City of Burnsville Election Lawsuit On Hold

A lawsuit contesting the June 7, 2005 Burnsville City mayor's election has been put on hold at this time, pending the results of qualifying for a special election planned for September 6, 2005.

Burnsville's mayor for 21 years, Bobby H. Johnson, was re-elected on June 7 by a narrow margin of five votes. The election results were contested by one of the other candidates, David Nixon, who was Johnson's closest opponent.

In a surprise move, Mayor Johnson resigned recently, stating that he did not want to put the city through a lawsuit or court trial.

Upon the resignation of Johnson, the Board of Aldermen for the city voted to hold a special election September 6.

According to candidate Nixon's attorney, Danny Lowrey of Corinth, Nixon has chosen to put the lawsuit on hold until the deadline to qualify to run in the special election has come.

Lowrey said if Nixon is the only candidate to qualify to run in the special election, he plans to withdraw the lawsuit at that time. Otherwise, he will determine at that time whether he will proceed or not.

Potential candidates have until Wednesday, August 17, 2005, to qualify to run for mayor of Burnsville. The paperwork needed in order to qualify may be picked up before August 17 at Burnsville City Hall during business hours.

IPD Traffic Stop Leads To Arrests

A routine traffic stop Sunday, July 31, by an Iuka City officer led to the arrest of two.

According to a report from Iuka Police Department, during a routine traffic stop Sunday in front of Wal-Mart, the passenger of a car, which was pulled over by Iuka Police Department Officer Cory Wilson, was arrested after it appeared that the man swallowed what may have been an illegal controlled substance and then resisted arrest.

Arrested was Derrick Pritchard, 28, of Iuka. In addition to being charged with resisting arrest, Pritchard was charged with failure to comply with an officer, possession of a controlled substance and possession of marijuana in a motor

vehicle. At press time, he was still being held at the Tishomingo County Jail.

Also arrested during the stop was the driver of the vehicle, Natasha Turner, 26, of Florence, Ala. She was charged with DUI-other substance, no insurance, no seatbelt, possession of a controlled substance and possession of marijuana in a motor vehicle. At press time, Turner had been released on bond.

According to the police department report, Pritchard was offered medical treatment following the incident, but he refused.

Officer Wilson was assisted at the scene by Iuka Police Captain Anita Mitchell and Tishomingo County Deputy Bruce Whited, according to the report.

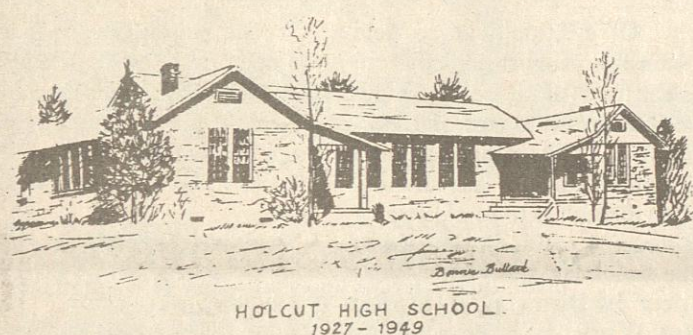
Read-To-Me Costume Contest

Middle Age And
Presbyopia...

If you're having trouble in focusing your eyes when reading a book or newspaper, this may indicate that your eyes' focusing ability has reached the stage of presbyopia. This is a natural occurrence for most people, especially when they enter middle-age. They feel the need to hold reading material further away from their eyes in order to read it clearly. They may also experience headaches because of the strain this puts on their vision.

Presbyopia results from the normal aging process of the lens of the eye. It comes on very gradually and can become a problem at any age. It occurs most often, however, between the ages of 40 and 45. This condition continues to need correction until about age 65 or 70 when the condition tends to stabilize.

Treatment for presbyopia consists of properly prescribed eyeglasses. If you have a focusing problem when reading or looking at objects close up, have your eyes examined by your eye doctor.

