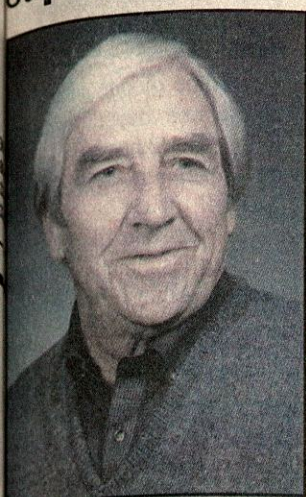

## Former Tishomingo County Supervisor A. C. Ryan Dies

Former Tishomingo County Supervisor, A. C. Ryan, 79, of Iuka, MS, died on Monday, February 2, 2004, at the VA Medical Center in Memphis, TN.

Mr. Ryan served as the Tishomingo County Third District Supervisor for many years. He was a US Army veteran of World War II. After the War Ryan returned to Tishomingo County and was employed with TVA at Joe Wheeler Dam for several years. He later was elected as the Tishomingo County Third District Supervisor, a post he held for 20 years. Mr. Ryan also served as the President of the Board of Supervisors for several years. He was a 32nd degree Mason, a Shriner, and a member of the

Iuka Lodge #94 F&AM. He enjoyed fishing and hunting.

Mr. Ryan is survived by three sons and one daughter: Danny Ryan, Ricky Ryan, and Tim Ryan, all of Iuka, MS, and Shelia Wilson of White House, TN; one brother, J. W. Southward of Tishomingo, MS, and one sister, Louise Brantley of Meridian, MS. He is also survived by 13 grandchildren; 6 great-grandchildren; and Lalla Ryan.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Dimple Ryan, and his parents, Arthur Ryan and Mae Ryan Davenport.

Services for Mr. Ryan were held at 11:00 a.m. on Wednesday, February 4, at Cutshall Funeral Home Chapel in Iuka with the Rev. Dan Minton officiating. Burial was in the Bethlehem Cemetery. Pallbearers were Chris Ryan, Ronnie Ryan, Butch Wilson, Richard Wilson, Paul Ryan, Neil Ryan, Keith Ryan, and Steve Wilson. Honorary pallbearers were Tommy Lomenick, Leslie Cox, Judd Brumley, Charlie Spearman, and Eddie Woodruff.

## Iuka Man Seriously Injured In Motorcycle/Pickup Collision

At approximately 7:25 on Tuesday morning, February 3, 2004, Tim Tigner, of 25 CR 266, who is in his early 30's, was seriously injured in a motorcycle/truck accident on the J.P. Coleman Park access road. Also involved in the accident was Leroy Davis, who also lives in the Coleman Park area.

According to Investigator Jay Moyers of the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, Tigner was apparently west bound and Davis, who works the night shift at World Color in Corinth, was east bound on his

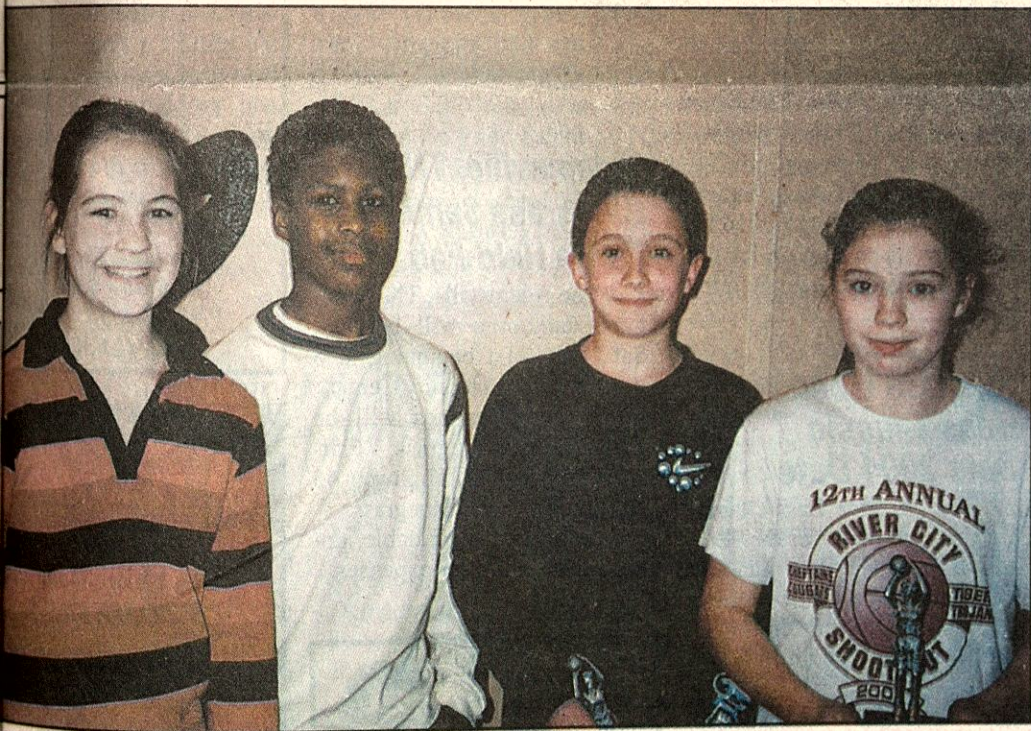
way home from work when the collision occurred. According to Officer Moyers, as of presstime, details are still sketchy and the accident remains under investigation.

