Christmas Season Opens With Festive Parades

The Christmas Season will officially arrive in the area this weekend with the presentation of the 2003 Christmas Parades in Iuka, Tishomingo, and Burnsville.

City Officials have announced Grand Marshalls for each of the parades: Iuka's Grand Marshall is Lana Harrelson; Tishomingo's Grand Marshall is Sis Bickerstaff, and Burnsville's Grand Marshall is Pat Jones.

Iuka's parade will start at 6:00 p.m. Friday, December 5, on Battleground Drive in front of Ables' Real Estate and will end at the Mineral Springs Park on the Quitman Street side.

All participants in the parade will need to enter the parade route on the south end of Battleground Drive by entering in front of Iuka Ford. Participants should stop at the registration table, which will be in front of J. C. Lambert's Hardware, where participants should pick up their number for the parade. Numbers need to be picked up by 5:00 p.m., and all participants should be in line by 5:30 p.m. The parade participants will line up on the street (Battleground Drive). Floats and entries will not need to go into the Wal-Mart parking lot.

Iuka's City officials are excited about this year's parade and hope everyone can attend the "Ole Fashion Christmas."

Tishomingo's parade will begin at 6:30 p.m. on Saturday, December 6. The participants will line up at the Tishomingo Middle School between 5:30 and 6:15 p.m. The streets will be shining brightly this year due to special donations lending to the theme, "Wishing Upon A Star."

Burnsville's parade will begin at 6:00 p.m. on Monday, December 8. Line up will be at Sister's Restaurant at 5:00 p.m. This year's theme is "Silent Night."

Lighting of Mineral Springs

Mineral Springs Park will officially be lighted at 6:00 p.m. on Thursday night, December 4.

Everyone is invited to attend this official lighting of the park. Iuka City Officials are very proud of this park and all the decorations in the park. Several local businesses, nursing homes, and organizations have displays in the park for everyone to see. This year Mineral Springs Park is a showplace for the City of Iuka.

Santa in Jay Bird Park

Notice To All Tishomingo County Taxpayers

Paul Whitlock, Tishomingo County Tax Collector, would like to remind all taxpayers that tax statements have been mailed and the books will be open December 1st for payment of 2003 taxes. Real and personal taxes may be paid after December 1st and must be paid before February 1, 2004 to avoid a penalty.

There are some things that you should know as a taxpayer that will make paying property taxes easier and more convenient.

(1) Since the separation of the Tax Collector and Tax Assessor's Office in 1996, the Tax Collector's only responsibility concerning property taxes is the collection of money due.

If you have a question about your taxes, assessment, number of acres, etc., you need to get those questions answered before mailing or coming to pay.

(2) If you would like to pay by mail, you may do so by mailing your payment to Tax Collector, 1008 Battleground Drive, Iuka, MS 38852.

(3) The office is open from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, if you want to come in.

(4) It is very important, if a mortgage company is responsible for paying your taxes, to mail the statement to the mortgage company, if it comes to you.

If the office of the Tax Collector can be of help to you with your car and truck tags, car and truck titles, mobile home registration, privilege license, disability forms, or the paying of your taxes, please don't hesitate to call 423-7048.

Mrs. Lana Harrelson Named Grand Marshall Of The 2003 Iuka Christmas Parade

The Grand Marshall for the 2003 Christmas Parade is Lana Harrelson, a retired Tishomingo County teacher, who now works as reporter/writer for the *Tishomingo County News*. No matter what her job, she says she enjoys meeting and talking to people.

Lana Dawson Harrelson first came to Tishomingo County in 1970-71 to teach seventh and eighth-grade English at Burnsville Middle School. After three years at Burnsville, she returned, along with husband Jerry, to her home, Booneville, to teach Business Education at Jumpertown High School. Mrs. Harrelson taught at Jumpertown for four years before returning to Burnsville to teach junior and senior English. After two years at Burnsville, she came to Iuka High School to teach Business Education. With consolidation, Mrs. Harrelson moved to Tishomingo County High School where she taught a combination of Business, Computer Education, and English classes until she retired in 2001 after 31 years in the classroom. Twenty-seven years were spent in Burnsville, Iuka, and at Tishomingo County High School.

