### Tishomingo County Development Foundation Meets At Belmont City Hall

The Tishomingo County Development Foundation Board of Directors held its January monthly meeting at Belmont City Hall. Board Chairman John R. White moderated the meeting.

Board members heard a report on the status of the Pickwick Lake proposal from committee chairman Ken Cooley. An ad hoc committee is near an agreement on the proposed marina and resort development by Pickwick Pines Re-

Board members heard a report on the Whitfield future expansion project. Tishomingo County Economic Development Authority thanked for investing EDA funds in winterization of the former Jacuzzi Building. The project may create up to 60 new jobs. Additional funding for renovation of the county-owned industrial building is ex-

pected from the Mississippi Development Authority.

Board members heard a confidential report on a code named industrial project that is considering Tishomingo County for a new operation.

Board members discussed the proposal of a company interested in leasing an industrial building in Burnsville.

Board members agreed to sponsor a campaign to raise private funds for marketing Tishomingo County. All funds raised will be used only for marketing the county.

Board members discussed a proposal of a company interested in purchasing an industrial building in Iuka.

Board members discussed the start-up of Heavenly Comfort Furniture in part of the former Holland Building in Burnsville. A wholesale and retail company called Furniture, Fabrics, and More is start-

ing up in part of the building.

Board members received notice that the Tishomingo County Development Foundation had received a marketing matching grant from the Mississippi Development Authority for \$994.63.

Chairman John R. White appointed a budget committee consisting of Greg Pharr, Gary Walker, and Dan Young.

Board members authorized a foundation staff person to attend the February 3-4, 2005, Northeast Mississippi Economic Competitiveness Council Retreat at Ole Miss. The retreat is sponsored by the CREATE Foundation to work on a regional economic development strategy.

The next foundation board meeting will be Tuesday, February 8, 2005. The public is invited to meetings of the foundation.

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department has recovered a 4-wheel drive Kubota Lawn Tractor stolen in Oct., 2004. On Dec. 30, the Sheriff's Department was contacted by a local resident concerning a tractor sitting in the parking lot at Fairview Church on CR 356.

A deputy went to Fairview to check on the tractor and the VIN number showed the tractor as stolen. Inv. Jamie Reynolds contacted Tupelo Police Department and was informed that the \$10,000 tractor and its trailer had been stolen in Oct. of 2004. The mower was returned to the TPD for further investigation.

### Iuka Man Sentenced To Ten Years for Kidnapping

An Iuka man has been sentenced to 10 years in prison for the kidnapping of a woman from an Alabama gasoline station in 2004.

Charles Casey Parsons, 28, entered an open plea in Tishomingo County Circuit Court last Friday, January 14, 2005; and, Judge Paul Funderburk sentenced Parsons to 30 years in prison with 20 suspended and 10 to serve. Parsons is also required to serve five years of Post Release Supervision and pay a \$5,000

fine plus court costs.

Parsons was arrested in January of 2004 for kidnapping his ex-wife at knife-point. On January 7, 2004, Parsons kidnapped his ex-wife from the Paradise Food Mart near Cherokee, AL. He then brought her to Mississippi and held her and reportedly sexually assaulted her against her will in an abandoned manufactured home at 124A CR 193. The trailer was located on Parsons' family's land. The trailer had no electricity or heat

at the time.

Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department Deputies Jon Tapp and Scott Hyde spotted the car around 9:30 a.m. on Thursday, January 8, 2004. The suspect was found hiding in a closet. The deputies apprehended Parsons, and he was arrested and carried to jail.

Charles Casey Parsons was sentenced during the January term of Tishomingo County Circuit Court presided over by the Honorable Judge Paul Funderburk.