Legal Update

STATE YOUR COMPLAINT
A civil lawsuit begins with a "complaint" filed with the court in which the plaintiff alleges that the defendant violated or her legal rights and asks the court for a remedy. The complaint, which is delivered to the defendant, contains the information. To begin the lawsuit, the plaintiff must establish jurisdiction of the court. If it notifies the defendant that he or she is being sued and is required to respond. By receiving adequate notice, the defendant has time to prepare a lawyer and begin considering the basis on which he or she will contest the plaintiff's claims. Finally, the complaint frames the issues of fact and law that will be involved in the case, setting the stage for litigation.

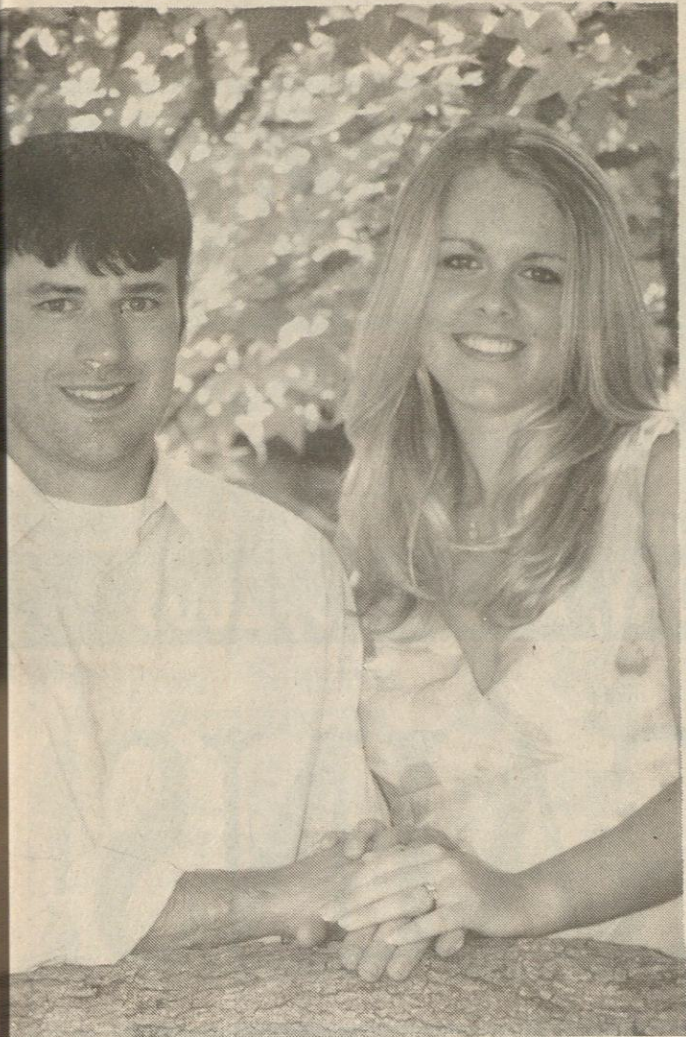

The church is located 2 miles West of Cherokee, AL. Turn on Millcreek Loop (CR 5) then go 2 miles and the church is on the right.

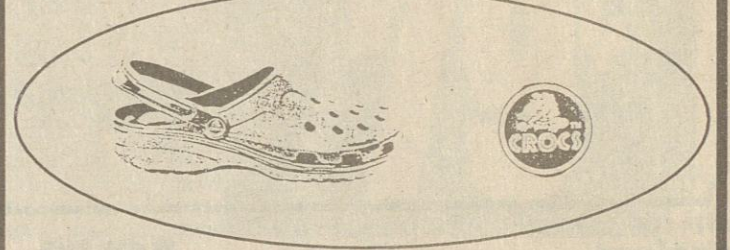

pleased. The Territory of Mississippi was organized April 7, 1798, embracing most of the vast area. In March 1817, this territory was divided, the eastern half being organized into the Alabama Territory, and the western portion later being admitted into the Union as the State of Mississippi on December 10, 1817. As early as 1818, the Chickasaw Indians' rights were under the strict observation of the white settlers, and to avoid a long troublesome controversy, the Indians relinquished their title and claim to all lands within the bounds of Tennessee by the Treaty of 1818. The Choctaws and Chickasaws, according to Adair, one of the earliest writers, were descendants from a tribe called Chickemilaws. The Pontotoc Treaty between the Government and the Chickasaws, completed October 22, 1832, gave the Chickasaws a reservation west of the Mississippi River. About this time a land office was set up at Pontotoc, and as early as 1833, white settlers came into the northern part of this territory, making preparations for permanent homes.