When the motorcycle and truck collided, Tigner suffered serious injuries to one leg and one hand. He also received other cuts and bruises. Mr. Davis received cuts and bruises. The Air Evac Life team airlifted Tigner to the North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo, where he was stabilized and surgery was per-

formed to amputate his leg which could not be saved.

The accident occurred approximately .2 of a mile east of the Hwy. 25/J.P. Coleman Park access road intersection in the curve at the top of the hill.

Emergency personnel from the North Cross Roads Volunteer Fire Department, area EMT's, the Iuka Hospital, and the Mississippi Highway Patrol, assisted the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department and the Air Evac Life team in medical aid, traffic control, and cleanup activities at the scene.

## Iuka Businessman & Family Plead Guilty To Satellite Piracy

According to a report that aired on the WTVA Channel 9 news Tuesday evening, a Tishomingo County family has been caught a second time for satellite piracy. The Jackson office of the FBI along with Direct TV and DishNetwork investigated the family who has admitted to selling modified satellite access cards.

Robert "Sonny" Scott, Jr. 58, his wife, Donna Scott and their son 37 year-old "Scotty" Scott of S&S Satellites in Iuka all pled guilty to the felonies.

This is the second time they have been caught for this, they were convicted in 1992 on similar charges.

## February 6th Is "National Wear Red Day" For Women

February 6 has been designated as "National Wear Red Day" to encourage public awareness toward America's No. 1 killer of women: heart disease. By showing off a favorite red dress, jacket, shirt or tie, you can join a national movement to give a woman a wake-up call about their risk for heart disease.

Many people are not aware that heart disease kills more than 500,000 American women each year. That's more than the next seven main causes of death, including all forms of cancer, combined.

Locally, North Mississippi Medical Center-Iuka wants area residents to be informed. "In 2003, we treated more than 150 patients with cardiac chest pain that resulted in either a hospital

admission or the emergency transfer directly to a cardiologist at another hospital," said Jennifer Dawson, a certified registered nurse practitioner with the NMMC-Iuka Emergency Department. "Many of these patients were transferred by helicopter due to the severity of their condition."

"Because 'chest pain' is the chief complaint of Emergency Department patients, we have developed a chest pain protocol that includes an EKG, labwork, X-ray, oxygen, and certain other medications for evaluation and rapid treatment," Dawson said. "Many new treatments such as clot-busting drugs can save heart tissue but can only be used at the onset of the problem. Once damage has occurred from a heart attack, scar

tissue forms which cannot regenerate. It is imperative to seek help quickly."

Consider these facts:

- Cardiovascular disease killed 931,108 Americans (men and women) in 2001.
- Other major causes of death were cancer - 553,768; accidents - 101,537; Alzheimer's disease - 53,852; and HIV - 14,175.
- Cardiovascular disease is the number 3 cause of death for children under age 15.
- Mississippi had the highest death rate by state for total cardiovascular disease in 2000.
- One in four adults had high blood pressure, or hypertension.
- More than 65 percent of Americans are overweight.
- Smoking has declined by over 40 percent since 1965, but 3.2 million Americans tried their first cigarette in 1997; 2.3 million of these new smokers were ages 12-17.
- At age 40, the lifetime risk of developing congestive heart failure for women is one in five.
- 70 percent of women diagnosed with congestive heart failure (CHF) may die within eight years without treatment.
- Only 25 percent of women with peripheral artery disease are undergoing treatment.
- This year, an estimated 700,000 Americans will have an acute coronary attack; about 1/2 million will be recurrent.

