Baymont, Inc. of Golden Announces Expansion

Eighty new jobs in Belmont; thirty new jobs in Golden

Baymont, Inc., of Golden, MS, announces that it will expand its Tishomingo County, MS, operations. The expansions will create approximately 30 new jobs in Golden and approximately 80 new jobs in Belmont. The new operations will manufacture fiberglass bath and shower units, aluminum shower doors at a subsidiary called Golden Bath Productions, Inc., and wood components at a subsidiary called LL Wood Products, Inc. Another new company called Carolina Carports, Inc., will occupy part of the same property in Belmont. Carolina Carports will create 55 new jobs.

Baymont, Inc. CEO Mike Stockton reports that the new operations will startup during the first quarter of 2004. Baymont, Inc., currently employs approximately 100 at its Golden, MS, facilities.

Baymont, Inc., began with a company called Redmont, Inc.,

that was started by Mike Stockton in October of 1992. Redmont soon became a successful fiberglass tub company and was sold to Jacuzzi in 1997. Mike Stockton, the President of both Redmont and Baymont, worked for Jacuzzi for four years.

Baymont, Inc., was incorporated in March, 2001, with the first tub coming off the line on April 16, 2001. Baymont, Inc., currently builds tubs, shower stalls, tub showers, whirlpools, and shower doors. Primary customers are the manufactured housing and modular housing industries, and Lowes, Inc. Baymont, Inc., ships throughout the Southeast, which includes the states of Alabama, Mississippi, Georgia, Florida, Tennessee, North Carolina, Arkansas, and Texas.

Baymont, Inc., is located at 30 Red Bay Road in Golden, MS. The company is housed in a 110,000 square foot building

that consists of both the manufacturing facility and administrative offices.

Java and Adela Herrera founded Carolina Carports, Inc., in October, 1997. The company produces metal carports and garages. Carolina Carports has 230 employees in its plants in North Carolina, Georgia, Missouri, and Texas. The company operates a steel mill in Texas that supplies the other plants. New plants are opening in Mississippi and Pennsylvania. Carolina Carports has an established network of 650 dealers in 20 states. The company's attention to detail, excellent service, prompt delivery, and technical support along with a substantial inventory of raw materials and finished products, accounts for the company's rapid growth.

Belmont Mayor Bob Yarber reports, "We congratulate Baymont, Inc., on its expansion. Baymont is a home-grown company that has done well in the market place. The company already has a tremendous economic impact on Tishomingo County. We welcome Carolina Carports, Inc., which is new to our community."

Murphy now faces charges of jail escape along with other felony charges in McNairy County, TN.

Local Attorney Attends International Comparative Law Seminar In Cuba

The Authors are attorneys who attended law school together at Samford University in Birmingham, Alabama. They spent eight days in Cuba in March 2004 attending an International Comparative Law Seminar sponsored by the National Union of Jurists of Cuba and organized by Suffolk University Law School of Boston, Massachusetts.

Cuba cannot be understood to any degree without a fair understanding of its historic struggle against tyranny and colonialism. In 1492, Christopher Columbus discovered Cuba and declared the island as well as its inhabitants to be subjects of the Spanish Crown. Spain ruled Cuba with an iron fist for nearly four centuries. During this period, native Cubans were methodically executed, enslaved, and otherwise treated inhumanely. By 1557, only about 2,000 of the three million native Americans that had greeted Columbus remained in Cuba.

Spain's harsh colonialism sparked numerous revolts. The most famous of which was led by Jose Marti. Marti was born in Havana in 1853, but, by the age of 17, Marti was expelled from Cuba because of his intense opposition to Spanish colonial rule. Marti studied in Spain, established his literary career in Mexico, and traveled throughout Latin America and the U.S. raising support for Cuban independence. Marti, wary of U.S. expansion policies, concluded that if Cuba did not quickly gain independence from Spain it risked becoming just another spoil of war between Spain and the U.S.

In 1895, Marti returned to Cuba to lead the war against Spain. Legend has it that Marti led his troops into battle while riding on a white horse. Marti was killed and became an instant martyr for Cuban independence. Today, Marti is revered by the Cuban people.

