Alabama Escapee Sited Iuka On Sunday Remains At Large

Area residents are warned on the lookout for a man who walked away from a Department work program between 12:30 and 1:15 p.m. Friday, March 18. George Justin Knoblock, an escapee from the Iuka, AL, Police Department was seen in Iuka on Sunday, March 21.

Knoblock was incarcerated on DUI, driving while armed, switched tag, open container, probation violation, second degree possession of marijuana.

According to authorities, Knoblock was spotted at the Brian Inn on Hwy. 72 on Sunday, March 20. He and his friend, Katie Elizabeth, had checked into the inn about 5:30 a.m. Sunday

morning. They checked out about 6 p.m. on that same night. Upon leaving the motel Knoblock learned that his girlfriend planned to take him back to Decatur, and he ran from Zent's vehicle, a green Ford Aerostar, on foot. When he ran, he had no money or transportation. The escapee was last seen wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt and blue jeans.

Still No Word On Missing Man

Authorities still have not located missing fisherman, Paul Parker, 47, of Olive Branch, MS. Parker, who was checking out fishing spots for a March 12 tournament at Pickwick, has been missing since Friday March 11. Parker's boat was found on the bank on Saturday on the Alabama side of the Tennessee River.

Water Patrol authorities from Alabama, Tennessee, and Mississippi have continued to search for Parker since his disappearance.

Tishomingo County Rescue Squad President, David Rice, said the Rescue Squad has plans to take part in a combined, concentrated search by all the involved water patrol agencies on Wednesday of this week; however, weather could possibly interfere with the search effort. Rice said that the Tishomingo County Rescue volunteers have continued to search for Parker on an almost-daily basis.

Burnsville Drug Store Broken Into Early Tuesday Morning Three Arrested in Tuscumbia, Alabama

The Burnsville Discount Drugs located in the East Burnsville Shopping Center on Hwy. 72 was burglarized early Tuesday morning, March 22. A large amount of prescription drugs were taken, and it appeared that no narcotics were included in the haul.

A call from a security company at around 12:30 a.m. Tuesday morning alerted the local 9-1-1 authorities of an apparent break-in. The owner of the store was also notified.

When authorities arrived, they found that the heavy metal door at the back of the building had been pried open. This door received extensive damage. There was also

damage to the roof of the building. No intruders were found.

Three suspects were apprehended in Tuscumbia, AL, later Tuesday morning in connection with the break-in. According to authorities, a patrolman stopped to question the occupants of a vehicle parked on the side of the road. The patrolman first questioned the three and let them go. The officer, however, became suspicious some time later when he found that this same vehicle had returned to the same location. He again stopped to question the occupants of the vehicle. When the patrolman asked them why

they had returned to the same spot, the three made some excuse about losing some keys earlier. The patrolman made a closer examination of the vehicle and found two garbage cans full of what appeared to be prescription drugs.

The three suspects—two adults and one juvenile—were arrested for possession of drugs and are currently being held by the Tuscumbia, AL, authorities. After release from Tuscumbia, the three suspects will be brought back to Tishomingo County to face burglary charges. Authorities declined to name the suspects at this time.



Tip Leads to Recovery of Stolen Vehicle Near Tombigbee Boat Ramp in Burnsville

A truck missing since last summer was discovered near the Tombigbee Boat Ramp in Burnsville on Monday of last week. Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock reported that a Burnsville citizen told him that there might be a submerged vehicle in the area of the ramp. The Burnsville man said that he had been told by a man who had been fishing recently in the area that he had discovered what he believed to be a submerged vehicle. The fisherman said that his line had become entangled on an under-

water object; when he finally freed his line, he found a windshield wiper blade on the end of the line.

Divers from the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department found a submerged vehicle late Monday afternoon, March 21, approximately 250 feet from the end of the boat ramp. McRae's Wrecker and Timbes' Wrecker were called to the scene to help retrieve the vehicle. When the truck was brought to the surface, it was determined to be a maroon Chevrolet pickup. This truck had been reported stolen almost

a year ago from Corinth.

