Money Recovered By Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department To Be Returned to Colbert Co. Woman

A Colbert County woman who was scammed out of \$1500 earlier this year by "fictitious home repair workers" is getting her money back. These workers were believed to be a part of a nation-wide tribe of gypsies who travel from state to state scamming people.

After litigation and legal procedures, the money has been released for Sheriff David Smith to return to Colbert County, AL, Sheriff Ronnie May, who will return it to the woman.

Sheriff David Smith and Tishomingo County Deputies

apprehended four and arrested three of the four in connection with the multi-state scam operation last January.

In Tishomingo County, the roof repairers allegedly were working both ends of the county. At one residence, they reportedly sprayed water on the roof and charged over \$8,000. This victim stopped payment on the check. At a second residence, the roofers sprayed a red metal roof with what looked like black tar and were waiting to receive their pay when Deputies Rodney Pannell

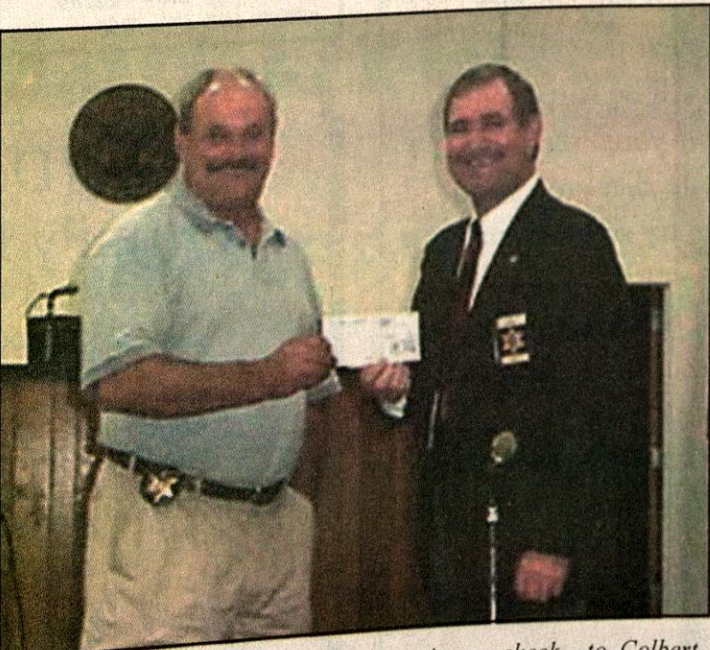
and John David Murphy apprehended them.

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department had been alerted by a woman who lives on Highway 25 North. She reported that she was suspicious of two men who had come to her home wanting to do repair work on her metal roof. She did not know the men and refused to let them do the work. She called the Sheriff's Department and gave them a description of the pickup the men were traveling in. Her help quickly led to the apprehension of the suspects.

Arrested and charged in connection with the scam activities were Teddy E. Girton, 26, of Mt. Juliet, TN, and Manuel Cooper, 34, of Benton, AK, and Levie Linda Stanley Girton, 30. They were all charged with felony false pretense.

Tishomingo County Sheriff David Smith continues to urge all citizens and especially the elderly to report any suspicious cars, characters, or activities to the Sheriff's Department at 423-7000.

Second Primary Election Ballots For County Sheriff Again Re-Examined

In the continued efforts to decide the outcome of the Democratic Second Primary winner for Sheriff, Jerry Boyd, Glenn Whitlock, and their attorneys, and the other representatives who were present at the first re-examination, met on Wednesday, Oct. 8, at the Tishomingo County Courthouse to re-examine contested ballots and take depositions from witnesses.

According to Richard Bowen, attorney for Whitlock, this pre-trial discovery meeting would be used to specifically examine the contested ballots and their envelopes for presentation during the hearing of the case.

Boyd's attorney, Dennis Horn, had also requested a meeting with the appropriate parties to hear the deposition(s) of a witness(es).

Circuit Court Judge Kenneth Thomas of Cleveland, MS, has been appointed by the Mississippi Supreme Court to hear the case of Jerry Boyd, who brought allegations of violations of voting procedures during the August 26 Democratic Primary election. This case has been scheduled for October 20 and 21.

Although rumors are circulating about a different date for the hearing of this case, Tishomingo County Circuit Court Donna Dill says that an order for a change of date has not yet been reported to the Circuit Court Clerk's office.

Depending on the outcome of and the timeliness of the hearing, as many as two additional elections might have to be held in Tishomingo County to decide a final winner in the Sheriff's race.

Firefighting Grants Go To Four VFD's North MS

The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has approved fire safety grants for four volunteer fire departments in north Mississippi, federal lawmakers said Thursday.