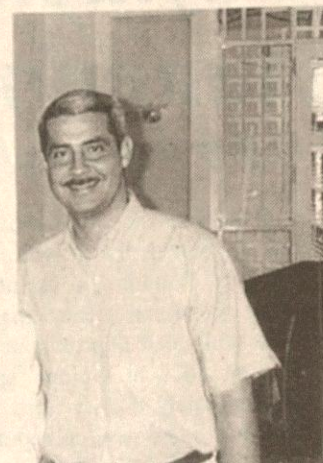
In 1898, Cuba, with assistance from the U.S., prevailed in its war against Spain. Spain, as Marti had feared, did not relinquish control to the Cuban people. Instead, Spain signed the Treaty of Paris, which abdicated

control over Cuba to the U.S. The U.S. immediately established a military government. Although the U.S. claimed that it supported Cuba's quest for self determination. The U.S. insisted that Cuba adopt several constitutional amendments (collectively known as the Platt Amendment), which guaranteed continued U.S. control over an independent Cuba. Cuban leaders had not choice but to capitulate to U.S. demands.

An independent Cuba, although free from the ravages of colonialism, entered into an era of political turmoil, tyranny by its own leaders, and frequent intervention by the U.S. In 1933, Fulgencio Batista came to power in a military uprising known as the Revolt of the Sergeants. Batista appointed himself the leader of Cuba's army and appointed several figureheads as leaders of Cuba before he was actually elected as Cuba's head of state. Batista ruled Cuba until 1944 when he was forced from power. Batista fled to Florida with over \$10 million in public funds.

In 1952, Batista returned to Cuba and seized power through another military coup. Although Batista's first regime brought significant economic development to Cuba, Batista's second regime was marked with violence and corruption. Batista renewed his friendship and business relationship with gangster Meyer Lansky, and he promoted Cuba as a haven for high stakes gambling. During Batista's second regime, Havana became known as the Latin Las Vegas. Batista's sole interest seemed to be retaining power and obtaining wealth. When he was finally ousted from power in 1959 by Fidel Castro, Batista was rumored to have accumulated a fortune worth over \$300 million.

In 1926, Fidel Castro Ruiz was born to a wealthy landowner. Castro had all of the privileges afforded the Cuban wealthy: he was educated by Jesuits, he earned a law degree from the prestigious Havana University, and he married into one of Cuba's wealthiest families. Intelligent, athletic, and well spoken, Castro could have easily settled into a life of leisure and luxury. Yet, Castro forsook the trappings of wealth and power and revolted against Batista's regime, which so ruthlessly

oppressed the 99% of the population that did not belong to Cuba's upper class.

On July 26, 1953, Castro led an attack on the Monaca military barracks. This attempted coup failed miserably, and Castro was arrested. At trial, Castro defended himself, denounced Batista, and demanded a revolution in his now famous History Will Absolve Me speech. Castro was promptly convicted and sentenced to 15 years in prison. In 1955, Castro was given a general amnesty and was exiled to Mexico.

One year later, Castro and 82 followers sailed to Cuba on the Granma to lead another revolution against Batista. Castro was accompanied by his brother, Raul, and his confident, Ernesto "Che" Guevara, an Argentinean doctor turned revolutionary. Although Castro was primarily a political opportunist (his initial views were nationalist, reformist and anti-imperialist), Raul and Guevara were hard line communists. The U.S. feared that if Castro succeeded in overthrowing Batista, communism would gain a foothold in Cuba and endanger the U.S.

Castro's triumphant return to Cuba got off to a bad start when his ship ran aground, and several members of his group were executed by Batista's soldiers. Castro escaped to the Sierra Maestra Mountains where he began organizing guerrilla attacks against Batista's military. Castro's tactical skills and successful operations soon

gained him national prominence. After three years of guerrilla warfare, Castro forced Batista to flee Cuba, and at the age of 32, Castro became ruler of Cuba.

The new leader was faced with the challenge of organizing and operating a new form of government. Castro's biggest fear was that the Imperialist giant (the U.S.) would invade Cuba. Castro's fears were not unfounded. The U.S. had meddled in Cuban affairs for a number of years, and the U.S. did not approve of Castro's regime-particularly Castro's plan to nationalize Cuba's major corporations and deprive wealthy Cubans of their property. Castro's "redistribution of wealth" deprived several prominent American corporations of their property and generated significant animosity within the U.S.

