Concerned Citizens Meet with Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors and Sheriff Glenn Whitlock With Questions About Jail



jail is checked several times a year by the State of MS, and that all the problems noted by this department had been fixed soon after their visits. After the last visit from the state agency, several electrical and plumbing items were repaired. (The State of MS agency was at the jail making one of their inspections as this meeting was taking place.) Sheriff Whitlock also added that he expected all the personnel at the Sheriff's Department to treat all inmates fairly. He also added that he wanted adequate facilities for the inmates and that the Sheriff's Department officers were doing the best that can be done with what is available to them.

Sheriff Whitlock also said he felt that as long as people are involved in situations that personalities will clash at times and there will be two sides to every story.

After more than an hour of discussing the concerns, the meeting was concluded with Mrs. Parsons saying she would bring a civil suit against the sheriff and the supervisors if something was not done about the conditions at the jail.

Trial Re-Enactment At The Old Courthouse Museum

An original 1930s trial "Mrs. Mary Nell Prichard vs. the Southern Railway" will be reenacted in the courtroom of the old Tishomingo County courthouse on Saturday, April 23. The historic courthouse, located at 203 E. Quitman Street in Iuka, was the scene of the original trial. Promptly at 7 p.m., the courthouse bell will chime to announce that court is in session. Testimony will be presented to the judge and jury, and while the jury is deliberating, there will be a short intermission with refreshments served in the back of the courtroom. Court will reconvene when the bell chimes, and the jury will present the verdict.

Students from Tishomingo County High School and Belmont High School are participating in the event as the actors and actresses. The performers will have assistance in hair dressing and applying makeup in the 1t audience appeal, but will remain faithful to the action and dialog of the original records.

Seating is limited due to the size of the courtroom. Tickets are currently on sale at the old courthouse museum's gift shop. Tickets purchased in advance are \$5.00 for adults, \$8.00 for couples, and \$2.50 for children 10 and under. Tickets will be sold at the door the night of the trial providing space is still available, and will cost \$5.00 each. We ask that children two and under please be held, so we can seat as many people as possible.

At the Monday, April 18 meeting of the Tishomingo County Supervisors, a group of citizens met with the supervisors to express their concerns about alleged bad conditions at Tishomingo County Jail treatment of inmates. The group presented their concerns to the board in the form of a written list. The group also discussed several pertinent facts concerning treatment of inmates, medication availability, the cleanliness and safety of the bathroom facilities, condition of showers, commissaries, visitation, arrest procedures, lack of a full-time woman jailer, food, exercise, smoking time, the commissary system now in use, and others. Sheriff Whitlock was in Iuka County during the meeting session investigating recovery of some guns that had been stolen from Tishomingo County residents. President of the Board of Supervisors, Arlie South extended to Phyllis Parsons, the mother of a former inmate and main spokeswoman for the group, that the board control of jail deals only with facility

maintenance and the operating budget.

The Board set up an afternoon meeting so the citizens could present their concerns directly to the sheriff. Sheriff Whitlock and Deputy Jay Moyers, along with the supervisors, were all present for this afternoon meeting.

Sheriff Whitlock and Deputy Moyers responded to all the questions that were directed to them by the group.

They fully explained all the questioned situations. Some of the questions included necessities provided to prisoners free of charge, the state operated commissary that sets their own prices for pre-packaged items that keep illegal items from being smuggled into the prisoners, optional commissary items, (the jail has a program that helps provide for those people who are not able to buy from the commissary.), neglect of sick prisoners, strip searches and cavity searches, and distance required between inmates and visitors during visiting times.

Sheriff Whitlock said he felt there were some situations that had been misrepresented to the group. He also added that the

Eleven-Year-Old Boy Killed When Struck By Vehicle at Mississippi State Line Bridge

A Friday fishing trip turned tragic when an 11-year old boy was struck and killed by a vehicle on Highway 25N in Tishomingo County. Patrick Clark of Christy Lane, Iuka, TN, had been fishing under the State Line Bridge on Highway 25N in sight of his home.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner, Mack Wilemon, Clark had been fishing on rocks under a bridge on the east side, and had moved to the west side. When he returned to the other side to get his fishing

pole, he scaled the rocks and stepped over the guard rail onto the highway where he was struck by a Chevrolet pickup. Coroner Wilemon speculated that a sign marking the end of the bridge might have affected the visibility of the driver. Wilemon added that young Clark died instantly as the result of multiple traumatic injuries. The identity of the driver was not immediately released.

The Gregg Funeral Home in Jonesboro, AK, was in charge of the arrangements.

Pickwick Pines Marina Signs Deal To Build \$4,000,000 Marina & Tourism Facility On Pickwick Lake

Pickwick Pines Marina has signed a lease agreement on 31 acres located on Pickwick Lake and Highway 25 near Aqua Yacht Harbor and Yellow Creek Port. The \$4,000,000 development will be built by Pickwick Pines Marina, a division of Pickwick Pines Resort, and will include 100 covered boat storage spaces, fuel dock, retail sales facility, restaurant, meeting facility, up to 25 rental cabins, and related infrastructure and utilities. In time, a hotel and convention center could be added that would increase the total investment by the developers to \$8,000,000.

