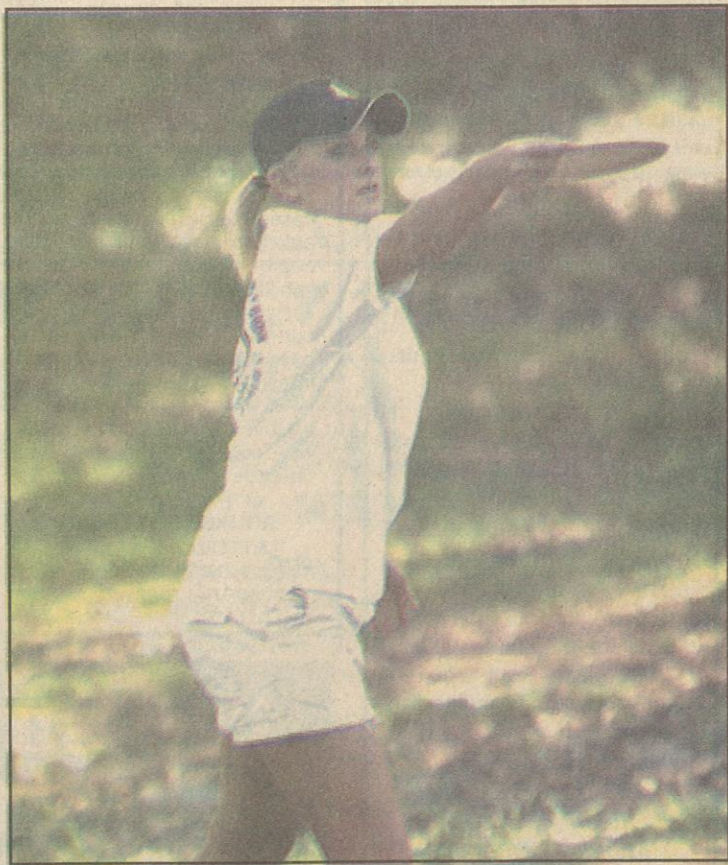
## Miki McCarty New Professional Women's Mississippi State Disc Golf Champion.....

Miki McCarty of Iuka wins the Mississippi State Disc Golf Championship in the Pro Women's Division by 12 strokes over second place Lori Maxwell. Lori is the current Southern National Pro Women's Champion, and last seasons Southern National Pro/Am Tour money and points leader.

Miki threw a four under par the first round, which was the best score for the round, tied with only four other player, all Open Men, including the eventual Open winner Matt Orum of Mobile. She carded a two under par the second round, finishing the day 15 strokes ahead of second place. This allowed her a very comfortable lead going into the final round Sunday on the temporary course.

The last time she was in Hattiesburg was for the 2001 edition of the Mississippi State Disc Golf Championships, which she won playing in the Amateur Women's Division. She will be traveling to Poplarville, Mississippi over the Labor Day weekend to compete in the Southern National Pro Disc Golf Championships.

She is hoping to play in the PDGA (Professional Disc Golf Championship) Worlds Disc Golf Championship August 7 through the 14 in Des Moines Iowa, if the funding becomes

available. This is the biggest Disc Golf event of the year, and even bigger than most since the Amateur, Professional, and Junior divisions are all competing at the same place.

She is looking for sponsorships to help with the expenses and entry fees; the entry fee is \$180, and the motel is \$65 per day plus taxes. As this is a

week of competition, it takes quite a bit to make it all happen.

She will be competing against the best the world has to offer; not in the least Juliana Korver, 3 time World Champion, and Des Redding, the current Open Woman's PDGA World Champion. At the moment there are 15 Open Women registered.

The last PDGA World event she attended was in 2001 Amateur Disc Golf Championships in Nashville. She placed second in the Junior girls under 16 Division, quite an accomplishment for a 13 year old girl!

## Sentencing For June, 2004, Term of Tishomingo County Circuit Court

In the June, 2004, term of Tishomingo County Circuit Court, the Honorable Shairon Richardson Aycock presided and handed down the following sentences on the following counts:

Count I Grand Larceny 5 years in MDOC with 5 years suspended pending future good behavior and non violation of city, county, state or federal laws; to run concurrent with Count II charge;

Count II Burglary and Larceny 7 years in MDOC; placed in Intensive Supervision Program/House Arrest Program; ordered to pay court costs of \$251 and a 2% bond fee of \$100; restitution of \$12,180, jointly and severally with Co-defendants, Michael Lynn Copening and Sarah Robin Poindexter to Lewis Hood, Florence, AL.; must enter into a payment plan within 30 days.

