Tishomingo County Development Foundation Meets at Domes International

The Tishomingo County Development Foundation held its June monthly meeting at Domes International in Paden.

Board members toured Domes International. CEO Dicky Sparks gave a brief background on the company. Domes International manufactures dome and other structures. The company sells these structures worldwide. Kwajalein in the Marshall Islands was the first major contract and the company also has a presence in India and Africa. The company recently completed a jail in Boaz, Alabama, with significant savings to the sheriff's department. Fiberglass dome structures offer cost savings

over conventional construction and have the added advantages of lower maintenance costs, greater energy efficiency, and a life span up to 300 years. The domes are also very tough and can deflect a .38 caliber bullet. Domes International employs 25 persons worldwide. The company plans to add another 25 to 50 employees in the near future.

Board members heard a report on the private funds campaign. The foundation has 74 members who have invested \$17,990. Chairman John R. White reminded board members to continue working on the private funds campaign and that private funds are used only for marketing

Tishomingo County.

- Depressed sexual interest and activity.
- Hopeless or helpless feelings.
- Feelings of guilt, worthlessness.
- Pessimistic outlook.
- Suicidal thoughts.
- Changed appetite, either increased or decreased.
- Changed sleep, either increased (with increased need for sleep) or decreased (with tiredness)

People on the "high" side of bipolar disorder feel on top of things, productive, sociable, and self-confident but the feel-

ings are exaggerated.

The "lows" of bipolar disorder are in a profoundly sad, irritable, or "flat" mood. When depressed, people with bipolar disorder lose interest in their usual activities. They cannot concentrate, remember, or make decisions.

Scientists believe that bipolar disorder is the result of chemical imbalance that affects certain parts of the brain. There

is also genetic input.

Bipolar disorder is treated by medication, psychotherapy, support and education.

Understanding Bipolar Disorder

Bipolar disorder is a disorder of the brain resulting in episodes of mania and depression. These episodes last days

to months. Bipolar disorder strikes 1.5 percent to 3 percent of the adult population affecting more than 3 million Americans.

Recognition and diagnosis of the disorder in its earliest stages is critically important. Although bipolar disorder is described as a mood disorder, episodes of illness produce changes in thinking and judgment, speech, activity, energy, sleep and ability to maintain relationships with others.

If you have bipolar disorder, a person is either high and

active or low and down. Mania describes the activated phase of bipolar disorder. Symptoms are:

- Either an elevated, happy mood or an irritable, angry unpleasant mood.
- Increased activity and energy.
- More thought and faster thinking than normal.
- Increased talking, more rapid speech than normal.
- Ambitious, often grandiose, plans.
- Poor judgment.
- Increased sexual interest and

A NO-WIN SITUATION

It's upon us one more time! The Summer Reading Program at the public library. This year it's all about having fun at the CIRCUS! The theme is "FUNtastic Reading!"

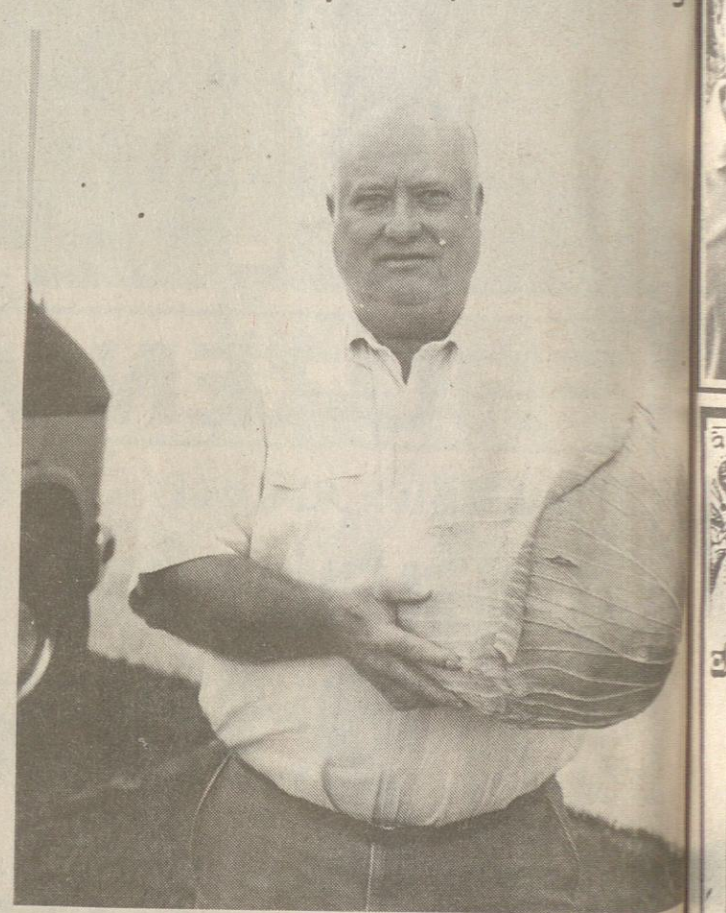
Our program is set to be July 8th-29th, 2005 on Fridays! The schedule is as follows:

The Smiths have answered a call to pastor the Heritage Hills Baptist Church in Lincoln City, Indiana.