Lana, husband Jerry, and son Richy have made their home on Martha Lane in Iuka since 1977, and both "Mamma—Mz. H" and Lefty Harrelson have enjoyed following Richy, all his friends, and "their school kids" in all their extracurricular—especially sports—activities.

Lana is an active member of the Pilot Club of Iuka. She is a charter member of that organization, and has served as president of Pilot twice, in 1992 and again in 2001. She is also currently serving as president of Upsilon Chapter of

Delta Kappa Gamma, an honor society for teachers. She has also served on several Zeta (Mississippi) State DKG Committees. Mrs. Harrelson is also a member of the Tishomingo County and Mississippi Retired Teachers Association. All of the Harrelsons have attended Iuka Baptist Church since they came to Iuka in 1977.

Mrs. Harrelson says her years in the classroom were the very best years of her life and that she feels so privileged to have "touched and been touched" by the lives of so many people. "My greatest satisfaction comes from the fact that I have taught and have had (I hope) a positive influence on the very special lives of doctors, nurses, lawyers, accountants, newspaper reporters, pharmacists, carpenters, policemen, deputies, dental hygienists, writers, landscapers, actors, soldiers, professional singers, beauticians, missionaries, scientists, cancer researchers, computer programmers, typesetters, and designers, a World Champion race car driver, butchers, business owners, mechanics, chemical engineers, mechanical engineers, preachers, mothers, fathers, and teachers (Preschool-College), and coaches. I loved the classroom, and I always tried to instill in my students that they should set high goals, strive to reach them, and always leave a place looking better than they found it."

Just before she retired, one particularly happy moment was when she walked into the auditorium at TCHS on a first day of school and saw how many of "her kids" had become teachers. "That moment was an awesome one for me."

Upon retirement from the classroom, Lana has continued to work

Before retirement, she wrote Tishomingo County High School news for the paper, and she still especially enjoys writing about and making pictures of students and teachers. North Mississippi Medical Center - Iuka invites area residents to a free holiday cooking demonstration at 2 p.m. Wednesday, Dec. 10.

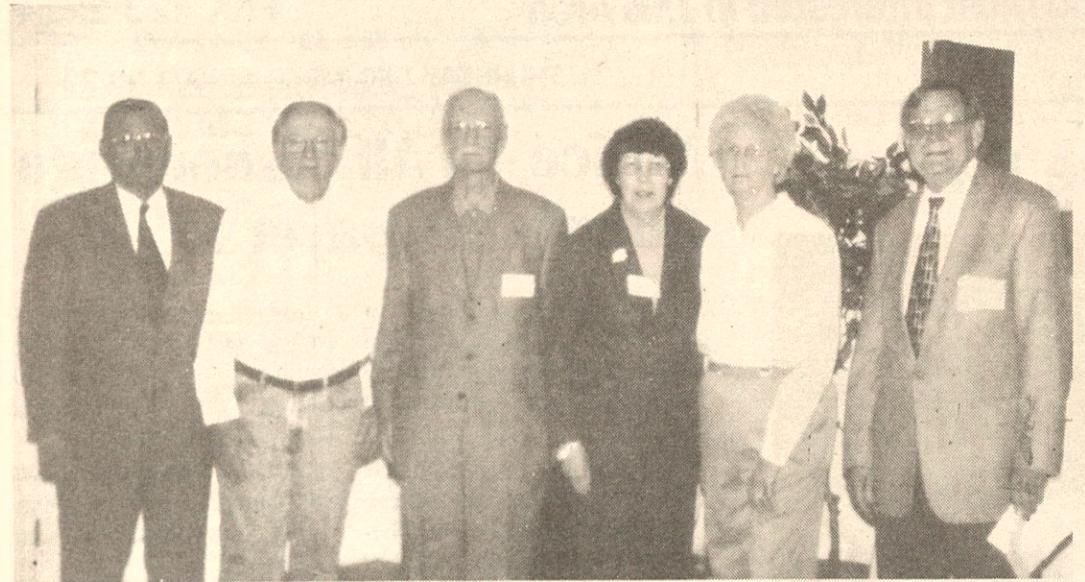



The Whitening Process...

After an exam to ensure oral health, your dentist will determine if you are a candidate for a whitening process. There are several whitening processes available today; your dentist will recommend one that will give you the best results.