In 1960, the U.S. enacted an economic embargo to force Castro from power. If anything, this embargo secured Castro's position and power. Thousands of Cubans who were either loyal to Batista or were members of Cuba's wealthy class fled to the safety of the U.S. The CIA began plotting with these exiled Cubans to overthrow Castro.

However, as eager as President Kennedy was to rid the world of Castro, Kennedy was even more concerned that the could not perceive the U.S. as the force behind any military action against Castro. In 1961, the CIA provided military training to 1,400 Cuba exiles and planned an elaborate invasion of Cuba. The invasion turned tragic when Kennedy, at the last minute, refused to authorize critical air support for the invasion. The Cuban exiles were captured and executed. After the Bay of Pigs fiasco, Castro was certain that an all out U.S. invasion was imminent. Consequently, Castro turned to the only power capable of assisting Cuba in a war against the U.S. the USSR.

In 1962, the USSR supplied Cuba with ballistic missiles. Castro claimed these missiles were necessary to protect Cuba against a possible U.S. invasion, but the U.S. viewed the buildup of missiles on Cuban soil as an act of communist aggression. President Kennedy ordered a naval blockade of Cuba to prevent any further promulgation of weapons in Cuba, and for thirteen tense days, the world teetered on the brink of a thermonuclear war.

Eventually, the Soviets agreed to withdraw their missiles from Cuba in exchange for an agreement by the U.S. to dismantle numerous missiles stationed in Turkey. Many speculate that the Soviets orchestrated the Cuban missile crisis to create an opportunity to negotiate removal of U.S. missiles from Turkey. The Soviets did not consult with Castro before reaching this agreement with the U.S., and Castro was infuriated to the point that he never completely trusted the Soviets again.

In 1991, the USSR collapsed. The disappearance of Cuba's primary trading partner wreaked havoc on the Cuban economy. Castro used Cuba's economic crisis as an excuse to rail against the U.S. for the economic embargo and to rally the Cuban people by telling them that the "Special Period" of the Revolution had begun which would require additional sacrifices.

Despite Castro's rhetoric, the Cuban government has made great strides towards capitalism including: legalizing the use of U.S. currency, allowing small privately owned businesses, and passing the Foreign Investment Act which facilitated foreign investment in Cuba.

Rather than favorably responding to Cuba's steps towards capitalism, the U.S. has intensified the economic embargo (despite its devastating impact on the Cuban people) and has implemented even greater restrictions on

travel to and from Cuba. The current U.S. policy towards Cuba has accomplished little more than to continue the oppression and suffering of the Cuban people and it is time the United States reconsidered its policy towards Cuba.

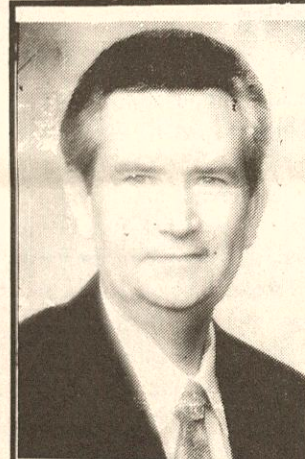

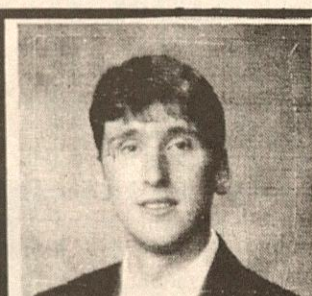
What Is Legal Blindness?

Low vision is the general term used to describe several levels of very limited sight which interferes with a person's daily routine activities.

One extreme of low vision is LEGAL BLINDNESS. Everyone has heard the expression, but not everyone knows what it means. Legal blindness is defined as visual acuity that cannot be corrected to better than 20/200 and/or a restricted field of vision less than 20 degrees. In the former instance, a person even with lenses cannot see at 20 feet what a person with normal vision can see at 200.

The major category of low vision, however, consists of people who are PARTIALLY SIGHTED. This means that their visual acuity when corrected is between 20/70 and 20/200.

Low vision is often the result of injury, birth defects, aging, or disease. Many of the cases caused by disease can be prevented when its symptoms are detected early enough.