These and other frightening statistics all report the same message: Americans should learn to seek better treatments and prevention methods.

Prevention includes eating healthy, exercising, keeping your cholesterol levels and blood pressure in check, smok-

ing cessation, and maintaining a healthy weight. It is also very important to know your family history of heart disease to fully understand your risk. For example, if your mother and father have heart disease, it is highly likely that you will, too.

Because heart disease affects so many local residents, NMMC-Iuka will soon be offering cardiac rehabilitation services. The cardiac rehab unit will be located in the physical therapy area and managed by Kristi Reece, RN, with Stephanie Magee, physical therapist, and Dr. Douglas Palenschat coordinating care. Anyone who may need cardiac rehabilitation, including those with CVDs, should discuss this treatment option with their physician and call 423-6051 for more information.

Don't forget to wear red on Feb. 6 to show your support for all the women who have died or who are suffering with heart disease.

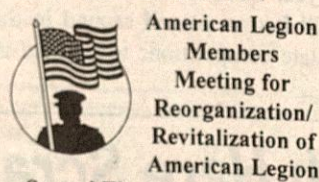

## GOING OUT ON A LIMB

To provide a harsh deterrent to anyone considering cutting down a tree other than one of his or her own, in nearly every state a person who intentionally injures someone else's tree is liable to the owner for two to three times the amount of actual monetary loss. This should make someone think twice about cutting limbs of a large tree that hangs on his or her yard when the trunk is on the neighbor's property. A tree whose trunk stands wholly on the land of one person belongs to that person. If it stands partly on the land of two or more people, it is called a boundary tree and, in most cases, belongs to all the property owners.

## Effects Of Thumbsucking

Because the jawbone of children under 8 are still and pliable, thumbsucking reshapes the jawbone and the teeth to grow out alignment. The upper teeth will flare out and upward, and the lower teeth will move inward. This condition is called open bite because there is a space between the upper and lower front teeth when the back teeth come together.

Long-term thumbsucking may also affect the growth of the child's palate, which leads to poor tongue placement and problems with chewing, swallowing and speaking.

## Color Blindness - Mostly Male Problem

The term color-blindness is often applied to people who, strictly speaking, do not suffer color blindness. Only a few individuals actually see the world entirely in black and white. In most cases, the problem is a color deficiency which makes it difficult to recognize certain color shades.

The commonest type of color problem is the one which uses all three primary colors, but in wrong proportions. Another type is the person who only sees two of the three primary colors. Such as individuals will be either red blind, green blind, or, extremely rare cases, blue blind.

It is a genetic defect which occurs primarily in men. Sixteen times as many men as women suffer from this form of color blindness. While there is no known cure, all is not hopeless. Some interesting work has been done with filters and tinted contact lenses which often help individual discrimination between colors.

## CARPE DIEM

The term "devil's advocate" comes from church history and referred to the person the church would appoint to search out any defects in the life of an individual who was being considered for sainthood. This process was simply a precaution against the selection of an unworthy person for this important recognition. The role came to be called the "devil's advocate" because Satan was not considered to be a friend of saints. Today, the term may refer to anyone who argues the unpopular side of an issue. 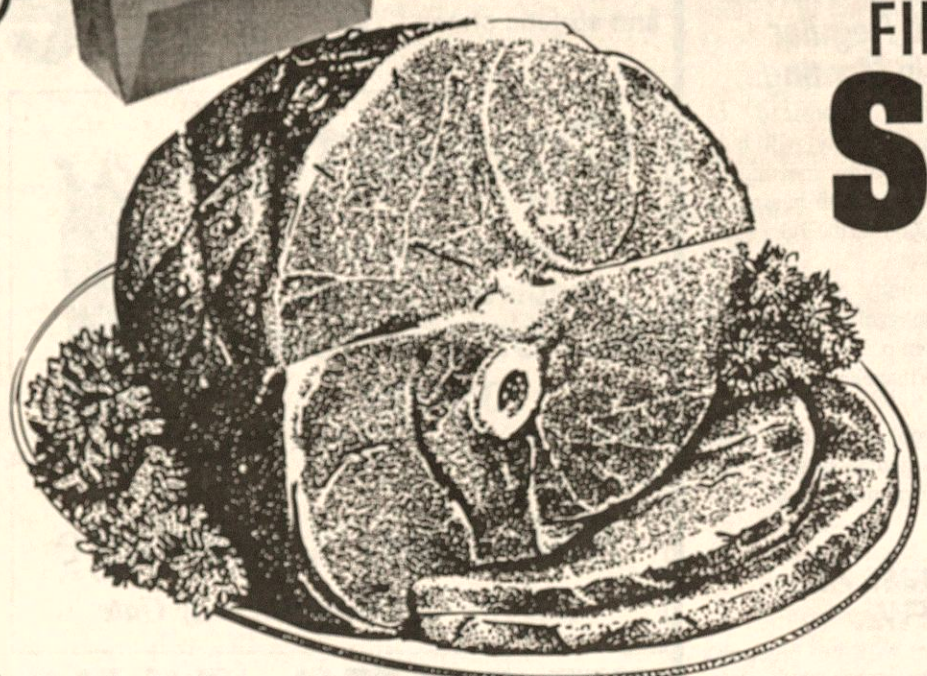

