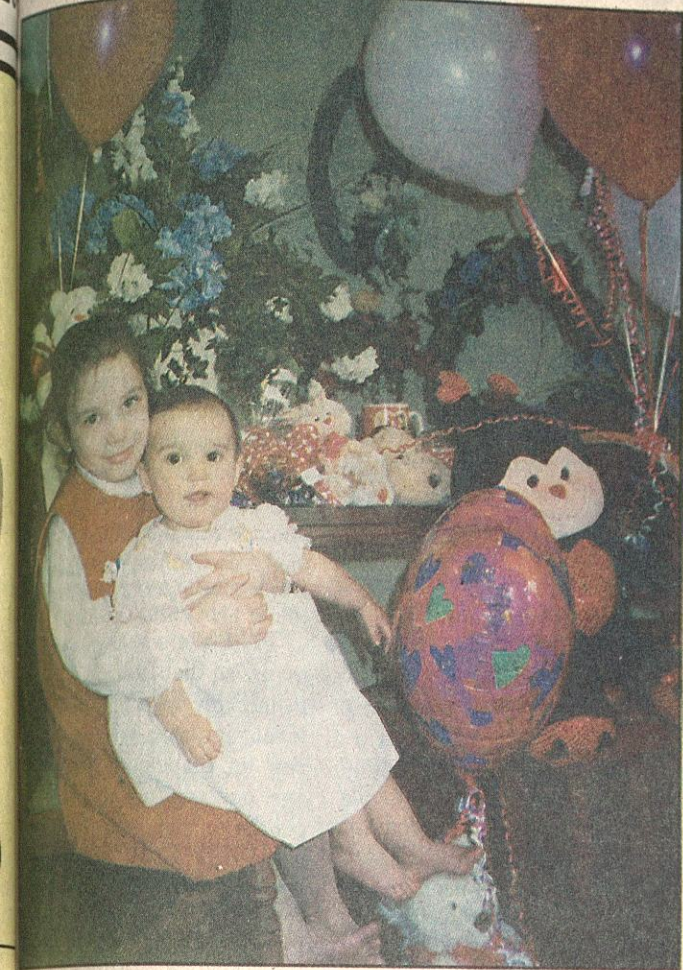

Iuka Man Arrested On Burglary Charges

An Iuka man who was just recently released from prison where he was serving time for burglary and larceny charges has now been arrested and charged for more of the same.

According to Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer, the suspect, Johnny S. Lambert, 32, of Iuka, was arrested on Sunday, Feb. 8, and has been charged with burglary and larceny of a church--St. Mary Catholic Church, located on Airport St. in Iuka. He has also been charged with grand larceny in the theft of some diamond rings taken from another residence in Iuka, Stringer stated.

Chief Stringer said that Sister Bernadette Englehardt reported the break-in at St. Mary's Iuka Police Department officers on Wednesday morning, Feb. 4. When the officers arrived, they found that a window had been

broken out. Also, one door had been kicked completely off the hinges, several filing cabinets had been pried in to and a desk had been vandalized.

Taken from the church was a DVD/Video Cassette Recorder combination. Chief Stringer said that the dollar amount of damage to the church was much more than the cost of the item taken.

In the second theft, the estimated dollar amount of the rings taken from the Iuka residence was approximately \$1,500, according to the owner.

Chief Stringer said that thanks to the joint effort between his department and the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, Lambert was arrested during the early morning hours Sunday.

Stringer stated that Lambert is also a suspect in two other

local break-ins--one at Iuka Mini-Storage and one at El Picante Mexican Restaurant. Lambert is also wanted for questioning by authorities in Lee County regarding some stolen money, Stringer stated.

Tishomingo County Parole Officer with the Mississippi Department of Corrections Melinda Whited said that Lambert had been released from prison in October of 2003 after serving time on burglary and larceny convictions. She said he will be returned to prison on parole violations. Also, he will have to go to court on these latest charges which could add additional time.

Presently, Lambert is being held in the Tishomingo County Jail in Iuka on two bonds--a \$10,000 for Iuka Police Department and a \$10,000 Grand Jury bond. Also, he has a hold for the Department of Corrections.