Officials at the Corinth Police Department were notified of the recovery of the stolen vehicle, and it was secured for their investigation.

Sheriff Whitlock wants to thank everyone involved in the recovery of this vehicle, especially the divers and the wrecker crew personnel. Whitlock would also like to encourage anyone who witnesses any criminal, or suspicious activity, to please report it to the Sheriff's Department at 662-423-7000 or to their local law enforcement officials.

Middle Age And Presbyopia

If you're having trouble in focusing your eyes when reading a book or newspaper, this may indicate that your eyes' focusing ability has reached the stage of presbyopia. This is a natural occurrence for most people, especially when they enter middle-age. They feel the need to hold reading material further away from their eyes in order to read it clearly. They may also experience headaches because of the strain this puts on their vision.

Presbyopia results from the normal aging process of the lens of the eye. It comes on very gradually and can become a problem at any age. It occurs most often, however, between the ages of 40 and 45. This condition continues to need correction until about age 65 or 70 when the condition tends to stabilize.

Treatment for presbyopia consists of properly prescribed eyeglasses. If you have a focusing problem when reading or looking at objects close up, have your eyes examined by your eye doctor.



Legal Update

FOR WHAT IT'S WORTH
If you are injured in an accident, you must be compensated by the liable party for such things as medical expenses, lost income, pain and suffering, permanent disability, emotional damages, damaged property, etc. To that end, the insurance adjuster for the liable party adds up the total medical expenses (medical special damages, or "specials") and uses that figure to calculate how much to compensate you for pain, suffering, and other non-monetary losses ("general" damages). The special damages are multiplied by a factor of 1.5 or 2 when the injuries are relatively minor, and up to 5 or 10 in serious cases. That total is then added to lost income, and the number forms the basis from which negotiations begin.

There is no restriction on the types of non-monetary losses that can increase the general damages sought by injury victims. 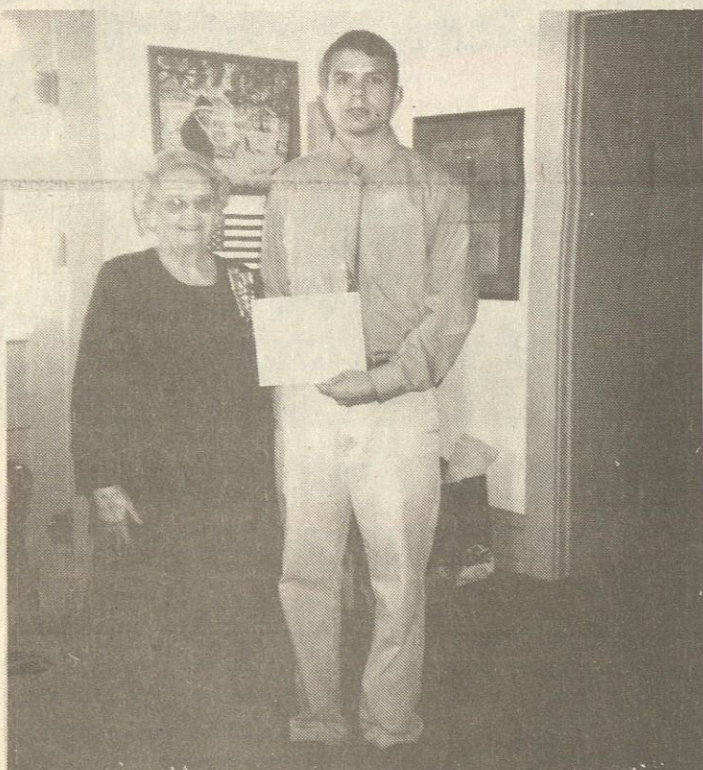

