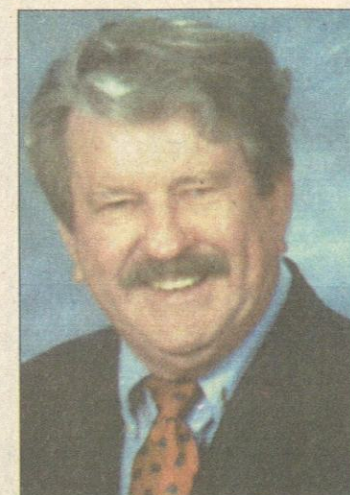
Billy Wallace Announces Candidacy For Alderman Of City Of Iuka

Early Morning Traffic Stop Yields Meth Lab(s) in Dennis Area

An early morning traffic stop by Tishomingo County Deputy Mike Kemp and South Half Constable Jeff Kemp ultimately led to the discovery of crystal meth labs.

The traffic stop provided the final information needed to obtain a search warrant for a Dennis residence that had been under observation. This residence was located at 22 CR 24, just south of Highway 4. Search of the residence revealed the presence of precursors and remnants of a meth lab. This dwelling was being rented by Ray Higginbottom, a white male, 42, and his wife, Robin Higginbottom, a white female. After entering the 22 CR 24 address, officers learned that Higginbottom and his wife had recently moved to another address, 2373 CR 961, just north of Highway 4 in Dennis. This property was also being rented by the Higginbottoms. Upon arrival at this location, Ray Higginbottom was placed under arrest for illegal items found at the 22 CR 24 address. Further investigation by the officers led to the discovery of an active meth lab at the 2373 CR 961 address. At this time both of the Higginbottoms were arrested and transported to the Tishomingo County jail.

The Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics was called in by the local authorities for the clean up and destruction of both meth labs.

At the time of this press release, Ray Higginbottom was being held at the Tishomingo County jail, charged with manufacturing Crystal Meth and Intent to Distribute.

Higginbottom was also being held on one charge of Conspiracy to Manufacture Crystal Meth. No bond had been set at presstime for either of the Higginbottoms.

Both Sheriff Whitlock and Deputy Kemp feel confident that these arrests will lead to more arrests in the on-going investigation. Sheriff Whitlock would like to thank both Deputy Mike Kemp and South Half Constable Jeff Kemp for their many hours of dedicated service and hard work in helping stop illegal drugs in Tishomingo County.

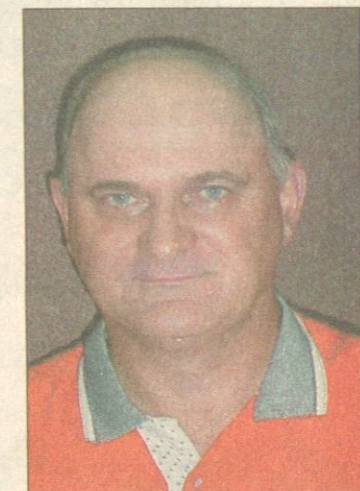
Richard A. (Ricky) Smith Announces Candidacy For City Of Iuka Alderman

Legal Update

COMPARATIVELY SPEAKING

If a pedestrian's own negligence contributed to his or her being injured by a motorist, would it affect that person's ability to sue and collect damages for his or her injuries? In accordance with traditional tort law, even if the defendant is negligent, the plaintiff's "contributory negligence" prevents any recovery. But, in efforts to distance themselves from this all-or-nothing interpretation, many states have abandoned contributory negligence in favor of "comparative negligence." This holds that the plaintiff's fault reduces, but does not entirely eliminate, the defendant's liability for the plaintiff's injury. The jury is assigned the task of quantifying the degree of fault, and the damages are based on the percentages arrived at by the jury.

If an injured person's own carelessness or disregard for safety precautions contributes to his or her injuries, the court may apply a portion of the responsibility to the plaintiff, in turn reducing the amount of damages awarded against the defendant. HINT: Contributory negligence is a common law defense that originated in England. It holds that one who negligently harms another cannot be found liable if the injured person was negligent himself to the slightest degree.