In-office whitening is done at your dentist's office. While it may require several visits depending on the number of teeth that need whitening, in-office whitening is the fastest way to brighten your smile. Your dentist protects your gums, then applies a bleaching agent to the teeth. A special heat light may be used to activate the agent.

A dentist-supervised, at-home whitening system is the most popular way to achieve a whiter smile. Your dentist first takes an impression of the teeth to create a custom bleaching tray. When you receive the bleaching tray; you will also receive the whitening gel and specific instructions from your dentist on how to use the system. This system usually takes 10 to 14 days to complete but some patients may begin to notice results right away. Your dentist will ask you to come back to check on your progress.

A number of whitening toothpastes are available to purchase over-the-counter. These toothpastes rely on chemical or abrasive agents to remove stains from the surface of teeth. Since the active whitening ingredient is not exposed to the tooth surface for long, toothpastes are less effective for significant whitening. These toothpastes may be best to maintain a bright smile after an in-office or at-home whitening treatment. Check with your dentist before using one of these products.

Causes Of Eyestrain

There is a collection of symptoms that people lump under the term "eyestrain." This includes tiring of eyes when reading, a tight or pulling sensation around the brows, and a general feeling of fatigue centered in the eyes.

Most often eyestrain simply indicates that an individual has reached his or her threshold of eye use and is ready for a rest. Your eyes do have limits, and the limits vary from person to person. By and large, you must live with this, but there are some common-sense measures you can take to maximize the amount of time you can read or use your eyes intensely before tiring. Getting enough sleep is important, as is a good diet. Good lighting can help, and so can taking a break from time to time.

If you get tired that your eyes are getting tired more often and more easily, however, visit your optometrist. He or she can rule out muscle imbalance or the need for glasses - or prescribe them if necessary.

A MATTER OF TIME

In personal injury law, the term "statute of limitations" refers to the time period between when an injury occurs (or is discovered) and the final date on which a lawsuit can be filed. If the statute of limitations expires before a lawsuit is filed, it can be dismissed for being untimely. The period of time during which a lawsuit can be filed usually begins with the date of harm. There are instances, however, in which an injury may not be discovered until after it occurs. For instance, a surgery patient may not discover that an instrument was left inside his body until much later. In such a case, the statute would apply starting from the date the mistake was discovered.

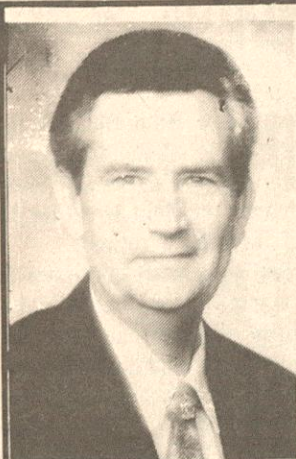
CARPE DIEM

This is from the Mississippi Annotated Code of 1972 as amended from Title 97 Crimes Chapter 41 Cruelty to Animals:

SEC. 97-41-1. Living creatures not to be cruelly treated.

If any person shall override, overdrive, overload, torture, torment, unjustifiably injure, deprive of necessary sustenance, food, or drink; or cruelly beat or needlessly mutilate; or cause or procure to be overridden, overdriven, overloaded, tortured, unjustifiably injured, tormented, or deprived of necessary sustenance, food or drink; or to be cruelly beaten or needlessly mutilated or killed, any living creature, every such offender shall, for every offense, be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Here are just a few of the animals that have been abandoned in Tishomingo County. Our group is currently trying to find them permanent homes.

(Picture A) Justus and Pamela with foster pups "Ollie" and "Jackie". These pups are both female, about 8 weeks old, and are black and white. One pup has the brown markings on her face like a Rotweiler. As you can see, they are very good with children. They both are very curious and love to play.

(Picture B) Jonathan with foster pup "Baby". She is about 10 months old and looks to be an Australian Shepherd and Lab mix. She has small brown spots on each side of both ears. Sensible holiday eating starts with cutting out extra calories in the preparation stage. The key, Rhodes says, is to "reduce and replace" in your diet. For example, add zesty seasonings to low-fat meats such as ground turkey, lean meat, fish and poultry to duplicate a high-fat favorite like breakfast sausage. "Ground turkey eliminates the high fat and sodium in sausage, so you can still enjoy the taste of sausage and save about 123 calories per serving," she said.

