## Floods Hit Tishomingo County Causing Death and Destruction

Acknowledgement of the sacrifices made, the hardships endured and the battles fought will only take us a few moments that day.

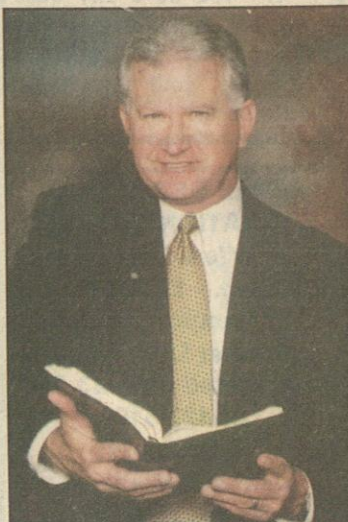

Torrential rains falling on the south end of Tishomingo County Wednesday morning, August 25, caused one death, and thousands of dollars in damage.

The 10-12 inches of flooding waters did extensive damage in the Belmont area washing out several roads including a section of the Natchez Trace Parkway, washed power poles out of the ground, and moved homes from their foundations.

Rising waters from Jourdan Creek west of Dennis was responsible for the death of 87 year-old Raymond Patrick, of Ripley.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner, Mack Wilemon, the accident occurred around 10:00 Wednesday morning as Mr. Patrick attempted to cross a flooded section of Hwy. 4 near the Natchez Trace Parkway. Mr. Patrick had left his home in Ripley around 9:00 and was traveling Hwy. 4 toward Dennis. According to witnesses, he pulled up to the edge of the flooded road, hesitated before attempting to cross and then proceeded. It is estimated that the water was some 2 to 4 feet deep and the shoulder of the road had been washed away. Mr. Patrick's car began turning sideways as it floated in the water then turned upside down submerged in the rushing waters. According to Mr. Wilemon it was some two hours before rescue workers could free Mr. the victim from his car. He was pronounced dead due to accidental drowning.

Raymond Estes Patrick was formerly of Belmont, where he was owner and operator of Belmont Dry Cleaners for 59 years before his retirement in July 2004.

Services were at 11 a.m. Saturday at McBride Funeral Home Chapel in Ripley with Minister Glen Fann and Dr. Patrick Chapman officiating. He was carried to Deaton Funeral Home in Belmont for visitation with burial in Lindsey Cemetery. He was a member of the Belmont Church of Christ and an elder at both Belmont and Ripley Churches of Christ.

Survivors include his wife, Eudora Booker Yates Patrick of Ripley; a son, Raymond Edwin Patrick of Russellville, Ala.; a stepson, Ray Yates of Ripley; a stepdaughter, Alice Grisham of Blue Mountain; two foster daughters, Carla Cockrell of Ripley and Rebecca May of Ashland; a sister, Blanche Meeks of Tiplersville; a grandson, Jason

Edwin Patrick; three stepgrandchildren, and five foster grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his first wife, Velma Savage Patrick, in 1971; his parents, James Henry and Annie Shappley Patrick; a sister, Ima Jackson; and four brothers, Gordon Patrick, Doc Patrick, Jewel Patrick and Ned Patrick.

She added that the Emergency Management plan in Tishomingo County was enacted last Wednesday and all local agencies were contacted and responded as trained.

The Tishomingo Red Cross provided assistance to 4 families that were affected by the August 25, 2004 flood. The families were supplied with vouchers to purchase food, clothes and household necessities.

Forty cases of water were delivered to 13 families throughout the county.

Volunteers from the Tishomingo Service Center performed damage assessment functions on the effected property in Paden, Dennis, Tishomingo, Belmont and Cairo.

### Natchez Trace Parkway Closure Update

As a result of heavy rains and flooding, a section of the Natchez Trace Parkway in Tishomingo County, Mississippi, has been washed out and is closed between Milepost 293.5 and 297.4. A recommended detour around this closed section of the Natchez Trace Parkway is as follows:

Northbound traffic should exit the Natchez Trace Parkway at Milepost 293.5 onto Tishomingo County Road 1; travel north to Highway 4 East and follow Highway 4 East to the Natchez Trace Parkway.

Southbound traffic should exit the Natchez Trace Parkway near Milepost 297.4 onto Highway 4 West to Tishomingo County Road 1, follow Tishomingo County Road 1 to the Natchez Trace Parkway.

These detour routes will be signed accordingly. This detour will remain in effect until further notice while this section in under repair.

