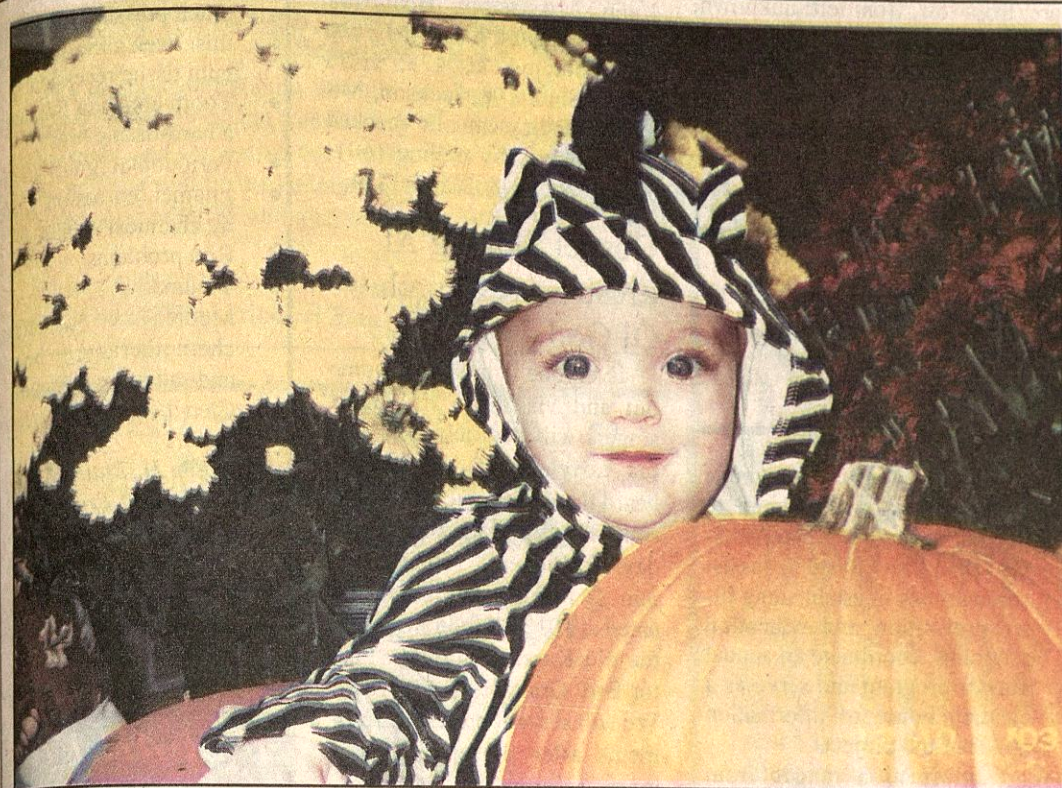

### New County and State Officials To Be Seated

Polls Will Be Open From 7:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m.

All Tishomingo County voting precincts will open at 7:00 a.m. Tuesday morning, November 4, for voters to cast their votes in the last round of the 2003 General Election.

Winners are scheduled to take office in January, 2004. See the sample ballot with specific names for all offices on page 8.

**Tishomingo County Offices**

In Tishomingo County, voters will go to the polls to elect their own county officials for the offices of Sheriff, Surveyor, District 2 Supervisor, District 5 Supervisor, Southern District Justice Court Judge, and Northern District Constable.

At the time of this writing, the voting for the office for Sheriff of Tishomingo County was still in question because of the "Jerry '10-Speed' Boyd" suit against the Tishomingo County Democratic Committee.

The hearing to finalize the outcome of the Second Primary Democratic election, which certified Glenn Whitlock as the winner by 40 votes, was rescheduled again for Friday, Oct. 31. The first scheduling of

the hearing was for Monday and Tuesday, October 20 and 21. After conflicts with the judge's schedule, the hearing was rescheduled for Friday, October 31, with a new judge. However, the hearing was then again rescheduled for Thursday, Oct. 30, and Friday, Oct. 31 according to Donna Dill, Circuit Court Clerk. The Circuit Clerk's office was notified late last week concerning the change in the date. Since the next paper date is after the hearing, the results of that hearing cannot be reported until the Thursday after the Tuesday, Nov. 4, election.

Candidates for Sheriff on Tuesday's ballot will include: Independent Chris Davis; Republican Steve Thorne, and Democrat Glenn Whitlock. (If Boyd wins his appeal hearing, the Circuit Court's office will be instructed as to how to handle the situation.)

Candidates for Surveyor include Democrat Wayne Lambert and Republican James T.

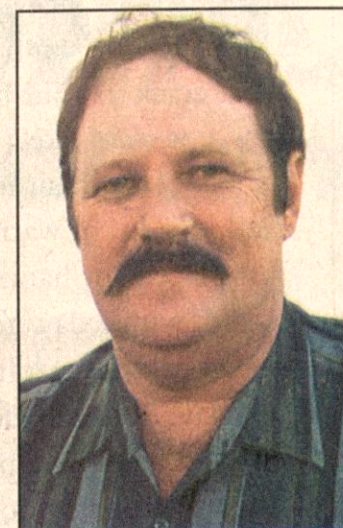
### Mike Robinson Asks For Your Support On November 4th