Mama Whit's trademark is wearing a beautiful hat each Sunday morning, and, in her honor, several women in the congregation wore hats. The pastor, Jim Holcomb, had Mama Whit stand while everyone sang "Happy Birthday" and when the choir came in many ladies had on hats. But, the most special time was when the kids from Children's Church came in. All the little girls had on hats. Gail Cutshall, Chil-

dren's Church Director, asked Mama Whit to join them down front as she talked about the testimony Mama Whit lives every day.

Sunday afternoon, Mama Whit's daughter and son-in-law, Bess and Pete Hayes along with her grandchildren and their spouses, Donna and Earl Solomon, Rebekah and Lonnie Fedrick and John and Regina Young and great granddaughter and husband, Beth and Gary Carden, hosted a birthday party in the fellowship hall.

Mama Whit wants to thank everyone for the gifts and well wishes and for making her 90th birthday the most special one she's ever had.

## The "Father Of Black History Month" Carter Godwin Woodson

Carter Godwin Woodson was born on December 19, 1875, at New Canton, Va. He was an American historian who first opened the long neglected field of black studies to scholars and also popularized the field in the schools and colleges of blacks. To focus attention on black contributions to civilization, he founded Negro History Week in 1926. This celebration and remembrance would later evolve into Black History Month.

Carter was born of a poor family. He supported himself by working in the coal mines of Kentucky and was thus unable to enroll in high school until he was 20. After graduating less than two years, he taught high school, wrote articles, studied at home and abroad, and received his Ph.D from Harvard University (1912). In 1915 he founded the Association for the study of Negro Life and History to encourage scholars to engage in the intensive study of the past as it related to Africans and their descendants through the world. Prior to this work, the field had been largely neglected or distorted in the hands of historians who accepted the traditionally biased picture of blacks in American and world affairs. In 1916 Woodson edited the first issue of the association's principal scholarly publication. *The Journal of Negro History*, which under this direction remained an important historical periodical for more than 30 years.

Woodson was dean of the

College of Liberal Arts and head of the graduate faculty at Howard University, Washington, D.C. (1919-20), and dean at West Virginia State College, institute, W.Va. (1920-22). While there, he founded and became president of Associated Publishers to bring out books on black life and culture, since experience had shown him that the usual publishing outlets were rarely interested in scholarly works on blacks.

Important works by Woodson include the widely consulted college text *The Negro in Our History* (1922: 10th ed., 1962); *The Education of the Negro Prior to 1861* (1915); and *A Century of Negro Migration* (1918). He was at work on a projected six-volume *Encyclopedia Africana* at the time of his death. Woodson died on April 3, 1950, in Washington, D.C.

Many people ask why

Black History Month is in February. It is not some conspiracy to designate the shortest month to our remembrance as some would think. It is also not in honor of Fredrick Douglas who was born in February. Woodson chose February because even though the 13th Amendment to the constitution was signed in January which abolished slavery. Slaves did not start to hear of the news until February. So that is why Woodson chose February. He could have chosen June when slaves in the Mid Western states got the word but that is a debate for another time.