Letter To The Editor...

Don't Live In Ignorance Or Fear...

Let me tell you a story... Suppose you were sitting on a couch with your wife in a house that was owned half by your wife and the other half owned by your wife's brother. Now...imagine that your wife's brother decides he wants sole possession of the house and to accomplish that he contacts the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department to remove you and your wife. Then, while peacefully sitting on the couch with your wife, a Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputy bursts into the home and places you under arrest.

Is there a warrant? NO! Is there a signed affidavit? NO! Did the officer see or witness anything to support the arrest? NO! Was the only evidence the verbal word of the brother?

YES! Was the wife forced off of her property by the deputy with no charges whatsoever being brought against her? OH YES! Did a Tishomingo County justice court judge set a \$500 bond on the 46 year old husband that had never before been arrested for anything and had lived continuously in the county for fifteen years? YES! Did the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department continue to forcefully keep the husband in jail even after bond was set by refusing to let the wife pay the bond? YES! Did the brother drop the charges before the court date? YES! (Not, however, before the husband was forced to spend the night on the floor of the county jail.)

Could this happen to you or your child or your grandmother? The sheriff approves

of this type of behavior by his deputies, and when I attempted to question the sheriff during a phone conversation about his investigating matters such as this, the sheriff hung up on me, so I believe the answer is, it could happen to anyone in the county.

Where are these people today? The deputy has been promoted to criminal investigator. (Congratulations, and hopefully you have learned the meaning of probable cause and due process since we last met.) The brother is an auxiliary deputy. (Surprise, Surprise) The sheriff continues in his policy of ignoring civil rights and the Mississippi code of law.

The husband and wife continue their unrelenting efforts to make information available to the public about judicial and police misconduct. The husband and wife hope that the county and state will acknowledge the problems in the current system and that county and state agencies will make reforms to protect citizens against police misconduct and bring back the respect that the law officers that do serve with integrity and honesty, so richly deserve.

