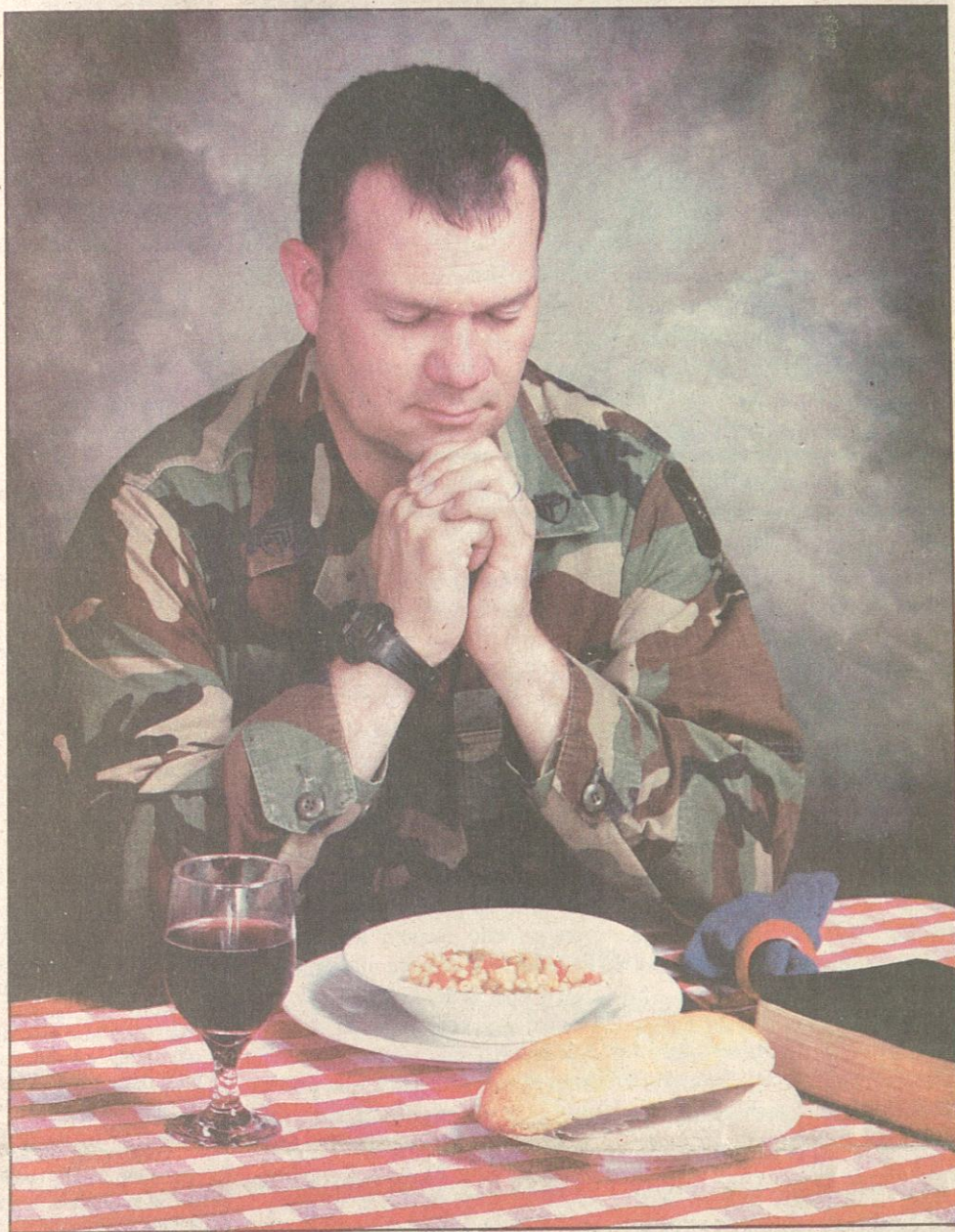
We also want to say a special Happy Father's Day to all our fathers here at home.

