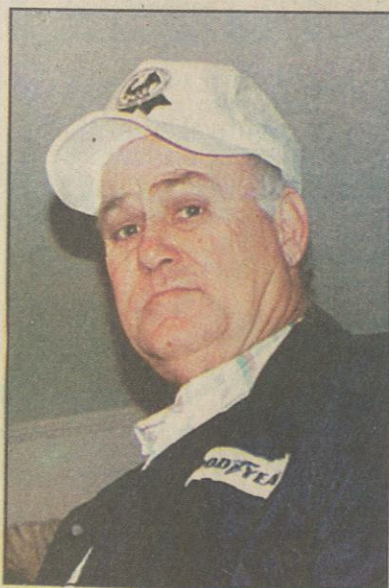
Lunch will be served in the Family Life Center following the service. After the meal, "POP" the Clown will entertain the children. We look forward to seeing you Sunday!

Tishomingo County Local Emergency Planning Committee Meets To Develop County Plan

Have you even driven past an industrial plant and wondered what was happening inside, what dangerous chemicals were in use, and whether an emergency plan existed if an incident requiring evacuation occurred? These concerns grew after the 1984 chemical tragedy in Hoppal, India, where a release of toxic gas killed and injured thousands of people.

In the past, if citizens wanted to know more about the hazardous and toxic chemicals in their communities, they had to depend on the cooperation of industry for information. Some companies were willing to answer questions and even opened their gates for public tours a few times a year. But if a company wasn't willing to share information about its operations with its neighbors, there wasn't much a concerned citizen could do about it.

That changed in November of 1986, when Congress passed a law designed to help communities like ours deal safely and effectively with the many hazardous substances that are used throughout our society. This law is called the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA).

The law has two main purposes: to encourage and support emergency planning and responding to chemical accidents; and to provide local governments and the public with information about possible chemical hazards in their communities.

For the law to work, industry, concerned citizens, and government at all levels must

work together to plan for chemical accidents and to reduce the risk to the public from releases of toxic chemicals into the environment. The law establishes an ongoing forum at the local level for discussion and a focus for action at the Local Emergency Planning Committee.

Local Emergency Planning Committees are crucial to the success of EPCRA, and must consist of representatives of all of the following groups and organizations: elected state and local officials, law enforcement, emergency management, firefighting, first aid, health, local environment and transportation agencies, hospitals, broadcast and print media, community groups, and representatives of facilities subject to the emergency planning and community right to know requirements. The initial task of this group is to develop an emergency plan and prepare for and respond to chemical emergencies. The plan must be reviewed annually, tested, and updated. Because the LEPC members represent the community, they should be familiar with factors that affect public safety, the environment, and the economy of the community. That expertise is essential as the LEPC develops a plan tailored to the needs of its planning district.

The emergency plan must include the identify and location of hazardous materials procedures for immediate response to a chemical accident; ways to notify the public about actions they must take, names of coordinators at plants, and schedules and plans for testing

the plan. Once the plan is written, the SERC must review it. The LEPC must publicize the plan through public meetings or newspaper announcements, get public comment, and periodically test the plan by conducting emergency drills. The LEPC must also update the plan at least annually and let the public know of its activities.

The LEPC has other responsibilities that include receiving emergency releases and hazardous chemical inventory information submitted by local facilities and making this information available to the public upon request. It must establish and publicize procedures for handling those requests.

LEPC's have the authority to request additional information from facilities for their own planning purposes on behalf of others. The LEPC's may visit facilities in a community to find out what they are doing to reduce hazards, prepare for accidents, and reduce hazardous inventories and releases.

The Tishomingo County Local Emergency Planning Committee is strongly committed to the safety of Tishomingo County's citizens by assuring proper resources and planning for environmental emergencies. The LEPC is an active group of emergency responders, planners, business representatives, health care providers, elected officials, media, and citizens that work together for the preservation of our environment. TC's Wes Dotson Signs Baseball Scholarship At Northeast Mississippi Community College

Tishomingo County High School senior Wes Dotson has signed a national letter of intent to play baseball at Northeast Mississippi Community College in 2006.