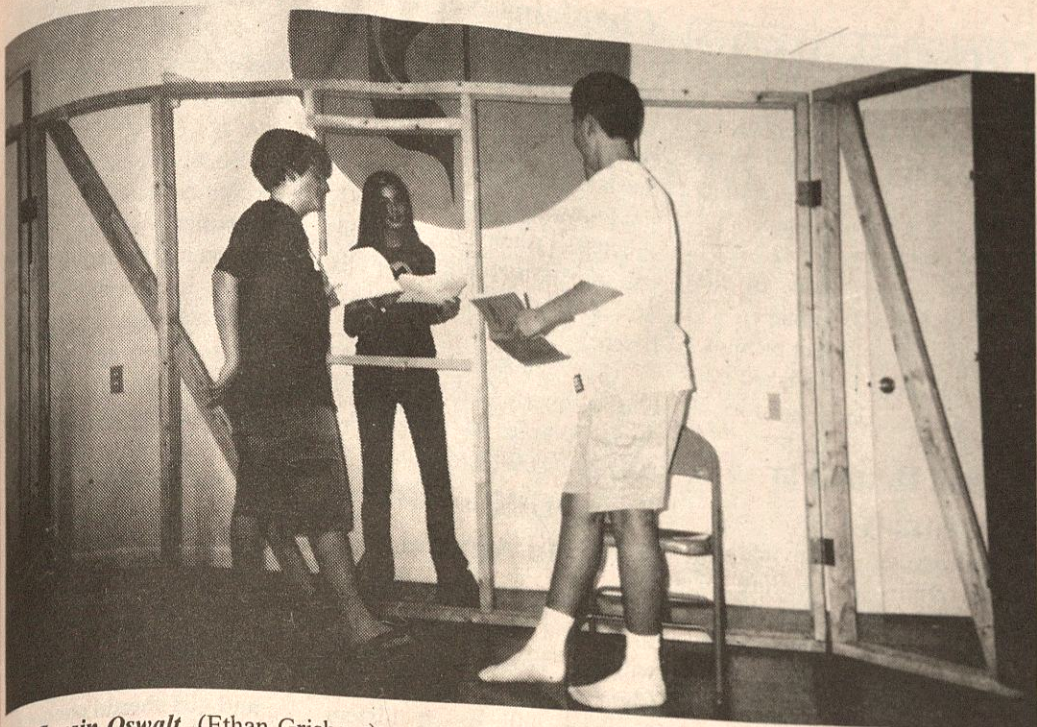
Entertaining often sparks a conflict of interest. "We invite

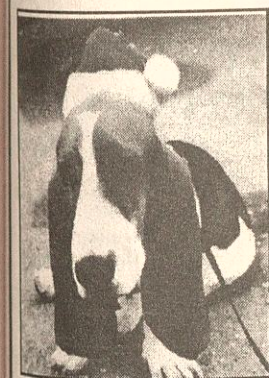

MDOC Probation And Parole Officer Melinda Whited Completes Academy

Melinda Whited of Iuka graduated from the Basic Law Enforcement Class B-32 at the North Mississippi Law Enforcement Training Center on November 20, 2003. encourage parents to immunize their child between six months and two years of age. "Children in this age group are at risk for influenza-related hospitalizations. Influenza vaccination of all children in this age group is encouraged when feasible."

Local county health department clinics will begin administering the flu vaccine in early October at the cost of \$10. The flu shot, as well as the pneumococcal vaccine, are provided by Medicare, Part B.

Influenza, or the flu, is a disease of the lungs and can lead to pneumonia, hospitalization and even death. Typical symptoms of the flu include fever and respiratory symptoms, such as a cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, as well as headache, muscle aches, and often extreme fatigue. The flu season usually begins in late December and is over by sometime in March, but health officials say the time of the season varies from year to year.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, complications from the flu claim the lives of people more than any other vaccine-preventable disease. Over 700 Mississippians died in 2002 from influenza and pneumonia. In an average flu season, 114,000 people in the United States are hospitalized and about 20,000 people die because of the flu. Most who died are over 65 years of age, but young children less than two years old are likely as those over 65 to go to the hospital because of the flu.

Pregnant Women And Children Benefit From Flu Vaccine...

Mississippi public health experts recommend pregnant women in their second and third trimester and infants over six months of age get the flu shot in October and November.