History of Father's Day

In 1909, Mrs. John B. Dodd, of Spokane, Washington, first proposed the idea of a father's day. Mrs. Dodd wanted a special day for her father, William Smart. William Smart was a Civil War veteran, was widowed when he died in childbirth with their sixth child. Smart was left to raise all his children alone on a small farm in eastern Washington state.

The first Father's Day was observed on June 19, 1910 in Spokane, Washington. Mrs. Dodd wanted Father's Day to be celebrated on the first day in June, her father's birthday. However, the Spokane council couldn't get the resolution through the first reading until the third Sunday in June. At about the same time in various towns across America people were beginning to celebrate a "father's day." In 1924 President Calvin Coolidge supported the idea of a national Father's Day.

Finally in 1966 President Lyndon Johnson signed a presidential proclamation declaring the third Sunday of June as Father's Day. (Taken from Internet Sources)

Burnsville's Voting Boxes To Be Examined

After only a 5 vote difference in Burnsville's balloting for mayor on June 7, candidate David Nixon has retained a lawyer to make a request to examine the town's voting boxes.

In the election, Nixon received 172 votes to the incumbent Bobby Harold Johnson's 177 votes. Nixon said he has

received numerous calls asking him to request an examination of the boxes for various reasons.

Nixon added that he will not make any decision as to whether to contest the election or not until after the examination of the boxes tentatively set for Monday, June 20th at 1:00 p.m. has been made.

Exposure To Smoke Is Fatal To Iuka Woman

An Iuka woman, Annie Pearl Hargrove, died Monday, June 13, after being exposed to heavy smoke at her home according to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon.

Hargrove, 58, was pronounced dead at 2:15 p.m. at North Mississippi Medical Center-Iuka. According to Wilemon, family members indicated that a skillet/pot had been left on the stove, and the house had filled with smoke. Ms. Hargrove, who had her

inhaler with her, was able to get outside, but she collapsed on the porch. "She had bad asthma along with some other health problems," Wilemon said, "and in an incident like this I'm going to check for carbon monoxide. With her asthmatic condition, that acute exposure could have set it off."

Services for Annie Pearl Hargrove were incomplete at press time, and will be announced later by Lee-Sykes Funeral Home of Columbus, MS.

Arkansas Teen Drowns At Yellow Creek Monday Afternoon

Carl Robert Harris, 16, of Wynne, AR, apparently drowned while trying to swim across an inlet on Yellow Creek near the Tennessee line around 4:15 p.m. on Monday, June 13. Harris had recently come to Corinth to spend the summer with his father, and he and some friends had come to Yellow Creek for a swimming outing.

Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon said the boy and two friends were swimming in the Crappie Hollow area near Piney Point. Apparently two of the swimmers were trying to swim across an inlet when young Harris gave out, went under, and did not

come back up. The inlet they were attempting to swim across is approximately 100 yards wide.

The friends called 911 for help, and personnel from the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, the Tishomingo County Rescue Squad, F&W Authorities, and TVA Rescue Personnel all responded to the scene.

Divers recovered the body of Harris about 7:15 in approximately 17 feet of water near the Yellow Creek Port. Coroner Wilemon said the cause of death has been ruled as freshwater drowning. Harris' body will be taken back to Wynne, AR for burial.

Sprouting Tomato - A Rare Find

Mrs. Dela Cox of Iuka has a usual tomato—it has sprouted a new plant. Mrs. Cox purchased a basket of tomatoes from Leon Thompson's Vegetable Stand at the railroad overpass on Highway 25 N in Iuka. She took her tomatoes home where she stored them on the cabinet. She said she noticed one of the tomatoes had a bump on the side of it. After

several days on the cabinet, she saw that the tomato had sprouted a new plant. She called Tishomingo County's Extension Director, Danny Owen. Owen called Vegetable Specialist, Dr. David Nagel at Mississippi State University. Nagel said a tomato's sprouting is a rare occurrence, but it has been known to happen. Nagel added that possible explanations included

sudden temperature swings or spraying with a blossom setting chemical.