At TC, the right-handed pitcher is 5-3 as a senior with 50.67 innings of work. He struck out 67 and allowed only 44 runs this past season. Dotson limited opponents to only 27 earned runs. He allowed only 27 walks. At the plate this season, Dotson hit .293 hitting 24 for 82. He had 16 RBI's and 4 stolen bases for his Braves' team.

During his career as a Brave, Dotson was 9-6 as a pitcher. In his 96 inning career, he allowed only 58 earned runs out of 80. He gave up 93 hits, had 119 K's, and had 65 walks.

Dotson hit 48 out of 149 times at bat for a .326 overall batting average. He had 29 RBI and 5 stolen bases.

Coach Jerry Long said Wes is a very



deserving player and that he will make significant contributions to the NE Tiger team next season. Wes is the son of Ricky and Jane Dotson of Burnsville.

Harvey and his brother, John Harvey, were living in Tishomingo County, Mississippi. George was listed as being 48 years old, and John was 37 years old. George's assets included \$6,000 worth of real estate, and the value of his personal estate was \$14,000. In the next U.S. Census, dated July 8, 1870, only John Harvey was enumerated. He was still working as a physician, and his brother, George, was not listed. Later, the U.S. Federal Census dated June 2, 1880, shows a 67-year-old George Harvey still serving as a physician in Tishomingo County. His brother, 57-year-old John Harvey, was also still living in the same residence. This census also shows a black housekeeper, Mary Harvey, living in the residence with two children, Mollie and John. Family history reports that the Harvey brothers had race horses on the property. This historical information appears to be accurate since the census noted that the Harvey brothers

were also farming. According to Tishomingo County land records, E. S. Candler, Sr., sold the property on November 30, 1903, to James L. Bishop for \$2,500 with one stipulation. The hickory timber on the property would be removed by December 1, 1904, and if not removed by that time, the timber would revert back to the Bishop family. James' son, Hector Bishop, acquired the property after his father's death. Hector Bishop and his wife lived in the home for many years, raising their children: James Hector Bishop, Erlene Bishop Belue, Emogene Bishop Nagle, and Harold Thomas (Tom) Bishop. In 1976, Emogene and her husband, Chester Nagle, obtained the property and raised their two daughters.

The Bishop home place is a "timeless treasure." It is a magnificent Federal style residence, built no later than 1850; the home reverberates with history. It was used as a medical clinic before, during, and after the Civil War. The house features 12 ft. ceilings, 8 ft. windows, and 8 ft. doors with 2 ft. transoms over each door. Other unique aspects of the home include specialized touches; for example, the kitchen pantry was obviously once used as the medicine storage closet for the Harvey's medical clinic. This stately structure sits on 6.5 acres surrounded by beautiful pine and oak trees, shrubs, and flowers. Located ¼ mile west of Tishomingo County High School, the home will be auctioned off on Saturday, May 7, by Hodge Auctions in Iuka, Mississippi.

George Harvey's will is as

follows:

In the Name of God Amen;

I, George Harvey of the County of Tishomingo, Mississippi, being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make this my last will and testament.

Item 1st. I give my body to the dust and my soul to God who gave it.

Item 2nd. I direct that out of my estate my just debts and funeral expenses be paid by my executor.

Item 3rd. I give to my beloved mother the sum of

Three Thousand Pounds Sterling English Money.

Item 4th. I give to my nephew George H. Rule the sum of One Thousand Dollars.

Item 5th. I direct that out of my estate there be paid by my executor to Mary Harvey a colored woman formerly my slave for her support the sum of One Hundred Dollars per year.

Item 6th. I give and bequeath all of the residue of my property to the children of the said Mary Harvey Col. now living to wit; to Napoleon - Harvey and to Mary P. Harvey and to the child of which the said Mary Harvey Col. is now pregnant.

Item 7th. I appoint my friend John M. Nelson and my brother John Harvey executors of this my will and testament.