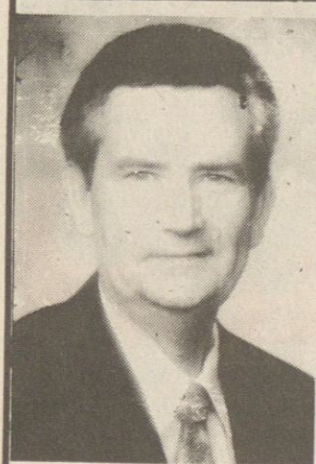

McKnight-Daugherty To Wed June 11th, 2005

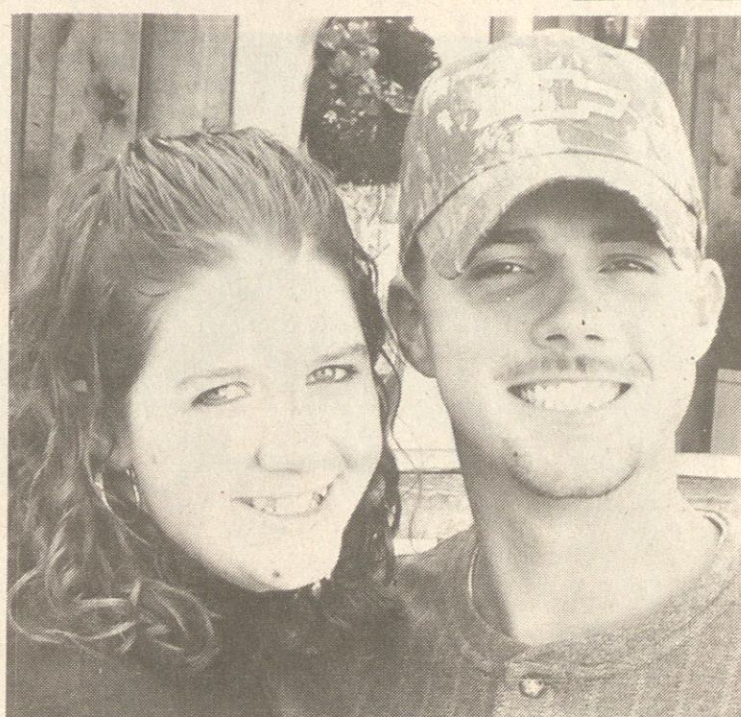

Mrs. Smith Runs for Mrs. Smith

Almost two years ago, Mrs. Smith (Corinne Rutherford Smith) told her cancer-ridden sister-in-law, Mrs. Smith (Pam Ledbetter Smith) that she was going to run a Marathon in her honor. However, Pam was taken from her family before Corinne could run her race. Pam died on July 2, 2003, and since then, Corinne has been working to raise money to contribute to the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society in Pam's memory. Corinne has been working through the Tupelo Chapter of the MS Chapter of the National Leukemia Society. She is a member of the LLS Team In Training.

Corinne has been training for her marathon run since telling Pam what she had planned to do just before Pam's death. A marathon run consists of pounding the pavement for 26.2 miles—about 5.5 hours of running time. Corinne ran a half marathon 2 years ago in Nashville, and now she wants to complete the 26.2 mile run.

As far as the money earning part of the run, Corinne set a personal goal of \$3,500, but she has already raised more than \$6,200+. Corinne said she has just been overwhelmed by the response from everyone around her who finds out what she is trying to do. Corinne's run has become a community endeavor.

When she first started, she just planned to send out a few letters to her friends. Even with only a few letters, her cause has spread throughout the area. People have recognized her concerns and have rallied to her cause. Corinne can not even talk to anyone about her planned run without crying and becoming exceptionally emotional. She now wants to complete this run for Pam and Pam's sons, Alex and Austin, and her husband, Billy.

To date Mrs. Smith has received donations from TCHS, IMS, IES, and Tishomingo Elementary as well as many of her friends. She is so thankful for all the funds she has received. Some of the money has come through the following: TCHS - Freshman Class headed up by Kelly Lowrey and Chasity Moore, Sophomore Class by Erica Taylor, Senior Class with help from Walker Wood, Beta Club sponsored by Rene Fowler, and Foreign Language Club sponsored by Laura Hall.

Classes at IMS, sponsored by Ms. Emily Wooten, also raised money.

And at Tishomingo Elementary Mrs. Crystal Taylor's third-grade class raised money to help fight cancer. Tears welled in Mrs. Smith's eyes as she told the story of these third graders. These third graders know in their hearts how losing a loved one feels since one of the classmates lost a mother and another lost a grandmother to cancer during this school year. The children started out saving 50 cent a day, and their teacher matched all their savings in memory of those her students had lost. Mrs. Smith says she just cannot believe the generosity of all the people around her—especially these wonderful third graders.

Now, just in time for Relay for Life, Mrs. Corinne Smith is finishing up her fundraising and recovering from a knee injury

that has slowed her training. She also has had trouble finding enough daylight hours to do the running she wants to do while working her schedule to include school and working every other weekend at her second job.

Pam Ledbetter Smith was a star athlete in her own time. She was a 1987 graduate of Iuka High School, where she played basketball for Coach Jerry Harrelson. Coach Harrelson remembers Pam as a tremendous player. He said she was an excellent shooter, played good defense, was a good rebounder, and a good ball handler. Pam was a great passer and possessed great knowledge of the game. She could have played all five positions on the floor. He still remembers how Pam hit a shot at the buzzer to win the Iuka tournament against Fulton in '87. That definitely was one of the highlights of the year for the '87 team. Pam's quick wit and ready smile are remembered by the many who knew her and watched her play. She loved life and gave it her all, just like she did when she was on the court. She would have been proud of the money raised in her memory.