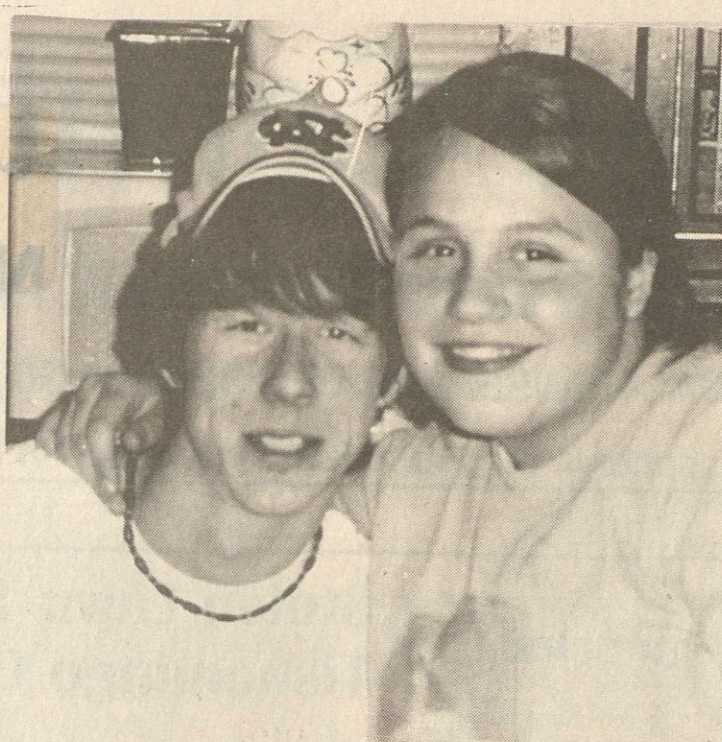

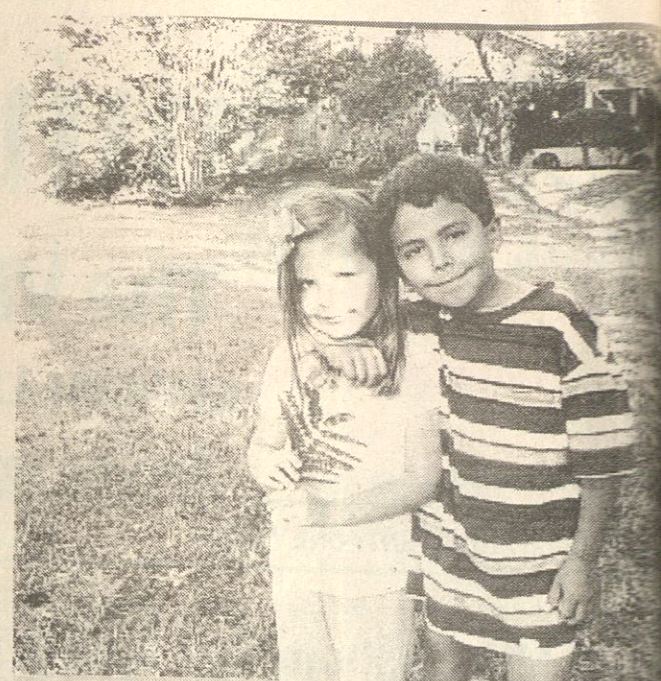

3. Now for surgery. The procedure lasting up to 2 hours, generally performed in the surgeon's office with anesthesia or light sedation. An incision is made in the gum tissue exposing the jawbone, a hole is gently and precisely drilled for the implant. The surgeon then starts with a narrow pilot drill, gradually increasing until he's reached the size of the implant. The implant is screwed into place.

What happens next can vary according to your health and the implant selected, and the specialist you're consulting. A number of specialists have you've got to wait anywhere from 3 to 8 months for submerged implants to completely osseointegrate before they can be uncovered and mounted with permanent restorations.

Some take the "traditional" route, covering the implant with gum tissue, placing sutures, and waiting for weeks or months of healing. Others maintain the permanent crown, bridge, or denture can be fitted into as soon as a permitted type of implant being within weeks, or even a month. This is known as "immediate loading." (Dozens of varieties are available for quick loading.)

While individual needs and teeth are different, the lower jaw may receive only six to 10 implants, while the upper jaw will support 12 to 14 teeth to be joined as a one-piece unit. Says Glenn J. Wolf, DMD, a Fort Washington, Pennsylvania, prosthodontist who is a clinical instructor at the Columbia University School of Dental and Oral Surgery, "The rationale is over-engineering," says Neeraj, a prosthodontist at the University of Michigan. That way, if any implants eventually fail, there are others there for backup.

