Air Evac Expands To Better Service Area

Air Evac has expanded and can now service Tishomingo Countians even more efficiently. A new Air Evac facility opened on September 8 in Corinth. The new facility is located behind Magnolia Hospital and services a 70-mile radius of the Corinth location, including Tishomingo County and southern Tennessee. This new location enables Air Evac to provide a much quicker response to both accidents and hospital transfers. The team is also even more familiar with the area it services.

The 24-hour helicopter service flies with both a paramedic and an RN on board. Air Evac first began in the West Missouri area in 1985 and now has some 58 helicopters serving 11 states with more locations scheduled to open soon. Corinth is the first Mississippi-based facility. Tishomingo Countians who work the Corinth location include: Earl McIntosh, Gail Hudson, Bubba Carpenter, and Rick Owens. They had been working out of the Muscle Shoals location before moving to Corinth.

Iuka Man Found Dead In Submerged Vehicle Near Tishomingo/Alcorn Line

An Alcorn County homeowner discovered a submerged vehicle in his pond Thursday morning and the driver dead inside the vehicle.

According to Alcorn County Sheriff Jimmy Taylor, the driver of the vehicle, Tony Hollis, 44, of Iuka, appeared to have pulled into the driveway of a residence on Alcorn County Road 358 near the Lovejoy/Leedy Community and attempted to turn around when he apparently backed off into the pond.

Since the residence is near the Tishomingo/Alcorn County line, the original call came in on 9-1-1 in Tishomingo County. It was determined the residence was in Alcorn County, so

emergency personnel from that county responded to the scene Thursday.

Sheriff Taylor explained that the homeowner awoke around 9 a.m. Thursday and saw the top of a vehicle sticking out of the water at his pond. He and some friends were able to pull part of the vehicle out of the water and then they realized that the driver was still in the car, so they called 9-1-1.

According to Taylor, after an examination of the tire tracks at the scene, it appeared that Hollis was attempting to turn around in the driveway and accidentally backed off into the small pond. The pond was very deep, according to Taylor.

The authorities said there

did not appear to be any foul play; however, the body was sent to Jackson for an autopsy.

Tony Hollis was the father of seven and was a 16 year employee of the Heil Company in Tishomingo.

He is survived by his wife, Teresa Hollis of Iuka, his mother and stepfather, Anna and George Jankus of Iuka; five sons, Jacob Hollis of Jacinto, Wesley Hollis and Matthew Day, both of Iuka, Gary Day of Warrior, Ala. and Chris Day of Athens, Ala.; two daughters, Sarah Roach of Glen and Cindy Enlow of Belmont; and four grandchildren, Savannah Enlow, Holly Day, Courtney Day and Kaylin Roach.

Donna Cupido Still Missing After One Year Of Searching

It will be one year this Friday since the disappearance of Iuka resident Donna Teresa Cupido and the search for her whereabouts continues.

After a year of diligent searching for the Iuka resident by local, state and federal authorities—as well as private detectives—and following numerous leads, both in and out of state, she has yet to be found.

According to Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer, in addition to the searches which took place just after Donna Cupido was reported missing, the investigation has not stopped and continues to be ongoing.

Throughout the summer, with the help of search teams consisting of various law officers, including members of the Dept. of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, several searches of wooded and surrounding waters have been conducted.

According to Chief

Stringer, the teams brought in cadaver dogs and all other resources available to them to search for the missing woman. Every possible lead and all information given by members of the community and family have been followed up.

In connection with the investigation, a total of seven polygraph tests have been administered, Chief Stringer stated. However, no information from the tests has led to Cupido's recovery.

Donna Cupido, age 44 at the time of her disappearance, is a white female, 5 foot 9 inches in height and weighing 135 lbs. She has blond hair, green eyes and a butterfly tattoo on her right shoulder. She was last seen wearing a flannel shirt and slacks. Her vehicle, a silver Kia Sportage, was recovered from behind the Iuka Apostolic Church, located on Hwy. 72 E. There appeared to be no signs of foul play at the

scene where the vehicle was found parked.

Iuka Man Wins World Skeet Shooting Title

Iuka resident Wayborn Bowling has just returned from the World Skeet Shooting Competition where he earned the title of 2005 Doubles World Champion.

Talented, dedicated, smooth and confident; these are all adjectives that could describe a World Champion Shooter and these would certainly describe shooter Wayborn Bowling of Iuka.

As a member of the National Skeet Shooting Association for 18 years, Wayborn has been shooting competitively since 1989 and has participated in the World Skeet Shooting Competition in San Antonio, Texas for the past 12 years.

