Raymond Vick, a former law enforcement officer who at one time resided in Burnsville, received a 17-year sentence for drug possession and burglary and larceny of a pharmacy in Burnsville.

Judge Paul Funderburk sentenced Vick on Tuesday, February 24, 2004, in Prentiss County Circuit Court to 24 years with seven suspended, and five years of post release supervision after he pled guilty to three charges: possession of cocaine in Tishomingo County, burglary and larceny in a commercial building in Prentiss County, and possession of morphine with intent to distribute in Tishomingo County. In actuality, Vick received 35 years with 18 suspended, leaving 17 to serve on three charges (three were retired from the files). His time on all three charges will run concurrently.

Vick was also ordered to pay \$211 to the DA's Bad Check Unit for a bad check in Warm County. That charge was retired in exchange for Vick's plea. Vick was also ordered to pay restitution of \$2,366 to Gary Hardy of the Greenville Community Pharmacy for drug theft and \$125 to the Tupelo Crime Lab. Vick faced charges of possession of Oxycodone, more than 14 dosage units but less than 28 in Tishomingo County. That charge was reduced from possession of Oxycodone with intent to distribute. He was charged with attempted jail escape in Prentiss County. This charge was reduced to misdemeanor jail escape. The one-year sentence was suspended, but he was also ordered to pay court costs.

Wick, at one time employed in law enforcement in Prentiss County, in Tippah County, and in the City of Olive Branch, was working in law enforcement at the time he committed the crimes. This case was investigated by the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics.

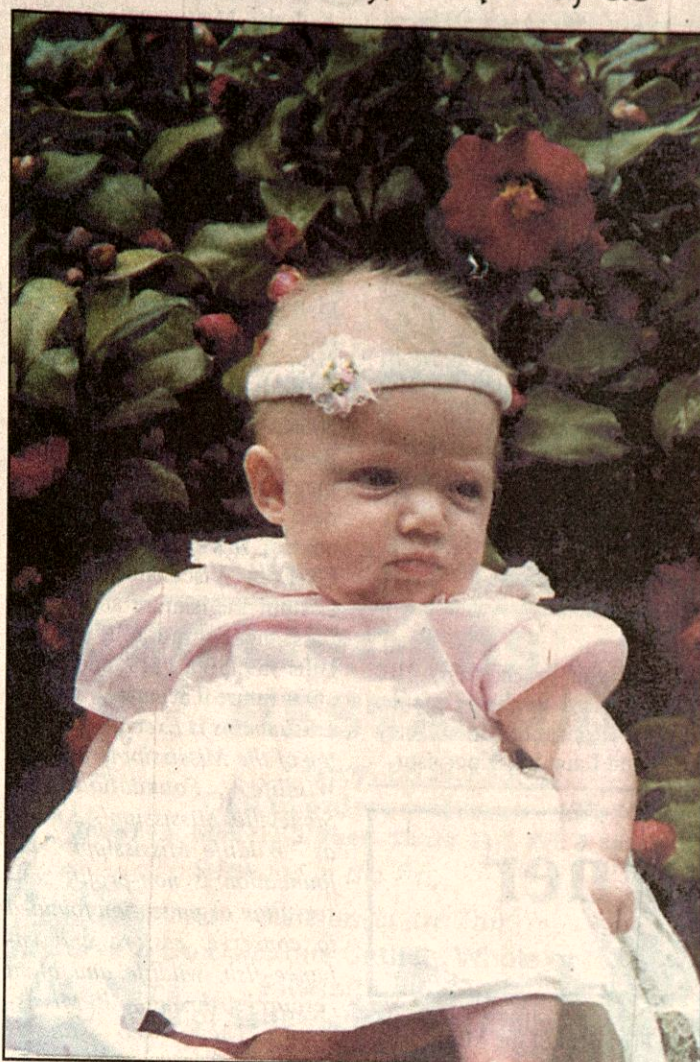

Perry Mask, of Tishomingo County, is being sought in connection with the Sunday morning, February 29, shooting of Charles Anthony Bascombe, 47, of 532 CR 300, Corinth, MS.

Bascombe was shot in the back while he was sitting in his car on County Road 306 about 11:00 a.m. Sunday near Corinth. Bascombe, who was critically injured was airlifted from the scene and flown to North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo, where he remained in critical condition on Monday.

