# **APlan to Bring Broadband Internet To Tishomingo County Begins**

Dr. Kelly Segars, Iuka Jackie Bryant, Burnsville Mayor Bobby Harold Johnson, Belmont Mayor Bob Yarber, Miltec Plant Manager Jerry Wilemon, TCEPA Manager Robert Grisham and other representatives from Tishomingo County Electric Power Association, and Gary Matthews from the Tishomingo County Community Development Association, along with several other interested Tishomingo County businessmen and development officials met last Wednesday, October 6, with USDA Rural Development State Director, Nick Walters, and USDA Rural Utility Service field representative, Bill Vogt, to explore the possibility of bringing expanded broadband Internet Tishomingo County through the electric power cooperative.

To keep up with everchanging global economy, any business or organization needs access to expanded Broadband Internet according to these representatives. Currently, Iuka/ Tishomingo County's cable television does offer a cable Internet service, but this service isn't available where there is no cable service.

In the past, USDA has offered loans in some Northeast Mississippi Counties including Alcorn and Prentiss, but not Tishomingo County; and these officials wanted to explore the process needed to apply for such loans.

After reading in a Memphis newspaper last spring that USDA had granted loans to several Northeast Mississippi counties, but not Tishomingo County, Segars began inquir-

ing about the availability of loans for Tishomingo County. Dr. Segars put this project on his list of priorities, and Wednesday's meeting was a direct result of his inquiries.

Vogt and Walters, from the Rural Development and Utility Services, discussed the many possibilities with the group. "Walters said that the first thing that had to be done was to determine whether this was an

idea worth exploring, and Vogt explained how funding might be sought. "A firm decision would have to be made before going forward and putting an application together for a loan," according to Walters. Funding possibilities might be secured so that TCEPA could provide these

Robert Grisham said that the power association will research Mississippi legislation that governs power cooperatives and will also look at demand for the services, and these ideas will be presented to the association's board of directors at the next board's meeting for consideration.

Gary Matthews, executive director of the Tishomingo County Development Association said, "High speed Internet access today is sought by many industrial prospects; and, as mentioned by someone at the meeting, that Internet access is probably in the same category in terms of succeeding in the new global economy as adding a rail line to a city was in the

19th century.' Broadband Internet access would be a positive option for both business and industrial development in Tishomingo

# **Tishomingo County Circuit Court** Sentences For Sept. Term of Court

Tishomingo County Circuit Court presided over by the Honorable. Judge Paul S. Funderburk, the following sentences and fines were administered:

Rice- one count of taking a motor vehicle; 5 years in MDOC with credit given for time already served and with balance of time suspended pending future good behavior and nonviolation of city, county, state, or federal laws; also ordered to pay court costs of \$272, a 2% bond fee of \$100, and a fine of \$250 to be paid in full by 12/31/04; banished from the First District (Alcorn, Itawamba, Lee, Monroe, Prentiss, Pontotoc and Tishomingo Counties) for 5 years beginning 9/13/04 with no contact whatsoever with victim(s).

\*L. Cass- one count of embezzlement; 10 years in MDOC with one year in Intensive House Arrest Program; upon completion of one year in IHAP, Post Release Supervision 5 years; failure to complete program will result in serving remainder of sentence; pay court costs of \$271, a 2% bond fee of

In the September term of \$200, a \$100 assessment to MS Crime Victim's Compensation Fund, restitution of \$42,944.66 plus interest \$6,851.78 to victim(s), and additional restitution of \$4,542.66 to MS State Auditor's office with immediate payment of \$3,000 toward court costs and restitution with additional payments to begin on 10/01/04.

