Boys & Girls Club Of Iuka Students Awarded Presidential Freedom Scholarship

Jessica Davis and Rebecca Jooker each have been awarded a \$1,000 Presidential Freedom Scholarship from the Corporation for National and Community Service and Boys & Girls Clubs of America in acknowledgement of their outstanding commitment to public service. Two-Year Old Involved In Accidental Shooting

A two-year old boy accidentally shot himself last Tuesday, January 18 at the home of his Uncle and Aunt on Eastport Street in Burnsville.

The youngster's mother had left him at his Aunt's house while she ran to the grocery store. The young boy, who stayed at the Eastport home often, went down the hall to a closet where his toys were kept. "The Aunt said she thought he was still playing with the closet toys when she heard a gunshot," according to

Burnsville Police Chief Danny Dillard. Apparently the child had gone into a bedroom and found a small gun on the bedside table. When he tried to pick up the gun, it discharged. The bullet hit the child in the lower left side of his body.

The Aunt immediately called 911 and EMT's were quickly on the scene. The two-year old was transported by ambulance to North MS Medical Center in Iuka, and then airlifted to LeBonheur in Memphis.

Police Chief Dillard said he had talked with family members on Monday, January 24, and that the child had returned home from the hospital and was progressing satisfactorily after receiving damage to his intestinal system. The child is expected to fully recover from the unfortunate accident.

Police Chief Dillard said this shooting has been ruled an accident. He also cautioned everyone to double check their homes to make sure that all guns are out of the reach of youngsters.

Roger Clark Appointed Second Judicial District Circuit Court Judge By Gov. Haley Barbour

Roger Clark, an Iuka native, has been appointed as a U.S. Magistrate by Mississippi Governor Haley Barbour.

Barbour appointed Clark, of Gulfport, MS, to fill the unexpired term of U. S. Magistrate Judge Robert Walker, effective January 1, 2005. Clark joins three other judges in the Second Judicial Circuit Court District, which serves Harrison, Hancock, and Stone Counties.

The Iuka native began practicing law in Gulfport 35 years ago, primarily as an insurance defense attorney. He was one of several lawyers considered and reviewed by a judicial advisory committee, who submitted

recommendations to the Governor.

Barbour spokesman, Pete Smith, said that Clark is one of the most respected, well-known lawyers on the coast and added that the governor knows that Clark will do a great job.

Roger Clark comes from a family of lawyers. His father and grandfather were attorneys, and he has a brother (Richard) and a son in the practice of law.

Roger is a 1958 graduate of Iuka High School. He is also a graduate of University of Mississippi School of Law, and he is a member of the American College of Trial Lawyers, American Board of Trial Advocates, and the Mississippi Bar Foundation. Clark has been recognized in the book,

Fresh Touch Fellowship Is Now Sponsoring A Food Outreach Program Available to All Angel Food Ministries

Fresh Touch Fellowship formerly Grace Bible Church at 442 CR 172, Iuka, is now sponsoring the Angel Food Ministries program. One of their outreach programs. According to Fresh Touch's Heath Lovelace, this ministry has been considered several months, and is finally becoming a reality. This for-profit food ministry, Angel Food Ministries, operates in more than 28 states and trains the food through food distributors. Fresh Touch Fellowship has been looking for a way to help the people in this area, and they feel this ministry will provide the opportunity to help others.

Tishomingo County Improves Economic Ranking

Tishomingo County has been removed from the most distressed county category by the Mississippi State Tax Commission as of January 2005.

Tishomingo County has been rated Tier 3, the lowest rating that indicates long term economic distress. The Mississippi State Tax Commission issues the county ratings based upon a combination of the highest unemployment rate and the lowest per capita income for the most recent 36 month period. The county ratings are used in calculating the amount of certain types of incentives available to business and industry. The ratings allow great incentives in economically distressed counties. For example,

in a Tier 3, "less developed" county, a Jobs Tax Credit of \$2,000 per year for five years is allowed if ten or more jobs are created by certain types of businesses. In a Tier 2, "moderately developed" county, the Jobs Tax Credit is \$1,000 per year for five years if 15 or more jobs are created. In a Tier 1, "developed" county, the Jobs Tax Credit is \$500 per year for five years if 20 or more jobs are created.

Tishomingo County's "promotion" to Tier 2 indicates that long term unemployment is improving and per capita incomes are increasing. Tishomingo County ranks number 30 out of 82 counties with number 1 Jefferson

County having the greatest economic distress and number 82 Rankin County having the highest employment and per capita income. Other county rankings in Northeast Mississippi are Lee County at number 67; Itawamba County at number 66; Alcorn County at number 57; Prentiss County at number 37; and Monroe County at number 25. In 2000, Tishomingo County ranked number 24; fell to number 21 in 2001; increased to number 23 in 2002; fell again to number 22 in 2003; and increased to number 27 in 2004.