Perry Mask, who has been wanted by authorities in Alcorn, Tishomingo, and Hardin County, TN, on charges of auto theft and other property crimes, is being sought in connection with the shooting.

Mask is a 35-year old white male, who is six feet tall, and who weighs 160 pounds. He has blond hair and brown eyes. He may have altered his hair color.

According to authorities, in the past, Mask has allegedly used other people to help him allude authorities, and these authorities are warning people to be on the lookout for Mask. Authorities stress that anyone who helps Mask can be charged with accessory after the fact.

Anyone who might have information concerning the whereabouts of Mask is asked to call the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department at 662-423-7000 or the Alcorn County Sheriff's Department at 662-286-5521 or Crime Stoppers at 1-800-TIPS (8477).

All registered voters of Tishomingo County are encouraged to go to the polls on Tuesday, March 9th, and vote for the candidate of your choice in the Democratic Presidential Preference Primary Election. This election will be for Presidential candidates only who are running on the Democratic ticket. A sample ballot is shown in this week's paper.

In the First Congressional District, George W. Bush has no opposition on the Republican ticket nor does Congressman Roger Wicker. Therefore, there will be no Republican Primary in this election.

In this election, because of the new **Help America Vote Act (HAVA)** which is a **federal law**, some 100 people in the county who have registered to vote by mail during the time period of January 1, 2004, through February 9, 2004, will be required to show some form of identification in order to vote a regular ballot. This identification can be any of the following six acceptable identifications as required by **FEDERAL** (not state) law. These forms of identi-

fication are:

1. A current and valid photo id (i.e., drivers license);
2. A current utility bill with the registrant's name and address;
3. A bank statement with the registrant's name and address;
4. A government check with the registrant's name and address;
5. A paycheck with the registrant's name and address; or,
6. Any other government document that shows the registrant's name and address.

The voters in the county who are affected by this law have been notified by mail of this requirement. If they do not show ID at the polling place, they can vote, but they will have to vote by an affidavit ballot. We are sorry for any inconvenience this may cause, however, because this is a **FEDERAL ELECTION**, we have to comply with **FEDERAL LAW**.

Conservation Corner

The Mississippi Legislature is considering a bill to allow the hunting of deer and other species of wildlife over bait. Management programs which provide available nutrition for wildlife through planting (e.g., food plots) is good; this bill does not affect them. Research has shown that food plots benefit wildlife through improved health. Furthermore, they provide the hunter and landowner an avenue to do something positive

for the benefit of a diversity of wildlife. Allowing the piling of bait can have harmful implications for wildlife. The passage of this bill would further deteriorate the tradition and sport of hunting. Today we face increasing attacks from the animal rights community that do not approve of hunting. The passing of this bill will play right into their hands. According to Jimmy D. Taylor II, a Research Wildlife Biologist

and President of the Mississippi Chapter of the Wildlife Society, "Baiting can cause biological problems for wildlife. The increased density of animals at, or in the vicinity of, bait sites will increase the likelihood of disease transmission. The risk of disease transmission directly

from the bait is well documented, as target and non-target wildlife ingest wet, moldy or fungus infected grain or other feedstuffs. These events could have dramatic

negative impacts on populations that wildlife biologists and sportsmen have worked so hard to restore and conserve. All of this is evermore important today, in light of our lack of knowledge of emerging wildlife diseases such as Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD). If you don't think this is serious, just ask a deer hunter in Southwest Wisconsin where there is an effort to kill 25,000 deer in that part of the state to halt a fatal outbreak of CWD. Experts say there is no evidence that CWD can infect humans, but the World Health Organization advises people not to eat any part of a deer with the infection. And venison is a large part of many Mississippians' diet. Officials with the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks and the Mississippi Board of Animal Health are continuing efforts to monitor and begin proactive steps to prevent the disease. Currently, CWD has not been diagnosed in Mississippi.

"Preparations are being made to develop a CWD surveillance and monitoring plan for these cervids in Mississippi," former State Whitetail Deer Coordinator Larry Castle said. Castle said that the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources banned all supplemental feeding and baiting of deer as a preventive measure to control the further spread of CWD in Wisconsin. The Mississippi Legislature should not pass the baiting bills (House Bills 359, 500, 1019, and 1044) . Our future is at state. James L. What Kind of Bifocals?

