Floods Hit Tishomingo County **Causing Death and Destruction**

The Trace was heavily damaged by the swollen Jourdan Creek and will be closed in this area for some time.

Torrential rains falling on the south end of Tishomingo County Wednesday morning, August 25, caused one death, and thousands of dollars in damage.

The 10-12 inches of flooding waters did extensive damage in the Belmont area washing out several roads including a section of the Natchez Trace Parkway, washed power poles out of the ground, and moved homes from their foundations.

Rising waters from Jourdan Creek west of Dennis was responsible for the death of 87 year-old Raymond Patrick, of Ripley.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner, Mack the accident Wilemon, around 10:00 occurred Wednesday morning as Mr. Patrick attempted to cross a flooded section of Hwy. 4 near the Natchez Trace Parkway. Mr. Patrick had left his home in Ripley around 9:00 and was traveling Hwy. 4 toward According to Dennis. witnesses, he pulled up to the edge of the flooded road, hesitated before attempting to cross and then proceeded. It is estimated that the water was some 2 to 4 feet deep and the shoulder of the road had been washed away. Mr. Patrick's car began turning sideways as it floated in the water then turned upside down submerged in the



Northbound traffic should exit the Natchez Trace Parkway at Milepost 293.5 onto Tishomingo County Road 1; travel north to Highway 4 East and follow Highway 4 East to the Natchez Trace Parkway.

Southbound traffic should exit the Natchez Trace Parkway near Milepost 297.4 onto Highway 4 West to Tishomingo County Road 1, follow Tishomingo County Road 1 to the Natchez Trace Parkway.

These detour routes will be signed accordingly. This detour will remain in effect until further notice while this section in under repair.





prescribed to correct the four most common types of optical errors: nearsightedness, farsightedness, astigmatism, and presbyopia. Still, there persists a good deal of confusion and misunderstanding concerning these problems.

To begin with, THESE ARE OPTICAL ERRORS NOT EYE DISEASES

Eyes that are nearsighted, farsighted, astigmatic, or presbyopic are not unhealthy, nor are they any more subject to eye diseases than eyes without optical error. Since they are not diseased, they do not have to be cured, merely corrected.

The correction for optical errors is corrective lenses - even glasses or contact lenses - which will also perfect or near-perfect vision when in use. There is no reason to be unhappy about having an optical error requiring correction, bit it's certainly no cause for anxiety and self-doubt.

consequences of particular facts that they agree occurred. in cases in which the two sides agree on the facts but do not agree on what laws should be applied to them, there is no necessity to go to trial. Shelby Co. Sheriff's Deputy, Natalie Hillman Captures Fugitive After 22 Years On The Run

This week, Shelby County Sheriff's Deputy Natalie Hillman got an anonymous phone call that led her to the Oregon resident who blew out of Memphis on the eve of his armed robbery trial - 22 years ago.

Ralph Phipps, now 60, of Aloha, Ore., was in an Oregon jail Thursday night, waiting to come back to Memphis for trial.

Like Hillman, deputies on the fugitive squad serve dozens of warrants a week. Or try to. Often suspects change their address, leave town, disappear. But sometimes citizens want to do the right thing and make that call to turn someone in. "When something like this pans out, it's exciting," Hillman said.

Phipps, originally from Memphis, was charged in 1982 in a two-month, five-robbery spree. Two drugstores, a grocery store, a bookstore and pizzeria were robbed at gunpoint in March and April of that year.

Phipps was let out of on bond and absconded be trial, sheriff's spokesman Se Shular said. For 22 years, case lay dormant - and Phy lay low. Then came the tip Phipps might be in Oregon, Hillman began tracking with Oregon authorities' he

She discovered Phipps living in Oregon as "Tim dis." Within hours, Wash ton County, Oregon depi arrested "Andis." He has criminal record in Oregon.

Hillman verified his i tity through fingerprints. P ecutors say they have a via case against Phipps - even a 22 years.

Will The Real Jesus Please Stand Up!

We have a little unfinished business in Psalm chapter two, so I will return to that chapter. Verses eight and nine of our chapter say, "Ask of Me, and I shall give Thee the heathen for Thine inheritance, and the uttermost parts of the earth for Thy possession. Thou shalt break them with a rod of iron; Thou shalt dash them in pieces like a potter's vessel." These verses are the words of God the Father to Jesus, but they are so written that it shows Jesus doing the talking and repeating what His Father has said in a decree to Him, as the Son.

The indication of verse eight is that Jesus can simply ask the Father for the control of the nations (heathen and nations being the same Hebrew word), and He will give it to Him. It is interesting to me that so many people are always talking about God's control in heaven in the future, but they never say anything about the control of Christ on the earth. Have you noticed that the verse before us speaks of God the Father giving the "uttermost parts of the earth" to Jesus as a possession? We hear much talk about Christ reigning in His church, but He is going to reign as King over the nations of the earth. His manner of control will not then be a pleading for the nations to willingly submit to Him; it will be a matter of ruling with a rod of iron!

Most people do not like to hear about this attribute of Christ, but it is just as much a part of Who He is as is the matter of His love for the world. It is true that God is love; it is also true that God is just and holy, and that justice and holiness is going to be displayed by the Son of God when He comes again! The instruction to earth's kings is given in Psalm 2:10-12: "Be wise now therefore, O ye Kings: be instructed, ye judges of the earth. Serve the LORD with fear, and rejoice with trembling. Kiss the Son, lest He be angry, and ye perish from the way, when His wrath is kindled but a little.