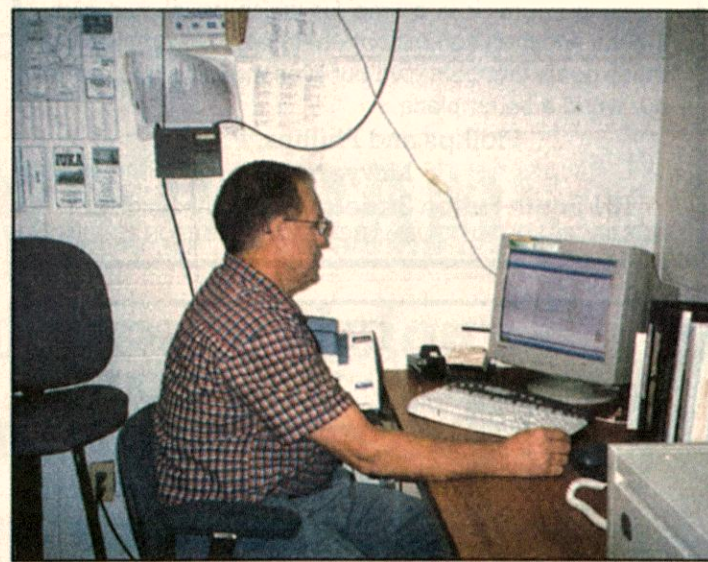
U. S. Rep. Roger Wicker and Sens. Thad Cochran and Trent Lott said funds will be used to strengthen fire operations and enhance firefighter safety.

The awards include:
*\$39,915 for Dennis VFD (Tishomingo County);
*\$42,336 for Spout Springs VFD (Tippah County);
*\$13,876 for Potts Camp VFD;
*\$45,648 for Fairhaven

VFD (DeSoto County)

The award came from the Assistance to Firefighters Program approved by Congress to directly assist the nation's firefighters and the services they deliver. It is administered by FEMA and the Emergency Preparedness and Response Directorate at the Department of Home Security.

The program provides funds to increase the effectiveness of firefighting operations, health and safety programs, purchase of new firefighting equipment, and improve emergency medical service response capabilities.

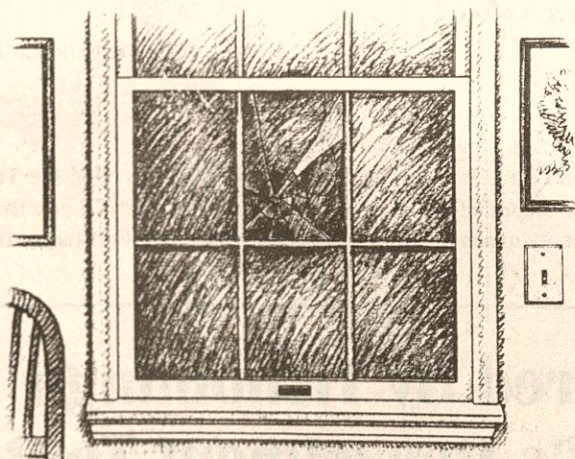
"Being a 4-H member has given me the confidence to speak in public and lead groups of people", said Robert Martin, Tishomingo County 4-H member.

Disc Golf Tournament At Tish. State Park

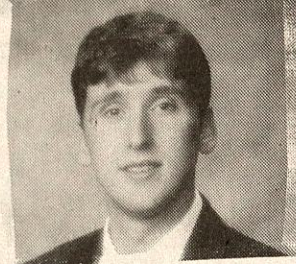

Diabetes And The Retina

More than 32 million Americans are legally blind. About 4,700 lose their sight each year because of retinal damage caused by diabetes, a diabetes retinopathy (medical term). The damage increases with the duration of the disease. After 10 years, 2/3 diabetes show eye damage, rising to 90% after 30 or 40 years.

Visual problems usually start with changes in blood supply to the eyes. New blood vessels - often leaking blood - may form in the eye, interfering with sight. In addition, hemorrhages can form, leading to scarring, which restricts vision. As disease progresses, blood vessels grow over the retina. These also swell and bleed, leading to hemorrhages. Laser surgery can be used to coagulate the outgrowths and leaky blood vessels and stop the blood vessels that threaten the retina. The procedure can be performed on an outpatient basis.