Immediately following the Pontotoc Treaty, the greatest

enactment the state legislature could have effected at that time for northeastern Mississippi was the one agreed on, February 9, 1936, dividing the lands ceded to the Government by the Chickasaws lying in the state of Mississippi into ten counties. Namely, there were: Tishomingo, Itawamba, DeSoto, Tunica, Panola, Tippah, Pontotoc, Fayette, Marshall, and Chickasaw. Tishomingo was referred to as the Free State of Tishomingo, or sometimes as Old State of Tishomingo, due to its enormous size, which was little less than that of an empire. It embraced all of the present counties of Tishomingo, Alcorn, and Prentiss, the largest ever in the state. The total area was 923,040 acres. The act to organize these counties was approved February 14, 1836, providing as follows: "Be it enacted by the legislature of the state of Mississippi that the following persons be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to organize the county of Tishomingo, to-wit: Peter G. Rives, James Davis, James McMatthews, A. M. Cowan. And full power is hereby given

to said commissioners, at any time after the passage of the act, to organize said county in the most speedy manner and according to such regulations as may be prescribed by said commissioners. And be it further enacted, that the board of county police of said county be and is hereby invested with full power to designate the place where the seat of justice for said county shall be located at the geographical center, or most convenient point, within five miles thereof, and said board of police may acquire by donation or purchase any quantity of land for the use of said county, not exceeding eighty acres."

Teens Across State Of Mississippi Gather For Weekend Retreat Addressing Abstinence

On June 3, 4, and 5th, 2005, the Booneville School District and the Mississippi Community Education Center's Aiming for Abstinence Programs brought together over 80 students for a weekend for workshops, speakers, debates and discussions focused on abstinence. The "Rising To The Stars" retreat was held at Lake Tiak-O'Khata in Louisville, Mississippi and focused on motivating and empowering teens to abstain from high-risk behaviors including tobacco, alcohol and other drugs with an emphasis on abstinence from premarital sex.

Attaining a vision of success is critical to breaking the cycle of poverty, teenage pregnancy, and other high-risk behaviors that exist among many at-risk youth. In an effort to help youth realize their full potential, the mentoring project offers high school students opportunities to serve as tutors/mentors for elementary students in order to provide younger students positive abstinent role models and to prepare them for continuing their education and healthy adult relationships.

Teens from across the State of Mississippi attended the three-day retreat, which included presentations by the Friends First Stars Program and the R.I.S.E. to Your Dreams

character-based abstinence program. The Booneville School District and the Mississippi Community Education Center abstinence programs are funded through a SPRANS Community Based Abstinence Education Program Grant. This grant supports these programs efforts in developing and implementing strategic, statewide communication efforts designed to increase awareness and acceptance of abstinence as a healthy choice and a positive lifestyle and by supporting abstinence-only education programs for school-aged children, males and females, ages 12-18.

Dr. Nancy New-Boyll, Executive Director of the Mississippi Community Education Center stated, "This retreat provided a venue in which youth were given an opportunity to learn and, more importantly, voice their opinions about the challenges and opportunities that they face in their world day to day. We are already making plans and looking forward to next years retreat."

Carolyn Gowen, co-author of the R.I.S.E. to Your Dreams Curriculum and Director of the Booneville School District's Abstinence Education Program commented, "It was refreshing to see so many school districts and other organizations represented at the retreat. We appreciate the collaborative efforts of all individuals and organizations involved that made the retreat a success, especially the Corinth Boys and Girls Clubs that provided transportation for some of the participants. It really does not matter what area of the state children come from; they all face the same pressures and hard decisions."