## Who Loves Ya, Baby? A Mother's Kisses Can Last A Lifetime

Calling all new or soon-to-be mothers. There's something you can do as soon as your baby is born to give him or her healthy teeth: Start chewing gum. (That's right - we're talking about you, not the baby - who's too young for gum anyway.) Don't chew just any gum, but gum containing natural sweetener called xylitol, a sugar alternative (with 40 percent fewer calories) that will not only minimize and even reverse cavity formation in your teeth, but will give your munchkin long-range cavity protection, too. A study of 5-year-olds in Finland (where xylitol is widely used as a sweetener) showed that those whose moms chewed xylitol gum when they (the babies) were 3 to 24 months old had 70 percent fewer cavities.

Baby teeth - even as soon as they start appearing, a few months or so - can become infected with caries-causing bacteria transmitted from the mother's saliva through feeding, tasting, pacifier-cleaning and kisses. It's also believed that this bacteria transfer to baby's new baby teeth will determine the child's lifelong caries risk.

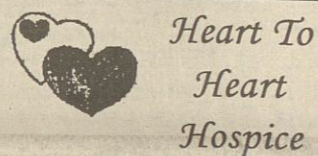

Diabetes mellitus is defined as a fasting blood glucose of 126 milligrams per deciliter (mg/dl) or more.

### 2 Types of Diabetes Mellitus

**Type I Diabetes:** usually occurs in children and young adults. Pancreas makes little or no insulin. Without daily injections of insulin, people with Type I diabetes will not survive.

**Type II Diabetes:** Most common type of DM. It appears most often in middle age adults. It develops when the body doesn't make enough insulin and doesn't efficiently use the insulin it makes. (Sometimes referred as insulin resistance)

**Complications:** Blindness, Kidney Disease, Cardiovascular Disease, Delayed healing of wounds

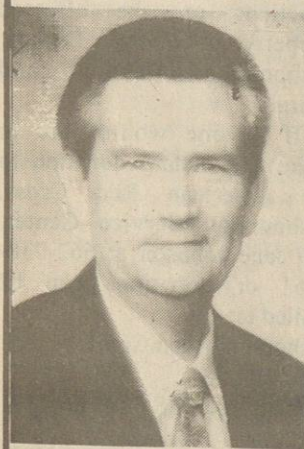

### Optical Errors

Millions of people wear corrective lenses. The great majority of them are prescribed to correct the four most common types of optical errors: nearsightedness, farsightedness, astigmatism, and presbyopia. Still, there persists a good deal of confusion and misunderstanding concerning these problems.

To begin with, THESE ARE OPTICAL ERRORS NOT EYE DISEASES

Eyes that are nearsighted, farsighted, astigmatic, or presbyopic are not unhealthy, nor are they any more subject to eye diseases than eyes without optical error. Since they are not diseased, they do not have to be cured, merely corrected.

The correction for optical errors is corrective lenses - even glasses or contact lenses - which will also perfect or near-perfect vision when in use. There is no reason to be unhappy about having an optical error requiring correction, but it's certainly no cause for anxiety and self-doubt.

"Viewer's Choice" award.