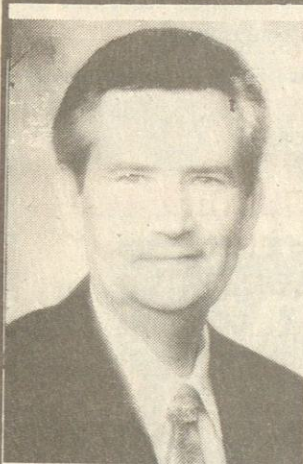

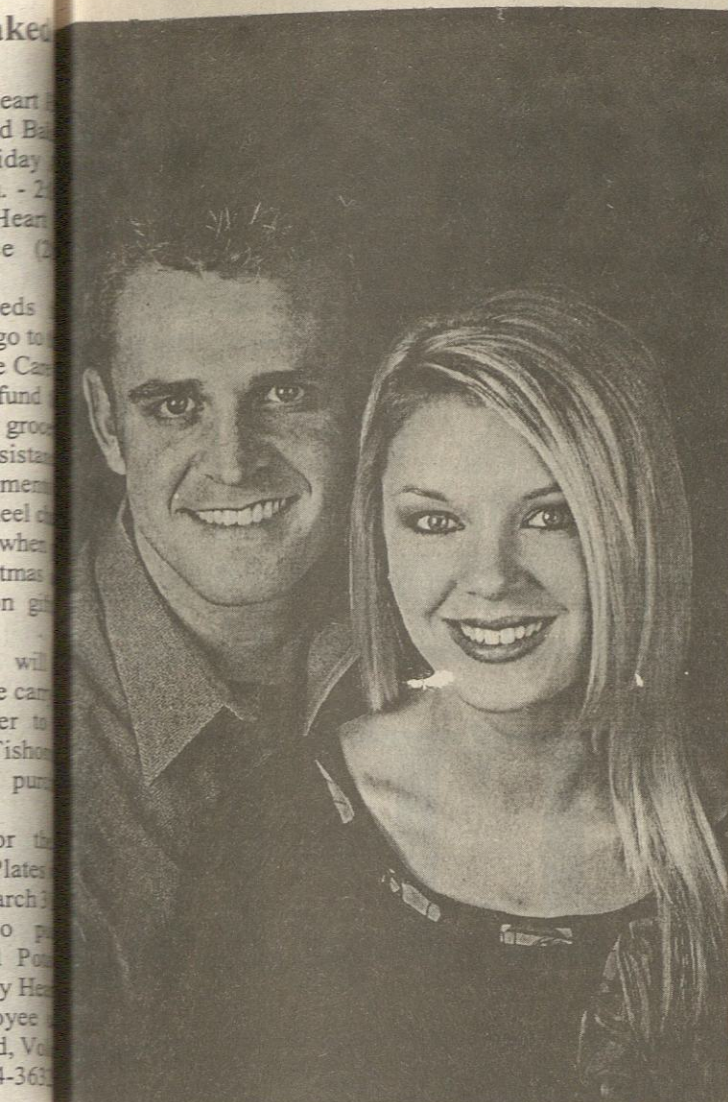

Tishomingo Co. Development Foundation Meets in Tishomingo

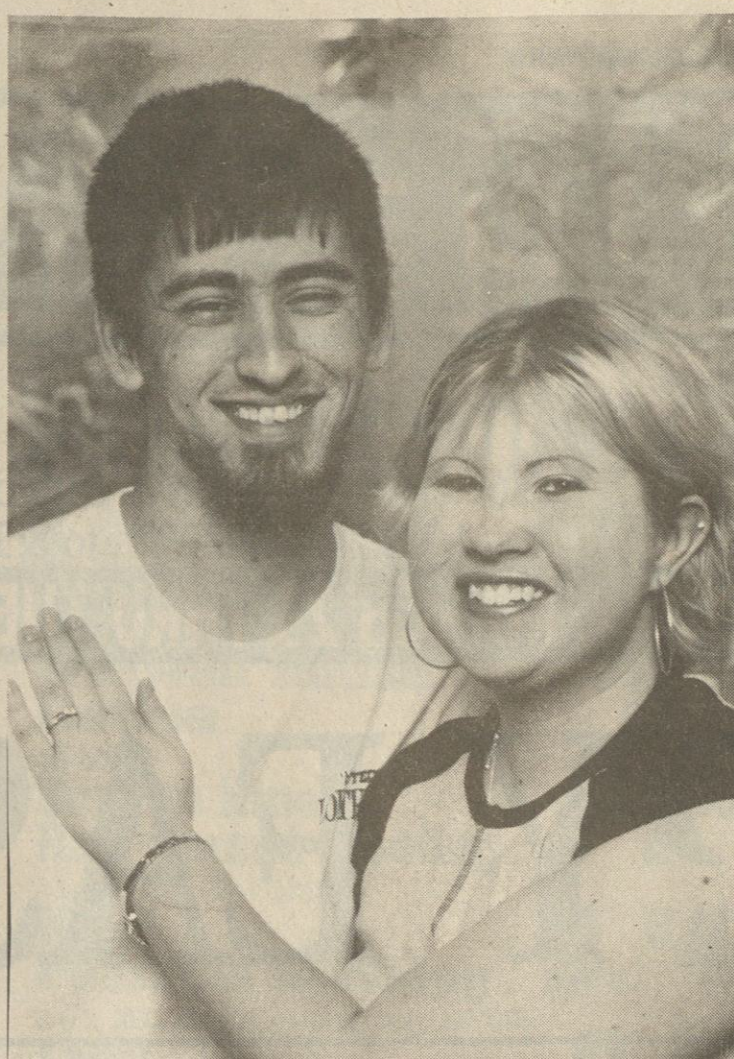
The Tishomingo County Development Foundation held its monthly meeting in Tishomingo at Tishomingo Hall. Board chairman R. White moderated the meeting.

Jane Dicks and Ruth Daugherty won door prizes that Mary Sue brought.