Tishomingo County's Ricky Cummings Named Chair of Mississippi's County Affairs Committee

During the 2004 session of the Mississippi Legislature, our own Tishomingo County Representative Ricky Cummings will serve as the Chairman of the prestigious County Affairs Committee.

The County Affairs committee handles all kinds of pertinent affairs that deal with all local entities of government business. Last year, laws dealing with crime prevention, historic cemeteries, use of prison labor, allocation of some highway funds, disposition of lost, stolen, abandoned, or misplaced personal property, authorization of counties to alter and clean public and private property, setting of fees by circuit clerk's, preparation and maintenance of school bus parking and Headstart turn around locations and pads, the increase of patrol officers salaries, public work contracts,

revisions of fees for marshals and constables, and the purchase of new voting machines were just a few of the many matters considered by the County Affairs Committee.

Tishomingo County Chancery Clerk Hayden Ables said that this appointment is one of the top appointments in the state and that being named is an honor not only for Cummings but also for Tishomingo County. "Having Ricky named as chairman of this committee is very advantageous to Tishomingo County and the surrounding areas in our state. We certainly are proud of Cummings' appointment."

Tishomingo County Circuit Clerk, Donna Dill, also added that having Ricky Cummings as the head of the County Affairs committee is good for us here in Tishomingo County. Ricky serves our county as a

direct link to the affairs in Mississippi government.

In the Mississippi House of Representatives, Cummings was also named as a member of the important Ways & Means Committee; the Judiciary B Committee; the Ports, Harbors & Airports Committee, and the Tourism Committee.

Cummings served as a Tishomingo County Supervisor for two terms, 1987 - 1995, before being elected as a member of the Mississippi House of Representatives in 1996.

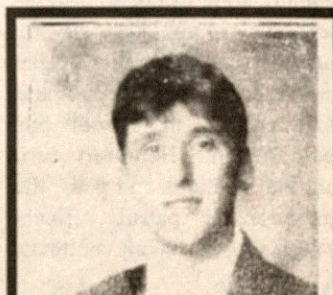

Junior's First Glasses

Here are some hints for selecting Junior's first pair of glasses. Who's wearing what in the world of music, movies and television? Picking styles worn by favorite stars means excitement and anticipation at the prospect of glasses. Encourage your child to pick what he likes. Chances are he'll wear glasses he's chosen himself.

Choose well balanced, well built frames that will stand up to the kind of rough and ready treatment a young child can be expected to inflict. Look for spring hinge construction at the temples for added strength and durability. If possible, when purchasing glasses, buy two pair. Children are notorious for losing, leaving, sitting on and breaking glasses.

Shop value. High quality frames can be expected to stay securely in place, hold their adjustment, fit properly and look good over a long period of time. A good manufacturer's guarantee is your assurance of quality and value.

Any patient tested that fasted glucose level over will receive a second test to obtain his or her hemoglobin A1c levels. Another drop of blood is required for the HbA1c test. This drop of blood is placed into an HbA1c test cassette. The analyzer will run for 6 minutes. WILL THE SCREENING TELL ME IF I HAVE DIABETES?

No, the screening will not diagnose diabetes. It will only indicate whether your blood sugar levels indicate you may be at risk for diabetes. We encourage our patients to take the results to their local health care provider.

HOW LONG IS THE SCREENING?

The screening takes about ten minutes. However, the screening technician will talk with you about your results and provide general education on diabetes.

ARE APPOINTMENTS NECESSARY?

It is recommended that patients make appointments. Pharmacies will accommodate walk-ins when/if an open slot is available. This prevents patients from waiting in line and gives all participants the opportunity to receive a complete interpretation of their results.

Q. Why is it important to replace a missing tooth?

A. Throughout the life of a tooth, teeth are lost for a variety of reasons, including cavities, gum disease, wear, roots and accidents. When a tooth is lost, the bone previously surrounded by the tooth root resorbs, or shrinks away. This process is called muscle atrophy that occurs from lack of use.

Missing teeth compromise your eating, speech and appearance. The loss in the front of your mouth can result in a visible defect in the bone that is difficult to camouflage, affecting the appearance of your smile and your self-confidence. Missing teeth in the back of your mouth lead to collapse of your bite, affecting the appearance of your face, your ability to chew, and the health of the remaining teeth. Complete tooth loss results in facial structure collapse as the jaw deteriorates over time.

