Meth Lab Discovered And Shut Down In Tishomingo County

On Tuesday night, March 2, 2004, Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office Constable Jeff Kemp received a call around 11:30 p.m. concerning a possible meth lab at 12 CR 38, between Dennis and Belmont.

As a result of this call, two men were arrested and charged with manufacturing crystal meth, possession of firearms, and conspiracy to manufacture crystal meth. Arrested were Timothy Carr (J.T.) Carr, PO Box 95, Tishomingo, MS and Joel Kevin Gray, 23, CR 961, Tishomingo, MS.

Kemp and Tishomingo Police Officer, Leslie Adams answered the prowler call, and upon arrival at a burned-out residence with a 1-car garage nearby, they found two cars in the driveway.

The law enforcement officers pulled into the drive, got out, and approached the garage. As they were approaching, two men came out of the garage with flashlights in hand.

Upon questioning by Kemp, the men said they were at the residence because Gray had recently bought the property and was in the process of cleaning the garage. Kemp said that at this time he had noticed a pungent, but familiar odor coming from the garage.

When questioned, Gray said that there were some old propane tanks in the garage. When Kemp went into the garage, he found the meth lab consisting of gas cans, gallon jugs, and various chemicals.



Dangerous Goods - Common everyday items that can be bought locally are used in the assembly of a Crystal Meth Lab. Crystal Meth is a highly addictive drug and the lab is extremely explosive. If you suspect that there might be a lab in your area contact the sheriff's department.

According to Kemp, he immediately notified the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department and Investigators Donald Thomas and Jay Moyers were dispatched to the scene. Upon the arrival of Thomas and Moyers, they called the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics.

Sheriff Glenn Whitlock, who had been called by Thomas and Moyers, arrived on the scene to take control of the investigation that netted the physical contents of the lab, chemicals, a 1998 Camaro and a 1978 TransAm.

Sheriff Whitlock and the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics agent waited at the scene until about 7:30 a.m. the next morning on HAZ-MAT personnel out of Mobile, AL, to come to dismantle the lab.

According to Sheriff Whitlock, Carr and Gray are currently being held in the Tishomingo County Jail. Bond has been set for Gray at \$100,000; however, Carr has been denied bond by the District Attorney's office because he was out of jail on a similar felony charge.

Constable Jeff Kemp was quick to praise the fast, thorough backup and help he received from Investigators Thomas and Moyers, Sheriff Glenn Whitlock, and Tishomingo Police Assistant Chief Leslie Adams.

Sheriff Whitlock said the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department is constantly seeking ways to rid Tishomingo County of drugs. If you have any information, please call the SO at 423-7000.

Break-in At Paden Domes International, Inc. Solved By Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department

On Thursday, March 4, a break-in occurred at Domes International in Paden, MS. Domes International is located at 1402 N. Smith Street, Apt. 1, Booneville, MS 38829.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department Officer, Bruce Whited, something during the early morning hours the front glass door to the building was broken out to allow entry into the building.

During the investigation, Whited, along with Investigator Donald Thomas, found a large amount of blood splattered all over the building and on a

five-drawer filing cabinet that had been dragged to an exit. According to the factory authorities, this cabinet did contain a small amount of petty cash.

When further investigation on Friday morning indicated that someone had been stuck in a ditch in front of the building, Officer Whited canvassed the nearby area to question residents to see if anyone had seen or heard anything unusual during the night.

One of the Paden residents reported that a man had come to his door at approximately 3:00 a.m. and asked to use the phone. The man asked the resident to look up a number for him. The resident had written the phone number down so the

deputies were able to call the number, which turned out to be the number of a local wrecker service.

When contacted, the wrecker service was able to give the deputies the name of a person who had called to have his vehicle removed from the ditch in front of the building.

Prentiss County authorities were contacted, and they picked McVey up at his Booneville home and held him until Tishomingo County Deputy Scott Hyde could go after him.

McVey is currently out of jail on a \$10,000 bond on charges of breaking and entering a commercial building.

Shooting Suspect, Perry Mask, Now Wanted For Murder, Search Intensifies

An area-wide search continues by law officers for 35-year-old Perry Mask, of Burnsville, who is wanted in connection with the February 29th shooting death of a Corinth man.

The search for Mask intensified Thursday after murder charges were filed against him. The Alcorn County Sheriff's Department filed the charges after they were notified of the death of 47-year-old Charles Anthony Bascombe. Bascombe had been shot on Sunday and died at the North MS Medical Center in Tupelo on Thursday, March 4.

According to officials, Bascombe was shot in his left shoulder while sitting in his car on Alcorn County Road 306. Also in the car was Bascombe's stepson. It was reported that Mask and Bascombe had argued over a \$50.00 loan. An eyewitness said Mask left the scene in a maroon pickup, which has not been located.