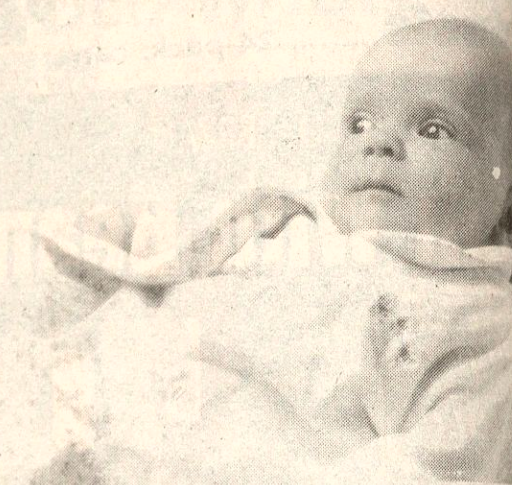

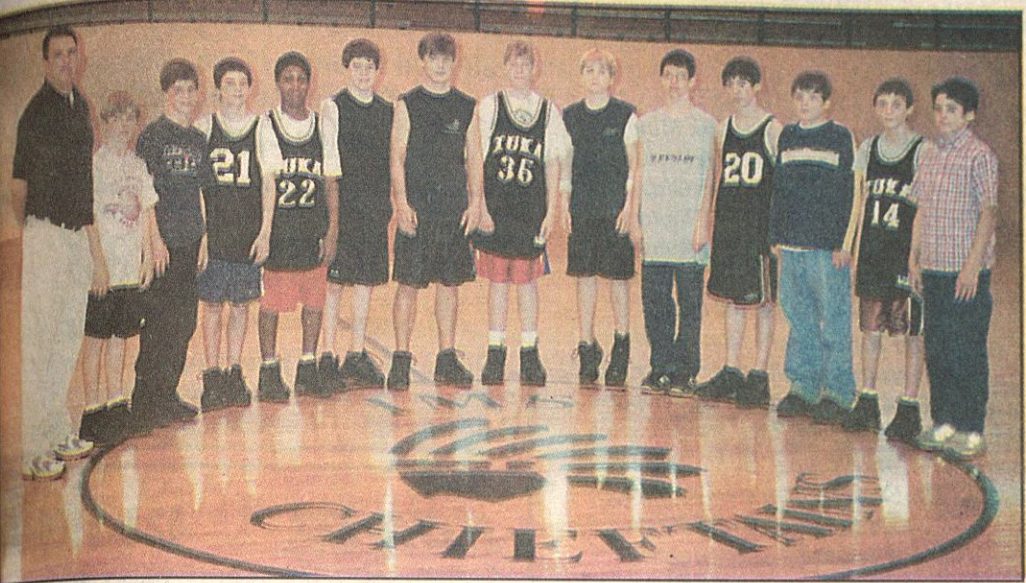
non Edmondson. These boys also won their county tournament last year as seventh graders.

## Summary Of Action Plans For Tishomingo County

Economic development requires a long-term and consistent effort. Three plans of action were developed to foster the comprehensive and long-term economic development of Tishomingo County. The plans of action will be updated and revised at least annually.

**Industry Assistance Plan**  
The Industry Assistance

Plan spells out specific actions to assist the county's existing industries to survive, expand, and prosper. Most new jobs come from businesses and industries that are already in the community. This plan includes a campaign to educate local industry management about technical assistance sources, incentives, and financing pro-

grams. Foundation staff will assist industry management in the identification and mitigation of impediments to industry growth, assist in the identification of potential new markets and customers, assist in the development of marketing programs, and other activities as needed by local industry. Recruitment of new industry is virtu-

ally impossible without an industry assistance plan.

### Small Business Development Plan

The Small Business Development Plan spells out specific actions to assist individuals in-

terested in going into business and to assist businesses that desire to expand in Tishomingo County. The Foundation will place greater emphasis on development and marketing of the tourism resources of Tishomingo County. The Foundation will identify gaps in services and goods and attempt to encourage local businesses and individuals to fill those gaps where possible. Recruitment of new businesses may be needed for some types of services and goods as long as this recruitment will not create competition for the county's existing businesses. The Foundation is studying other ways to create additional small business activity in Tishomingo County.

### Marketing Plan

The Marketing Plan spells out specific actions to market Tishomingo County to new industries. Telecommunications, warehousing, and distribution are also targeted. Other

categories of industries may be considered as opportunities arise. Priority is given to industries that may offer business opportunities to existing industries in Tishomingo County. The Marketing Plan proposes several activities to promote Tishomingo County. Partnerships and networking are vital. Other activities may include printed full-color marketing flyers and brochures, telephone and e-mail contacts, visits to industrial prospects and site selection consultants, Internet marketing, print advertising in

the Nashville and Memphis Business Journals, and other marketing activities as the budget allows.

