Expect A Good Fit

CRASH-SCENE ADVISORY
People who are involved in automobile crashes are advised to simply exchange factual information at the scene. Immediately after the crash, they should consult with a lawyer about their case. Under no circumstances should they talk with insurance representatives for individuals involved in an accident. Nor should they sign anything. Insurers may try to contact accident victims personally, or through their attorneys, in an attempt to deal with the case before they hire attorneys. Insurers' goal is to lower their claims costs by contacting attorneys out of the settlement. All this may be done under the guise of "helping" victims, but these appeals until they are talked with their own lawyer.

Our reunion, held yearly on the third (3rd) Sunday in October, has grown to include the extended families of both John Austin and Meredian Murphy Nunley.

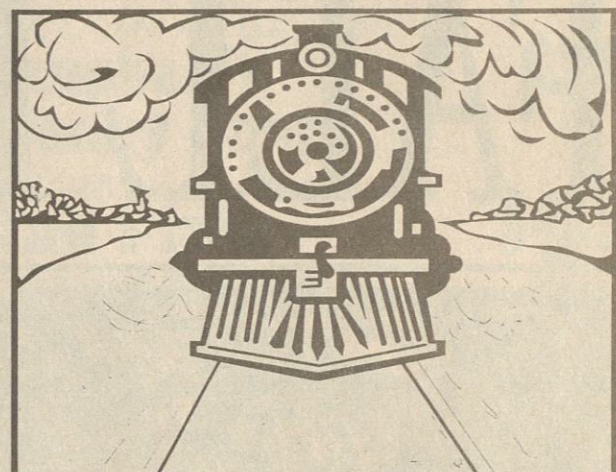

October Is Lupus Awareness Month...

The month of October is "Lupus Awareness Month". Those who experience lupus symptoms are encouraged to visit their physician.

What Is Lupus?

- Lupus is a widespread and chronic (lifelong) autoimmune disease that, for unknown reasons, causes the immune system to attack the body's own tissue and organs, including the joints, kidneys, heart, lungs, brain, blood, or skin.
- The immune system normally protects the body against viruses, bacteria, and other foreign materials. In an autoimmune disease like lupus, the immune system loses its ability to tell the difference between foreign substances

and its own cells and tissue. The immune system then makes antibodies directed against "self".

What Are The Symptoms Of Lupus?

- Symptoms often mimic other less serious illnesses.
- Symptoms can range from mild to life-threatening.
- Lupus can go into periods where symptoms are not present, called remission.
- Although lupus can affect any part of the body, most people experience symptoms in only a few organs.

What Causes Lupus?

- Lupus is NOT infectious, rare, or cancerous.
- Researchers do not know what causes lupus.
- While scientists believe there

is a genetic predisposition to the disease, it is known that environmental factors also play a role in triggering the disease.

- Some of the factors that may trigger lupus include infections, antibiotics, ultraviolet light, extreme stress, certain drugs, and hormones.
- Hormonal factors may explain why lupus occurs more frequently in females than in males.

How Is Lupus Treated?

For the vast majority of people with lupus, effective treatment can minimize symptoms, reduce inflammation and maintain normal bodily functions.

- Treatment approaches are based on the specific needs and symptoms of each person.
- Because the characteristics and course of lupus may vary significantly among individu-

als, it is important to emphasize that a thorough medical evaluation and ongoing medical supervision are essential to ensure proper diagnosis and treatment.

- Medications are often prescribed for people with lupus, depending on which organs are involved, and the severity of involvement.
- Commonly prescribed medications include:
 - nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDS),
 - acetaminophen
 - corticosteroids
 - antimalarials, and
 - immunomodulating drugs.

Increased professional awareness and improved diagnostic techniques and evaluation methods are contributing to the early diagnosis and treatment of lupus. With current methods of therapy 80-90% of people with lupus can look forward to a normal lifespan.



National Depression Screening Day Incorporates Postpartum Depression Screening Oct. 6

The birth of a baby is supposed to be a joyous and exciting time in a mother's life. But for many women, it is the exact opposite.

According to the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, about 70-80 percent of women experienced the "Baby Blues" after childbirth and about 10 percent of women develop postpartum depression (PPD), a serious medical condition that develops during the first month after childbirth.

To help address this serious health issue, National Depression Screening Day—the program that offers free, anonymous screenings for mental health disorders to the public—is incorporating screening for postpartum depression into this year's event.

Those who are concerned that they or a loved one may be suffering from postpartum depression can attend a free, anonymous screening at one of the more than 2,500 sites across the country participating in National Depression Screening Day on Oct. 6, 2005.

As part of the program, attendees will have the opportunity to take a brief, written screening and talk to a health professional about their results. Those who score positive will be referred to local treatment resources.

National Depression Screening Day, now in its fifteenth year, is a program of the nonprofit screening for mental health. The free program provides a non-threatening way for the public to be screened for depression and related illnesses such as bipolar disorder, anxiety, post-traumatic stress disorder and postpartum depression. Symptoms of postpartum depression:

- *Strong feelings and depression and anger that continues beyond one or two months after childbirth.
- *Feelings of sadness, doubt, guilt, or helplessness that increase each week and get in the way of everyday activities.
- *Inability to care for oneself or the baby.
- *Difficulty concentrating or doing tasks at home or on the job.
- *Change in appetite.
- *Concern and worry about the baby are too intense, or interest in the baby is lacking.
- *Anxiety or panic attacks.
- *Withdrawal or isolation from friends and family.
- *Fears of harming the baby.
- *Thoughts of self-harm or suicide.