Bifocals are the choice of people who require two separate corrections - one for distance and the other for near vision. The sensible alternative is carrying two pairs of glasses and changing them constantly. What degree magnification is desired? The power of the segment can be selected any distance desired, often it is set for distance, but it need not be. It can be made for so close as eight to ten inches for very precise work or for thirty inches to the dashboard of an airplane. But it cannot provide focus at both distances. Train Traveling Through Iuka Catches on Fire

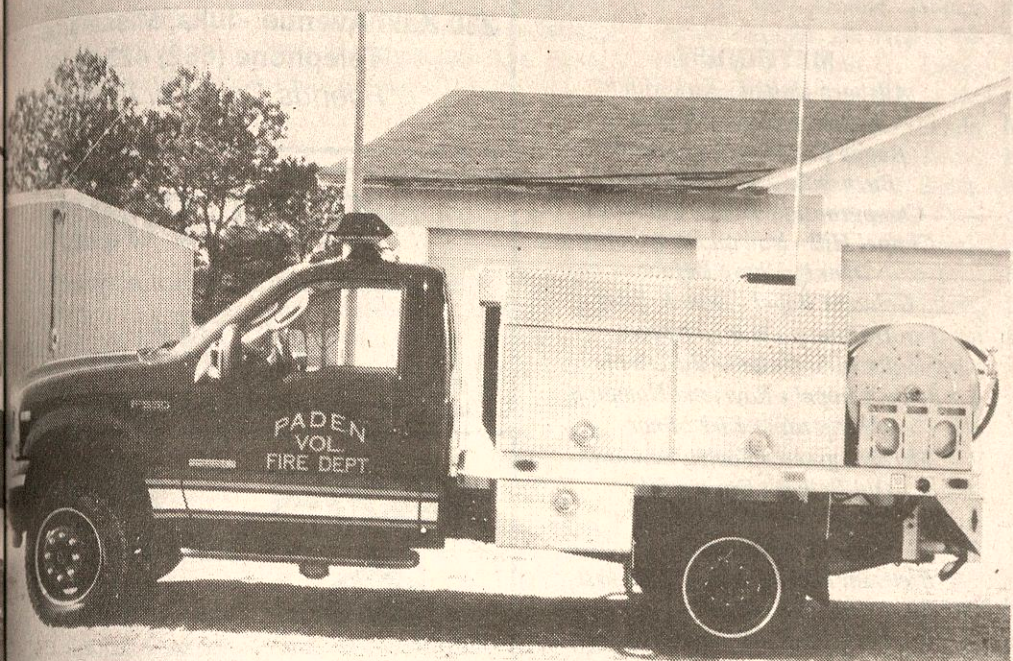

Hard-Tissue Laser May Replace Dentist's Needle And Drill Your Kids May Never "Fear" Going To The Dentist

No shots? No drills? No numb lips? This can't be dentistry...can it?!

Actually, thanks to technology, it can. Dentists are now wielding lasers to seek and destroy cavities. And get this: It doesn't hurt.

"Ninety-eight percent of the fillings we can do without anesthesia," said Dr. L. Don Wilson of Family Dental Care in Florence, Alabama, who uses multiple lasers in his practice.

One half of the American public does not visit the dentist. This is often due to "FEAR." People may grow up equating the dentist with "PAIN." Today, however, laser dentistry is helping to change this phenomenon.

With laser dentistry there can be much less anxiety since there is no anesthesia used in most cases; which can mean no shot and no drill either. Laser technology lets the dentist work with light energy and allows for small preparations. The laser does not cause microfractures of the tooth structure and sterilizes as it works. It also creates an ideal surface for bonding, and is generally painless and stress free.

"There can be less interruption of a child's routine, or an adult's schedule, since there is no numb lip for laser patients to contend with afterward," said Wilson. "The laser lets us do a filling, and the patient can even eat if they want to, right after leaving our office."