Count I Possession of Methamphetamine with intent to distribute; sentenced to 20 years in MDOC with 18 suspended under Post Release Supervision, for 5 years; ordered to pay court costs of \$251, a 2% bond fee of \$200,

\$5,000. fine with \$2500 suspended, an assessment of \$100 to Mississippi Crime Victims' Fund; ordered to enter a payment agreement within 30 days of release from MDOC; remanded to Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department awaiting transportation to MDOC

Count II Possession of marijuana with the intent to distribute more than 1 gram BU- sentenced to 2 years in MDOC; sentenced to run concurrent with Count I

Sentenced to 5 years in MDOC with 3 years suspended and 3 years of Post-Release Supervision to run concurrent with DUI 3rd charge; required to do 10 days community service and report to probation officer upon release from MDOC; pay court costs of \$172.50 and a \$600 fine; remanded to custody of Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department awaiting transportation; will not receive credit for time served

DUI 3rd Felony; sentenced to 5 years in MDOC with 3 years suspended and 3 years of Post Release Supervision; must enroll and successfully complete long-term community Therapeutic A&D treatment program while in MDOC's custody; pay court costs of \$279 and a \$2000 fine, ordered to enter into a payment

plan within 30 days of release from MDOC, will not receive credit for time served, remanded to Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department awaiting transportation to MDOC.

Count I Grand Larceny 4 years in custody of MDOC to run concurrent with Alcorn Co. Cause CR03-180, with credit for time served, pay court costs of \$251.00

Count II Burglary and Larceny of a Building sentenced to 6 years in MDOC with 6 years suspended with 5 years Post-Release Supervision to run consecutively with Count I, pay restitution of \$12,180 jointly and severally with Sarah Robin Poindexter and Thomas Shane Jackson to Lewis Hood of Florence, AL.; pay restitution in Alcorn County of \$139.05 to Gardner's Supermarket, Uttering a Forgery Sentenced to 4 years in MDOC, will be given credit for time served to run concurrent in Count I, pay court costs and restitution as ordered in Count II

## The Town of Paden, MS Got It's Name From Peden/Paden Family

The fiftieth Peden Reunion will be held July 17th and 18th, 2004 at Fairview Presbyterian Church near Fountain Inn, Greenville Co., South Carolina.

This reunion is celebrated by the descendants of John Peden, born 1709, and his wife, Margaret (Peggy) McDill, born August 1715, both born in Antrim County, Ireland. They died in South Carolina. John and Peggy Peden's 10 children, all born in Ireland, include:

I MARY, born 1732, married James Alexander died Greenville Co., SC. Descendants settled in SC and Gwinnett Co., GA.

II JAMES, born 1734, m) Mary Brown buried Fairview Church, Greenville Co., SC. Descendants of James and Mary's son, Thomas who married Isabella Paden, settled Tishomingo Co. (See below). James and Mary's grandson, Alexander Savage, settled in Tishomingo Co., along with his Paden cousins who left SC in the 1830's.

III JANE, born ca 1738, married 1) John Morton 2) Robert Morrow buried Morgan Co., Ala. Descendants settled in Morgan Co., Ala.

IV THOMAS, born 1743, m) Elizabeth White, died Spartanburg Co., South Carolina

V WILLIAM, born 1749, m) Mary (Polly) Archer. Most descendants settled in North MS, particularly Tishomingo Co., MS. Descendants established Bethany Presbyterian Church, just south of Tishomingo.

VI ELIZABETH, born 1750, m) William Gaston buried Fairview Church, Greenville Co., SC No Children

VII JOHN, born 1752, m) Baker?, Archer? buried Fairview Church, Greenville

Co., SC. Descendants settled in SC, Gwinnett Co., GA, Kemper Co. MS, and Tallahatchie Co., MS.

VIII SAMUEL, born 1754, m) Katherine White m) 2nd Margaret. Died Kemper Co., MS. Most descendants went to North Ala and then settled in Kemper Co., MS. Established Smyrna Presbyterian Church in Kemper Co., MS. Other descendants were at times in

Tishomingo County and Winston Co. in MS.

IX ALEXANDER, born 1756, m) Rebecca Martin buried Fairview, Greenville Co., SC. Descendants settled in SC, Kemper County, MS and Gwinnett Co., GA.

X DAVID, born 1760, m) 1st Eleanor Goodgion m) 2nd Margaret Hughes. Died Kemper Co., MS. Descendants first settled in North Ala., Gwinnett Co., GA, Kemper and Chickasaw Co. in MS, later to MO and Parker and Tarrant Counties in Texas. Descendants of the other siblings above also may have settled in and around Tishomingo Co., MS. Many of the houses intermarried (each child of John and Peggy McDill Peden is considered a House of this family, for example: I am of the House of William.) The town of Paden, MS in Tishomingo Co. gets its name from this family. The community of Peden in Kemper Co., MS is named after the Samuel Peden above. Pedens/Padens established Bethany Presbyterian Church in Tishomingo Co., MS, Smyrna Presbyterian Church in Kemper Co., MS and Fairview Church in Gwinnett Co., GA.

Peden (a brother-in-law), and Alexander Peden, along with their families, regularly dismissed. (Signed) Anthony Savage, Clerk of Session". These families as well as others from Fairview, first went to Fayette County, Tenn. where the mother, Mary, died and is buried at Mt. Bethany Cemetery there. The children later, and at different dates (Alexander the last), came to Old Tishomingo County, MS. Their change the spelling of their name from Peden to Paden. William and Mary's descendants now live all over

North Mississippi.