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION PROPOSING TO AMEND SECTION 213-A, MISSISSIPPI CONSTITUTION OF 1890, TO PROVIDE THAT APPOINTMENTS BY THE GOVERNOR AFTER JANUARY 1, 2004, TO FILL VACANCIES ON THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING CREATED BY EXPIRATION OF MEMBERS' TERMS OF OFFICE SHALL BE MADE FROM EACH OF THE THREE MISSISSIPPI SUPREME COURT DISTRICTS; TO PROVIDE THAT SUCH APPOINTMENTS SHALL BE MADE FROM THE SUPREME COURT DISTRICT HAVING THE SMALLEST NUMBER OF BOARD MEMBERS UNTIL THE ENTIRE MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD INCLUDES FOUR MEMBERS WHO ARE RESIDENTS OF EACH SUPREME COURT DISTRICT; TO PROVIDE FOR STAGGERED NINE-YEAR TERMS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That the following amendment to the Mississippi Constitution of 1890 is proposed to the qualified electors of the state:

Amend Section 213-A, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read as follows:

Section 213-A. The state institutions of higher learning * * * in Mississippi, to wit: University of Mississippi, Mississippi State University of Agriculture and Applied Science, Mississippi University for Women, University of Southern Mississippi, Delta State University, Alcorn State University, Jackson State University, Mississippi Valley State University, and any others * * * which may be * * * organized or established by the State of Mississippi, shall be under the management and control of a board of trustees to be known as the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning. The * * * Governor * * * shall appoint the members of the board with the advice and consent of the Senate. The Governor shall appoint only persons who are qualified electors residing in the district from which each is appointed, and at least twenty-five (25) years of age, and of the highest order of intelligence, character, learning and fitness for the performance of such duties, to the end that such board shall perform its high and honorable duties * * * to the greatest advantage of the people of the state and such educational institutions, uninfluenced by any political considerations. The board of trustees shall be composed of twelve (12) members. The members of the board of trustees as constituted on January 1, 2004, shall continue to serve until expiration of their respective terms of office. Appointments made to fill vacancies created by expiration of members' terms of office occurring after January 1, 2004, shall be as follows: The initial term of the members appointed in 2004 shall be for eleven (11) years; the initial term of the members appointed in 2008 shall be for ten (10) years; and the initial term of the members appointed in 2012 shall be for nine (9) years. After the expiration of the initial terms, all terms shall be for nine (9) years. Four (4) members of the board of trustees shall be appointed from each of the three (3) Mississippi Supreme Court districts and, as such vacancies occur, the Governor shall make appointments from the Supreme Court district having the smallest number of board members until the membership includes four (4) members from each district. In case of a vacancy on the board by death or resignation of a member, or from any * * * cause other than the expiration of such member's term of office, the board shall elect his successor, who shall hold office until the end of the next session of the Legislature. During such term of the session of the Legislature, the Governor shall appoint the successor member of the board from the district from which his predecessor was appointed, to hold office for the balance of the unexpired term for which such original trustee was appointed, to the end that one-third (1/3) of such trustees' terms will expire each three (3) years.

The Legislature shall provide by law for the appointment of a trustee for the La Bauve Fund at the University of Mississippi and for the perpetuation of such fund.

Such board shall have the power and authority to elect the heads of the various institutions of higher learning, and contract with all deans, professors and other members of the teaching staff, and all administrative employees of the institutions for a term not exceeding four (4) years; but the board may * * * terminate any such contract at any time for malfeasance, inefficiency or contumacious conduct, but never for political reasons.

Nothing herein contained shall in any way limit or take away the power the Legislature had and possessed, if any, at the time of the adoption of this amendment, to consolidate, abolish or change the status of any of the above named institutions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this amendment to the Constitution shall be submitted to the qualified electors of this state at an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday of November 2003, in the manner provided by Section 273 of the Constitution and by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the explanation of this proposed amendment for the ballot shall read as follows: "This proposed amendment provides that after January 1, 2004, as vacancies occur, the twelve-member Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall be appointed from each of the three Mississippi Supreme Court districts, until there are four members from each Supreme Court district. The terms of office are reduced from twelve years to nine years. The terms are staggered so that all members appointed after 2012 will have a term of nine years."

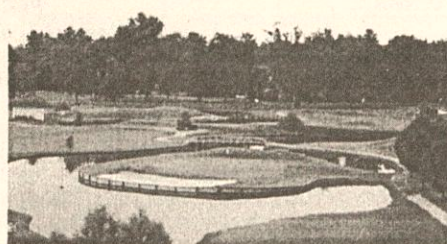

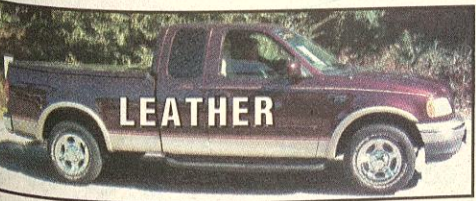

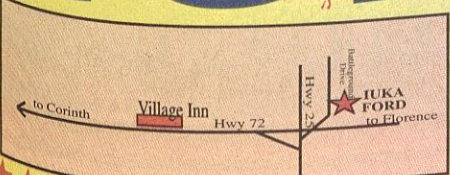