According to Donald Thomas, an investigator with the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, the whereabouts of Mask eluded officials until an eyewitness reported seeing him on a 4-wheeler in Burnsville on Thursday morning.

The belief that Mask

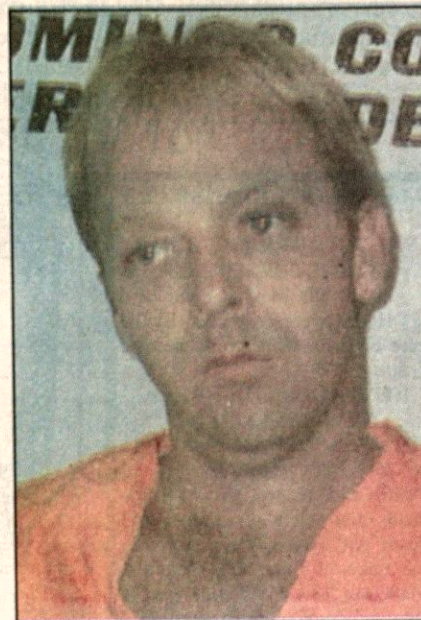
was in or near Burnsville was validated on Thursday afternoon, when Jerry Allred, of CR 214 (road behind Meeks' Grocery) reported that his maroon 1989 Chevrolet van had been stolen from his home (while he and a neighbor were standing in the yard). The van, apparently driven by Mask, was headed south on 214, in the Glen area.

Alcorn and Tishomingo County officers immediately began a search of the area south of Hwy. 72.

On Saturday morning, the maroon van was spotted by a National Guard helicopter. The van had been abandoned behind a vacant house on CR 352 in SE Alcorn County. The motor was cold and it appeared the suspect had left the van in a rush because the motor had been left running. The battery was dead but the radio would still play indicating that the van might have been abandoned as early as Thursday evening.

Search units from Tishomingo County, Alcorn County, the Department of Fish and Wildlife, and Search Canines and a National Guard helicopter hunted throughout the day Saturday to no avail.

A reward is being offered for any information leading to the arrest of Perry

Mask. All information will be kept strictly confidential and residents are reminded that anyone assisting the fugitive could be charged with accessory after the fact.

Perry Mask is described as a white male, six feet tall and weighing 160 pounds. He has blond hair and brown eyes.

Sheriff Whitlock reminds area residents to keep their doors and vehicles locked and do not let any strangers into your home. The suspect could be armed and dangerous. He says his department is working around the clock looking for the fugitive.

Iuka Police Officers Solve Case Involving Identity Theft

Iuka Police Department Officer Joseph Marlar and Captain Anita Mitchell have successfully resolved a two-year-old case involving the identity theft of an elderly Iuka resident.

According to Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer, a local woman had fraudulently obtained several credit cards using personal identification information she had gotten from an elderly Iuka man.

Chief Stringer said the woman had been making payments on the cards until recently. When a credit card company contacted the man about delinquent payments on the credit cards, he knew he did not have, he contacted the Iuka Police Department.

Officers Mitchell and Marlar were able to trace down the Iuka woman and question her about obtaining the cards without the permission of the victim. The officers were able to get the cards and find out the balances due. The officers, then, required her to pay the balances, in full.

"While the woman could have been charged for fraudulently obtaining and using the credit cards, the victim did not want to press charges as long as the balances on the cards were completely paid and the cards destroyed," according to Chief Stringer. Stringer urges anyone who might suspect identity theft to contact the Iuka Police Department at 423-6340.

Helen Nelson was born in Dennis, MS on December 7, 1921, and she was a member of the Iuka United Methodist Church. She graduated from Belmont High School in 1939 and went to work for the Draft Board in Iuka. She and her husband, Merle, owned and operated four businesses in Iuka. Miss Helen also kept the books for their four businesses including Mill Creek Boat Dock, Nelson's Marine, Nelson's Finance Company, and Nelson's Supermarket. She also enjoyed playing bridge, golf, and watching football. Her quick humor will be remembered by all her friends.

Funeral services are scheduled for 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, March 11, at Iuka United Methodist Church with Rev. Ed Temple and Rev. Franky Smith officiating. Burial will be in Oak Grove Cemetery. Cutshall Funeral Home in Iuka is in charge of the arrangements.

Survivors include her husband of 56 years, Merle Nelson; two sons, Steve and his wife Sheri, and Mike Nelson, all of Iuka; two brothers, Rufus "Dave" Davis of Selmer, TN, and Warren Davis of Memphis, TN; one sister, Dorothy Durance of Gastonia, NC; and three grandchildren, David, Stacey, and Mollie Nelson, all of Iuka.

