Monday Morning Fire Destroys Burnsville Home

On early Monday morning, February 28, fire completely destroyed the 4203 home of Gary Hubbard. A call from a neighbor alerted the fire to the 9-1-1 at approximately 1:30 a.m. No one was at home at the time of the fire. The Burnsville Volunteer Fire Department arrived on the scene at approximately 1:47 a.m. According to Burnsville Fire Chief Ricky Cummings, the roof was already missing when they arrived. The county fire investigator, shown with Chief Cummings, arrived at the scene early Monday morning to try to determine the origin of the fire. A dog in the foreground was returning to the smoking ruins while this photographer was on the scene. When asked about the dog, Hubbard said that the dog had had puppies under the house. All of the puppies perished in the fire.



State Parks Rescued from Legislative Budget Cuts by Cummings' Amendment

The Mississippi House of Representatives voted Thursday, Feb. 24, to set aside \$7 million to keep state parks open in the year that starts July 1. This vote reversed a vote to cut funding for the state parks in a vote the House took last week. Members of the Mississippi House of Representatives said they had been flooded with phone calls and email messages from people wanting to keep the parks running.

Thursday's 110-3 vote came after Representative Ricky Cummings, D-Iuka, offered an amendment to House Bill 1657 that originally would have closed 23 of the 24 state parks as one of many cost-cutting op-

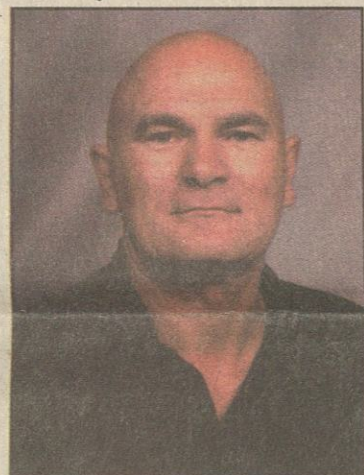
tions. The resounding vote to restore funding for the parks came after some two hours of debate. In a fiery presentation of the amendment by the usually reserved Cummings, he convinced the House on a voice vote that park funding should be restored. Cummings said keeping the parks open improves the state's quality of life and helps to promote tourism and economic development in the state.

Tishomingo Countians are thankful to Cummings and the House for the vote to restore funding for all the state parks, including Tishomingo State Park and J. P. Coleman State Park.

Tishomingo County School District Selects Jimmy Smith as Principal of Year

Jimmy Smith, Principal of Iuka Middle School, has been selected as the 2004-2005 Tishomingo County School District Principal of the Year. Making this announcement, Superintendent John B. Moore said, "Smith strives to make the transitional middle school for students go as smoothly as possible for the students. Moore also added that Smith is genuinely concerned about the academic/social experiences that are so much a part of the lives of our eighth-grade students. With 30 years of educational experience, he has devoted countless hours to improving the quality of education for the students of this community. Iuka Man Arrested in Connection with Theft of Wiring in Alcorn County

Alcorn County Sheriff Jimmy Taylor said that James Tabor, 47, of Iuka along with Todd Rencher, 35, of Alcorn County have each been charged with burglary of a commercial building—the Garan Shirt Factory Building on South Harper Road. The building, which now belongs to Northeast MS Community College, was stripped of copper wiring and aluminum from the heating and air conditioning units in the burglary. The building received extensive damage in the theft. Both men were remanded to the custody of the Alcorn County Sheriff.

Dennis Trading Post Burglary Solved: Two Suspects Arrested

Two suspects have been arrested in the February 15 burglary of the Dennis Trading Post according to Tishomingo County Deputies Mike Kemp and Wayne Ivey.

The suspects entered the store by breaking out the front glass door. They took several packs of cigarettes and approximately \$200 in rolled coins.

On February 21, 2005, the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department deputies reported that Rebecca Bonds and Keith Letson have been arrested and charged with the burglary of a commercial building.

Deputy Kemp received a tip from a Dennis resident concerning a late-model gray SUV that had been seen in the parking lot of the store around the time of the burglary. Deputy Ivey also received information concerning a subject's using rolled coins to purchase items at a local business. Following these tips, TCSD Investigator Jamie Reynolds, along with Kemp and Ivey, worked several days questioning subjects and following up leads that led to the arrest of the suspects.

Rebecca Bonds has been re-

leased on bond, and Keith Letson currently remains in custody at the jail.

Sheriff Glenn Whitlock would like to thank the local residents who came forward with information and asks that anyone with information about criminal activity to call the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department at 423-7000. "With law enforcement and citizens working together, we can make our community safe," according to Sheriff Whitlock.

TCHS FBLA Competes At District Level

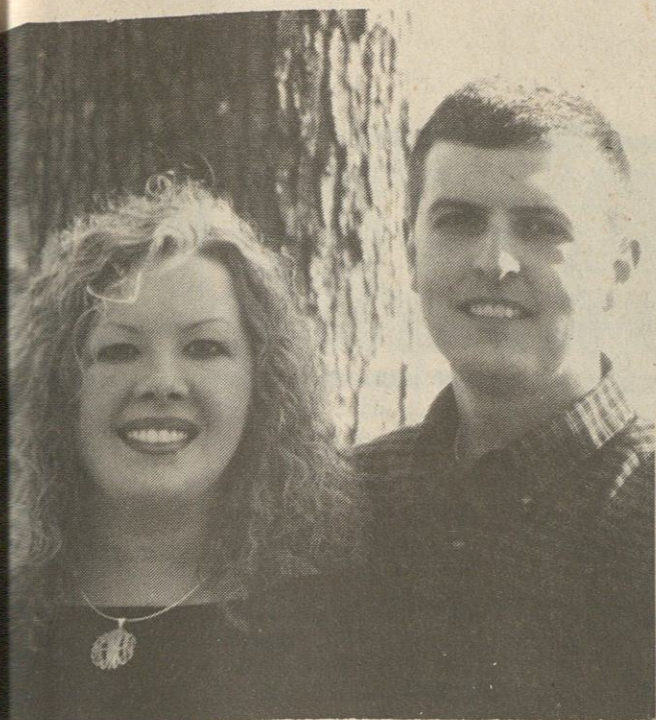
On January 13, TCHS Future Business Leaders of America members traveled to the Tupelo campus of ICC to compete at the district level in twenty-four business-related events.

Jerry Brown Arts Festival Linking Folk Times To Fast Lane

Ninth generation potter Jerry Brown never envisioned the pottery skills he had sitting at his father's as a young child some 45 years ago in rural Northwest Alabama would be passed on to generations of artists, young and old, or as he prefers, folk and traditional, to his hometown of Iuka, Alabama.

In its third year, the Jerry Brown Arts Festival has grown to be one of Alabama's top ten arts events. Word has spread among artists throughout the country about the quality of craftsmanship being shown at this very exclusive festival. Setting this festival apart from many other festivals is the distinction of being a juried, fine arts festival. All work exhibited by artists must be original and creative, and no kits, commercial molds, or fabricated forms are allowed to be exhibited.

The two day festival is slated for Saturday, March 5 and Sunday, March 6 at the E. T. Sims Recreational Facility in Hamilton, Alabama. Saturday's hours are 9 a.m. until 5 p.m., while Sunday's hours are 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. There is no charge for admission.

Artists from throughout Alabama, Georgia, Tennessee, Mississippi, Arkansas, and even as far away as Alaska have confirmed their attendance, many of whom are returning artists at the festival. Another distinction for the Jerry Brown Arts Festival is the great diversity in forms of artistry that will be on display—pottery, quilting, paintings, engraved rocks and stones, handmade baskets and brooms, wood crafting, and blacksmithery.
