Tishomingo County Emergency Management - Homeland Security Receives Domestic Preparedness Equipment Grant

Local officials with the Tishomingo County Emergency Management/Homeland Security agency have been busy preparing equipment bags to distribute to area First Responders and law enforcement agencies.

These equipment bags were made possible through a grant secured by Tishomingo

County Emergency Management/Homeland Security Director Norma Lomenick and Assistant Director Jerry Bonds.

The Domestic Preparedness Equipment Grant was received to enhance existing capabilities in order to improve the response to acts of domestic and international terrorism, the use of weapons of mass de-

struction and biochemical agents.

Included in each bag are Tychem coveralls, boots, gloves and a respirator for response to a nuclear, biological or chemical incident.

Among the first to receive the equipment bags were Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer and Iuka Fire Chief Brian Grissom for their departments.

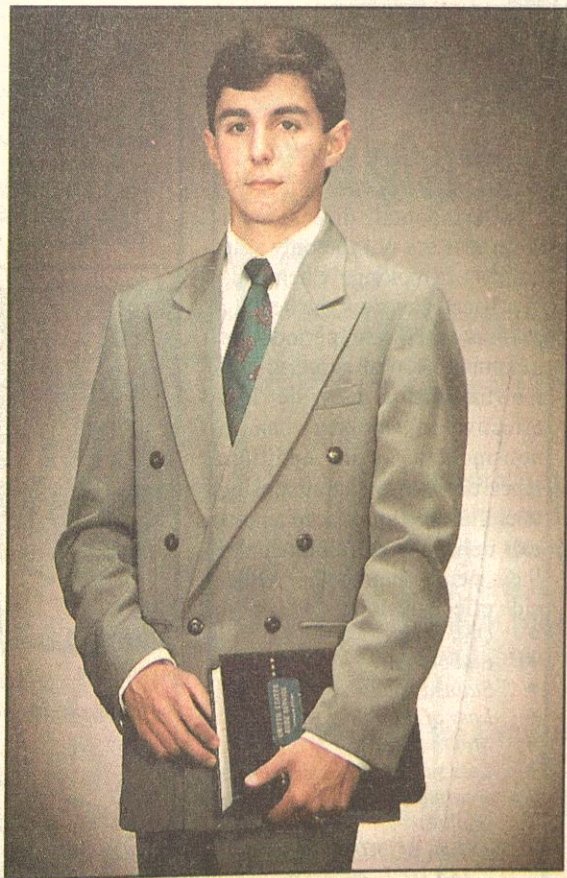
Iuka Native, Mark A. Lambert, To Be Admitted To The MS Bar in February

One-Vehicle Accident North of Iuka Claims Life of Alabama Resident

A one-vehicle accident on Hwy. 25 Saturday night, January 17, just after midnight, has claimed the life of an Alabama man.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, the victim, James Gober, 64, of Vina, Ala., was traveling south on Hwy. 25 when the 1985 Ford LTD he was driving left the roadway near the old Central School Road. The accident happened at approximately 12:28 a.m.

"The accident is still under investigation," according to Wilemon. "With the information we have at this time, it appears that it may have been a natural death."

Wilemon said he is awaiting results of the autopsy to confirm the cause of death.

Apparently there were two witnesses driving on the highway at the time of the accident who stated that Gober's car left the roadway and traveled approximately 200 yards before coming to rest, broadside, near some trees.

It was reported that there was very little damage to the



vehicle and upon investigation by officials at the wreck scene, there did not appear to be any skid marks or any signs of the brakes being applied by the victim before the car came to rest.

According to a family member, Mr. Gober had been to visit a friend and was on his way home when the wreck occurred.

James Wilbur Gober was a native of Alabama and a well driller for 20 years.

Services were Tuesday, Jan. 20, at Sparks Chapel with Bro. Tom Scott officiating. Burial was in Sparks Chapel Cemetery. Deaton Funeral Home

was in charge of services.

Conservation Corner

The conservation of important habitat types, such as hardwood trees and longleaf pine, play an important role for Mississippi as well as our nation. Conservation easements are one of the most landowner friendly tools available. Easements enable a landowner to protect habitat while at the same time, taking advantage of federal tax benefits.

The federal government, specifically and Internal Revenue Service, recognizes that conservation easements have potential public benefits and as such could qualify the owner for a substantial tax deduction.

The best way to understand conservation easements is to look at rights that come with owning land. When an easement is placed on a property, the owner may give up certain rights (e.g., developing the property, etc.). Restrictions on the property are specified in the easement document, which

must be perpetual in order to receive federal tax benefits. The easement document is a legal instrument that is recorded in the county of record.

There are three important aspects of any conservation easement that must be met. First, the easement must meet a definite conservation purpose. The primary purpose, in most habitats. Second, in order to qualify for a conservation easement, the easement must be granted to or be held by a "qualified conservation organization," such as the Mississippi Land Trust. The easement gives the organization the right and responsibility to monitor and enforce the easement document.

A third, but equally important aspect of the conservation easement process is the development of what is referred to as a baseline ecological assess-

ment. It is an ecological "snapshot" of the property and records the condition/uses of the property.

Except for the restrictions described by the easement, the property owner retains all other rights. Hunting, fishing, wildlife viewing and timber management can still be conducted. Conservation easements do not allow public access.

When one places a conservation easement on property, the owner can be assured that it will remain in a natural state forever. The property owner is rewarded by the fact that the easement will promote his or her conservation ethic while receiving immediate tax benefits.

it was quite a moving moment.

For the rest of the week we were mostly in an organizational phase as the lieutenant governor prepared her list of committee assignments. As I noted last week, these assignments are critical to the way the work will flow over the next four years. Committee chairmen have a great deal of say over which legislation will live and which will die and naming the correct person to each chairmanship is very important.