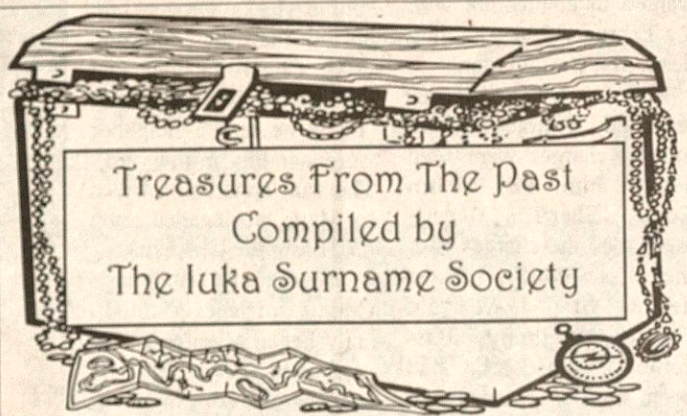

Correcting Astigmatism

Astigmatism usually occurs when the shape of the front of the eye is not oval but round. Why it happens is not known. Some theories say it is inherited, developmental. Still others blame such factors as poor lighting, or increased amounts of close work.

Astigmatism is most often corrected with prescription eyeglasses. Now, there are also contact lenses which are specially designed to match the special shape of an astigmatic eye. Which lenses are prescribed, depends on whether the astigmatism is usually a period of adjustment during which objects may look distorted, slanted or out of position. After that, vision is substantially improved.

The degree of astigmatism usually does not change rapidly, but gradual changes generally occur. This is particularly true for school age youngsters and older persons. If you are an optometrist, you can help your patients compensate for the change.

Q. What kind of toothbrush is best to use, manual or mechanical?

A. There are many excellent toothbrushes on the market today, both in the manual and mechanical or powered type. Dr. Sam Yankell, a researcher in this field for more than 40 years, states that used with the proper method and for a sufficient time either type of toothbrush is effective. There can be a vast amount of variability in the way patients hold the toothbrush, the brushing motion, and the amount of time the teeth are brushed.

Studies comparing the manual and powered toothbrush have shown, in general, the powered toothbrush to be more effective than the manual toothbrush if used for the same amount of time and under the same conditions.

The bottom line: Manual toothbrushes are very effective (with vastly improved designs) when used correctly and powered toothbrushes are great for patients who have limited dexterity, and motivation because they are not as technique sensitive.

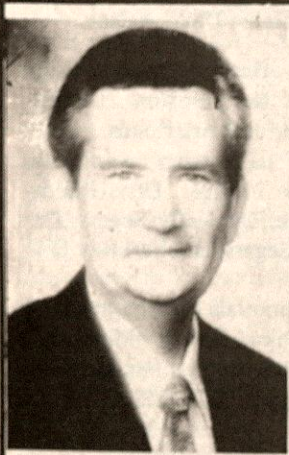

Fairfax Washington Saga Needs Closure

It's time to set the record straight! Fairfax Washington, 19 years old Confederate Ordinance Sgt., 38th Mississippi, died October 2, 1862 at the home of Rev. William McKnight after a leg amputation from wounds received in the Battle of Iuka, September 19, 1862.

Rev. McKnight was a circuit riding Methodist minister and a trustee of Snowden Methodist Church. His home was across Indian Creek bridge, facing Mineral Springs Park. He had protection papers from Federal officers for his family while Union forces were in Iuka. He got passes to go in and out of Union pickets. At times he boarded Union officers and they protected his property. He was paid for caring for a Federal Colonel. However, Rev. McKnight's claim for Civil War damages were repeatedly denied until finally after nine years of filing, the part he claimed for 273 cords of wood stacked by the Memphis and Charleston Railroad for use by wood burning trains was granted. His claim for pork, lard, coffee, soda, sugar, molasses, dried peaches, flour, salt and candles was denied.

Rev. McKnight buried Fairfax in his McKnight family plot in Oak Grove Cemetery where it remained unmarked until his sister Louisa Washington Bell, wife of Claiborne Bell, left provisions in her will, recorded in Harrison County, Mississippi in 1911, for a marker for Fairfax. The receipt for the purchase of the monument was from a monument company in Columbus, Mississippi.

A local citizen was granted permission to remove Fairfax's marker to be cleaned. It never made it back to the grave and wound up in Iuka's water company yard, then placed in Iuka Public Library and from there to Iuka's old courthouse

museum. If Fairfax's bones could speak, I'm sure they would have a very disturbing tale to tell. After all efforts to get the marker returned to the burial site failed, application was made to the United States government for a Confederate marker. This required naming the relationship and when leaving it blank failed, a second trail listed the relationship as "Iuka Surname Society." It worked!