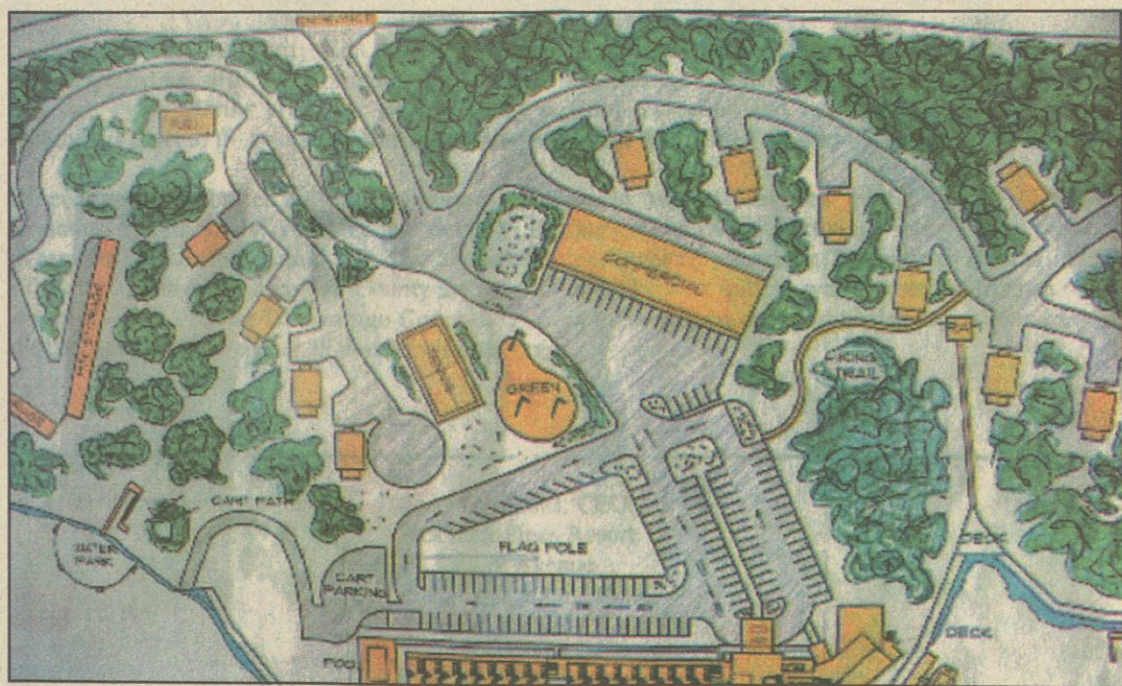

First-Time Contact Wearer

When you get soft contacts, your doctor of optometry will give you a schedule telling you how many hours a day to wear your new lenses. Soft lenses tend to be comfortable right away, but new users still must increase wearing time gradually. Don't wear your lenses any longer than your instructions tell you. If you do, you are risking damage to your eyes and to your contacts.

Until you get used to your soft lenses, you might have some temporary discomfort. Redness, excessive tearing, blurred vision, abnormal blinking, and light sensitivity are common symptoms that are irritating but usually not painful. Stop wearing your contact lenses and call your doctor of optometry if these symptoms do not go away in a few days.

Take your lenses out immediately and seek medical attention if you experience any pain, swelling, burning and stinging of eyes, or fogging vision.

Legal Update

ON REPORT

In the unfortunate event that you are involved in a vehicular crash, it may be in your best interest that a police officer respond to the crash scene. Once there, the officer will likely write up an accident report, particularly if someone is injured. This report may mention a violation of a specific section of the vehicle code, with the result that it led to the accident. There may be an indication that the officer issued a citation, or mention that a driver drove negligently. Any of these police report references can be very helpful in proving the other driver's negligence in the event that he or she were to be sued for damages arising from the accident.

When you are involved in an automobile accident, as either the driver, a passenger, pedestrian or bicycle rider, it is highly important to take the necessary steps to protect your rights. If you have been injured in an auto accident, you may be eligible to receive compensation. For further information, call our office for a consultation.

HINT: Keep your insurer's phone number, a list of the information that the insurance company requires, and a disposable camera in your glove compartment.

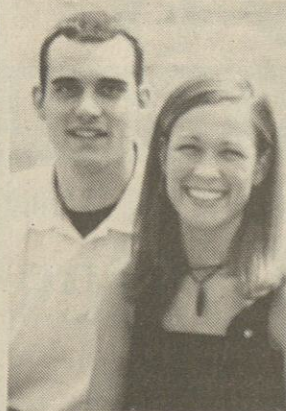
the Iuka Soccer Association, and volunteer fireman for the City of Iuka and several other county departments.