Miss Dela, a loyal reader of *The Tishomingo County News—Vidette and Belmont News*—said she has put the tomato sprout in a flowerpot and covered the rest of the tomato with dirt so that the birds can't peck it. She added, "I have always told my friends that I would like to have something that nobody else has, and now I've got it." This is definitely an unusual occurrence that she will enjoy sharing with others.

The fire is believed to have started behind the oven. The County's Fire Investigator as well as the Insurance Investigators were on the scene Monday morning, June 13, to try to determine the exact cause. The fire remains under investigation at this time.

Thursday evening, June 9th, Jim Seago, Iuka's Animal Control Officer, drove into my driveway and asked if I had a mean dog, that needed to be taken off to the city dog pound. He said someone had called the Sheriff's Dept. to complain about a dog tangled up around a tree with no water. Well, the Sheriff's Dept. called the City Police Department, since mean and stray or neglected animals are not the concern of the County authorities when they are within the city's limits.

The dog was tied to a Box Elder Tree in our yard with a roaming radius of approximately 30 feet. Fresh water and food were within reach of her lead line. Molly is not a "mean mangy" dog. She is well fed, well groomed, and friendly to a fault. The person or persons who called the authorities were watching from across the street when the Animal Control Officer visited me Thursday evening. I asked him to invite them over to see what they were complaining about but they refused to come over and see that they were wrong. I might suggest that next time they put their eyes and brains in motion before they put their mouths in gear.

Two days earlier, on Tuesday the 7th, someone moved

Molly from a tree on the other end of our property to an oak tree 150 feet west, next to our neighbors fence row. Whoever moved her did NOT move her water and food bowls so she was there in the heat of the day with NO WATER. It's a good thing I didn't see this sneaky little caper taking place or the guilty party would be recovering from serious bodily harm. We can't help but wonder if the person who moved Molly on Tuesday is the same mis-guided individual who called Animal Control on Thursday. If someone has a gripe with me come and tell me your problem, don't abuse my daughter's dog to "get even" with me.

The Myopia Myth

It is estimated that 25% of our population is myopic (nearsighted). Some say this is inherited. Statistics disprove this. Before age 10, approximately 4 to 6% of the population is nearsighted. When the same children enter college, the number rises from 60 to 80%, with a higher percentage among the honor and graduate students. Evidently, there is a connection between amount of reading and nearsightedness.

In a survey of 100 families, only 2% of children who could read or write showed myopia. Yet among their children who were attending school, approximately 65% were nearsighted. This happens in a single generation in a population known to be somewhat farsighted.

Yet, some still believe that nearsightedness is inherited, that it tends to run in families, although this example shows massive reversal in a single generation. Genetics cannot account for it.

THAT SETTLES IT!

Because the parties in a civil lawsuit may agree to settle the case at any point in a lawsuit, most civil lawsuits never go to trial. A compromise between opposing parties can take place from the time the lawsuit is filed up to where the case has been tried but before the jury reaches a verdict. A settlement consists of an agreement by the plaintiff to accept money in return for dropping the action against the injured party. While the plaintiff's lawyer may offer a realistic assessment as to whether the lawsuit based on the plaintiff's claim will ultimately be successful, the final decision of whether or not to accept a settlement offer rests solely with the plaintiff.

HINT: If you are involved in an auto crash, never bow to the pressure from the other party's insurance company to settle without consulting a lawyer.