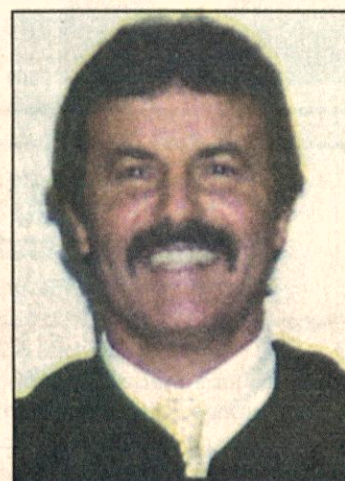

I spend a lot of time driving around Mississippi - from Clarksdale to Natchez to Pascagoula to Tupelo. I have also had the pleasure of seeing all states except Alaska, Con-

necticut, Hawaii, Idaho, Oregon and Washington. And I have to admit, I was shocked to see that so many states are much cleaner than my beloved Mississippi. Bismark, North Dakota is the cleanest city and state I have ever seen.

In Mississippi we have trashy road sides and streets. Even our rural roads are littered with trash and old culverts. It appears that we don't care about how our surroundings look to us or other people. Although I'm confident that is not true.

The Mississippi Legislature recognized this problem. In 1988 the legislature passed a bill authorizing "Keep Mississippi Beautiful/People Against Litter." The program is not-for-profit and operates under a 17-person Board of Directors.

Its goals are to encourage communities in Mississippi to become part of the Keep America Beautiful System, assist communities in establishing litter prevention and education programs, coordinate an annual awards program and serve as a clearing house of information on ideas and projects.

Information ranges from prevention, which is most important, to litter cleanup and recycling. Information is free.

Funding for the program is, in part, through a contract with the Mississippi Department of Transportation. It also receives support from many public and private companies, as well as individuals who recognize the need for a clean and beautiful state. Having a clean state is not only important for a quality environment, but a healthy

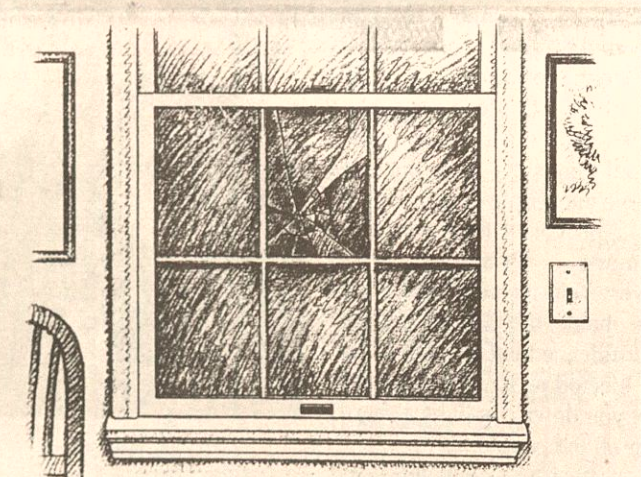

## Beware Home Made Saline

Home made saline solutions made from salt tablets should not be used to rinse contact lenses after heat disinfection or before or after chemical disinfection. The only acceptable use for salt tablets is to prepare solutions to be used in the heat disinfection process, or as a rinse BEFORE heat disinfection.

Evidently, contact lens wearers using home made saline solutions may be at a higher risk of a rare but serious eye infection. A potential source of contamination is non-sterile distilled water often used to dissolve the salt tablets. Therefore, a solution made from it may also be contaminated.

If a contaminated solution is used before or during the heat disinfection process, the heat will kill the organism. If the contaminated solution is used afterwards, the organism can get into the eye. Enzyme tablets used to remove protein deposits should be dissolved only in commercially available sterile saline solution.

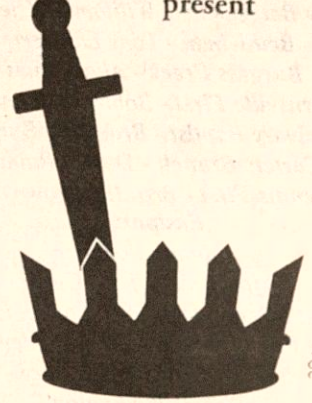
Luka Middle School Football Teams

## Letter To The Editor...

A lot of people in Tishomingo County are wondering why sheriff's candidate Jerry Boyd continues to press his contest of the Democratic primary runoff election.

Some people are calling it a racial issue, even though Mr. Boyd ran a campaign totally focused on his qualifications and experience.

I just want to say for the record that it was not Mr. Boyd who brought the issue of race into the election. Instead, it was a city official - a former city police chief - who introduced the subject of race into the election. Mr. Boyd has witnesses who can attest that this official was campaigning at the front of the court house on election day, a direct violation of Mississippi law. He in fact told some voters that they should not cast their ballot for the black candidate.

There were other violations that could have made a huge difference in the election that separated the candidates by only 40 votes. Among the irregularities were two workers at two nursing homes who signed as witnesses on numerous absentee or affidavit ballots, something that is not permitted by law.

There were also several registered voters who had voted with no problem in previous elections but were denied the privilege in this election.

Finally, Mr. Boyd has lived and worked in this community for more than 25 years, through that time building a solid reputation for integrity. He has demonstrated nothing but character in his performance of his duties as a state Highway Patrol officer and as an officer with the Mississippi

Army National Guard.

I think it is important for everyone in the county to understand the facts when it comes to understanding Mr. Boyd's reasons for wanting all the available information about the sheriff's runoff election aired in a court of law.