## Legal Update

**THE FIRST STEP**  
Once your attorney deems that your case warrants legal action in a civil court, he or she will file a petition. This document, which officially requests the court's assistance in resolving a dispute, specifically identifies the plaintiff and the defendant and describes the matter that it wishes the court to decide. Included in the complaint will also be the plaintiff's suggestion for resolution of the issue. For instance, the plaintiff may ask for monetary damages. As soon as the petition has been filed with the administrative clerk of the court, the lawsuit officially begins. The court will then notify the defendant of the plaintiff's charge and will include a copy of the complaint in the notification.

If you believe your dispute warrants a case in civil court or a civil suit has been brought against you, your first course of action is to speak with an attorney. ## Project Homestead Sponsors "Kid's Survival Kit"

Tishomingo County Project Homestead Task Force is sponsoring a drive to provide our local Family & Children's Services with items to include in a foster kid's survival kit. Most of you know that the Mississippi Department of Human Services has had significant budget cuts over the last year or so. The money that was available for emergencies has dried up completely. When a child is removed from the home, he/she often leaves with little or nothing, sometimes with only the clothes on his/her back. Often infants are taken with no extra diapers or other necessities. The initial placement allowance provided to the foster family will not cover ALL of the needs of the child, and often the foster parents must spend money out of their own pockets to provide these necessities. Project Homestead is asking for help from the community to fill this gap. Following is a list of items desperately needed:

- Diapers, size 1 and up
- Bottles (new or gently used and CLEAN), and pacifiers (new, in package please)
- Personal care items, such as child size toothbrushes, toothpaste, hairbrushes and combs, shampoo (new, in package, please)
- Pajamas, sizes 6 month to child size 12 (new or gently worn & CLEAN)
- Socks & underwear, child sizes (new only, please)
- Gift cards or gift certificates to LOCAL grocery and/or discount stores, in any amount, the larger the better, of course.
- Tote bags, backpacks or luggage - Many children who have some items to carry with them often have nothing but a grocery or garbage bag in which to put their things. It

helps the dignity of a child to have HIS things in HIS bag during such a traumatic time. Please send new or "gently worn" items, only. Luggage that will not stay closed or has no handle is not usable.

Tishomingo County is the most caring and wonderful place to live. Recently, the people of this county have responded to the needs of our soldiers in Iraq, as well as the tsunami victims. ### Municipality Election Process A Little Different This Year

Municipalities in Tishomingo County are scheduled to elect new Mayors and Boards of Aldermen in 2005. Belmont, Burnsville, Golden, Iuka, Paden, and Tishomingo will all be holding elections.

The official deadline to file qualifying fees and statements of intent for the offices of Mayor, Alderman, and Chief of Police (where elected) will be Friday, March 4th, 2005, at 5:00 p.m.

This year, qualifiers must fill out necessary paperwork, obtain the signatures of 50 qualified voters, and file a Pre-Primary election Campaign finance report by the appropriate date. (Signatures of 50 rather than 25 voters is different this year. (Qualifiers will need to pick up their paperwork earlier to allow time to secure the required 50 signatures.)

If needed Party primaries will be held on May 3, 2005. The Run-Off election, if needed, will be held on May 10.

The General Election will be held on June 7, 2005. Newly elected officials are scheduled to take office on July 4, 2005, according to information from the Mississippi Secretary of State.