## Continued From Last Week Why Does A Tooth Ache?

6. A teeth-zinging feeling when you eat is a likely indicator of tooth decay, says Dr. Murray.

7. A crack in the tooth - even a minute fracture - can cause a sharp pain either when you bite, or when you release your bite, says Dr. Murray.

8. Gum recession, inflammation, and a general build-up of plaque - typically caused by an overabundance of bacteria in the mouth - can all produce a dull ache, not limited to one tooth.

9. If you wake up in the morning with a sharp, sporadic pain, perhaps accompanied by muscle ache, a likely cause is tooth-grinding, which tends to take place while you sleep.

10. An impacted wisdom tooth can cause an intermittent dull, throbbing pain at the back of the jaw and in the neighboring second molar, says Dr. Moriconi.

## Chemicals In The Eye - 1st Aid

Most medical emergencies call for the prompt professional medical attention. However, in the case of chemicals getting into the eyes, some immediate first aid can be a real sight saver.

Whether it's your eye or that of your child, and even if you don't know what the substance is, the first thing to do is to flush the eye quickly and thoroughly with water. Do not try to figure out what the substance is and devise an antidote. This can waste precious time. Flushing with lots of water will dilute and wash the substance from the eye, whether it's shampoo or lye.

The key is to remain calm and to proceed with the utmost efficiency. Don't bother searching for an eye-cup if you don't know exactly where it is. Use a full sink, a large bowl, even your cupped hand will do a pinch. Then open your eyes, or hold open the eyes of your child, underwater. Continue repeatedly for several minutes. Only then should you consider going for medical attention.

## Leaving No Plad Behind

### By Governor Haley Barbour

Mississippi Medicaid was bleeding badly - doubling in cost over 5 years and changes had to be made. Our dilemma was this: How to keep the Medicaid program sustainable while making sure everyone had adequate health care coverage?

A part of the solution was to move 47,000 state Medicaid recipients who are also eligible for federal Medicare (6% of all recipients - called PLADs, or Poverty Level Aged and Disabled) off of Medicaid and onto Medicare alone. The state program would be strengthened; those who were eligible for both programs would be off Medicaid, but have new Medicare coverage available to them. This change was necessary and appropriate because Mississippi is not rich enough to pay for what the federal government already provides. The 6% who are being shifted to Medicare need and must get quality health care. This is how we plan to help them!

Time to Transition. We are delaying the implementation of the shift from Medicaid to Medicare for PLADs beneficiaries - from July 1 to September 15, 2004 meaning an additional 11 weeks of transition time. This extra time is needed so we can help PLADs recipients with the transition.

Early Enrollment. We have received federal permission to allow Mississippi PLADs beneficiaries an exclusive advance enrollment opportunity for Medicare prescription drug cards and some patient assistance programs. The federal Medicaid agency, CMS, will allow those Mississippi Medicaid beneficiaries who

will be shifted to Medicare to sign up in advance for their Medicare prescription drug cards - instead of having to wait until they are removed from the Medicaid program before they can sign up.

Sign-Up Assistance. We will conduct a 77-day public education plan to contact all 47,000 PLADs beneficiaries to assist them with their enrollment in the correct prescription plans. We will help them sign

up for and receive not only Medicare benefits but also tremendous benefits available under the Patients Assistance Programs, which make more than 1350 prescription programs available for no more than \$15 per month. Every PLADs beneficiary is eligible for these benefits. We know many of them need in getting enrolled and we will use this delay to ensure they get it.

Good News for All Beneficiaries. We have negotiated positive waiver negotiations with federal officials about allowing 18,000 at-risk beneficiaries to remain on Medicaid. Now, with extra transition time we are even more confident waivers will be granted by the reforms go into effect September 15.

To signify our commitment to help, I have asked Director of Medicaid Dr. Warren Jones provide the employees at Medicaid with plaid ribbons. I want our staff to wear these ribbons not just to symbolize our commitment to help, but to identify us as the people who can help the affected PLADs beneficiaries sign up for all their benefits before September 15 so there will be no gaps in their coverage.

The Calvary Rodeo Co. will be coming to Iuka on July 17th with an exciting night of rodeo fun for the entire family.

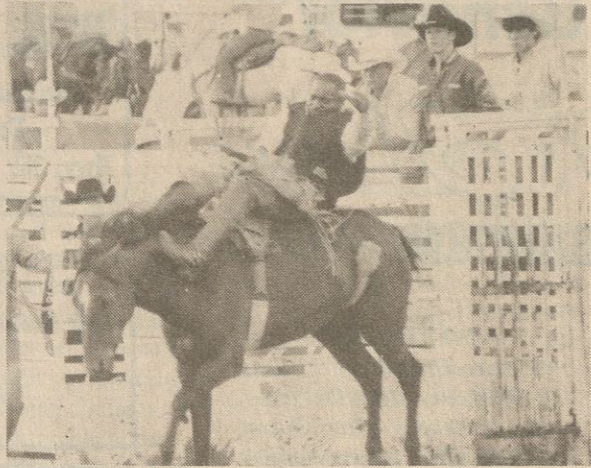
Circle N Arena, 2 miles east of Iuka, (left on CR 995 Airport Road) will be the site for the event.