"Much of the illness and death caused by the flu can be prevented by a yearly flu shot," said State Epidemiologist Mary Currier, MD, MPH, with the Mississippi State Department of Health.

So, why should pregnant women in the second and third trimester and infants over the age of six months get the flu shot? Dr. Currier says that these two groups have a high rate of hospitalization from the flu.

Pregnant Women

Women who will be beyond the first three months of pregnancy during the flu season should get a flu shot. "Pregnant women who have medical problems that increase their risk for complications from the flu should get a flu shot before the flu season, no matter their stage of pregnancy," said Dr. Currier. "Pregnancy can increase the risk for complications from the

flu, and pregnant women are more likely to be hospitalized from complications of the flu than non-pregnant women of the same age."

"Pregnancy can change the immune system in the mother, as well as affect her cardiovascular system (heart and lung function)," Dr. Currier added. "These changes may place pregnant women at increased risk for complications from the flu."

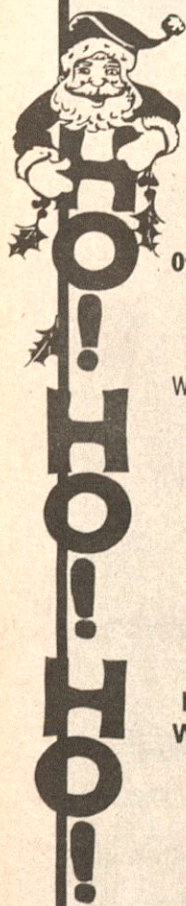
Because the flu shot is made from inactivated viruses - the viruses are killed - public health experts consider flu shots safe during any stage of pregnancy. However, since miscarriages most often occur in the first trimester of pregnancy, experts have traditionally not given a flu shot during the first trimester to avoid a coincidental association with miscarriage.

Even breastfeeding mothers can get their flu shot. "A flu shot cannot cause flu in either the

mother or the baby," said Dr. Currier.

MS Division Of Medicaid Urges High-Risk Patients To Get Flu Shots

The Mississippi Division of Medicaid is urging Mississippi Medicaid Beneficiaries to heed the advice from The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and their personal physician, that those individuals over 50 years of age and those at high risk for complications from flu and pneumonia should get the flu shot now. More than 100,000 people are hospitalized each year from complications caused by the flu. Most of those deaths involve the elderly and individuals who are chronically ill.

"That is why the Mississippi Division of Medicaid encourages it's beneficiaries to get the flu shot every year and make sure they are up to date on pneumonia vaccines," said Rica Lewis-Payton, Executive Director, MS Division of Medicaid.

Although none is projected

this year, past shortages of the flu vaccine has motivated the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP), and the Flu Vaccine Manufacturers to suggest that persons over 50 and the chronically ill get their shots during October or November, and as advised by their personal physician. "The Mississippi Division of Medicaid supports that effort," Payton said, "We want Medicaid beneficiaries who are over 50 years old or at high risk for complications from flu and

pneumonia to get their flu shot as soon as possible. They should also check to see if they

are up to date on their pneumonia vaccine."

"We understand the County Health Departments currently have the vaccine available and we know most clinics in Mississippi are actively immunizing their patients. All individuals over 50 should be given the flu and pneumonia vaccination, especially those who have the highest risk of severe complications if they get the flu. The high risk population includes those with on-going health problems such as heart, kidney, and lung disease, cancer or diabetes, women at least 3 months pregnant, health care workers that come in contact with the chron-

ically ill, and those individuals in congregate living arrangements" said Dr. Robert P.N. Shearin, M.D., M.S. - Medical Director for HealthSystems of Mississippi.

HealthSystems of Mississippi is a non-profit corporation contracted with Mississippi Medicaid to carry out utilization review, quality improvement, and education services. These organizations have joined forces to promote flu and pneumonia immunization in preparation for the upcoming Flu Season.

