One Vehicle Accident Claims Life of Young Tishomingo County Woman

A passerby traveling on Highway 30 just after 7:00 a.m. on Monday morning, Nov. 29, spotted a vehicle off the road in a deep ravine. When emergency personnel arrived on the scene, they found the body of an luka woman missing since Saturday morning.

Kimberly Camille Cunningham, 32, of 1046, CR 992, Iuka, MS, had left home about 10:00 a.m. Saturday morning, Nov. 27, on her way to visit her Grandmother in Prentiss County. When Kim did not return home in time to go to work at 3:00 p.m., her family began to search for her. They tried to reach her via her cell phone, and they traveled the roadway to and from her destination several times searching for her.

According to MS Highway Patrol Sgt. H. L. Kitchens, the vehicle was found approximately 300 yards from the Highway 25/30 intersection in a 25-foot deep thickly wooded ravine. The dark-green vehicle was covered with leaves and pine branches.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner, Mack Wilemon, Kim apparently was traveling west when her 2001 Ford truck left the road on the south side and crashed into the deep ravine. The accident could possibly have been caused by hydroplaning. Wilemon said, "Cunningham died instantly from trauma received in the one-vehicle accident."

motor jumped into gear; and the boat was suddenly flipped up-side-down. Both men were thrown out of the boat. Finis landed on the side of the boat with the current; Mr. Jack landed on the other side of the boat. Both men made eye contact; and both thought it would be the last time they would see each other alive. Within just a few seconds the current had grabbed Finis and carried him at least 150 yards away. Finis did have on his life jacket, but he did not have it zipped. He also had on heavy workboots that he knew he had to get out of. He finally was able to untie his boots and slip his feet out of them. For the next two hours, he tried to swim against the current. Finally, he was able to swim out of the current and over to the front edge of a cove. Exhausted and cold, he was able to drag himself out of the water into a ditch-like area. He knew he had to get warm to keep going so he covered himself with mud, dirt, and leaves. He worked for some time getting his feet warm. After warming up, he followed the edge of water and headed back toward Coleman Park. The terrain was extremely ruff, and in many places the rock walls

were over forty feet high. Finis was able to later tell his family that he was glad the weather was not hot, because he had basically crawled through some "real rattlesnake" territory trying to get back to the boat dock. About four hours after capsizing, Finis finally could see the lights from Coleman Park. He began to yell for help. A man from Tupelo, a Mr. Baxter, who was at the Park checking on his boat, heard Finis. The man "borrowed" a boat from the marina and rowed to the other side where he located Finis and

Conservation Cost Share Program Underway

The signup is presently underway for the Environmental Quality Incentive Program (EQIP). The signup will continue until the end of January, 2005. At that time all applications will be ranked, and the applications with the highest environmental benefit points will be funded first and all other applications will be ranked in descending order until all EQIP funds are obligated.

Farmers and landowners are encouraged to sign up as soon as possible. As land user sign up for EQIP, the Natural Conservation Resources Service staff will work with the producer to identify eligible practices needed on their farm, explain ranking, criteria and develop a conservation plan that will be ready to rank following the January 31st cutoff date. EQIP funds are available to producers through contracts that run from 2 years

to as long as 10 years. Tishomingo -County had 35 contracts funded last year for \$84,000.

Funds will be used this year



to provide cost share assistance in the area of grazing lands, forestry, sedimentation, and soil erosion. Some of the eligible practices available include livestock watering facilities (pond and tough), heavy use area protection, cross fencing, fertilization and liming, weed control, critical for area stabilization, grassland: forestland; grade structures, stabilization sediment basin, diversions, terraces, grassed waterways for water quality protection.







Consolidated Farm & Rural Development Act Authorizes Designation **Of Tishomingo County To Receive FSA Disaster Loan Applications**

Emergency loans for farmers, ranchers, and operators are available through the Alcorn County Office of the Farm Service Agency, Harold Mills, FSA Farm Loan Manager, said today

Mr. Mills said this authority is pursuant to President Bush's declaration on September 23, 2004, of a major disaster in Alabama, caused by hurricane Ivan that occurred from September 13, 2004, and continuing. As a result of this disaster, Tishomingo County as a contiguous county in Mississippi is named as an area eligible for Federal Disaster assistance pursuant to Section 321(a) of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development

Applications for assistance in the disaster-stricken county will be accepted by FSA through May 23, 2005.

Farmers qualifying for emergency loans may borrow up to 100 percent of their actual production loss or the amount needed to restore their operation to its pre-disaster condition, whichever is less. The new emergency loan and outstanding principle balance of any existing emergency loan

owed by the applicant or any individual member of an entity cannot exceed \$500,000.00.

FSA emergency loans cover losses from designated disasters and are made to qualified farmers who cannot obtain credit from other lenders in the local area.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture, (USDA) prohibits discrimination in all its programs and activities on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, religion, age, disability, political beliefs, sexual orientation, or marital or familial status. 



Family members ere called and the sons, sonsn-law, and nephews all gathred gear and, boats to look for Ir. Jack. Emergency personrel were also alerted to the capsized boat, and everyone came involved in an intensive search.

As soon as the family mem-Ile, bers arrived with their boat, Finis insisted that he go with them to search. The time was now about 7:20. Finis knew the approximate location of where they had capsized. They used their limited light power to scan the top of the water as they proceeded out to the channel area. Once in the channel they cut the motor, and were happily surprised to hear omeone yelling. It was Mr. Jack.

Mr. Jack had cut the rope on he anchor and used it to tie himself to the boat. He had halfway pulled himself up on to the boat and was able to keep his head above water. He had to fight to keep from going to sleep. Rescue workers were able to get Mr. Jack out of the water. They wrapped him in blankets, and two family members laid down beside him to give him their body heat. An ambulance waiting on shore ransported Mr. Jack and Finis to Juka's North MS Medical Center. Finis was treated and released that night. Mr. Jack, who was released from the hospital on Sunday, said he felt fine although he did learn that he suffered a light heart attack during his approximate six hours in the cold water. Ann Ivy added that she had become alarmed when her husband and Dad had not made it home by dark and alerted family who headed toward Eastport, before being sent to Coleman Park.

This family is so thankful for all the help they received from Mr. Baxter, the area's Emergency Personnel, and their extended family. Ann Ivy, the wife and mother, added that she is so thankful that her husband and father are safe. They all give all the praise and glory for this Thanksgiving Miracle to God.
