

In Tishomingo County, voters will go to the polls to elect their own county officials for the offices of Sheriff, Surveyor, District 2 Supervisor, District 5 Supervisor, Southern District Justice Court Judge, and Northern District Constable.

At the time of this writing, the voting for the office for Sheriff of Tishomingo County was still in question because of the "Jerry '10-Speed' Boyd" suit against the Tishomingo County Democratic Commit-

The hearing to finalize the outcome of the Second Primary Democratic election, which certified Glenn Whitlock as the winner by 40 votes, was rescheduled again for Friday,

All Tishomingo County the hearing was for Monday voting precincts will open at and Tuesday, October 20 and

21. After conflicts with the judge's schedule, hearing was rescheduled for Friday, October 31, with a new judge. However, hearing was then again scheduled for Thursday, Oct. 30, and Friday, Oct. 31 according

to Donna Dill, Circuit Court Clerk. The Circuit Clerk's office was notified late last week concerning the change in the date. Since the next paper date is after the hearing, the results of that hearing cannot be reported until the Thursday after the Tuesday, Nov. 4, election.

Candidates for Sheriff on Tuesday's ballot will include: Independent Chris Davis; Republican Steve Thorne, and Democrat Glenn Whitlock. (If Boyd wins his appeal hearing, the Circuit Court's office will be instructed as to how to handle the situation.)

Candidates for Surveyor include Democrat Wayne Lambert and Republican James T.

### **Conservation Corner**

I spend a lot of time driving around Mississippi - from Clarksdale to Natchez to Pascagoula to Tupelo. I have also had the pleasure of seeing all states except Alaska, Con-

necticut, Hawaii, Idaho, Oregon and Washington. And I have to admit, I was shocked to see that so many states are much cleaner than my beloved Mississippi. Bismark, North Dakota is the cleanest city and state I have ever seen. In Mississippi we have

trashy road sides and streets. Even our rural roads are littered with trash and old culverts. It appears that we don't care about how our surroundings look to us or other people. Although I'm confident that is not

The Mississippi Legislature recognized this problem. In 1988 the legislature passed a bill authorizing "Keep Mississippi Beautiful/People Against Litter." The program is not-forprofit and operates under a 17person Board of Directors.

Its goals are to encourage communities in Mississippi to become part of the Keep America Beautiful System, assist communities in establishing litter prevention and education programs, coordinate an annual awards program and serve as a clearing house of information on ideas and projects.

Information ranges from prevention, which is most important, to litter cleanup and recycling. Information is free.

Funding for the program is, in part, through a contract with the Mississippi Department of Transportation. It also receives support from many public and private companies, as well as individuals who recognize the need for a clean and beautiful state. Having a clean state is not only important for a quality environment, but a healthy

economy, too. Let's say you have a large building to rent. Would you invite a potential manufacturer to come to your building and your office when you have not even cleaned it up. I mean there are old newspapers and coffee cups laying around, trash is abundant and files are stacked high and out of place. How your building looks to

the potential manufacturer plays an important role in the way Mississippians are perceived. It shows pride, or a lack of pride. If the manufacturer came to our state on an exploratory mission for an 800 person factory and saw the way your office, building and surroundings looked, what do you think he would derive about Mississippi's work ethic and quality of work?

Let's clean up our act. It's not free.

CONSTITUTIONAL **AMENDMENTS AMENDMENT NO. 1** SENATE CONCURRENT **RESOLUTION 522** This proposed amendment provides that after January 1, 2004, as vacancies occur, the twelve-member Board of Trustees of State

Institutions of Higher Learning shall

be appointed from each of the three

Mississippi Supreme Court districts,

until there are four members from

each Supreme Court district. The

terms of office are reduced from twelve years to nine years. The

terms are staggered so that all

members appointed after 2012 will

have a term of nine years.

A lot of people in Tishomingo County are wondering why sheriff's candidate Jerry Boyd continues to press his contest of the Democratic primary runoff election.

Some people are calling it a racial issue, even though Mr. Boyd ran a campaign totally focused on his qualifications and experience.

I just want to say for the record that it was not Mr. Boyd who brought the issue of race into the election. Instead, it was a city official - a former city police chief - who introduced the subject of race into the election. Mr. Boyd has witnesses who can attest that this official was campaigning at the front of the court house on election day, a direct violation of Mississippi law. He in fact told some voters that they should not cast their ballot for the black candidate.

There were other violations that could have made a huge difference in the election that separated the candidates by only 40 votes. Whether or not Mr. Boyd wins his case in the end, the number of election irregularities need to be aired in a courtroom so that individuals using unethical, and even illegal, tactics will know that those

actions will not be ignored. Anyone who chooses to run for public office in Tishomingo County should want to be reassured that they can count on fairness at the polls.

Among the irregularities were two workers at two nursing homes who signed as witnesses on numerous absentee or affidavit ballots, something that is not permitted by law.

There were also several registered voters who had voted with no problem in previous elections but were denied the privilege in this election.

Finally, Mr. Boyd has lived and worked in this community for more than 25 years, through that time building a solid reputation for integrity. He has demonstrated nothing but character in his performance of his duties as a state Highway Patrol officer and as an officer with the Mississippi