Soft-tissue lasers have been used in dentistry for over ten years to trim gums and growth around the mouth. But these soft-tissue lasers couldn't replace the use of needles and drills for fillings. Hard-tissue lasers, emerging from Japan about six years ago, however, are making this dental dream a reality. Hard-tissue lasers use

light to scan for water in the tooth, the excess of which indicates disease in the structure.

The laser is invisible; patients don't have to listen to the grinding sound of a drill.

Dr. Joe M. Cromwell of Savannah, Tennessee, recently added a DELight laser, manufactured by HOYA ConBio of Santa Clara, California, to his office.

"We recognized the potential the laser could bring to our practice," said Cromwell. "The comfort of our patients, especially our little ones, is important to us, and this no shot, no drill option makes it easier than ever."

Wilson and Cromwell are members of a small but growing group of dentists across the nation who have added the hard-tissue laser to their practice.

Wilson said lasers are the future of dentistry and will soon replace needles and drills, just like pulley-driven drills were replaced by high-powered electric drills in the 1950s.

Cromwell said, aside from the psychological benefits, a laser is more precise than a drill. It removes only the diseased part of the tooth. A drill bores out healthy tissue as well. Additionally, the surface of the tooth is better prepared to hold the adhesive that bind the filling to the tooth. A laser leaves behind a rough, dimpled surface, whereas a drilled tooth is smoother and doesn't allow for as strong of a bond.

Cromwell said that much of the public is still unaware that fillings by laser are possible. "We hope to educate more of the community so they can benefit from no-anesthesia dentistry."

"Safety is always a big concern for patients, especially parents," Cromwell added. "And part of educating the public is to also dispel misconceptions about dental lasers."

Cromwell also explained that some people are concerned should the laser miss a tooth it could burn them; that's a common misconception. When the laser's wavelength is set for hard-tissue use, it only affects the tooth structure, leaving other parts of the mouth unaffected. The laser will not interact with gum tissue unless it is specifically set to do so by the

dentist. The beam of light emitted by the laser destroys only tooth decay, and cannot accidentally harm nor "burn" you as many people fear. In fact, it can even be moved back and forth across a hand at close range to demonstrate there are no adverse affects.

"Children are particularly receptive to the idea of replacing a shot and drill with something more pleasant," said Wilson. "They like to wear the

'cool glasses' used during treatments. We've been very pleased to note how much adding hard-tissue lasers to our practice has helped make our younger patients happier, and how that makes their parents happier too."

Wilson, who trains other dentists to use the hard-tissue lasers, said he has used the laser in over 9,000 cases. "Patients love it," he said. "Many people are afraid of the needle and

drill, and it keeps them away from good dental care. Lasers are helping us to overcome those fears."

Lasers allow children as well as adults, to be treated early and quickly. So, with proper education and training, laser dentists are creating a generation of patients who will have no fear of treatment to pass along to their children.

Health Briefs

Children May Try To Hide Learning Problems By Acting Up

The class clown or play-

ground bully might need a trip to the doctor rather than the principal's office.

"Behavior problems are often the first sign of an underlying developmental problem," said Dr. Sherry Vinson, an assistant professor of pediatrics at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston. "You can't be quick to blame it on behavior without checking out other possible concerns."

Children often attempt to hide a learning deficit through disruptive behavior, said Vinson, also a developmental pediatrician at Texas Children's

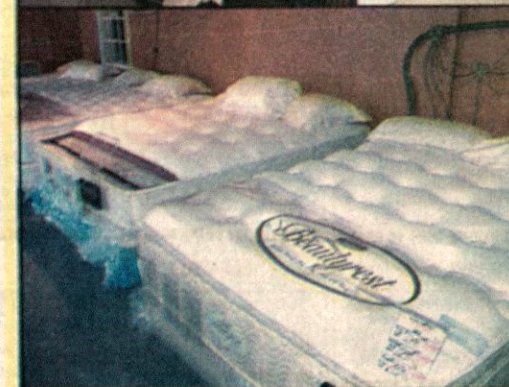
Hospital. Often, once a developmental problem is identified, it can be specifically addressed and the behavior problem lessens or disappears.

Some of the behavior problems are usually the first signs of developmental problems, such as tantrums, aggression, and activity, food refusal and withdrawal. The child might show self-aggression, or show signs of immaturity.

When behavioral problems appear, parents should be pediatrician and arrange psychoeducational testing