Letter To The Editor...

If Gilmore Memorial has not lost their doctors to NMMC, why are they concerned another hospital in Lee County would draw them? We do need another hospital and I don't want doctors from Gilmore.

I have first hand experience with both hospitals. May 31, 03 I became ill. June 3, 03 I realized I had more than a virus, possibly a kidney stone. Not wanting to go to NMMC, I had someone take me to Gilmore Memorial. No one was in ER waiting so I was seen promptly. The first question the doctor asked was way I came way down there when we had NMMC. I told him I did not want to go to NMMC. He then asked who my family doctor was. I told him I no longer had one, NMMC had taken him over. After my examination was completed he told me I might have a pulled muscle and he would give me a shot and prescription for pain. I had to ask for nausea medication. He then told me if I was not better by Friday to go to a family doctor, they had a lot of good ones in Tupelo, but I did not want to go to one of them I could go to Fulton or Aberdeen to one of Gilmore's Clinics. The shot wore off about 3 a.m. the next morning. My pain medicine was Tylenol 3. I do not take Tylenol. Later in the morning I located my son in Memphis and asked that he come for me and take me to a hospital up there. We went to Collierville Baptist. The ER wait was short and I did have a kidney stone.

Soon I began to get a bill from NMMC radiology. They were wanting a payment for something because Medicare had not paid. I was surprised to find this was for services rendered at Gilmore Memorial. They kept wanting their money and finally they gave me the number for Medicare, which I called. It was because their paperwork was incorrect, and it was no fault of mine. Is there a connection between Gilmore Memorial and NMMC? Do they share some doctors?

Upon signing in for my last appointment with my family doctor, I was presented a form to sign and they would fill out all the information on it. I had already encountered this form with my sister's last appointment. I refused to sign the form since they already had all the information they needed for insurance purposes. I was told they would not treat me

unless I signed the form. I left and have no plans to return.

In 1997 a sister was hospitalized at NMMC. A night nurse told me she was short of help, was the only one on the floor for all the rooms, her feet hurt and would I help her turn my sister that night. I told her I would if she would wake me up. I guess my sister was turned at the proper times, but several of us noticed the socializing at the nurses station about midnight. It woke us up. From about 1999 until 2004 I had a sister and a sister-in-law hospitalized several times. Each time they went through the ER always having a long wait. In one instance my sister-in-law begged to leave and just let her go on and die. With

each hospitalization I stayed there and I was always offered you want to bathe her or want us to, and when I was fortunate enough to get into her bed or do you want to always let them do the medical training. My husband NMMC many years ago for cal service in Memphis. In March 1994 while at a store he had an insulin reaction they sent him to NMMC ended up being admitted and 48 hours later he was dead. doctor told me he had no this doctor never touched find out all he did was questions. 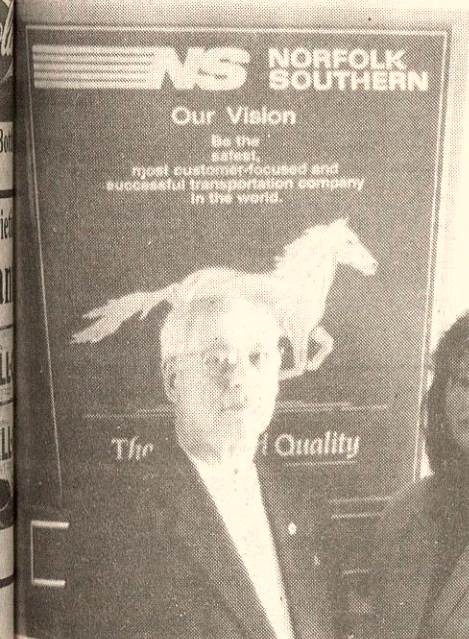
Lady Braves Annual Bar-B-Que And Ribs Dinner

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Iuka, Mississippi (the "Governing Body"), acting for and on behalf of the City of Iuka, Mississippi (the "City"), hereby finds, determines, adjudicates and declares as follows:

1. The City is authorized by Section 21-33-301 through 21-33-329, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "Act"), to issue bonds hereinafter proposed to be issued for the purposes and the amounts set forth in paragraph 2 of this preamble.