Absentee Ballots Now Available For March 9, 2004 Presidential Preference Democratic Primary

Donna Henry Dill, Circuit Clerk, announces that absentee ballots are now available for the March 9, 2004, Presidential Preference Democratic Primary. This election will be for the Democratic nominee only for President of the United States. There will be no Republican Primary held.

The candidates appearing on this ballot are: Wesley Clark, Howard Dean, John Edwards, John F. Kerry, Dennis Kucinich, Lyndon LaRouche, Al Lieberman, and Al Sharp.

All eligible absentee voters may cast their ballots in the

Circuit Clerk's Office through Saturday, March 6, 2004, which is the last day to vote an absentee ballot. The office will be open 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, and 8 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturday, February 28th and March 6th for those wishing to vote an absentee ballot. If you will need an absentee ballot mailed to you, you may call 423-7026 to request your application and ballot.

The following categories of registered voters are eligible to cast absentee ballots in Mississippi elections:

1. Members of the Armed

Forces or spouses or dependents of such members.

2. Members of the Merchant Marines or the American Red Cross, or spouses or dependents of such members.

3. Disabled war veterans who are patients in any hospital, or spouses or dependents of such veterans.

4. Civilians attached to any branch of the Armed Forces, the Merchant Marines, or the American Red Cross and serving outside the United States, or spouses or dependents of such civilians.

5. Persons temporarily residing outside the territorial limits of the United States and the District of Columbia.

6. Students, teachers, or administrators whose employment or studies necessitate their absence from their county of voting residence, or the dependent or spouse who maintains a common domicile outside the county of voting residence with such student, teacher, or administrator.

7. Persons who will be outside their county of residence on election day.

8. Persons required to be at work on election day during the times at which the polls will be open.

9. Persons temporarily or permanently physically disabled.

10. Persons sixty-five (65) years of age or older.

11. Parents, spouses, or

dependents of persons having a temporary or permanent physi-

cal disability who are hospitalized outside their county of residence or more than fifty (50) miles away from their residence if the parents, spouses, or dependents will be with such persons on election day.

12. Members of the Mississippi Congressional delegation, or spouses or dependents of such members.

Procedure for Absentee Balloting

1. Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-625 et. seq. (1972) contains several requirements for absentee voting. These requirements include:

- Absentee ballot applications shall be furnished by the Circuit Clerk to a person upon the oral or written request of the elector who seeks to vote by absentee ballot;

- The parent, child, spouse, sibling, legal guardian, those empowered with a power of attorney for the elector's affairs, or agent of the elector may orally request an application on behalf of the elector;

- An absentee ballot application must have the seal for the registrar affixed to it and be initiated by the registrar or deputy registrar in order to be utilized to obtain an absentee ballot;

- A reproduction of an absentee ballot application shall not be valid unless it is a reproduction provided by the office of the registrar of the jurisdiction in which the election is being held and which contains the original seal and initials of the registrar or deputy registrar;

- Third parties procuring applications for others must complete and sign a new section of the applications designated "Certificate of Delivery" on each application the third parties are procuring, identifying themselves and the voters for whom they are acquiring the applications;

- If the third party person acquiring an application for a voter cannot read or write, the Circuit Clerk or deputy clerk must complete the form "Request for Absentee Ballot Application by Third Person";

- Any voter who is blind, temporarily or permanently physically disabled, or cannot read or write, is entitled to request and receive assistance in the marking of his/her ballot. The voter may have the assistance of anyone except his/her employer, an agent of the voter's employer, or an officer or agent of the voter's union.

- Any person who provides assistance is required to sign and complete the "Certificate of Person providing Voter Assistance" on the absentee ballot envelope disclosing the date and time assistance was

provided and family relationship to the voter (if any).

- A candidate whose name appears on the ballot cannot be an attesting witness for an absentee ballot.

2. **Voting in the Circuit Clerk's Office:** All eligible absentee voters may cast their ballots in the Circuit Clerk's Office by completing the appropriate application form in the Circuit Clerk's Office.

