## Remember Our Brave Soldiers On Memorial Day 2005

Memorial Day is the day when we honor those who have lost their lives in the military while serving our United States of America. We honor those who have made the ultimate sacrifice for their country in many special ways. This year, Memorial Day, will officially be celebrated on May 30, the last Monday in May.

This year churches, towns, cities, and communities will honor both the living and deceased soldiers by flying their flags and decorating their surroundings with red, white, and blue. Many will also wear red poppies to honor their soldiers. Many still associate the poem "In Flanders Fields," written in 1915 by Col. John McCrae with the World War I. When the poppies bloomed in spring, it gave hope to the soldiers who had endured a long winter of fighting. The poppy was also the first plant to grow again in the battlefields in parts of Europe after the fighting ended. Poppies sprang up throughout the trenches and craters, especially in Flanders, an area of Belgium and France.

In Flanders Fields the poppies blow Between the crosses, row on row, That mark our place; and in the sky The larks, still bravely singing, fly Scarce heard amid the guns below.

This year, many will especially remember our Tishomingo County soldiers who are currently serving in Iraq. Many prayers will be lifted for their safe and timely return home.

Many people will also use the Memorial Day weekend to honor all of their loved ones who have died whether they served in the military or not with the decoration of local cemeteries and dinners on the ground at local churches and picnics in the parks. Many will also spend the weekend at the lake.

Many Southerners also think of the Memorial Day weekend as the official "unofficial" beginning of summer.

Don't Live In Ignorance Or Fear... The following is a copy of a letter given to the Belmont City Clerk that was written by my wife and myself. Please remember the City

of Belmont is awaiting a current decision from the Attorney General's Office regarding the situation stated in the letter. 5/12/05

Belmont Board of Alderman Belmont, MS 38827

Dear Belmont Board of Aldermen

A matter has come to our attention that we believe is of great importance to the Belmont Board of Aldermen as well as the citizens of Belmont. Article 1 Sections 1 and 2 of the Mississippi State Constitution state: ARTICLE 1

**DISTRIBUTION OF POWERS** 

SECTION 1. Powers of government. SECTION 2. Encroachment of power.

The powers of the government of the state of Mississippi shall be divided into three distinct departments, and each of them confided to a separate magistracy, to-wit: those which are legislative to one, those which are judicial to another, and those which are executive to

SOURCES: 1817 art II 1; 1832 art II 1; 1869 art III 1.

No person or collection of persons, being one or belonging to one of these departments, shall exercise any power properly belonging to either of the others. The acceptance of an office in either of said departments shall, of itself, and at once, vacate any and all offices held by the person so accepting in either of the other departments

SOURCES: 1817 art II 2; 1832 art II 2; 1869 art III 1.
The Attorney General's Office has also stated in an opinion in 1997 In response, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, Art. 1, Sections 1 and 2 prohibit a member of one branch of government from serving in an office of another separate branch of government. The Mississippi Supreme Court has held that these constitutional provisions prohibit a judge, a member of the judicial branch, from holding a job as a policeman, a job in the executive branch of government. In re: Anderson 447 So. 2d 1275 (Miss. 1984). It is our opinion that the same holds true for the office of alderman which is in the legislative branch. An alderman may not also serve as a regular or auxiliary policeman,

Accordingly, under Section 2 of the Mississippi Constitution of 1890, an A office holder in the executive branch of government who accepts a position in the legislative branch thereby vacates his position in the executive branch. Therefore, Mr. Gregory, upon being sworn in as a member of the House of Representatives, has vacated his position as a school district trustee.

Lastly, the Attorney General's Office stated in 2005:

I am aware of your opinion numbered 2004-0341, Scott (July 23, 2004), which "prohibits an individual from holding both the office of Alderman and Deputy Sheriff at the same time." That prohibition is based upon Sections 1 and 2 of the Mississippi Constitution of 1890. I assume that prohibition arises from conflict which would or could occur if any individual simultaneously served in the "executive" and 'legislative" branches of local government. Is this assumption correct? Your assumption is correct. Article 1, Section 2 of the Miss. Constitution of 1890 provides as follows:

No person or collection of persons, being one or belonging to one of these departments, shall exercise any power properly belonging to either of the others. The acceptance of an office in either of said departments shall, of itself, and at once, vacate any and all offices held by the person so accepting in either of the other departments.