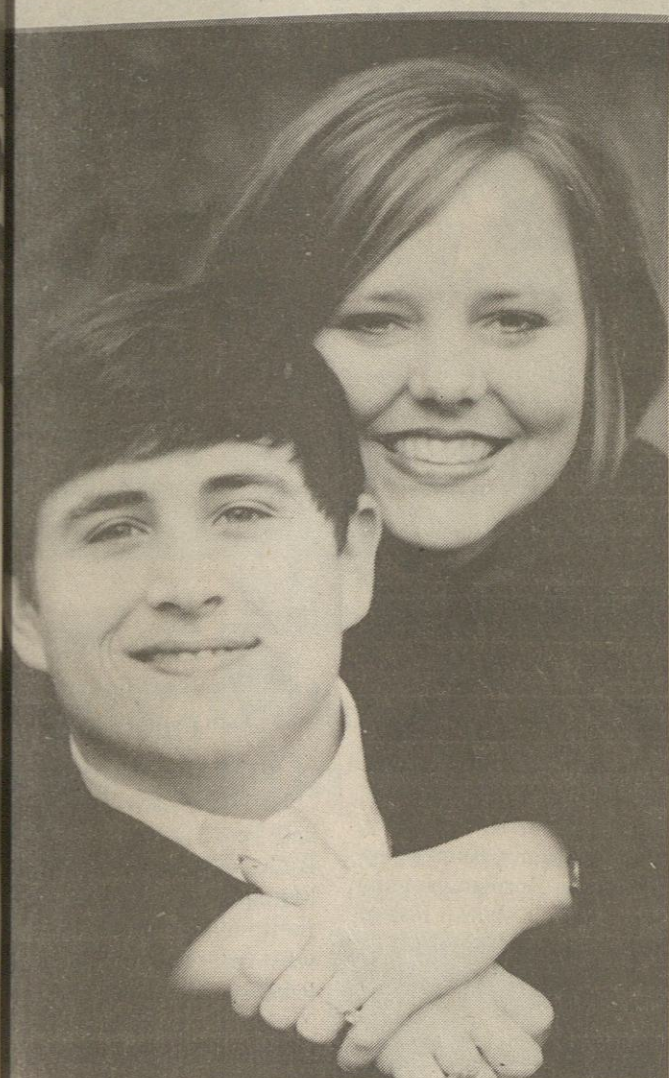

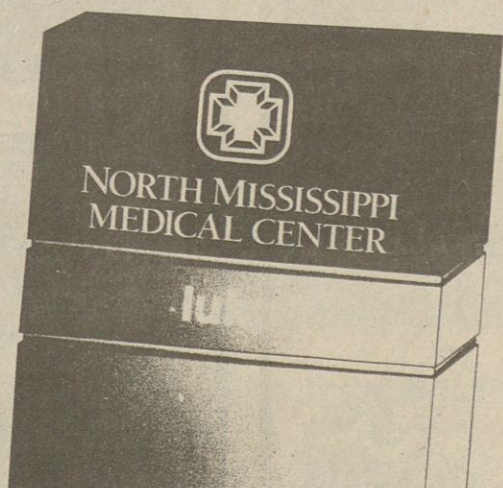

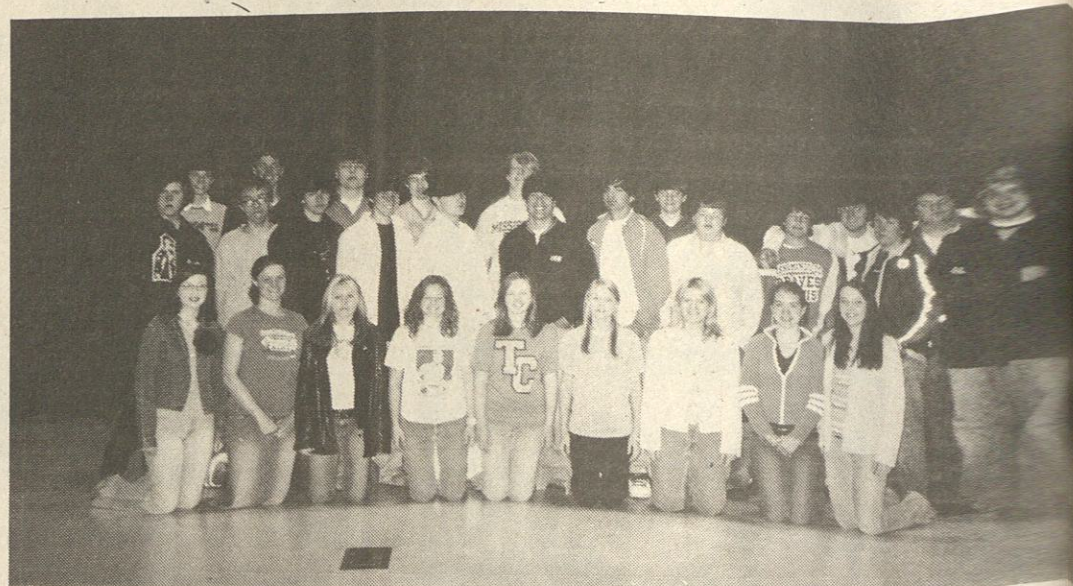

reunited with his family. Thanks for all the prayers and concerns for Virgil during his deployment.