We also had a fiscal briefing Thursday. The economy continues to show signs of improving. The only question is, will it improve enough over the next few weeks to help us with the budget process.

That process is difficult enough without having to shore up the budget with funds from various other sources. As you may know, we budget well in advance. For instance, we are currently halfway through the 2004 fiscal year even though we're still in January of 2004. Our 2005 fiscal year actually begins in July.

In September, state agencies had an opportunity to make their requests to the legislative Budget Committee. Collectively, the agencies asked for

appropriations that total \$4.491 billion - slightly \$1 billion more than what we appropriated for the current year. Obviously they will not get that amount.

Please understand that they

always ask for more money than they expect us to give them. Some of the agencies tried to hold down their requests this year, knowing that our revenue collections are below what we have estimated.

The answer to all of these budget problems, obviously, is strong national and state economy. Making sure that all of our people who want to work can find work will go a long way in solving this dilemma. We in the Legislature remain committed to doing all we can to bring more and better jobs to our state.

Friday the lieutenant governor named her committee assignments and now the real work will begin. There are about 3,000 bills filed every year and through the course of the session are winnowed down to about 600 which actually become law. That seems like a lot, but in reality a lot of the successful bills are local and private bills and appropriations bills and other bills necessary to keep state agencies open and working.

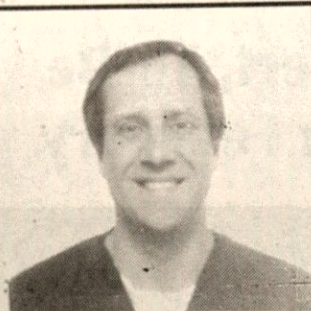
But each bill must be studied in committee and that amounts to a lot of work. We're anxious to get the process started.

I am proud that I was re-elected to the post of Senate President Pro Tempore by a unanimous vote of my fellow senators. I was also elected by my fellow senators to another term as chairman of the Senate Rules Committee.

Color Blindness Mostly Male Problem

The term color-blindness is often applied to people who, strictly speaking, do not suffer color blindness. Only a few individuals actually see the world entirely in black and white. In most cases, the problem is a color deficiency which makes it difficult to recognize certain color shades.

The commonest type of color problem is the one which uses all three primary colors, but in wrong proportions. Another form is the person who only sees two of the three primary colors. Such an individual will be either red blind or green blind, or, extremely rare cases, blue blind.

It is a genetic defect which occurs primarily in men. Sixteen times as many men as women suffer from this form of color blindness. While there is no known cure, all is not hopeless. Some interesting work has been done with filters and tinted lenses which often help individual discrimination between colors.

Federal Jobless Program Expires After Paying \$100 Million To Unemployed Mississippians

A federal program providing additional unemployment benefits for Mississippi's long-term unemployed has ended but not before paying them more than \$100 million in benefits.

The two-year program known as Temporary Emergency Unemployment Compensation (TEUC) ended Dec. 27. The 13-week extension still applies to those who had an active TEUC claim on Dec. 27.

The program paid additional weeks of benefits to 39,100 Mississippians in 2002 and to more than 32,000 unemployed workers in 2003. In 2002 \$52.3 million was paid to them, and in 2003 \$48.2 million was paid.

TEUC provided up to 13 additional weeks of benefits to unemployed workers after they had received 26 weeks of regular unemployment. The program is over for those filing first-time claims for unemployment.

In most cases the additional money helped families buy the staples - food, clothing and shelter.

The U.S. Congress passed the TEUC program in March 2002 to bolster the economy after September 11. The program was set to expire in May but economic conditions led to Congress extending the ending date to the end of the year.

TEUC payments are paid by the federal government and do not come from Mississippi's unemployment trust fund.

The amount of each check varies depending upon each individual's situation.

The Mississippi Employment Security Commission administers the program.

Summary of Action Plans for Tishomingo County

Recruitment of new industry is virtually impossible without an industry assistance plan.

Small Business Development Plan
The Small Business Development Plan spells out specific actions to assist individuals interested in going into business and to assist businesses that desire to expand in Tishomingo County. The Foundation will place greater emphasis on development and marketing of the tourism resources of Tishomingo County. The Foundation will identify gaps in services and goods and attempt to encourage local businesses and individuals to fill those gaps where possible. Recruitment of new businesses may be needed for some types of services and goods as long as this recruitment will not create competition for the county's existing businesses. The Foundation is studying other ways to create additional small business activity in Tishomingo County.

Marketing Plan For Tishomingo Co.

The Marketing Plan spells out specific actions to market Tishomingo County to new industries. The Marketing Plan targets specific types of manufacturers such as air conditioning, heating, and refrigeration; transportation equipment; electronics; furniture and other wood products metal fabrication and related products; food processing and food processing equipment; security related industries; and aerospace related industries. Telecommunications, warehousing, and distribution are also targeted. Other categories of industries may be

considered as opportunities arise. Priority is given to industries that may offer business opportunities to existing industries in Tishomingo County. The Marketing Plan proposes several activities to promote Tishomingo County. Partnerships and networking are vital. Other activities may include printed full-color marketing flyers and brochures, telephone and e-mail contacts, visits to industrial prospects and site selection consultants, Internet marketing, print advertising in the Nashville and Memphis Business Journals, and other marketing activities as the budget allows.

Other activities of the Foundation will include a periodic newsletter for economic development partners; fostering of closer working relationships with county and municipal officials; and frequent networking and partnering with other economic development entities such as the Mississippi Development Authority, North Mississippi Industrial Development Association, Tennessee Valley Authority, Northeast Mississippi Community College, Northeast Mississippi Planning and Development District, MSU Extension Service, Mississippi Employment Security Commission, and others.