As an avid hunter, skeet shooting was a natural progression for a person who loves the outdoors. When he's not dove or deer hunting, Wayborn now shoots for the Muscle Shoals Skeet and Trap Club and The Whitetail Ridge Gun Club in Blue Springs, Miss.

Wayborn has shot 80,500 registered targets over the past 18 years.

This win in San Antonio, on October 10, 2005, was Wayborn's first World Title, shooting in the Doubles Competition at the World Shoot. With over 750 participants from around the world, Wayborn was one of only 24 shooters to run a perfect 100 straight in doubles. Within the hour, the list of doubles competitors had dwindled down to

nine, then there were two: Wayborn Bowling of Iuka and Stuart Fairbanks, a national champion from Connecticut.

With his signature "taw-taw," Wayborn smoked the competition, winning his first World Championship Title. During the recognition ceremony, Wayborn received a "super bowl" size World Champion Ring, gold watch, medals and of course, the title of World Champion.

Throughout the shoot, Wayborn tallied "647 hits" out of 650 targets—enough to win him numerous awards in all gauges.

Wayborn adds this Doubles Championship to his list of accomplishments which includes five state titles and the honor of sitting on the "All American Team."

Wayborn and four other Mississippi Shooters also competed at the World Skeet Shoot under the Five-Man Team and Two-Man Team categories. The Five-Man team won in doubles, the 410 and High Overall events. As a partner in the Two-Man team, Wayborn and Mike Boyd of Clinton won honors as the champions in doubles, 28-gauge, 410 and High Overall events.

Congratulations to Wayborn for winning this prestigious shooting event.

A Masked Bandit...

I know these masked bandits are cute and adorable and you would just love to make one your pet. I have a few things I would like to share with you about raccoons before you decide you would like to own one of these creatures of the night.

The raccoon can adapt to the woods as well as living inside the city limits. They can live just about everywhere a human can. They can even take up residence in your chimney as well as your attic - not to count your storage sheds as well as any vacant room inside your home.

They get into your garbage cans as well as your garden and are quite the nuisance. So, why would anyone care if these animals are kept as a pet?

I will tell you some reasons why they do not make good pets then you can decide for yourself if you think owning a raccoon is the right thing to do.

The picture above is a raccoon I refer to as Jelly Belly. He got his name earnestly since raccoons are quite the consuming eaters of the mammals outside the opossums.

All raccoons are climbers, runners, swimmers and acrobats. Jelly Belly was no exception to the rule. Left on my deck in a cage he had outgrown

for at least eight months.

Jelly Belly's life was literally at stake since being in captivity he was extremely obese in size. No exercise and his intake of food, he was ready for heart failure, a Condit for hip dysplasia along with his liver being fatty. He had been in captivity for so long he had lost his spirit and was afraid to go outside of his cage.

In the wild, raccoons, known for being a spirited animal and full of mischief, find entertainment in the smallest creeks to chasing birds.

As a raccoon grows into adult hood and its mating season it becomes aggressive for at least three to four months every year. Since being against the law to own a raccoon as a pet you cannot get insurance to pay any medical bills if he or she bites someone. That is just what they will do, BITE! If a raccoon should bite anyone, especially a child, the raccoon will be without a doubt checked for rabies since raccoons are the primary carrier of the rabies

virus. If the virus found in the raccoon is positive, you will receive rabies vaccine injected into your stomach in a series of three shots.

Once they have bitten someone, raccoons are immedi-

ately killed and there heads are cut off and sent to Mississippi State to check the brain for the virus. That is the only way to detect rabies in any animal!

Now I know your children love him, kiss him, put clothes on him, and want to hold him all the time while he is a baby. I just thought I should warn you that the cute fuzzy raccoon you are letting your child hold has round worms, giardiasis, fleas and lice! (Not the type of round worms your dog or cats have.) Every time a raccoon sits down, they leave behind a sticky roundworm. Not even bleach or your best cleanser will kill it.

Jelly Belly had the diet of pizza, cheetos and even butter-scotch candy, not counting the cat food scattered all over his cage; these are the food items I unfortunately found in his cage all around him.

The sad thing is: where in the wilderness do you find these food groups for them to eat? I cannot say I have ever found a cheeto in the woods have you?

Jelly Belly had to learn to live without the safety of his cage. It took him two weeks before he would climb off the top of his imprisonment. It took him months to learn to eat and find his right diet. He and I learned together to search for acorns, wild berries, frogs, grub worms, grains.

Raccoons are very destructive, unpredictable and very aggressive in behavior. If you are smart, you should never trust a wild animal - certainly not a raccoon no matter how long you have had him as a pet. Did I mention the penalty of fines in owning one? Once again, we come to fines and possible imprisonment for owning simply a raccoon. I hope in your reading this it may help you to understand why a raccoon is not a pet.