"Pastor Jerry" as he is known, is the son of Marie Smith and the late Johnny Smith of Iuka. His wife of 29 years, Paula Jane, is the daughter of Braxton and Evelin Hester of the South Crossroads Community. They have two children, Jeremy who graduated from Vermont Technical College recently and has accepted a position as assistant project engineer with Whiting & Turner Construction in Baltimore, MD, and their daughter, Julie Smith Hesson, of Louisville, KY, who is married and the mother of the Smith's first grandchild, Luke.

Jerry and Jane Smith left Tishomingo County in the 1970's when Jerry answered his call to preach. 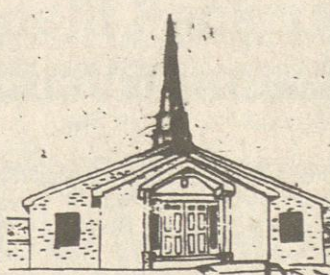

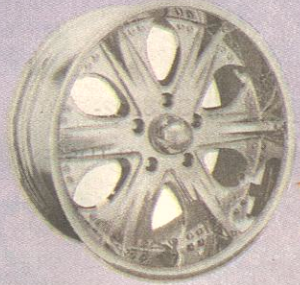

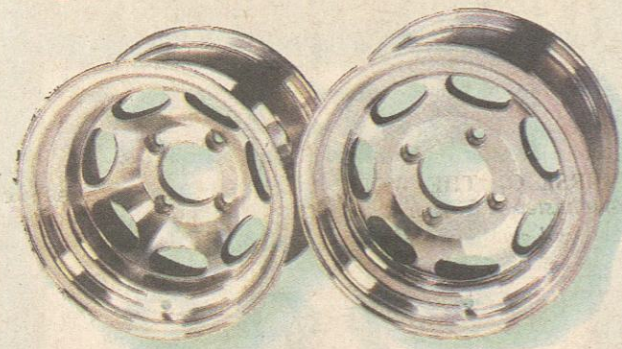

TCHS Smoke Signals by Callie Daniel

The following information can be found in Fan Cochran's book *History of Old Tishomingo County, Mississippi Territory* which is located in the Tishomingo County Archives & History Museum's research library.

THE MEMPHIS AND CHARLESTON

(The construction of Tishomingo County's first railroad.)

Beginning in 1852, the work of building the Memphis and Charleston railroad was pushed as rapidly as possible, and the last spike was driven just outside of the Western limits of Iuka on the first of April, 1857, five years after work was first begun at Memphis and Stevenson. The total length of the road was 271 miles, with one branch of 13 1/2 miles and another of 2 1/2, and 12 1/2 miles of side track, and cost finished and equipped \$6,102,540.09, averaging between \$20,000 and \$21,000 per mile including sidings. The completion of this road changed the history of Tishomingo County. New towns were started, old ones were abandoned, and a great change in the manner of living and marketing the products of the soil took place. Eastport and Farmington, two of the leading towns of the county, soon passed from view and Corinth, Burnsville and Iuka were accorded places on the map of the State. The railroad people had agreed to run the road through both Eastport and Farmington, for a consideration, but the people of the two towns only smiled. Eastport was located on the banks of the Tennessee River, at the head of all-the-year navigation, and the idea of the loss of a railroad affecting in

any manner the future prosperity of the place was, to the inhabitants, the height of absurdity. Those who had been intrusted with the management of the official affairs of the town of Farmington did not believe that the railroad would pass the place by, and thus lost the chance to make the town a permanency. For over twenty years, the products of old Tishomingo had been hauled to Eastport, from there to reach the markets of the world by way of the Tennessee River, but with the completion of the railroad a much cheaper, quicker, and far more satisfactory means of transportation was offered and the people were not slow to take advantage of the manifest benefits.

Previous to this time, ninety-five per cent of the clothing worn by the inhabitants of the "State of Tishomingo" was manufactured in the county, and the spinning wheel and hand loom were in daily use, but with the advent of the iron horse, ready made clothing made its appearance in the various towns throughout the county, and thereafter those financially able discarded the home spun garments for the greatly inferior, though far

only good enough for children and slaves. General merchandise stores were opened in all the towns of the county and large stocks of northern goods and ware purchased, and where during

the past it had been the rule to make and raise everything used and consumed in the county, cheaper freight rates caused the people to abandon diversified farming and devote their entire attention to the production of cotton.

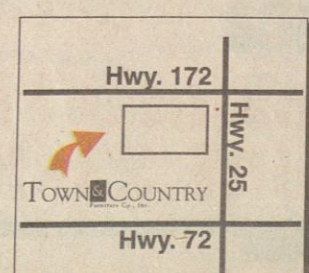