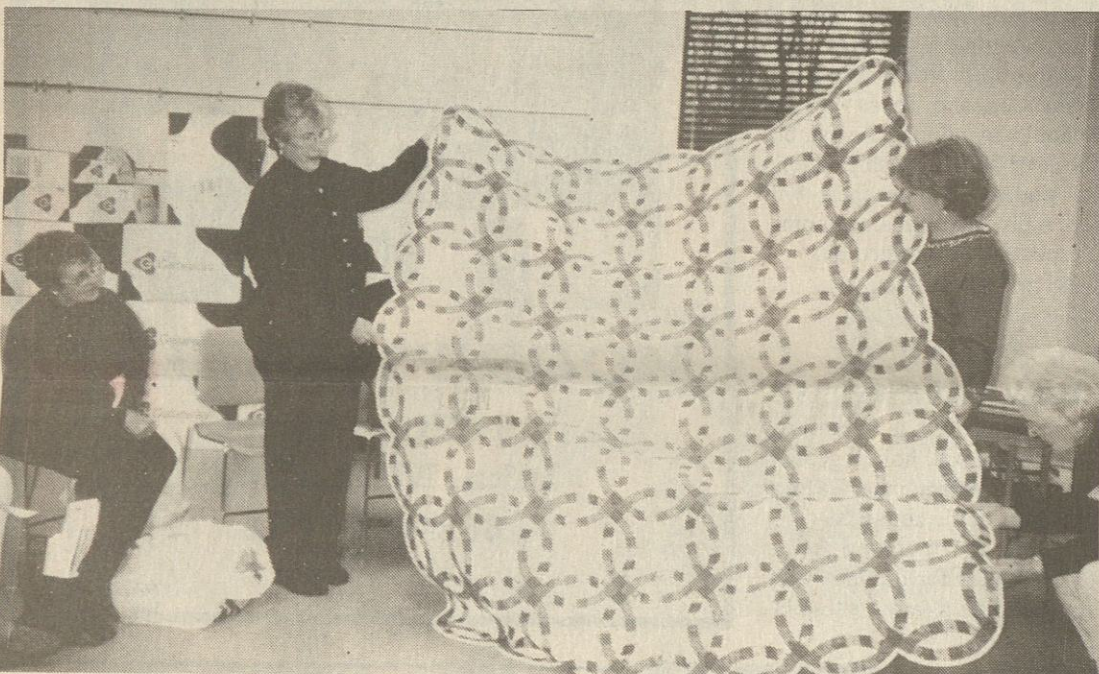

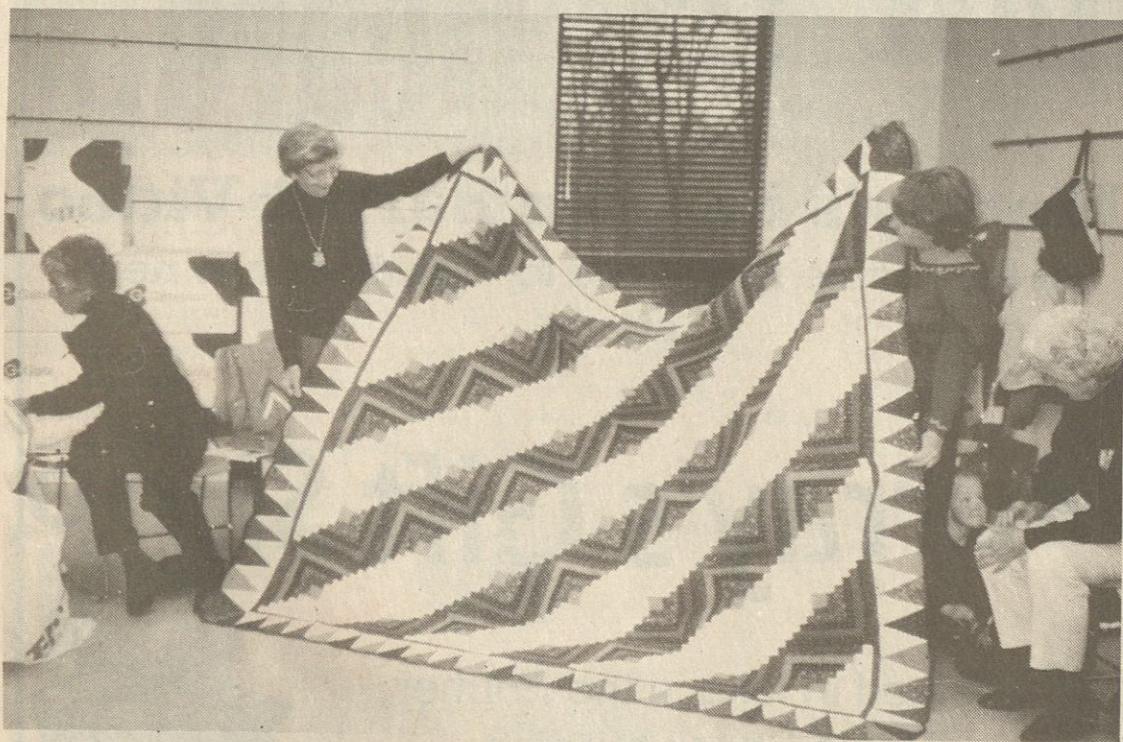

### PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE FOR INITIAL HEARING

Tishomingo County is considering applying to the Mississippi Development Authority for a Small Cities Community Development Block Grant of an amount not to exceed \$650,000 for the purpose of infrastructure improvements to serve industrial development. The State of Mississippi has allocated approximately \$34 million that will be made available to cities and counties on a competitive basis to undertake eligible community development activities. More specific details regarding eligible activities, program requirements, and the rating system will be provided at a public hearing which will be held at the Tishomingo County Boardroom on September 17, 2004, at 10:00 a.m. The purpose of this hearing will be to obtain citizen input into the development of the application.

### Shelby Co. Sheriff's Deputy, Natalie Hillman Captures Fugitive After 22 Years On The Run

This week, Shelby County Sheriff's Deputy Natalie Hillman got an anonymous phone call that led her to the Oregon resident who blew out of Memphis on the eve of his armed robbery trial - 22 years ago.

Ralph Phipps, now 60, of Aloha, Ore., was in an Oregon jail Thursday night, waiting to come back to Memphis for trial.

Like Hillman, deputies on the fugitive squad serve dozens of warrants a week. Or try to. Often suspects change their address, leave town, disappear. But sometimes citizens want to do the right thing and make that call to turn someone in. "When something like this pans out, it's exciting," Hillman said.

Phipps, originally from Memphis, was charged in 1982 in a two-month, five-robbery spree. Two drugstores, a grocery store, a bookstore and pizzeria were robbed at gunpoint in March and April of that year.