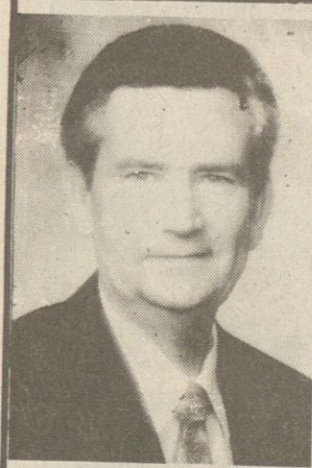

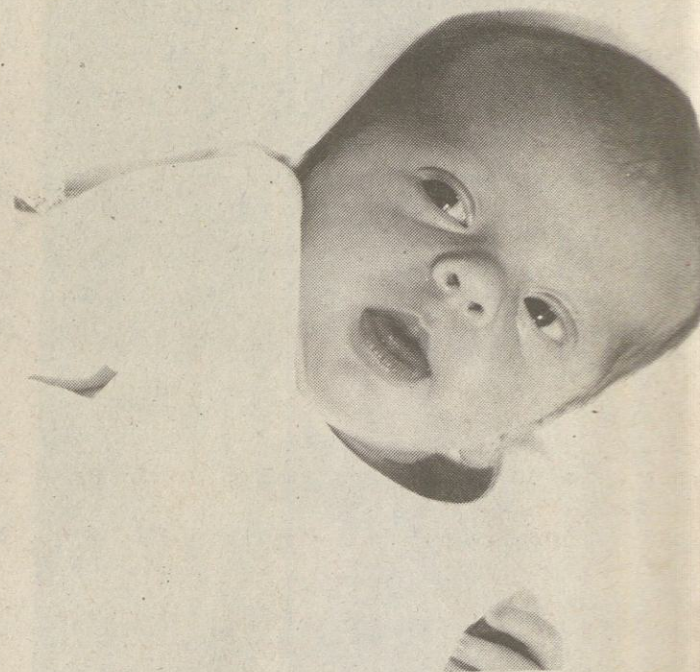


Happy Birthday To The 20th Century Club!

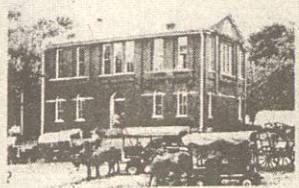

birth of the *Tishomingo Patriot*, at Jacinto, with J. M. Norment as editor and publisher. This paper supported the Bell-Everett Presidential ticket. The paper was published until the Yankees overran the county.

Two papers were published at Iuka after the war—the *Iuka Gazette*, Dr. J. S. Davis, editor, and the *Iuka Mirror*, Dr. Simmons editor and proprietor.

In Corinth after the war there was the *News*, by Milligan Brown & Vesey, and later by J. L. Wofford; the

Republican, by Jones Bros., and the *Model Farmer*, by Barr & Key. Several other papers were started in Corinth after the division of the county.



President Clinton was born William Jefferson Blythe IV, but took his stepfather's last name of Clinton at the age of 16.

Keith and J. K. Polk. On January 12, 1860, L. T. Shull and John M. Watson purchased the paper and changed it to a weekly. The *Young America* suspended publication in April, 1860.

The first week in September, 1860, marked the

following information was described from Fan Alexander Cochran's book entitled *History of Old Tishomingo County, Mississippi Territory*.

Newspapers Published in Old Tishomingo County Before the Division of the Counties

The first four newspapers published in the county were the *Jacinto Reporter*, in 1849; the *Eastport Gazette*, in the 1850's; the *Eastport North Union*, by G. Lewis, in 1848; and the *Eastport Republican*, by W. H. Tison, in 1851.

Rienzi's first newspaper was the *Clipper*, the first issued in its appearance on January 18, 1857. The office was owned by J. G. Lowrey

R. H. Gibson, J. A. Estes being editor and publisher. The *Clipper* was a column folio and was a very creditable publication. A

months after the paper was changed to S. H. Lockhart purchased an interest in the

paper, the style of the firm changed to S. H. Lockhart & Co. W. I. A. Estes continued as editor until

October 31, 1857, when he severed his connection with the paper, J. M. Martin and S. H. Lockhart taking editorial

charge. The 1st of May, 1858, S. Moore purchased the paper and with J. M. Martin

editor continued its publication until early in the year 1859, when the paper was discontinued.

The first paper ever printed in Corinth was the *Corinthian*, W. E. Gibson editor.

This paper was started in the year 1857 and continued its successful existence until the

1st of October, 1858, when the paper was purchased by C. P. & Co., the name of the

paper changed to the *Cross City*, with W. I. A. Estes publisher and W. E. Gibson

editor, the first issue of the paper was made on October 9, 1858. In January, 1859, John

Keith succeeded Mr. Estes as publisher, and on September 1st of the same year R. W.