\*Danny Austin- one count of burglary and larceny of a building; and one count of CS; 7 years in MDOC with 4 years suspended and 4 years of PRS in count 1; 7 years with 2 suspended and 1 year of PRS in count 2; to run concurrent with CR04-041 and CR02-006; must enroll and successfully complete and obatin GED while at MDOC; pay court costs of \$271, fine of \$1000, assessment of \$100 to MS Crime Victims Compensation Fund; remanded to custody of T.CSD awaiting transportation to



IN SUMMARY

A Motion for Summary Judgment, which may be filed by either party, is usually filed after the defendant has answered the plaintiff's complaint. The aim of this important motion is to resolve the case before any arguments are actually made in the courtroom. Motions Summary Judgment ask the judge to read over the pleadings (complaint, answer, counter-claim, etc.) and make a decision that is based strictly on the pleadings. The judge must then decide whether the pleadings contain sufficient information to warrant a determination. If there is, the judge decides immediately who wins the case. Often, the requires information to make this determination and, therefore, denies the motion and set the case for trial. practice, we

Vision Screening Not Enough

A child's ability to see and to use vision skills effectively can relate to his her classroom performance. In spite of this, there are many children who fall behind in school because undetected vision problems.

Many schools conduct valuable preventive vision screening programs. However, these screenings should not be confused with thorough examination by a doctor of optometry.

The typical school eve chart is designed to be seen at 20 feet and measures how well or poorly the child sees at that distance. Problems with near vision, eye coordination and focusing ability are among the many problems twill probably not be discovered in this test.

Urah Irene Riley, age 100, died Friday, October 8, 2004, at her home in the Oldham Community near Iuka.

Born March 30, 1904, she was one of 13 children born to James Emsley Deaton and Mary Etta Robinson Deaton of the Mt. Gilead Community.

In 1921 she married J. W. Riley and began her long life of being a loving wife and mother.

At a young age, she became a railroad wife, as Mr. Riley's job with Southern Railroad took the couple and their children up and down the Southern Railroad line between Stevenson, Ala. and Rossville, Tenn. They finally settled permanently in the Oldham Community right beside the tracks. Mrs. Riley loved watching the trains as they passed by each day and the engineers looked forward to seeing her as she worked in her beautiful yard. Not only her husband but her son, Brad, were railroad men. Mrs. Riley said the sound of the trains was "music to her ear."

She was an avid gardener and tended her yard until age 94 when her doctor told her she could no longer haul wood's dirt in the wheelbarrow.

Some of her beautiful flowers came from her children as gifts, from friends, and from her travels. While living in the town of LaGrange, Tenn. Mrs. Riley had discovered growing buttercups profusion. She filled a shoebox with one of each of the different bulbs and sent them to her mother with instructions to save them for her and then if she ever had a permanent home she would plant them in her yard. Today, in the Spring, thousands of buttercups can be seen in and around the yard, up and down the railroad and in neighborhood yards.

In the winter time, when gardening was slow, Mrs. Riley enjoyed making quilts, crocheting and cooking especially cooking. Anyone visiting had to eat at her bountiful table - she insisted. If you were lucky, you got egg custard, or fried pies, or maybe a butter-roll.

She also enjoyed fishing almost as much as yardwork, but had to give that up in the later years. During these quiet years, she enjoyed working puzzles, watching the birds outside her window, and beating anyone who came her way in dominoes.

She was a woman of great faith who spent many hours studying her Bible. She was a member of Unity Baptist Church and had taught generations of children in Sunday School and Bible School and was known as "Mamo Riley" to the young folks she touched with her Bible teachings.

Mrs. Riley lived a long life filled with many happy hours. Her warm smile welcomed everyone to her home and her door was always open to anyone who needed a "Mama." Her beautiful yard was always filled with the laughter of children. The big swing, the "playhouse", and the passing trains will long be memories for those who were fortunate enough to get an occasional

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That the following amendment

to the Mississippi Constitution of 1890 is proposed to the qualified electors of the state: Amend the Mississippi Constitution of 1890 to create a new Section 263-A to read as follows: Section 263-A. Marriage may take place and may be valid under the laws of this state only between a man and a woman. A marriage in another state or foreign jurisdiction between persons of the same gender, regardless of when the marriage took place, may not be

recognized in this state and is void and unenforceable under the laws of this state. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this proposed amendment shall be submitted by the Secretary of State to the qualified electors at an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday of November 2004, as provided by Section 273 of the Constitution and by general law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the explanation of this proposed amendment for the ballot shall read as follows: "This proposed constitutional amendment provides that marriage may take place and may be valid under the laws of this state only between a man and a woman. 