Other activities of the Foundation will include a periodic newsletter for economic development partners; fostering of closer working relationships with county and municipal officials; and frequent networking and partnering with other economic development entities such as the Mississippi Development Authority, North Mississippi Industrial Development Association, Tennessee Valley Authority, Northeast Mississippi Community College, Northeast Mississippi Planning and Development District, MSU Extension Service, Mississippi Employment Security Commission, and others.

## Yarber Drug To Provide Critical On-Site Diabetes Screenings In February

As diabetes continues to spread at an alarming pace, Yarber Drug is offering an important screening to help identify people who may have, or be at risk for, the disease. Pharmacists and diabetes screeners will be on hand to educate consumers and help them better manage or prevent the onset of diabetes.

According to the American Diabetes Association, approximately 5.4 million Americans with diabetes are unaware that they have the disease. What's more, according to an article published in the January 2004 edition of the Journal of the American Medical Association, more than half of diabetics are obese and a high percentage also have high blood pressure. These factors may lead to complications. The good news is that diabetes can be controlled through diet and exercise.

Because red blood cells live for 90-120 days, this test tells how well-controlled blood sugar has been for the past 3-4 months. A finger stick blood sample is taken and measured, and within a few minutes the results are available.

"One of the most important services I can offer my patients is a simple test to screen for diabetes," said Bob Yarber, R.Ph., Owner. "Our pharmacy wants to identify those at risk for diabetes and encourage them to visit their physician. We want to teach consumers that nearly half the time, diabetes can be prevented through simple changes in diet and exercise."

The screenings will take place on February 20 from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at Yarber Drug located at 85 Main Street. Patients should call (662) 454-3371 to set up an appointment or schedule an appointment in-person during their next visit to the pharmacy. Pharmacists will be available to answer

patients' questions.

Yarber Drug has some answers to commonly asked questions about diabetes screenings:

### HOW DOES THE SCREENING WORK?

A patient's glucose level is determined by putting one drop of blood on to a test strip using a simple finger stick. A glucometer then reads the test strip and issues results immediately. Any patient tested that has a fasting glucose level over 200 will receive a second test to obtain his or her hemoglobin A1c levels. Another drop of blood is required for the HbA1c test. This drop of blood is put into an HbA1c test cassette and placed into the analyzer. The analyzer will run for 6 minutes.

### WILL THE SCREENING TELL ME IF I HAVE DIABETES?

No, the screening will not diagnose diabetes. It will help to indicate whether your blood levels indicate you may be at risk for diabetes. We encourage our patients to take their results to their local HealthCare provider.

### HOW LONG IS THE SCREENING?

The screening takes about ten minutes. However, the screening technician will also talk with you about your results and provide general education on diabetes.

### ARE APPOINTMENTS NECESSARY?

It is recommended that all patients make appointments. Pharmacies will accommodate walk-ins when/if an open time slot is available. This policy prevents patients from waiting in line and gives all participants the opportunity to receive complete interpretation of their results.

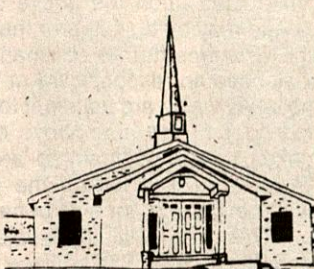

## MS National Guard 1st Calvary Division Unit Activated

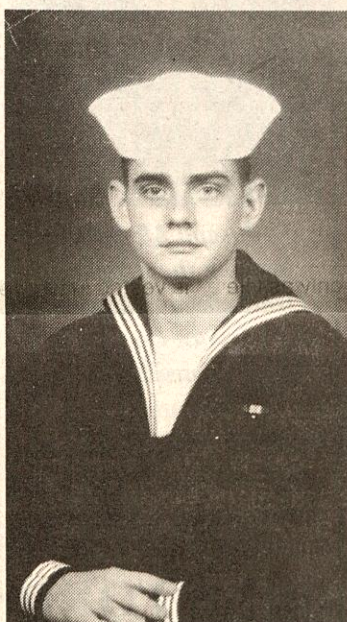

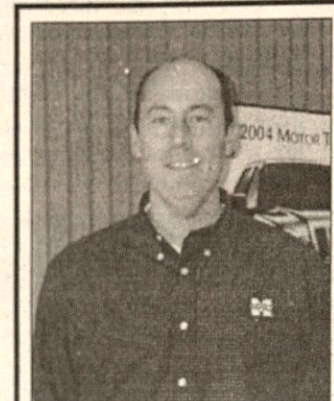