2. It is necessary and in the public interest to issue General Obligation Bonds, Series 2004, of the City in the principal amount not to exceed Eight Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$860,000) (the "Bonds"), to raise money for the purpose of constructing, improving or paving streets, sidewalks, driveways, parkways, walkways or public parking facilities, and purchasing land therefore, and repairing, improving and extending the sanitary, storm, drainage or sewerage systems (the "Project").

3. The assessed value of all taxable property within the City, according to the last completed assessment for taxation, is Eighteen Million Two Hundred Fifty Three Thousand Three Hundred Seventy Five Dollars (\$18,253,375); the City has outstanding bonded indebtedness subject to the fifteen percent (15%) debt limit prescribed by Section 21-33-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, in the amount of One Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$165,000), and outstanding bonded and floating indebtedness subject to the twenty percent (20%) debt limit prescribed by Section 21-33-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, (which amount includes the sum set forth above subject to the 15% debt limit), in the amount of One Million Fifty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$1,055,000); the issuance of the Bonds hereinafter proposed to be issued pursuant to the Act, when added to the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the City, will not result in bonded indebtedness, exclusive of indebtedness not subject to the aforesaid fifteen percent (15%) debt limit, of more than fifteen percent (15%) of the assessed value of taxable property within the City, and will not result in indebtedness, both bonded and floating, exclusive of indebtedness not subject to the aforesaid twenty percent (20%) debt limit, in excess of twenty percent (20%) of the assessed value of taxable property within the City, and will not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitation upon indebtedness which may be incurred by the City.

4. The City reasonably expects that it will incur expenditures prior to the issuance of the Bonds, which it intends to reimburse with the proceeds of the Bonds upon the issuance thereof. This declaration of official intent to reimburse expenditures made prior to the issuance of the Bonds in anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds is made pursuant to Department of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2 (the reimbursement regulations). The Project for which such expenditures are made is the same as described hereinabove. The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued for the Project is the amount hereinabove set forth.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY, ACTING FOR AN ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Governing Body hereby declares its intention to issue General Obligation Bonds, Series 2004, of the City in the principal amount not to exceed Eight Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$860,000) pursuant to the Act to raise money for providing funds for the Project. The Bonds may be issued in one or more series and will be general obligations of the City payable as to principal and interest out of an secured by an irrevocable pledge of the avails of a direct and continuing tax to be levied annually without limitation as to time, rate, or amount upon all the taxable property within the geographical limits of the City.

SECTION 2. The Governing Body proposes to direct the issuance of the Bonds in the amounts, for the purposes and secured as aforesaid at a meeting place of the Governing Body at it meeting place in the City Hall of the City of Iuka, Mississippi, at the hour of 7:00 o'clock p.m. on April 6, 2004.

SECTION 3. If on or before 7:00 o'clock p.m. on April 6, 2004, ten percent (10%) of the qualified electors of the City or fifteen hundred (1,500), whichever is less, shall file a written protest with the Clerk of the City of Iuka, Mississippi against the issuance of the Bonds pursuant to the Act, then Bonds for such purpose or purposes shall not be issued unless authorized at an election on the question of the issuance of such Bond to be called and held as provided by law. If no protest be filed on or before 7:00 o'clock p.m. on April 6, 2004, against the issuance of Bonds, then the Bonds may be issued without an election on the question of the issuance thereof, at any time within a period of two (2) years after the date specified in Section 2 hereof.

SECTION 4. The resolution shall be published once a week for at least three (3) consecutive weeks in the Tishomingo County News, a newspaper published in and having a general circulation in the City of Iuka, Mississippi and qualified under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. The first publication of this resolution shall be made not less than twenty-one (21) days prior to the date fixed herein for the issuance of the Bonds, and the last publication shall be made not more than seven (7) days prior to such date.

SECTION 5. The Clerk of the City shall be and is hereby directed to procure from the publisher of the aforesaid newspaper the customary proof of the publication of this resolution and have the same before the Governing Body on the date and hour specified in Section 2 hereof.

SECTION 6. The City reasonably expects that it will incur expenditures prior to the issuance of the Bonds, which it intends to reimburse with the proceeds of the Bonds upon the issuance thereof.