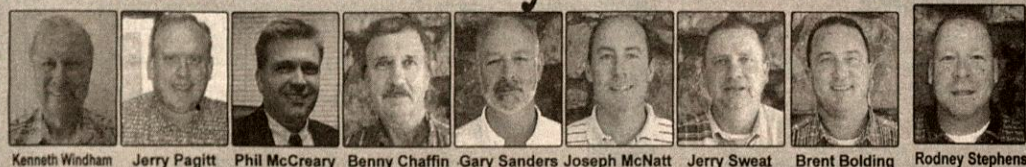

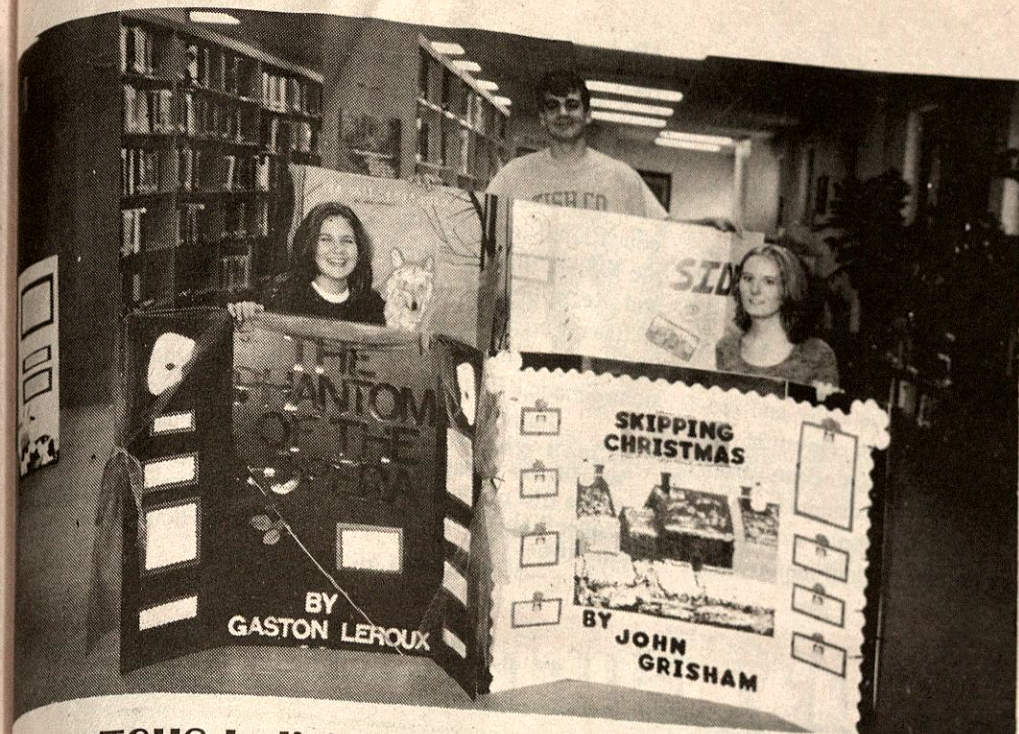

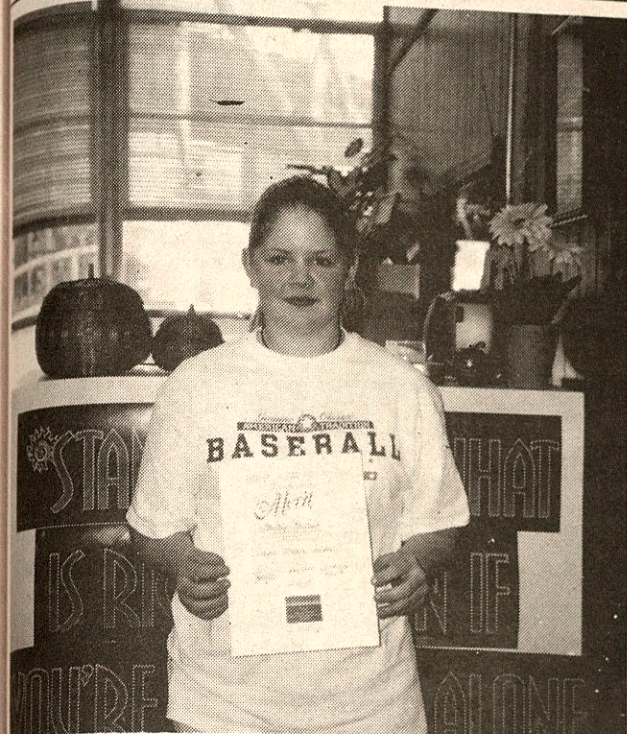