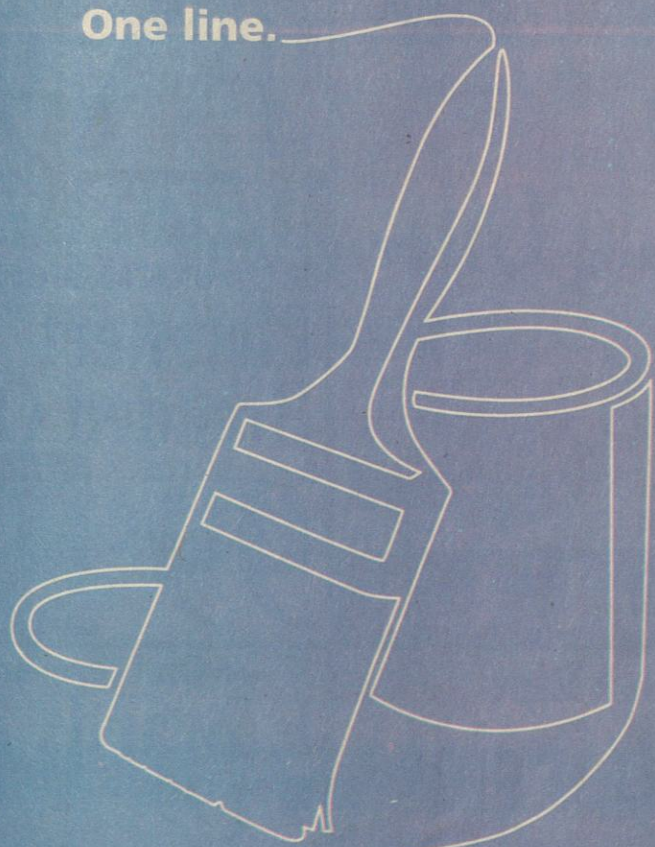

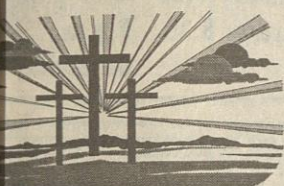
EASTER EGG HUNT TODAY! At Iuka Public Library

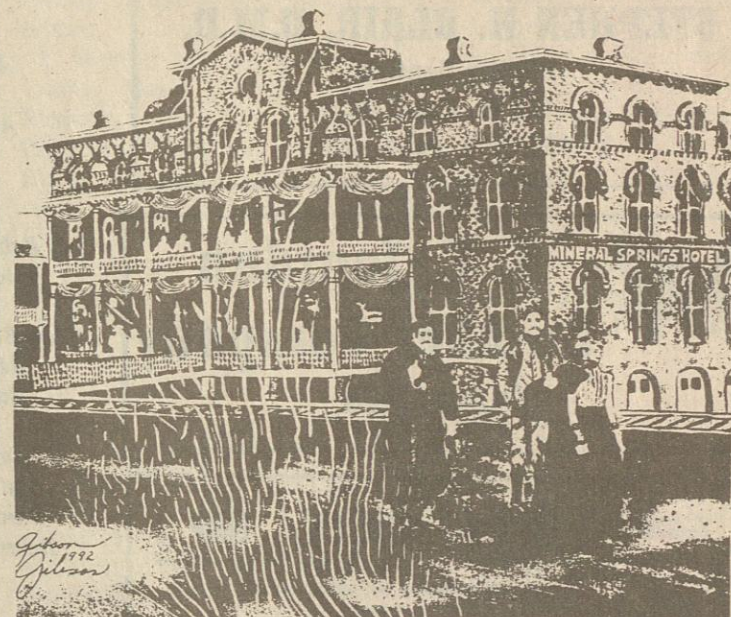

Remembering The Mineral Springs Hotel...

Many years ago when Iuka was a Mecca for pleasure seekers the world over, the Mineral Springs Hotel stood big and majestic on the site now occupied by Weathers Body Shop. In its earlier years, the hotel was known as the Iuka Normal Institute. After the Institute closed in 1902, the building operated as a hotel again. First called the Iuka Springs Hotel it later became known as Mineral Springs Hotel. For many years the hotel did a flourishing business as a resort hotel and people came from far and near to vacation and to visit Mineral Springs Park where they drank of the famous mineral waters.

The Mineral Springs Hotel was under the personal supervision of J.C. Jourdan, owner and manager, and afforded all the personal conveniences of the day. Private baths, hot and cold water, inter communicating telephones, and a spacious ballroom where orchestras would play for the guests to enjoy.

Eight trains a day came through Iuka on the Southern Railroad from Memphis to Chattanooga. For years the building was the home of the

Vidette, the Health Department and office headquarters for TVA while Pickwick Dam was under construction. The Vidette and Health Department were still located in the building when it burned.

The Tishomingo County Archives and History Museum is showcasing this grand building with a temporary display of its history as a school and hotel. Greg Woodruff, Museum Chairman of the TCAHM, is looking for items that are directly related to the Mineral Springs Hotel that we can use to create a permanent display.