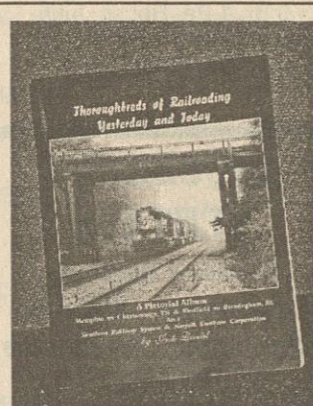


### TCHS Vo-Tech Future Business Leaders Of America Attend District Conference

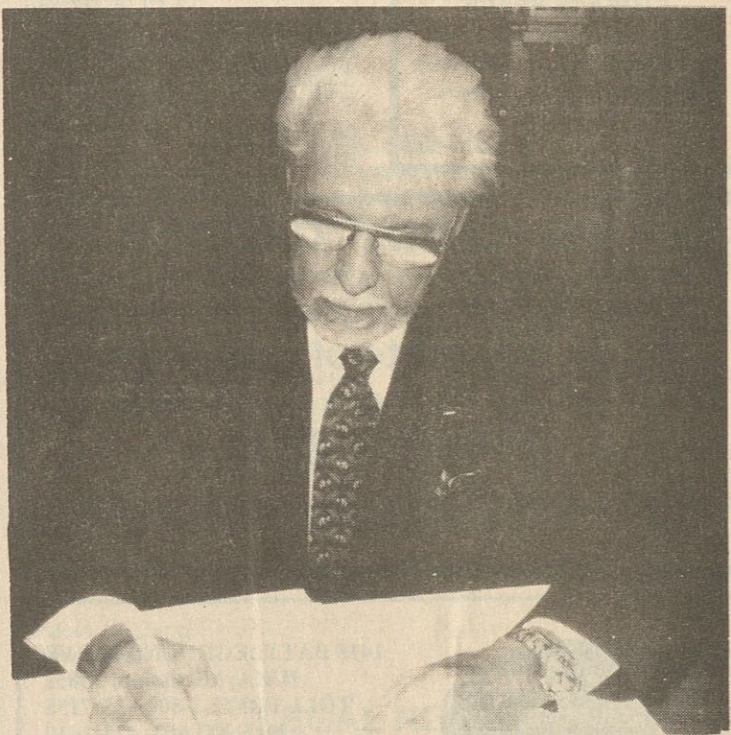

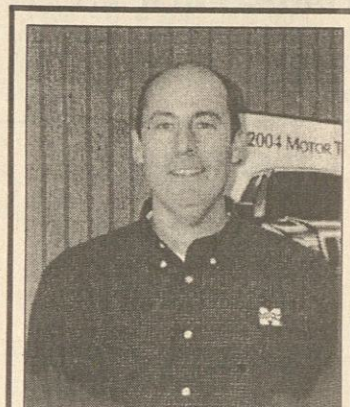

## Letter To The Editor...

As I write this letter, I want to first make clear I have nothing against hunting. I myself hunted in my teenage years until I decided there was no challenge to it and got bored. I do not want anyone to misread this letter and associate me in any way to whomever wrote the anti-hunting letters last month. All those letters did was keep in my mind longer an incident that occurred just inside the area where the Tombigbee hunting club hunts on November 23 of last year.

My family had a 12 year old registered chow (cinnamon in color). She had been with us since we purchased her from a chow kennel in central Mississippi when she was less than 3 months old. She was fixed, was good natured (had never bitten in her life) and loved our family more than most dogs could possibly show toward their owners. We were very attached to her also, and going on 12 years she was still in great health. She was good to bark when a stranger pulled up but that was as far as she would go. She was also deathly afraid of guns and the sounds they made. Even when my two sons would come out with pellet guns to shoot at targets, as soon as she saw the guns she went straight into her doghouse and stayed till the guns were put up.

She mostly stayed home except when we left or a few other rare occasions would walk with traffic up the side of the road and visit with neighbors and other dogs awhile and would come back home on the otherside. This dog never bothered anyone; she didn't care about the deer that passed through the yard or even rabbits. She just was never hostile or chased even other animals.

Now to the incident. On Tuesday afternoon of Nov. 23, we petted our extended family member as we headed for Corinth. As we left, she too decided to head up the road on her own journey. A couple of hours later we were nearing

home at one end of county road 177 near the edge of the hunting club when we came up on our chow's lifeless body lying just off the roadway facing home.

Upon investigation I determined she was headed away from the shooter towards home on her usual route up the side of the road and was shot from behind. The angle also suggested the coward shot her as he stood at the opposite side of the road at quite a good distance away from her.

This was done for no reason, as she wouldn't go up to strangers and bother them either. She was obviously getting further away; and if this person didn't like her walking down the road, he could've fired in the air. She would've gotten home in record time from fright.

It's a good thing I couldn't find her killer in the first few weeks before I cooled down because even in my belief of God, I probably would've done something drastic confronting them. I am still bothered and pray that I find out who shot her, but I have since through Church and prayer calmed my anger.

This letter basically allow me to get the rest of my bad feelings off my chest. Maybe the guilty party will read this. If he has an ounce of faith, maybe he'll feel sorry for his actions. A family is now without a cherished member and as far as even getting another (although it won't be the Lady Bridgett we came to love like a family member). With money tight around our house, I don't foresee being able to get another like her in the near future. All we have is her marked final resting place beside our home.