Johnson purchased a half interest in the office and succeeded Mr. Keith as publisher. On October 29th Mr.

Johnson resigned his position as editor and the publisher, Mr. Johnson, assumed editorial

charge. On the 26th of November, Mr. Johnson severed his connection with the

Cross City and on January 11, 1860, Dr. M. Davenport purchased the plant and on

February 18th secured the services of Dan Q. Allen an associate editor, and thus the

paper was conducted until January 12, 1862, when the office was purchased by M. H.

Griffin and T. T. C. Ledbetter and the publication of the paper continued until the evacuation

of Corinth by the Confederates. The next newspaper to be

started in Corinth was the *Republican*, edited by J. M. Jones. This paper was

owned by E. C. Gillenwaters, and the name changed to the *True Democrat* on the 25th of

September, 1859. This paper was a six-column folio and

supported the Douglas-Johnson Presidential ticket, and Jackson

makers, Stephen S. Hogue, L. N. Phillips and J. M. Thompson,

independent candidates for the lower house of the State legislature. On the 15th of

October, Thomas T. C. Ledbetter became publisher of

the *Democrat* and E. C. Gillenwaters and J. M. Jones

editors. On the 10th of December W. H. Jones

purchased the *Democrat* and in April, 1860, Mr. Gillenwaters

severed his connection with the paper and J. M. Jones assumed

editorial charge. On the 1st of October, 1859, the

Young America, a new tri-weekly newspaper, made its

Letter To The Editor...

I am writing in response to Beth Bolton's letter in the June 2nd issue, and also in response to the letter from the family who had suffered a suicide. Whoever is going through a tough time right now because of an emotional problem, a mental illness - yours or someone else's - you are not alone. We do have a group in Iuka that meets once a month now - on the first Monday of every month from 6-7 at Iuka Public Library. You can contact me for further information at 901-268-7029.

Going through a hard time is nothing to be ashamed of, as a matter of fact, smart people get help! Many times, when someone is ill, with a bad flu, a broken bone, cancer, heart trouble, Parkinson's, Alzheimer's, the community is there - with

casseroles, with prayers, with an encouraging word. Too often, when a person suffers a debilitating chronic mental illness, depression, bipolar disorder, schizophrenia, an eating disorder...people back away, there is conversation in hushed tones, the family is believed to be at fault, the patient is believed to deserve their illness, and so they are robbed of one of the most important aspects of any recovery - support and love of those around you.

The brain is the most complex organ in the body, and yes, many things can go wrong with it physiologically. (Did you know that many of the symptoms of temporal lobe epilepsy are the same symptoms of bipolar and schizophrenia?) Many years ago, tuberculosis was be-

lieved to be caused by a weak character, polio was thought to be caused by neglectful mothering. The science - that God gave us - taught us differently and saved lives. Science is now teaching us about true brain disorders. It is my prayer that not one more person is treated as my brother was - beaten, ostracized, talked about, rather than treated for his illness. He is treated now, but it is almost too late, so much damage has been done, and in many ways his life is a tragedy.

As for the family that suffered the suicide, God's word says "judge not, lest ye be judged". No one knows what God's purposes are, but we as people are here to serve one another, and to give our love and understanding no matter what illness befalls someone. Gretchen Meyer Hernando, Mississippi

Letter To The Editor

The following questions were presented to the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors at their meeting on June 6, 2005 by Terry and Resa Witt.

1. Auxiliary Deputies

How many auxiliary deputies has the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors approved for hiring or appointment by the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department? **Board response:** It was stated that the board only had authority over auxiliary deputies that are paid by the county. The board stated that the county does not pay the auxiliary deputies at present.

How many of these auxiliary deputies that have been appointed or hired are board certified? **Board response:** It was stated that they could not answer this question, as they do not have authority or knowledge concerning auxiliary deputies.

Does the board of supervisors and the sheriff's department approve of having uncertified and/or poorly trained deputies within the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department? If so, why? **Board response:** It was stated that they could not answer this question, as they do not have authority or knowledge concerning auxiliary deputies. **Sheriff response:** None, as sheriff Whitlock nor a deputy representing him was present at the board meeting.

