate always made a crop and continued to farm, even this year he made a sizable garden. "I had no choice but to farm and any job that came up," said Rev. Presley. The couple have two children, Hugh Van Presley and Charlotte Presley Swimmer. Tate attended church all of his life. Vetress joined the church at the age of thirteen. Her husband moved to join for many years though actively involved in the church, Tate fought the alter until he was thirty-three years old. Tate knew that God was still dealing with him. For ten years, Tate put off answering the call to preach. There were a number of ways that he was spoken to those years.

"I was plowing out here behind the house when I finally gave in and surrendered the Lord's will," he recalled. "I don't know why I waited it for so long. If God wants something He's gonna get it!" At that time, Tate was working for Mr. Leon Phillips at Phillip's Hardware. Rev. Presley was ordained in 1959. He served as pastor at a number of local Baptist churches such as the New Salem Baptist Church and at New Prospect Baptist. He also pastored at churches in Alcorn county through his ministry.

Forty-three years old is kind of late to decide to go off to seminary. "Better late than never!" Rev. Presley laughed. Mrs. Vetress said, "Tate went to school full time at Clark College for a year. I worked part time and we made ends meet until Tate finished." He returned to a full time job at the hardware store and would have several churches to lead for the next thirty years.

The Presleys recall a number of moving stories of how God used them to reach others. "I had one old man at New Salem who was over 80 years old when he accepted the Lord," he said. "That man stood up for my father when he married my mother," Mrs. Presley said. "He put it off as long as he could stand it," Tate said. "He didn't live much longer after that but I know he went to be with the Lord when he left here."

Another memorable event like this came when Brother Tate was at New Prospect. He recalls, "We took charge of ministering at the county home when the call came out that a pastor was needed." There was an elderly woman named Sibbie Harp there that the Presleys knew for a number of years. The old woman had never married and had never accepted the Lord. For several years, Rev. Presley witnessed to her and prayed that she would come to know the Lord. Brother Presley's prayer was answered when Miss Harp finally accepted Christ. On her deathbed, her niece called Rev. Presley to be with her aunt in her final hours. Tate came and held prayer for the woman. Hours later, she passed away with peace in her heart.

in dry barren soil all those years ago finally bloomed in my heart, thank you!"

Under Brother Presley's leadership, the Lord called three men to His ministry. One of these men is Brother C. I. Puckett. Brother Puckett, who is now retired but continues to work with the senior ministries at Iuka Baptist church, was the minister of music many years ago in a church Rev. Presley pastored. "C. I. just stopped singing in the invitation," Bro. Presley recalls, "He closed his Hymnal and put his hand on my shoulder telling me he was ready to surrender to the Lord's will." Tate recalled that moment with a smile and wiped a tear away as he said quietly, "AMEN!"

Brother Puckett has fond memories of this event and another special day in his life. He said, "Brother Presley let me preach my first service in that little church. My daughter, Debbie, came down the aisle and was saved that night. Brother Presley baptized her a short time later. Yes, I know that Bro. Tate Presley was called by God. He has sure been a blessing to me!"

Mrs. Vetress has been involved with the Women's Missions for nearly fifty years. She is now director of the W.M.U. at Iuka Baptist where she has served for several years. Brother Tate, upon retirement, came with his wife to Iuka Baptist Church where they have been involved in numerous church activities over the years. Once a month, every third Monday, the W.M.U. sponsors a prayer luncheon with great food, wonderful speakers and warm Christian fellowship. Here, I have come to know both Reverend and Mrs. Presley as warm caring Christian people. They truly take each day, one day at a time and do as the Lord guides them.

Bro. Jim Manley, pastor of Iuka Baptist Church has a special place in his heart for "Bro. Tate and Mrs. Vetress." He says, "Bro. Tate is a man who supports the church through many kind deeds. His greatest contribution is the fact that he sincerely prays for the church and all of us on the church staff. He is there with advice and

kind words of encouragement. We are proud to have this family as part of our church family."