Phipps was let out of on bond and absconded before trial, sheriff's spokesman Shular said. For 22 years, case lay dormant - and Phipps lay low. Then came the tip Phipps might be in Oregon. Hillman began tracking with Oregon authorities' help.

She discovered Phipps living in Oregon as "Tim Andis." Within hours, Washington County, Oregon deputy arrested "Andis." He has a criminal record in Oregon.

Hillman verified his identity through fingerprints. Prosecutors say they have a case against Phipps - even 22 years.

Natalie is the daughter of Bonnie Hillman of Burnsville, TN, the granddaughter of Hillman and Ruth Williams of Glen, Faye Adams of Philadelphia, MS and the late J.W. Hillman.

## Southern Corner Stones

Chronicles & Epitaphs from the old Tishomingo County Courthouse



Reprinted from the Tishomingo County News, Centennial Edition, Thursday, June 23, 1983. (spelling and abbreviation quoted per article).

**1900 Grocery List**  
This is a grocery list and hardware items bought by David Nathaniel Dawson, better known as "Dee", from D.O. Matthews, who owned a hardware store in Iuka, Mississippi. The list includes purchases from January 24, 1900, through October 24, 1900. To appreciate the cost of these items, which seem so cheap, one must realize that hard labor paid no more than .50 to \$1.00 per day.

D.N. Dawson was married to Sarah Alice Mauldin on December 22, 1886. They had two children, Sidney and Frank, who were small at the time. Mr. Dawson owned and operated a cotton gin, sawmill, and later a country store near the Dawson home of Highway 25 North of Tishomingo.

It was a common practice for the Dee Dawson's to open their home to friends, as well as strangers, and "put them up for the night," when they were prevented from crossing Cripple Creek because of the flooding. They were traveling between Iuka and Belmont by wagon and horseback.

Lifelong friends were made as a result of these courtesies extended Highway 25 travelers.

Some are still around today who remember the hazards of traveling old Highway 25 and the hospitality the Dawson's afforded all travelers.

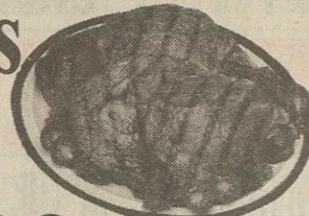

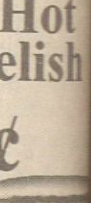

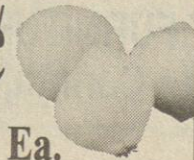

#### Will The Real Jesus Please Stand Up!

We have a little unfinished business in Psalm chapter two, so I will return to that chapter. Verses eight and nine of our chapter say, "Ask of Me, and I shall give Thee the heathen for Thine inheritance, and the uttermost parts of the earth for Thy possession. Thou shalt break them with a rod of iron; Thou shalt dash them in pieces like a potter's vessel." These verses are the words of God the Father to Jesus, but they are so written that it shows Jesus doing the talking and repeating what His Father has said in a decree to Him, as the Son.

The indication of verse eight is that Jesus can simply ask the Father for the control of the nations (heathen and nations being the same Hebrew word), and He will give it to Him. It is interesting to me that so many people are always talking about God's control in heaven in the future, but they never say anything about the control of Christ on the earth. Have you noticed that the verse before us speaks of God the Father giving the "uttermost parts of the earth" to Jesus as a possession? We hear much talk about Christ reigning in His church, but He is going to reign as King over the nations of the earth. His manner of control will not then be a pleading for the nations to willingly submit to Him; it will be a matter of ruling with a rod of iron!

Verse eight speaks of Jesus

breaking the nations with a rod of iron and dashing them to pieces like a piece of undesirable pottery! Most people do not like to hear about this attribute of Christ, but it is just as much a part of Who He is as is the matter of His love for the world. It is true that God is love; it is also true that God is just and holy, and that justice and holiness is going to be displayed by the Son of God when He comes again! The instruction to earth's kings is given in Psalm 2:10-12: "Be wise now therefore, O ye Kings: be instructed, ye judges of the earth. Serve the LORD with fear, and rejoice with trembling. Kiss the Son, lest He be angry, and ye perish from the way, when His wrath is kindled but a little. Blessed are all they that put their trust in Him."

This instruction is what God Himself gives to the rulers of earth. Please notice that this is an earthly scene, not a heavenly one. God is telling the leaders of the nations, as well as all of their subjects, that the only wise thing to do is to make friends with His Son (indicated by kissing the Son), so that they will not fall under the "wrath of the Lamb". I love the idea that God the Father is over all of His universe, not just heaven! His plan is for His Son to rule the nations of men, so that all will submit to Him, or be judged for their lack of submission. Men may like it or not; that is just the way it is!