The office of deputy sheriff is in the executive branch of government, while the office of alderman is in the legislative branch of government. MS AG Op., Curtis (July 23, 2004). The Mississippi Supreme Court has stated that a law enforcement officer exercises "core powers" of the executive branch of government. In re Anderson, 447 So2d 1275 (Miss. 1984). Service by one individual in these two positions simultaneously would be a violation of Article 1, Section 2 of the Miss. Constitution of

1890. Also

The language in Article 1, Section 2 is plain and unambiguous and prohibits simultaneous service by an individual in more than one branch of government, regardless of whether that service is in the same or different county or municipality. While there is no prohibition against the appointment of the individual to the position of police chief, by accepting the position of police chief the individual would automatically vacate the position of alderman in the other municipality.

According to the above stated evidence, Alderman Mark Nichols vacated his office as Belmont City Alderman upon his acceptance of the position of auxiliary deputy for the Tishomingo County Sheriff's department on

March 1, 2005. Accordingly, from the time Mark Nichols accepted the position as auxiliary deputy, he would not have been entitled to any pay or benefits relating to the office of Alderman, in addition, it would therefore follow that any items voted on by the Belmont Board of Aldermen that included his vote would be null and void.

We realize that this situation may have occurred through ignorance of the above stated circumstances, and we wish to allow the Belmont Board of Aldermen to address this issue before we pursue the matter through other avenues. We respectfully request the Belmont Board of Aldermen or a representative of the Belmont Board of Aldermen to contact us as soon as possible with an answer or resolution to this problem.

This information was conveyed to me on Monday, May 16, 2005 when I contacted the Belmont City Attorney, Lloyd Moore.

Citizens that live in areas other than Belmont may be wondering what a Belmont City Alderman has to do with them. Please remember that I stated in the letter that alderman or non-alderman Nichols is also an auxiliary deputy for the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department and, through that position, he can interact with anyone in the county. While I hope that there are good and honest deputies within the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, what path will alderman or non-alderman Nichols follow within the county's police force? #### The Ring

The first class ring was developed in 1835 for West Point U. S. Academy. In the early 1900's class rings came into fashion. The first class rings were crude and were only a shank with a symbol (usually of the class pin which preceded the class ring by a few years) attached to the bezel of the ring. They quickly became popular and soon stones were added and more intricate dies allowing for greater details got developed. The basis of the class ring (and pin) goes back to the Egyptians, who felt their scarabs rings promised them eternal life, they wore their seal and signet rings till death, and were buried with them.

In order to compete, these students had already succeeded in preliminary competitions at the area level

Of these 18 teams competing in areas ranging from livestock judging to floriculture, an astonishing 16 finished the day in 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place. The 5 teams winning 1st will join 2 other teams already selected in other competitions to represent Mississippi at the National FFA Convention in Louisville, Kentucky in the fall. Mr. Taylor feels that regardless of their success there, they have achieved great recognition for their school and the South Tippah School District where Pine Grove is located. He is looking forward to their representing Mississippi well at the national

"If they are willing to do the study and work necessary to complete, I will see they get to contest," says Mr. Taylor. "That is my job. The students are the ones who do the winning. This is beyond the work they do in the classroom, so they must be dedicated to studying, practicing after school, and working with a team of fellow students." Mr. Taylor also points out that in a small school like Pine Grove everyone cannot participate in sports so this gives the students the opportunity to compete, to go against students from all over the state in an academic contest. He says, "The competition is a good life experience regardless of whether they win or not. They have learned from being there.

Mr. Taylor has been teaching at Pine Grove for five years. He is a graduate of Tishomingo High School and lives in Tishomingo. He is married to Erica Wooten and they have one daughter, Claire-Mann.

#### The Cap and Gown

Academic dress for graduations started in the 12th and 13th centuries when universities first began forming. Whether a student or a teacher, standard dress for scholars was clerical garb. Most medieval scholars had made certain vows, and had at least taken minor orders with the church so clerical robes

were their main form of dress to begin with.

Back in 1321, the University of Coimbra declared that all Doctors, Bachelors, and Licentiates must wear gowns. Excessive in apparel was forbidden later on in the 14th century in some colleges and to create uniformity suggested everyone wear a long gown.