A phone call from a Washington family relative expressed the Washington family's appreciation for this marker and their concern over what happened to the original. Oak Grove Cemetery's Fairfax Washington was a 1st cousin of President George Washington three times removed.

The following letter from John A. Washington in Chevy Chase, Maryland, dated June 12, 1986, related the descendants from George Washington's father down to Iuka's Fairfax Washington: George Washington's father, Augustine Washington (1694-1743) had one brother who survived childhood, an older brother, John Washington (1692-1746), who lived at a farm called Highgate in Gloucester Co., VA and married Catherine Whiting. They had eight children, including two sons who grew up. The elder son was Warner Washington (1722-1790), who moved from Gloucester Co. up to that part of Frederick County which has been cut off as Clarke County, where he had a farm called Fairfield. He was, obviously, a first cousin of George Washington, and they were pretty close friends. Warner Washington (1722-1790) married twice, first to Elizabeth Macon and second to Hannah Fairfax. He had four children by the first marriage, including a son Warner (1751-1829) and eight children by the second marriage, including a son Fairfax Washington (1778-

1861) who is only incidental to our purpose.

The second Warner Washington (1751-1829) was thus a first cousin once removed of General Washington. He married twice, and had no less than 16 children. He lived successively at different farms called Clifton, Wudley, and Llewellyn, in the present Clarke Co., VA and had among the children of his second wife, a son Fairfax Washington (1802-1883), who was named for his father's younger half-brother, but was not descended from the Fairfax family at all. This Fairfax Washington (1802-1883) probably moved from Clarke Co., VA about 1839, to Hinds Co. Mississippi and stayed there awhile, moving to Handsboro, Harrison Co., Mississippi, down on the coast.

Fairfax Washington (1802-1833), like his father and grandfather, married twice and had a numerous family, in this case thirteen children, four by the first wife and nine by the second. His second wife, whom he married in 1838, was Sarah J. Richards (1819-1895) and the third of her children (seventh of Fairfax's) was another Fairfax Washington (1843-1862). This is the 19 years old Fairfax Washington who is buried in Oak Grove Cemetery, Iuka, Mississippi. It's time his family-purchased marker be placed in its proper place.



The John Marshall Stone Chapter #394 of the United Daughters of the Confederacy placed the marker for Private John Durell on November 15, 2003 at the Shady Grove Cemetery. Mr. Durell was killed on September 19, 1862 in the Battle of Iuka. Twenty seven descendence from John Durell gathered for the service.

Monument Placed To Honor John Durell

My name is Vita Durell Sloan, and I am John Durell's great granddaughter. I would like to thank Vickie Durham and the United Daughters of the Confederacy for arranging this ceremony, and Marquita Mathis for telling us last year that we could have a dedication ceremony.

John Durell was born in 1818. Legends were passed down that John was born on a ship of which his father was captain, and his home town was New Orleans. New Orleans records list Captain Jean Ursin Durell who died in 1817, and Capt. Jean Ursin Durell, J.A., but there was no John listed among his children. Legends in Texas suggest that John Durell's mother was an Indian girl.

John married Darkis Spradley in Montgomery County, Alabama, and they had 5 children. After Darkis died John married Tincie Jane Cauthen in 1853, and they had two sons. They lived in Covington Co., Alabama, near Red Level. John's son Bryant Durell and daughters Sally Durell Vinson and Martha Durell Poole went to Van Zandt Co., Texas. The other children stayed in Alabama. None of their children knew of their cousins in the other state.

John Durell enlisted in Captain Kentrick's Company, Company C, 37th Regiment, Alabama Infantry at Greenville, Alabama in March 1862, and trained at Auburn, Columbus and Baldwin, Mississippi. They were ordered to Iuka, Mississippi September 14, 1862, and arrived on the 15th. They engaged the Union late on the 19th, about "two hours by sun". About dusk they were ordered to charge, and they pushed the enemy back.

Apparently the fighting stopped as darkness fell. During that short time, from dusk until dark, John Durell and 15 other soldiers of the 37th were killed or mortally wounded. Twelve, including John, were buried in a ditch, on this spot, along with 251 other Confederate soldiers, 263 in all, as the plaque says. This was John's first and only battle. The Con-

federates had won the battle but Gen. Price's staff convinced him that they did not have enough troops to fight against the larger Union force so they retreated to Corinth. Twelve of the 263 Confederate troops buried in the ditch were from the 37th Regiment and four more later died of wounds. Word finally got to John's family that he was "buried in a ditch". Moore says her grandfather Howell Durell, always called this marker to the grave "Buried in a ditch."

We have met here to honor John Durell and the others who died here, and to mend them for being with fight and die for the thing which they believed. We cate this marker to the man of this brave man, our
