

#### **State Parks Rescued from Legislative Budget Cuts by Cummings' Amendment**

Representatives voted Thursday, Feb. 24, to set aside \$7 million to keep state parks open in the year that starts July 1. This vote reversed a vote to cut finding for the state parks in a vote the House took last week. Members of the Mississippi House of Representatives said they had been flooded with phone calls and email messages from people wanting to keep the parks running.

Thursday's 110-3 vote came after Representative Ricky Cummings, D-Iuka, offered an amendment to House Bill 1657 that originally would have closed 23 of the 24 state parks as one of many cost-cutting op-

The Mississippi House of tions. The resounding vote to restore funding for the parks came after some two hours of debate. In a fiery presentation of the amendment by the usually reserved Cummings, he convinced the House on a voice vote that park funding should be restored. Cummings said keeping the parks open improves the state's quality of life and helps to promote tourism and economic development in

#### **Dennis Trading Post Burglary Solved: Two Suspects Arrested**

Two suspects have been arrested in the February 15 burglary of the Dennis Trading Post according to Tishomingo County Deputies Mike Kemp and Wayne Ivey.

The suspects entered the store by breaking out the front glass door. They took several packs of cigarettes and approximately \$200 in rolled coins.

On February 21, 2005, the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department deputies reported that Rebecca Bonds and Keith Letson have been arrested and charged with the burglary of a commercial building.

Deputy Kemp received a tip from a Dennis resident concerning a late-model gray SUV that had been seen in the parking lot of the store around the time of the burglary. Deputy Ivey also received information concerning a subject's using rolled coins to purchase items at a local business. Following these tips, TCSD Investigator Jamie Reynolds, along with Kemp and Ivey, worked several days questioning subjects and following up leads that led to the arrest of the suspects.

leased on bond, and Keith Letson currently remains in custody at the jail.

Sheriff Glenn Whitlock would like to thank the local residents who came forward with information and asks that anyone with information about criminal activity to call the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department at 423-7000. "With law enforcement and citizens working together, we can make our community safe," according to Sheriff Whitlock.

The Myopia Myth?

It is estimated that a full 25% of our population is myopic (nearsighted). Some say this is an inherited condition Statistics disprove this. Before age approximately 4 to 6% of population nearsighted. When these same children finish college, the number varies from 60 to 80%, with a higher percentage among the honor and graduate students. Evidently, there is a connection between the amount of reading we do and nearsightedness.

In a survey of Eskimo families, only 2% of the children who could not read or write showed myopia. Yet among their children who were attending school, approximately 65% were nearsighted. This happened in a single generation in a population known to be somewhat farsighted.

Yet, some still believe that nearsightedness is inherited, that it tends to run in families, although this example shows massive reversal in a single Genetics generation. cannot account for it.

IN SUMMARY

Relatively few civil cases actually go to trial. Some cases are terminated before trial by "dismissal." This is a decision by the court that, even if the facts of the case are true the plaintiff does not have a legally recognized cause of action. That decision can be made on the pleadings alone. In the related event known as "summary judgment," the court determines that there are really no facts in controversy and the undisputed facts indicate that one party should win the case as a matter of law. The court can either decide the whole case in summary judgment, which ends the case, or a part of it, which reduces the issues to be tried.

Motioning for a summary judgment is also a way to avoid a trial when a plaintiff's claim is patently baseless. The courts do not like wasting time to settle a suit that is frivolous or of a vindictive nature. If you are sued, speak with an attorney about the course of action to take in your defense.