4-H Youth Livestock Program By: Mary C. Baldwin

The 4-H Youth program is one of the oldest and largest informal educational efforts in public education in the United States. The Junior livestock projects are educational projects and the type that help youth to achieve the 4-H objectives. The mission objectives of 4-H are to assist youth in gaining knowledge, developing life skills, and forming attitudes that will allow them to become self-directing, productive and contributing members of society. There is probably no other 4-H activity that has more potential for educational and personal development of youth than junior livestock projects and shows.

The junior livestock program is a one-of-a-kind opportunity to use live animals to develop young people. The main objectives of the program deal with the young person, not the animal. In addition to youth learning something about agriculture and livestock production they also learn life skills that help youth become productive citizens of our society. The experience of youth owning and working with animals, being responsible for their care, health and growth, and exhibiting them in a competitive environment is a great character building practice.

Annually more than 7,000 youth participate in the major animal science projects of beef, dairy, sheep, swine, horse, meal

goats, and meat science. In addition to the animal project work, related activities such as judging (horse, livestock, dairy and goat), meat judging and identification, premier exhibitor program, meats bowl, beef pork cook-out contests, horse bowl, horse photography, horse art, horse hippology,

horse public speaking, dairy bowl, and dairy products judging are included as part of the 4-H Animal Science Program and contribute to the personal development of youth.

Major junior livestock shows are the five district shows (Verona, Batesville, Greenwood, Jackson, and Hattiesburg) held in late January and early February, the Dixie National Junior Round-up held in February, and the Missis-

Legal Update

WHEN IT DOESN'T PAY TO SUE

It's one thing to win a civil case, and it is another thing to collect. One of the primary issues that a plaintiff will want to discuss with prospective plaintiff is defendant's ability to pay damages should he or she lose. A substantial award from an uninsured defendant with modest means may not be worth pursuing in a lawsuit. In purely practical terms, the damages associated with contact lens negligence torts are usually limited to insurance proceeds. It is in the plaintiff's interests, therefore, to establish liability in terms of the ability to pay. Only when all the facts of the case are discussed, an informed decision can be made.

In addition to determining the defendant's ability to pay damages, if your damages are too speculative, you would require guessing before court, you still may not receive proper compensation. It would like to file a claim, but with an attorney who can determine the value of damages and the chances of recovery. For additional information about this column, contact our office.

HINT: A defendant with more than an adequate ability to pay damages is said to have "deep pockets."



Iuka teen, Jon Paul Whitlock, brought home several honors from this year's Mid-South Fair's Angus Show.



Oh, I am not saying that we need to be in the dark about what is going on in the world; I am saying that we may need to be more selective about what we allow to enter our minds! I have something in

mind here, and I think it would be worthwhile for all who pick up this paper to read it, because it relates to every being who has ever lived or ever will live. Actually, it is a bit hard to find anything that relates to men and angels in such a wide range. Revelation 5:13-14 gives the information we need to prove the point I want to make: "And every creature which is in heaven, and on the earth, and under the earth, and such as are in the sea, and all that are in them heard I saying, Blessing, and honor, and glory, and power, be unto Him that sitteth

Deare friend will try to answar your kind and welcome letter was certainly glad to here from you all I sure wish I could see you as it is imposibull I am not able to make a viset out there I have been rite poorly for some time I have taking more mediciens this fall then I have sence I have been in Oklahoma and it dont seem to do me eny good I am growning febler all the time I dont eate anything hardley tho I have plenty of ever thing provide for me ef I want it I truley hope you may have good health some day ef I could see

you I could you more then I can write I am glad you all had good crops the cropes were verely sorro out here corn espoule cotton was good in some places I will try to tell you ef I can how much John owes me I know how much I have resived on the last note you know when it was due you can count up the entres and pay me all ef you can I would be glad to have it all payed up so I

could send your papers while I can John sent me 30 dollars you sent me 10 dollars John sent me 25 in January of tis yeare it is all 65 dollars you all have payed me on the last note I hope he can pay me all this time I did not make my viset to Texas my cousin wroate me she was comeing to see me in the spring ef nothing happen I hope nothing will happen and ef I am living I will go home with here I know she is a good sweet woman from the way she writes oh I could not be treated eny better by no others then these kin people treate me I am sure thankfull I can say that for them give my love and best wishes to all the children I wish I could see them all give my regards to all my friends back there oh what a grand time it would be ef I could see you I hope you may be spaired that you may enjoy some happye and peaceful days on earth I know I love ever bodie and wish ever bodie well I am verely poorly most all the time tho I do a rite smart of work with my needil yet I am peceing another silk and wasterd quilt have it


