Olive Branch Fisherman Missing On Tennessee River

Boat Found Saturday Morning On Alabama Beach

Plans to fish in a weekend tournament turned tragic last Friday when a 47-year old Olive Branch man did not report back to an assigned meeting place to join his fishing friends.

According to Paul Parker's buddies, John Smith and Billy Robilio of Southaven, MS, all three of the men had launched their boats about 7:30 a.m. Friday morning at the ramp on the north side of the MS State Line on Hwy. 25 North. During the day, Friday, the March winds (unofficially) gusted from 30 to 50 miles per hour in the area. The men were searching for good spots to fish in Saturday's upcoming tournament.

The men were supposed to meet back at the Stateline launching point at 2:30 p.m. Friday afternoon. Parker did not show up for the scheduled meeting. When the men could not reach Parker by cell phone,

they alerted Water Patrol authorities from Mississippi, Tennessee, and Alabama—who all began to search for Parker.

According to Tishomingo County Rescue Squad President, David Rice, the report was called into Tishomingo County 9-1-1 about 9:00 p.m. on Friday night, and members of the rescue squad immediately joined the search. From two to six members of the Tishomingo County Squad have been on the water since that time.

At approximately 11:00 a.m. on Saturday morning, TVA Police found Parker's black and white Skeeter Bass boat with a big Yamaha motor on it aground on the Alabama side of the Tennessee River. A life jacket was also found on the opposite side of the river that same day. It has not been determined at this time if this life jacket belonged to Parker.

Lt. Roy Ellis of the Alabama Marine Police said that when authorities found Parker's boat between Panther Creek and State Line Island, his expensive fishing gear—8 to 10 rods and reels (one of these had his wife's name, Brenda, on it) had been removed from the boat. Ellis said the lack of fishing equipment in the boat was unusual. He also added that it was possible that someone may have taken the equipment from Parker's empty boat. "There were no signs of any struggle."

Parker, retired from the US Navy, is a tournament angler and has competed in many FLW Outdoors tournaments.

At this time Parker is still listed as missing. Authorities are hopeful that he will soon be found. Divers have not been dispatched because the authorities don't know where to look. The search for Parker is continuing on a daily basis.

- Social Security Card

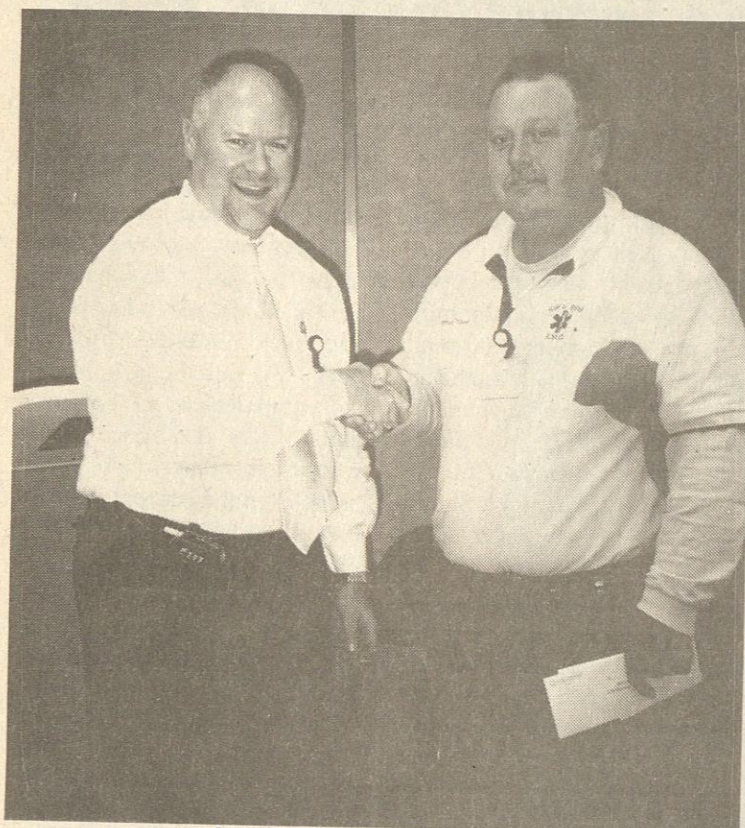
Teachers all across the County are looking forward to meeting parents and students on registration day.

The Procedure

Your general dentist handles standard root canal cases, while complex cases involving curved, narrow, or multiple root canals are referred to an endodontic specialist who specializes in the treatment of the tooth.

Step 1 - Numbing the tooth. These days, advanced anesthesia forestall any possible pain. Buchanan points to Septacaine (generic articaine, the first anesthetic that spreads through tissue), and to a new anesthetic delivery method through opening made in the tooth. This latter approach gives 100% numbness - pain difficult or impossible to achieve, especially in the molars.

Step 2 - Widening the root canal. After cleaning the root canal, a small hole is made in the top or back of the tooth usually with an air-driven bur. That's the noisy part (Earplugs come in handy here.) Next, a successively progressively wider, tapered files (which look like pins but have serrated edges) are used to clear out this space. State-of-the-art files made of nickel titanium hyperflexible metal allow five times stronger stainless steel and are more flexible," says Buchanan. Not only do new files cut the time by half, but they require less of a learning curve than traditional files and they reportedly give a superior result.

LIVING TOGETHER

In this country, the number of unmarried adults living together, has grown to 11 million, a growing proportion of which are over age 65. These couples may be cohabiting because they do not wish to mix their assets or lose Social Security/pension benefits acquired through a previous marriage. One common misperception is that if you live with someone for a number of years, you are a common-law wife or husband. This is not true. While fifteen states recognize common-law marriages, in these states, you must "hold yourself out to be married" to qualify as married. This means using the same last name, having a joint checking account, of filing joint tax returns.

Glaucoma Tests

If you're past the age of 35 and have your eyes checked regularly by your eye doctor, one of the tests he or she will make is for glaucoma. The symptoms of this disease are often difficult to detect in its early stages, but glaucoma is a very serious disease that can cause blindness if not treated early enough.

In glaucoma, there is either too much fluid produced by the eye or the fluid does not drain normally, causing a buildup of pressure within the eyeball. As the disease progresses, this can cause many symptoms in addition to painful eye pressure. Among them are blurred vision that comes and goes, seeing colored rings around lights, a loss in side vision, and difficulty in focusing.

Tests made by your eye doctor will include checking the optic nerve for any signs of the disease. You will also be given the tonometry test, which measures the pressure in your eyes. This is a completely painless test - but an important one.

Salt & Pepper Shakers On Display At Iuka Public Library

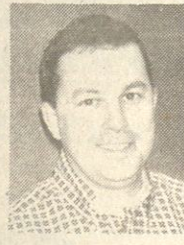

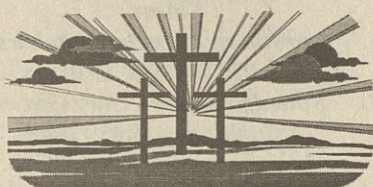
Easter Egg Hunt At Iuka Library...