How Husbands, Partners, Friends and Families Can Help

- *Get a referral to a doctor that is trained to deal with postpartum depression.
- *Show love and compassion, not anger or impatience.
- *Help her get plenty of rest and proper nutrition.
- *Build a support group of friends and family who can help with childcare, cooking laundry and housework.
- *Offer her understanding and reassurance.
- *Take some time off from work to be with her and the baby to prevent isolation.
- *Care for the baby for a few hours and encourage the new mother to spend some relaxing time with friends. Suggest she go to dinner, the movies or for a long walk.
- *Do not judge your partner's feelings or reactions. Instead, listen and sympathize.
- *Be patient. It will take time for the new mother to recover.

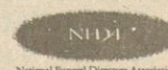

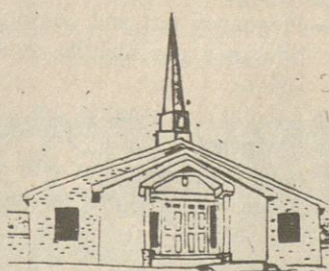

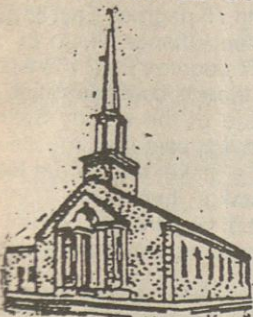

Volunteers Represent Tishomingo County At Genealogy Conference

Cindy Nelson and RaNae Vaughn recently traveled to Salt Lake City, Utah, where they attended the 2005 Federation of Genealogical Societies' annual conference. The Federation, celebrating its 29th anniversary this year, now serves close to 600 member societies. These societies represent over 500,000 genealogists across North America. Delegates from these societies attended the conference, to share successes and concerns about their societies with others, and to take new information back to share with members of their societies. The theme of the finely crafted program was "Reminders of the Past, Visions for the Future."

While at the conference, a "sneak preview" of a huge effort the LDS church has undertaken to digitize microfilm for the internet was demonstrated. As the project progresses over time, indexes to records from 110 nations previously stored on microfilm will become accessible to virtually everyone via the touch of a few keystrokes on the Internet. Previously, the information contained on this microfilm was stored in the LDS church's

Granite Mountain Records Vault, and requests for copies of the information on the microfilm had to be sent to a local LDS family history center. While in town, the two women researched in the renowned Family History Library, located less than a block from the Salt Palace Convention Center

where the convention was held. Nelson, who is Chapter Regent for Chief Tishomingo Chapter DAR, assisted Vaughn in collecting needed paperwork on her patriot in order to complete her DAR membership application.

The Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society is a member of the Mississippi Federation of Historical Societies, and as such, represented this organization as well during their six-day trip. The conference, which was held September 6-10, reminded the duo that the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society far surpasses many organizations nationwide in management skills and research abilities. Nelson, who volunteers as Executive Director for the Tishomingo County Archives & History Museum,

and Vaughn, who volunteers as the Librarian for the John Marshall Stone Research Library at the museum, purchased and donated new resource materials for researchers to use in the Society's genealogical library housed in the historic Tishomingo County courthouse. "It's an exciting time for reserving both county and family history," Nelson said. "Having gone to a convention this size, meeting volunteers and paid personnel working with major budgets, and realizing the resources that we have available in our small budgeted volunteer county archives, makes me very proud." Currently, there are approximately

400 cataloged items in the library, and the genealogical collection continues to grow on a daily basis. Additional records include surname files, church and school records, businesses records, photographs and maps. Transcriptions are continuing for the many original courthouse record books located at the Tishomingo County archives for the public to use in their research. Electronically, the Society offers 275 pages of county data on its Web site (<http://www.rootsweb.com/~mstchgs/index.htm>), two public use computers that contain 10 years of Society transcriptions, 80 searchable CDs, Family Tree Maker 8.0, 47 census and other county records on microfilm (which can easily be printed), and publishes a journal of Chronicles & Epitaphs for its members on a quarterly basis. 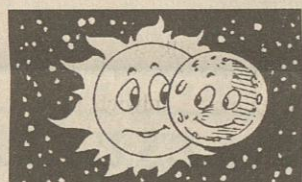

We are afraid we may forget someone, but we want to offer our sincere thanks to:

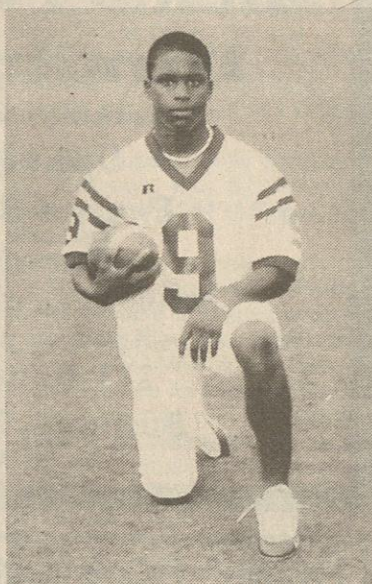