This has been especially true in recent years after Tate suffered a stroke. "He was out walking when it began," says Mrs. Presley, "I called Charlotte after her father was late getting back from his walk. She walked back with him as he began to noticeably drag his foot. His right hand was a bit numb but his blood pressure was fine." The family consulted with Dr. Ben Kitchens who set them up an appointment the next day with a specialist. By that time, Tate was having difficulty walking and his speech was slurred. A battery of tests confirmed five blood clots in Reverend Presley's arteries of the brain and neck. "I just put it in the Lord's hands and just trusted He would pull me through," Rev. Presley said smiling, "and HE had done it! Not me, HIM!"

Tate was given six weeks of rehab. "MY right hand was drawn up," he said balling the hand into a fist. He then laid it flat and brushed his other hand over it several times from palm to finger tips working the hand, "I did this over and over again trying to regain strength and movement," he stated. He also underwent extensive speech therapy for many months.

There were countless hours of quiet determination that Bro. Presley put into recovery from the stroke. Benny McClung recalls how he would see Bro. Presley out walking around the lake at Woodall Mountain Estates before the stroke. McClung relates the old preacher has been through example: "He was out there every day. After I heard about his stroke I figured, 'That was it!' for old Mr. Presley. Then it wasn't but a few weeks after he got home from the hospital that I saw him out walking in the yard. If ever someone has inspired me with faith and determination, it would have to be Bro. Tate Presley!"

Whether it is ninety-five degrees or twenty-five, Brother Presley walks. He works his tiller, lawn mowers and works hard in that garden. My mother admires the beautiful flowers that the Presleys grow in their garden. "There is a variety of various breathtaking flowers there. The flowers around the home and in their garden just make me happy!" she exclaims.

"Last Friday my wife and I passed by the Presley home," says DeWitt Bean, "and there was Brother Tate out in the rain just getting his walking in!" Bean said he has seen Bro. Presley out in the garden and or walking most any season of the year. DeWitt went on to note, "That old gentleman knows what he is doing, rain or shine, he is an inspiration to anybody who sees him just easing along his way!"

As I entered the house that day, Brother Presley met me at the

door with a firm handshake from that once debilitated hand. He had walked two and a half miles that cold January evening. "I usually try to walk five but today was just too cold!" he said. (That blustery day was tough for me walking too and I am fifty years younger than Rev. Presley!) We sat around the kitchen table with a cup of potato soup followed by a cup of coffee. Mr. Presley talked in a clear distinct voice. The couple sat together

in that warm little home reminiscing over their life together. They had been blessed with many gifts from the Lord. Still, when I asked if there were any regrets, Bro. Presley spoke right up saying, "Just one, for me anyway, I just wish I had surrendered my life to the Lord before I did and the same goes with fighting the call to preach."

Both the Presley children are active in their church work. Hugh Van Presley has spent six summers in domestic and foreign mission work. He plans to continue this work as God leads him. Hugh Van serves as a deacon at Iuka Baptist Church and serves in the Church Brotherhood and in a number of other capacities. Charlotte Presley Swimmer and husband Charles are also active in Iuka Baptist Church. For several years, the couple has worked with the three and four year olds after the children's sermon is given in the Sunday morning worship service. The Presleys have four grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

"We all put off doing something in life," says Mrs. Presley. Her husband laughs, "I think God calls everyone to do something in life. Farmers, preachers, (then looking at me and smiling) Chris, I'm looking at a man I am sure he has called to be a writer." It is true that we are all here for a reason. Brother Tate and Vetress Presley are fine examples of how anyone can be called and used by God at any age, anytime!

He went on to say that he had learned a valuable lesson from his life experience that "God doesn't put more on any of us than we can bear." He also believes that "We must do our part and God is gonna sure bless you ten times over!" he says. Rev. Presley went on to say, "That is why I just turned it over to Him when I had the stroke. I wasn't gonna fight His will. I had to save my strength and ask the Lord for Him to give me the help to fight back...and HE DID! That's why I made it...simply with HIM walking every step with me!"

As I started to leave, the Reverend made one final point, not only to procrastinators but to everyone who has put off making a decision or doing something they knew they should go on and do, he said, "You know when Jesus calls, when He does, YOU BETTER ANSWER RIGHT THEN!" shaking his head, "There's no way around it, so face it, embrace it and you won't regret it!"