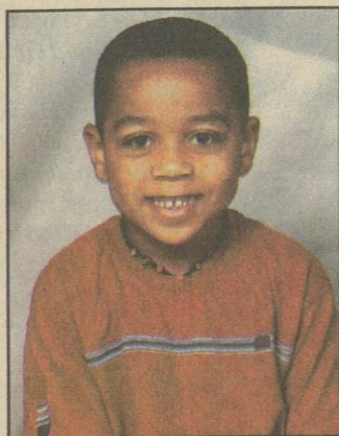

Things to Know About Easter Sunday

The greatest festival of the Christian Church commemorates the resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is a movable feast; since it is not always held on the same date. In AD 325, the church council of Nicaea decided Easter should be celebrated the first Sunday after the first full moon, or after the vernal equinox of March 21. Easter comes as early as March 22 or as late as April 25.

In many churches, Easter is preceded by a season of prayer, abstinence and fasting—called Lent. This is observed in memory of the 40 days' fast of

Christ in the desert. In Eastern Orthodox churches, Lent is 50 days. In Western Christendom, Lent is observed for six weeks and four days.

Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, gets its name from the practice in the Roman Catholic Church of putting ashes on the foreheads of the faithful to remind them that "man is dust." Palm Sunday, one week before Easter, celebrates the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem.

Holy Week begins on this day. Holy Thursday is in mem-

ory of the Last Supper of Christ with his disciples and Good Friday commemorates the crucifixion.

The name Easter comes from "Eostre"—an ancient Angle-Saxon goddess, origi-

nally of the dawn. In pagan times, an annual spring festival was held in her honor. Many Easter customs have come from this and the pre-Christian spring festivals. Others come from the Passover feast of the Jews. Formerly, Easter and Passover were closely associ-

ated.

The resurrection of Jesus took place during the Passover and Christians of the Eastern Church initially celebrated both holidays together. Passover can fall on any day of the week, however Christians of the Western church preferred to celebrate Easter on Sunday—the day of the resurrection.

It's Crappie Fishing Time in Mississippi SCA to sponsor six crappie fishing tournaments in North MS



Joe Miller of Iuka, President of the newly formed Southern Crappie Anglers, Inc. Tournaments is announcing a bold new plan for competitive crappie fishing tournaments. The SCA has slated six crappie tournaments in the State of Mississippi. Dates and the lakes have already been set for the tournaments which will qualify the top 20 teams to fish in the Mississippi State Classic to be held in September. "Qualifying in one of the six tournaments is the only way to get into the Classic," according to Miller.

Upcoming tournaments and lakes include:

- April 9 at Pickwick Lake in Iuka
- April 16 at Arkabutula Lake in Hernando
- May 14 at Tunica Lake in Tunica
- June 4 at Sardis Lake in Sardis
- June 14 at Enid Lake in Batesville, and
- July 16 at Grenada Lake in Grenada.

Though the tournaments will be held in lakes in North

Mississippi this year, SCA hopes to expand to more lakes next year.

SCA will guarantee a \$2000 payback in cash and prizes for each tournament, regardless of entries. The Classic will guarantee a payback of \$18,000 in cash and prizes. First place prize at the Classic will be a new fully-rigged War Eagle Boat with a Yamaha 50 hp engine. This rig has a retail value of \$14,000. Paybacks at the one-day tournaments will be \$1000 for 1st place; \$500 for 2nd; \$300 for 3rd and \$200 for 4th place. "Paybacks may be more, but never less," Miller stated.

Entry fees for the tournaments are \$150 per boat with a maximum of two people per boat.

Anglers will be expected to follow 27 rules. The main rule is the two-person teams are able to use any kind of bait, artificial or live. Anglers may see all rules in one of the SCA brochures available locally or by logging on the website at www.scaanglers.com.

In the Fall Classic a minimum of 120 boats is expected with 20 from each of the six

tournaments. Miller contacts with a Mississippi association, which could add additional 60 boats. The site will be one of the Mississippi lakes (Most will be Sardis Lake).

SCA has received from national anglers to help make a site for crappie anglers said. "I hope all anglers will remember the places and places where into the local area stated.