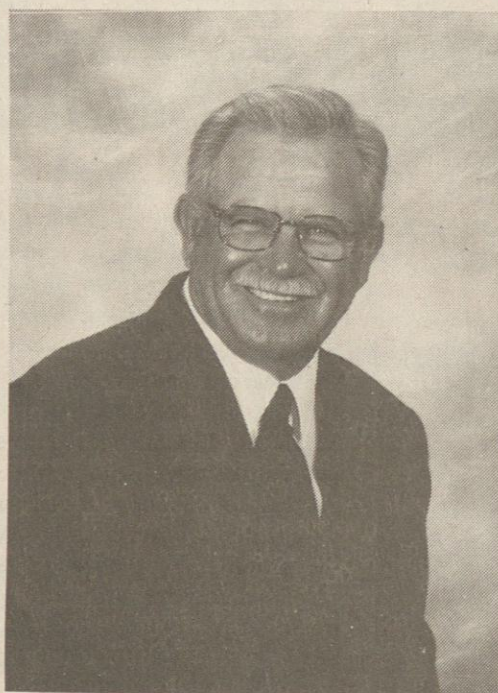

Letter To The Editor...

Law enforcement personnel should encourage and promote the safe operation of vehicles on the road and function as guardians of public safety in a professional manner. This was not the case during a recent visit to your city/state.

I am writing this letter to express the danger and shock experienced while traveling North on Highway 25 out of Tishomingo, Mississippi on Sunday, May 29th, at approximately 3:15 p.m. CST.

I was encountered from behind by a state trooper who ran our car and an oncoming car completely off the road. The state trooper passed us on a double-yellow line in excess speed of 80-90 miles an hour. The blue lights were flashing but the siren was not blaring.

I am appalled at the high-rate of speed and the danger we

I will be writing to Colonel Marvin E. Curtis, Director of the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol to express my concerns, along with the fear and panic received when approached by the driving methods used by this state trooper on May 29th.

I am thankful for the quick thinking used by the driver in our vehicle! He kept all of us from being injured and we arrived at our destination safely.

He walked into the bedroom, closed the door and in a second his life was over. His children had no father. His wife had no husband and his parents had no son. And we would never hear his laughter again. Anyone who has never been touched by this cannot imagine the horror you feel when this happens.

My first thought was how could he do this? How could he

be so selfish? Did he not realize the lives that would be destroyed because of his actions? Did he care? My second thought was why would he do this? Did we not let him know how much we loved him? Was there something we could have done? Why was he in such pain? Then came, who can I blame for this? His wife? His parents? Me? After years of wrestling with this, and I mean many years, I finally reached a conclusion. I can't blame anyone. Not him, not me, and not anyone else. Pain is an extremely strong emotion. We all deal with it in different ways. I wish he could have found another way but I guess to him, this was the only way.

Death is hard enough to deal with, but suicide seems to carry an extra burden. The way

people feel about it for one. When my brother-in-law killed himself we were faced with his death on top of people questioning how God felt about this. I've never questioned it.

I know of one great man who begged God for the strength to let him die. Sampson. Yes, Sampson committed suicide with help from God. (Judges 16 vs. 30) Sampson asked God to give him strength so that he could die among his enemies and God gave him the strength. What would be the difference in what Sampson did and anyone else? Suicide is suicide. There is no difference. Fortunately, no one here has the right to decide where we go after we die. Some want you to believe they do but those are the ones who somehow, have forgotten about a very strong, passionate man who was loved by God. I took comfort in that.

And I take comfort that the same God and sympathized with son's pain, will help the one who understands and anyone else's. God who will look down and see what's in despite our weakness.

So, in conclusion one who is living the nightmare just remembers deep into the heart makes no mistakes. I'm sure those who ever let anyone tell Sampson were heart well, even though without a doubt, with God.

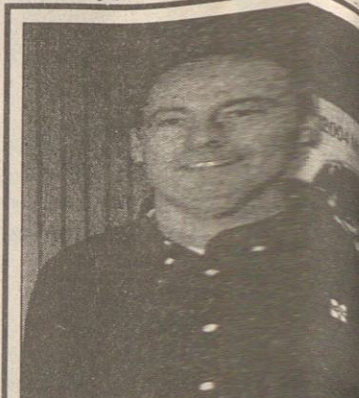