Signed sealed and published and declared as my last will and testament this ____ day of ____ 1867.

CANINE CONTUSIONS

In cases where people suffer injuries from dog bites, it is likely that they can successfully pursue a personal injury lawsuit against the dog's owner. In most instances, homeowner's insurance will cover the claim. During the litigation of a dog-bite case, the plaintiff's attorney will want to get complete veterinary records for the dog. It may have exhibited vicious behavior in the past that its owners may not be willing to admit to without documented proof. A subpoena may need to be issued to get these records. It is also important to take photographs of the injury as soon as possible. In addition, the appropriate health authorities should be contacted to make sure the victim did not contract rabies.

Though not every dog bite case warrants a personal injury case, when deciding whether or not to press charges against the animal's owner, it is reasonable to consult a personal injury attorney who understands this area of law. To discuss your personal injury matter, call our office to schedule a consultation. HINT: There are almost five million dog bites per year, for which about 800,000 victims require medical treatment.

Two or three Harvey brothers immigrated to the United States from Ireland in the early to mid-1800s. They eventually migrated to Tishomingo County, Mississippi, and made their home in what is now called Bishop's Bottom. According to family history, two Harvey brothers, who were both physicians, pitched a tent and eventually built a building to serve as a medical clinic. Some of the lumber, such as doors, etc., was brought to Tishomingo County from England. It is not known exactly when the Harvey brothers acquired the property;

however, County deed records show that the west half of Section 17, Township 3, Range 10 east, was conveyed on December 6, 1836, from the Federal Land Office to S. Duncan. Then, as recorded in Deed Book N, page 332, S. Duncan conveyed the property to Oakland College by warranty deed. Later at some point in time, the Oakland College conveyed the property to John C. Griner and Eli Callicott by warranty deed. It is assumed that the Harvey brothers then acquired the property.

At any rate, by the 1860 U.S. Federal Census, George

Melissa Kilough Overcomes Disability to Go to Work!

Melissa Kilough's world turned upside down after surgery to remove a spinal tumor in 1986, but she regained her balance through adaptation and learned to live.

In many respects her life is that of anyone else. She works from home as an Internet technician for Crossroads Internet, and she sings in the choir at Iuka Gospel Chapel.

But things weren't going well for Kilough in the years leading to 1986 as doctors struggled to find the source of her debilitating condition.

If anyone can say that they're thankful that the MRI was invented, I can, because it's what found the tumor," said Kilough, a 1977 graduate of Iuka High School. "Before that, they thought I had multiple sclerosis. They were kind of grasping at straws."

At the time, she was a mother of two small children—a son, Larry, and daughter, Jennifer.

"I went from taking care of everything to not being able to do anything," she said. "My daughter doesn't remember a time when it was like to have a walk with her mother."

In a period of four years before the tumor was discovered, she had gone from using a walker to some use of a wheelchair.

"I had surgery to remove the tumor, and the trauma to my body is what left me this way," said Kilough.

"I love my job," she said. "I like the customer interaction and the satisfaction of being able to help someone."

Outside of working hours, she enjoys church activities and spending time with family.

Whether working or not, her loyal pet dog, Sophie Grace, is usually curled in her lap to keep her company.

Through the years, Kilough said she has seen positive change in the way society views people who use a wheelchair.

"I have been in restaurants where people have looked at my family and said 'What does she want,' and talked to them like just because I'm disabled my brain doesn't work anymore," she said. "It's not so bad now. It's come a long way."

More buildings are now designed with accessibility in mind, and lifts and specially designed vans have made transportation much easier.

Kilough said some days are better than others, and things such as the weather can affect how she feels.

"In the disabled world, every day is a different day," she said. "You learn to take it one day at a time. There's days when picking up a phone is something that I simply can't do. There's days picking up coffee cups is hard."

"My body reacts to everything," she said. "If it's warm outside, I have much better days as far as mobility. If it rains or is bitterly cold outside, then my challenges are much greater."

"I really didn't have so much trouble adjusting to the disability because I had been debilitating for four years," said Kilough. "I

learned to run a household from a wheelchair, but I had use of both arms at the time."