3. **Voting by Mail:** Eligible absentee voters may request an absentee ballot by calling the Circuit Clerk's Office at 423-7026, if they will not be able to come to the Circuit Clerk's Office to vote because they are:

A. Temporarily residing outside the county;

B. Temporarily or permanently physical disabled;

C. Sixty-five (65) years of age or older; or,

D. The parents, spouses, or dependents of temporarily or permanently physically disabled persons who are hospitalized outside of their counties of residence or more than fifty (50) miles away from their residences if the parents, spouses, or dependents will be with such persons on election day.

Once you request the absentee ballot, an application will be mailed to you. You must complete this application and mail it back to us. When we receive your completed application, an absentee ballot will be mailed to you.

Applications and absentee ballot envelopes must be notarized or sworn and subscribed to by another official authorized to witness absentee balloting. However, applications and ballot envelopes of the temporarily or permanently disabled are not required to be notarized but must be witnessed and signed by a person eighteen (18) years of age or older. This person does NOT have to be a registered voter.

HAND DELIVERY OF ABSENTEE BALLOTS PROHIBITED

It is illegal to hand deliver absentee ballots in Mississippi. Unless an absentee ballot is be-

ing properly voted in the Circuit Clerk's Office, it must be mailed by the Circuit Clerk to the voter and the voter must return the voted absentee ballot by mail to the Circuit Clerk. (Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-735 (1972)).

ACT To Be Given On April 3rd Registration Deadline Is February 27th

College-bound high school students can take the ACT Assessment on April 3, 2004, the next nationwide test date. The registration postmark deadline is February 27. Late registration postmark deadline is March 12 (an additional fee is required for late registration).

The ACT Assessment is an achievement test in English, reading, math and science. It measures what students have learned in high school, and the

skills required for success in college. It is not an aptitude test. Some students find it more comfortable than an aptitude test because it reflects their high school curriculum. The ACT was administered more than 2 million times last year.

Important tips - Students who have already taken the ACT can take it again and try for a higher score. Juniors can use their scores to examine academic weaknesses, take courses to correct those weaknesses and re-take the exam as seniors. Students who take the exam more than once can report only their highest composite score to prospective colleges if they choose.

Owners Of S&S Satellite Sentenced In Federal Court

Edwin L. Worthington, Special Agent in Charge of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) in Mississippi, and Jim M. Greenlee, United States Attorney for the Northern District of Mississippi at Oxford, issued the following statement concerning the sentencing of an Iuka family for selling illegal satellite television access cards:

Following the completion of a long-term investigation by the Jackson Division of the FBI, with assistance from both Direct TV and Dish Network, three residents of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, have pled guilty to felonies and were sentenced last week for satellite piracy.

On October 28, 2003, Robert Calvin "Sonny" Scott, Jr., 58, his son, Robert Calvin "Scotty" Scott, III, 37, and Donna W. Scott, 59, wife of Sonny Scott, pled guilty to violating Title 47, United States Code, Section 605 (e) (4), Sale of Illegally Decrypted Electronic Devices used primarily in the theft of satellite television services. Specifically, the subjects were involved in the illegal sale of modified Direct TV and Dish Network satellite access cards.

On January 29, 2004, Robert Scott Jr. and Robert Scott, III were sentenced in United States District Court for

the Northern District of Mississippi, in Oxford. Robert Scott, III was sentenced to sixteen months in jail and a three-year term of supervised release. Robert Scott, Jr. was sentenced

to two months in jail and a three-year term of supervised release. Donna Scott was sentenced on an earlier date to months of house arrest and three years probation.

FBI Special Agent in Charge Worthington said, "The United States economy depends, in large part, on intellectual property, and investigations like this illustrate the commitment of the FBI and United States Attorney's Office to protect that property and prosecute its violators as vigorously as we investigate and prosecute subjects who physical assets, such as in robberies or cases of computer fraud." U. S. Attorney Greenlee stated: "These are repeat offenders, having been convicted at a jury trial by our office for the same offenses back in 1999 based on a similar FBI investigation. Such recidivists will always be investigated and prosecuted by our offices."

The latest case was investigated by the Tupelo Resident Agency of the FBI and prosecuted by Assistant U. S. Attorneys John Marshall Alexander and David A. Sanders of Iuka.