Kay Harrelson, abstinence educator attending the retreat said, "Our message is abstinence until marriage, but unless we help children and youth make wise decisions based on a strong foundation of character, we can't expect them to know what to do in sexual situations. Friends First mentors are top-notch teens and are excellent role models for our younger youth."

Various schools, church groups, and youth organizations with student mentors will begin to implement the program in the Fall 2005 semester and work with sponsors to provide character-based activities to younger students. A drama team has evolved out of the Booneville mentoring program and is available for presentations in schools and churches. Thirty seven percent of the population has O-positive blood, making it the most common type. So, many people with O-positive blood assume there are plenty of O-positive donors who will meet the demand. However, because it's the most common type, it's the type most commonly used by patients needed transfusions and more O-positive donors are constantly needed. What's more, O-positive blood can be given to patients who have A, B or AB-positive blood, but O-positive patients must have type-O blood.

O-negative blood is essential for several reasons. Only six percent of the population has O-negative blood, yet nine out of 100 patients receive O-negative transfusions. That's because O-negative blood is the universal blood type, even more so than O-positive. It can be given to anyone in an extreme emergency situation when there is no time to cross-match the donor's blood with the patient's. Another special need for O-negative blood is in the treatment of babies. Neonatal care facilities require fresh units of O-negative blood each day to treat their tiny patients.

"If you have never donated blood but know that you have O-positive or O-negative blood, remember that you're 'O, so special' to area patients," said Oldham. To schedule your donation you may call Joyce Sanders at 438-7546.

Conservation Corner

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) and Cornell Laboratory of Ornithology recently announced the establishment of an e-mail address (ivorybill@cornell.edu) and associated web site (http://www.birds.cornell.edu/ivorybill/). Those without internet access may request the form by calling (800) 843-2473.

"We've had reports of ivory-billed woodpeckers in people's backyards from Michigan to Maine," said Ron Rohrbaugh of the Cornell Lab of Ornithology. "These observations are well outside of the ivory-bill's historic range, but even within the range it's unlikely that someone would encounter one of their backyard. Rather, the birds sighted in these situations are almost certainly pileated woodpeckers. We urge the public to carefully study the differences between the two woodpeckers before reporting a sighting. This will help us focus on those reports that are most credible."

The Service has established a second e-mail address, ivorybill@fws.gov, where the public can submit questions or comments about the recovery of the ivory-billed woodpecker. The public may also write the Service at 1875 Century Boulevard, Atlanta, GA 30345.

The Service and Cornell Lab of Ornithology will work closely with partners throughout the Southeast to investigate credible reports of ivory-billed woodpeckers.

The partners hope that hunters, birders, hikers, kayakers and others who spend time exploring the bottomland hardwood swamps of the Southeast may be able to help in the search for the bird.

"It was kayaker Gene Sparling that led us to the confirmed Cache River Refuge sighting," said John Fitzpatrick, director of the Cornell Lab of Ornithology. "We hope that more ivory-billed woodpeckers are out there, just waiting to be seen."

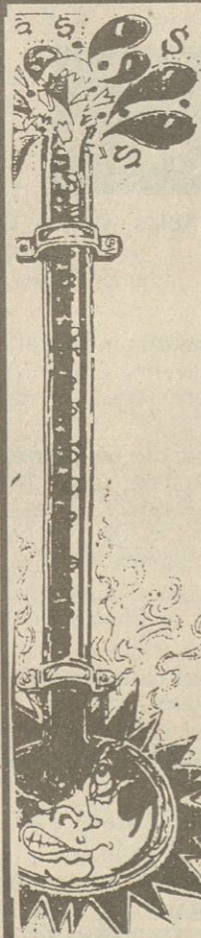

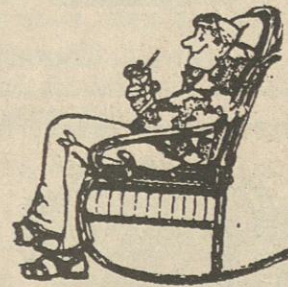