The biggest adjustment after surgery was letting others take control.

"I not only was depending on other people for my care, but I was depending on other people to take care of my home and my children," she said.

Later, Kilough returned to school to study microcomputer technology.

"I'm not a person who likes to sit still," she said. "The four walls were starting to get to me. I really wanted to be a profitable member of society."

When she sought a job, she faced a challenging job market and reluctant employers.

"It was a year before I was able to find a job," said Kilough. "Even though they are supposed to look at a person that's handicapped with no discrimination, they still do."

She's very happy with her current employer of almost two years, who she said hired her "with no reservations." Most people who call the Internet service provider for help between the hours of 2 p.m. and 6 p.m. will talk to Kilough. She helps people who are having trouble setting up their connection or other problems accessing the Internet.

"I love my job," she said. "I like the customer interaction and the satisfaction of being able to help someone."

Outside of working hours, she enjoys church activities and spending time with family.

Whether working or not, her loyal pet dog, Sophie Grace, is usually curled in her lap to keep her company.

A non-binding voluntary agreement to use Best Management Practice (BMPs) when clearing or harvesting timber along the Creek is basic to a landowner's participation. Scenic nomination also qualifies Bear Creek streamside landowners for a special state income tax credit of \$10,000 over 10 years toward 50% of transaction costs if they choose to create conservation easements along the Creek.

Coordinated voluntary, private conservation efforts can provide a connected patchwork of protective buffer zones along the length of the Creek. This non-regulatory program gives landowners an opportunity to take an active role in the future health of Bear Creek and the valuable fish and wildlife resources it sustains. The officer will notify the owner of the dog if the animal is tagged and collared. Be it known, that any time the town does not have a person to fill the position of animal control officer, the mayor and/or members of the board of aldermen may act as such, animal control officer.

The dog will go to the licensed veterinarian, of which will be chosen by the Mayor and Board. To pick up their dog(s) any and all expenses incurred at the vet's office will be the owners Responsibility.

If no one comes forth to claim the dog(s) picked up by the animal control officer after five (5) days, the licensed veterinarian will then be responsible for either the sale of the animal to a good home or the euthanasia and disposal.

BE IT KNOWN that if a dog(s) with a tag and collar is picked up (not on the owners property), it will be returned to the owner with a warning.

If the same dog(s) are picked up a second time, there will be a fine of \$40.00 and the owner will have to pick the dog(s) up at the veterinarians and pay for any fees incurred there.

If there is a third (3rd) time the fine will be \$65.00.

A fourth (4th) time will bring a fine of \$100.00

Be it known to all citizens of Paden that anyone who has a dog under his/her control should not permit the dog(s) to bark, howl, whine or make other loud and unusual noises, which annoy and become offensive to other members of the Town of Paden.

If a barking dog is disturbing the peace the owner will be given one warning and ask to handle the situation.

If a second complaint is made there will be a fine of \$50.00 and the fine will be raised \$5.00 for every complaint afterwards.

The courts take into consideration a "a reasonable person of normal sensitivity" when determining whether the noise violates this ordinance.

All fines will be due in thirty (30) days!

DON'T LIVE IN IGNORANCE OR FEAR

Anyone interested in further details about the following statements can request the minutes of the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors dated December 28, 2004, involving my complaint against the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department. The minutes are public records and freely available to anyone for viewing by requesting them at the Tishomingo County Chancery Clerk's office.

Did you know that you can be arrested by the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department without a warrant, without a signed affidavit, and without the arresting officer seeing the supposed crime, and no physical evidence at the scene. You can have a legal right to be where you are and someone can state to a deputy that you said

something that was disagreeable to that person and BAM!, you're in jail.

Even after your bond has been set by a justice court judge, the sheriff's department can refuse to release you and can detain you overnight, even though someone is available to pay your bond. All this can happen to you with only the verbal word of an individual citizen.

The arrest and false imprisonment can happen even if you and a witness have stated that you did not do what you were accused of.