If not, why are there poorly trained deputies within the department now? And also, why are these deputies being promoted within the Tishomingo County sheriff's department? **Sheriff's response:** None (not present)

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors can limit or eliminate the positions of auxiliary deputies within the sheriff's department according to 19-25-23 of the Mississippi Code.

Does the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors intend to continue to allow auxiliary deputies within the sheriff's department, regardless of being certified or properly trained? **Board response:** It was stated that the board only had authority over auxiliary deputies that are paid by the county. The board stated that the county does not pay the auxiliary deputies at present.

Our recommendation:

In order to restrict liability against the county, concerning situations such as happened with us and other similar situations from reoccurring, we believe it would be a

common sense approach to prohibit any auxiliary deputies from working with or for the Tishomingo county sheriff's department that are not board certified (Board on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Training).

2. Why are people routinely detained after their bond has been set and an attempt is made to pay the bond with sufficient funds? **Sheriff's response:** None, (not present)

There is a notice posted in the sheriff's department that states: *Anyone arrested for any alcohol or*

drug charge will remain in jail for 5 hours before making bond. Any one arrested on any domestic violence charge must remain in jail at least 8 hours before making bond. No one will be allowed to make bond after 10 p.m. All bonds will be set by a judge.

Per Sheriff Whitlock 1-5-2004

We would like to know what statute or ordinance authorizes the sheriff to enact and enforce these rules. **Sheriff's response:** None, (not present)

3. Does the sheriff's department routinely charge a process fee when releasing a prisoner when no process has been served and if so, why? **Sheriff's response:** None, (not present)

4. Why does the sheriff allow and reward behavior such as an arrest performed without a warrant or an affidavit and when the arresting officer has seen no unlawful behavior when a warrant or the witnessing of a crime is necessary for a legal arrest? **Sheriff's response:** None, (not present)

5. Why has the sheriff or a deputy representing the deputy not been present at all board of supervisor meetings as required by Mississippi statute 19-3-25, which states:

10-3-25 The sheriff of the county shall attend all meetings of the board of supervisors, either in person or by a deputy, and shall execute all its process and orders.

Sheriff response: None, as neither sheriff Whitlock or a deputy representing him was present to answer the question as to why he was not attending. **Board response:** County Attorney Nick Phillips responded by saying that he would check about the matter and get back in touch with us later in the week.

6. We have requested copies of entries on the jail docket, which are public record, and have been denied a copy of these records by Marty Rutherford, an employee of the sheriff's department, with the reason being stated: *They are unable to copy the*

records with the existing copies that they have.

Who is responsible for assuring that the sheriff's department can comply with their duties as far as equipment needed and why has the sheriff's department not been supplied with the proper equipment to fulfill their duties of supplying copies of documents, which are public record?

Board response: County Attorney Nick Phillips responded by saying that he was taking care of the matter and would get back in touch with us later in the week. However, we had already retained an attorney and paid attorney fees because of the sheriff department's refusal to give us these records, that by law, they are mandated to do.

7. The justice court clerk's office has told us that to look through their records, one of their employees will have to remain with us and charge us for their time for simply watching us. This is not the policy that the chancery clerk's office follows. When records are requested from the chancery clerk, the records are

simply handed over and the person simply remains in the chancery clerk's waiting room with no charges unless copies are needed. Why does the justice clerk's office not follow the procedure of the chancery clerk's office and require simply that the person remain in the waiting room of the clerk's office in full view of the office personnel and only charge if copies are re-

quired? **Board's response:** The board stated they would look into this matter for us so that the board could develop a reasonable procedure for us to access the records.

Once again, Sheriff Glen Whitlock, has blatantly disregarded the laws and the people of Mississippi by not appearing or having a deputy appear for him at the Tishomingo County Board meet-

ing as required by Mississippi code 19-3-25 which states:

19-3-25

The sheriff of the county shall attend all meetings of the board of supervisors, either in person or by deputy, and shall execute all its process and orders.

County.