Plants closings or an economic recession in the future could put Tishomingo County back into the Tier 3 category.

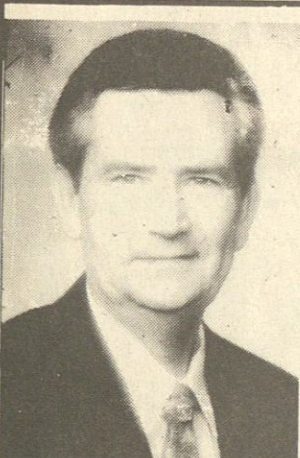

Legal Update

PRODUCT LIABILITY
Strict liability is a special set of rules that allows people who are injured by defective or unexpectedly dangerous products to win compensation from the manufacturer or seller of the product. Strict liability applies whether or not the maker or seller of the product was actually negligent. The ruling is that those who have been injured by a consumer product are entitled to compensation from the manufacturer or from the business that sold or rented the product, whether or not they sold or rented it directly to the consumer. Strict liability operates against a non-manufacturer who rented or sold a product only if it is in the business of regularly renting or selling those particular kinds of products.

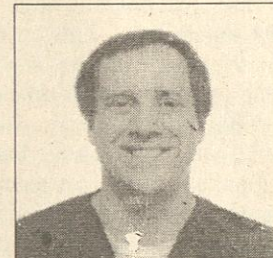

4. During the week after surgery, you return to the surgeon's or periodontist's office for suture removal and to make sure the healing is off to a good start. Follow-up visits may be scheduled for progress checks and to make sure there's no sign of infection.

5. In the case of individual front teeth, the implant typically is given a temporary crown right away. It's placed high or low enough so it doesn't touch the opposing tooth and isn't subjected to unnecessary pressure. The reason? To help the gum contour heal properly in such a prominent area. Otherwise, after a period of weeks or months, you return to the surgeon or periodontist, who exposes the head of the implants, and screws a permanent ceramic or metal abutment atop each one. These abutments become the attachment mechanisms for restorations.

6. You return to your general dentist or prosthodontist, who takes an impression of the head of the abutment.

Orientation For MS Naturalist Program Scheduled At Crow's Neck February 15th

The Mississippi Naturalist program will be conducted at Crow's Neck Environmental Education and Conference Center over a ten week period starting February 22nd.

Orientation is scheduled for 10:00 a.m. on February 15, 2005, at Crow's Neck Environmental Education and Conference Center, located in north-east Tishomingo. Crow's Neck occupies a 530-acre peninsula Bay Springs Lake. Rolling topography and vistas of wooded shoreline dominate the landscape. The peninsula supports a multitude of wildflowers, trees, ferns, insects, birds, amphibians, reptiles, and mammals.

Mississippi's Naturalist program serves to fill a growing need for knowledgeable individuals to assist with environmental education programs and projects at Crow's Neck, according to CN executive director Patricia Harrell. Activities will include presenting school programs, manning the information kiosk, and hosting environmental festivals. Trained volunteers may also contribute by working on the maintenance of nature trails, tending the Cens Butterflies and Native plant gardens, and by developing environmental education curriculum and programs.

Each participant that becomes a Mississippi Naturalist is required to provide restitution to Crow's Neck for this training in the form of service hours. An example of volunteer service

would be leading a program or doing an environment support project, Harrell said.

"Volunteers have a chance to give back to nature and guide others in the direction of environmental awareness by using Crow's Neck as a showcase for their knowledge."

According to Harrell, the structure of the Mississippi Naturalist Program largely follows that of the highly successful volunteer training effort, similarly offered through Extension Services in a number of states. Participants attend a full day of training sessions offered over a 10-week period, ranging on a variety of topics. Participants are required to pass a practical examination which focuses on topics of plant and habitat identification, and to develop an individual course project. Trained volunteers must also complete a period for service at Crow's Neck.

Course sessions will include plant identification, geology, weather, basic ecological principles, introduction to habitats, survey of organisms, watersheds and water quality, habitat regulation and management, ecological potpourri and environmental education activities.

There was also 1 felony shoplifting from Rainbow Dollar Store, Main St., Tishomingo. The shoplifter was arrested and automobile seized, due to drug related charges.

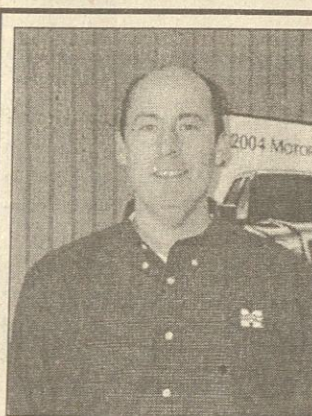

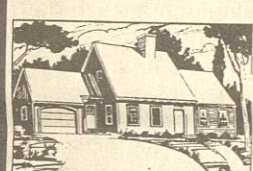
