Family Pleads With Public For Information On Missing Iuka Woman

Donna Cupido's Family Offering \$5,000 Reward For Information

The family of Iuka resident Donna Cupido has submitted the following press release, pleading for any information the public might have concerning her disappearance.

The last year has been agonizing for the family and friends of Donna Cupido, as they search for the 45-year-old wife and mother who went missing on Oct. 21, 2004, after dropping her daughter Jocelyn off at Iuka's Tishomingo County High School, along Highway 72.

Donna's car—a silver two-door Kia Sportage bearing a Mississippi license plate on the back and a decorative plate from Alberta, Canada on the front—was found later behind the nearby Apostolic Church.

An ongoing police investigation has not revealed Donna's whereabouts. Police and Donna's family are asking anyone who had any sort of contact with her on or around Oct. 21, 2004 to call Crime Stoppers at 1-800-773-TIPS (8477) immediately. The family is offering a \$5,000 reward for information that leads to uncovering Donna's whereabouts, but callers can remain anonymous.

Jocelyn, Donna's daughter, says her mother was behaving normally that morning, and promised to pick her up after school. Unfortunately, Donna never showed up.

Her normal routine after dropping Jocelyn off at about 7:45 each weekday morning was to return to the family's home at 1821 Independence Square, do household chores, drive to the Shell gas station for a coffee, then do volunteer work at Iuka's Salvation Army Thrift Store or Mission Thrift Store. She worked occasionally as a teacher's assistant at Tishomingo High School, as well as did yard work/housework. She also attended Calvary Baptist Church in Burnsville with her daughter, Michelle.

The slim, outgoing woman will be recognizable to many people because she enjoyed touring around the Iuka area - including Corinth, Glen, Burnsville, Cherokee, Muscle Shoals, Tusculumbia, Sheffield, Florence—to visit yard sales and other community events. Donna often visited The Wooden Nickel Restaurant in

Cherokee, Alabama.

Wherever she went, Donna was well-known for carrying her cell phone - and using it regularly.

Donna is 5-feet 9-inches tall, weighs about 135 pounds and has green eyes. Her hair is light brown with blonde highlights and was shoulder-length when she disappeared. She usually wore it in a ponytail. Donna has three piercings in each ear, and a dark blue and purple butterfly tattoo on the back of her right shoulder. She also has an approximately three-inch scar on her left knee.

Donna was wearing a flannel shirt and slacks while dropping her daughter off at high school, but she often wore midriff tops and shorts.

Donna and her husband are originally from Alberta, in Western Canada. They came to Iuka in 1998 when Brian became manager of Wild Rose Furniture. All of their extended family - including their parents and several brothers and sisters - live in Alberta, thousands of miles from here. They have traveled to Mississippi to join in the search, and recently hired a private detective to continue the effort.

"Distance has been a constant enemy for us," says Pearl Black, Donna's elder sister in Calgary, Alberta. "We need local people's help. Donna traveled the roads around Iuka every day. She befriended many people in the community. If anyone has any information about Donna that would make a difference to this investigation, please call Crime Stoppers at 1-800-773-TIPS (8477) right now."

"We're hoping people

who haven't previously come forward will do so now," Pearl added. "Maybe they didn't realize before that they had information which could be helpful. Maybe they were afraid to come forward. If so, please remember that we need your information - we don't need your name."

Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department Recovers Stolen Jewelry, Ala. Man Arrested

A large amount of jewelry stolen from a residence in Golden has been recovered and a Red Bay, Ala. man is in custody, according to Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock.

The residence of Jackie Ginn, located on County Road 73, Golden, was burglarized September 23, 2005 and approximately \$3,000 worth of jewelry was taken. A neighbor saw a pickup at the residence and gave that information to Officer Jeff Sparks who followed up on it.

The information on the vehicle was passed on to other law enforcement agencies, including Red Bay Police Department who stopped a suspect in their jurisdiction who matched the description.

The truck was being driven by Rick D. Hall, 47, of Red Bay. Sheriff Whitlock said Hall had the jewelry in his possession at the time of the stop and was



arrested.

At press time, Hall remained in jail in Alabama. He is charged with breaking and entering and grand larceny in connection with the Tishomingo County break-in.

Also, Hall had apparently stolen a motorcycle in Alabama which was found

abandoned in a field in Tishomingo County, according to Sheriff Whitlock.

Tishomingo County Deputy Jeff Sparks, with the assistance of Deputy Mike Kemp, was instrumental to this arrest and the recovery of the stolen items, the Sheriff explained.

Body Identified As Belmont Man Missing Since September, Homicide Investigation Underway

Results of DNA tests have identified the body of a homicide victim, found near Belmont on Oct. 28, as Richard Dale Patterson, 58, of Belmont.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock, Patterson had apparently been missing since the end of September; however, he was not officially reported as missing until Oct. 11. Whitlock said that family members told him that it was not unusual for Patterson to be gone for extended periods of time.

Patterson's death was ruled as a homicide after initial autopsy results were released from the Mississippi Crime Lab and revealed what appeared to be two bullet wounds

to the head.

At this point, the sheriff's department has moved forward with its investigation into Patterson's death. At press time, no suspects had been named; however, the Sheriff said leads are being pursued and he anticipates arrests to be made in connection with the case soon.

Patterson's 1984 blue Chevrolet pickup was found in Baldwin, Miss. last week by authorities and has been sent to the Mississippi Crime Lab in Batesville, Miss. for processing, according to Sheriff Whitlock.

The Mississippi Highway Patrol's Bureau of Investigations is assisting in the investigation.

The skeletal remains originally were found by a hunter in a heavily wooded area off County Road 6, west of Belmont.

According to family members, Richard Patterson was born in Belmont on Jan. 8, 1947, to Arthur and Bonnell Patterson. He lived in Belmont and Golden most of his life. He worked in building and refinishing pianos and antique furniture reproduction for 31 years. His favorite pastimes included hunting, fishing and searching for Indian artifacts.

One-Vehicle Crash On Red Bay Road Claims Life Of 31-Year Old Woman

A one-vehicle accident near Belmont has claimed the life of a Red Bay, Ala. woman Tuesday morning, November 15, 2005.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, Tara Pearson, 31, of Red Bay, was pronounced dead at the scene of the accident on Hwy. 366 (Red Bay Road, in the curve across from the Mrs.

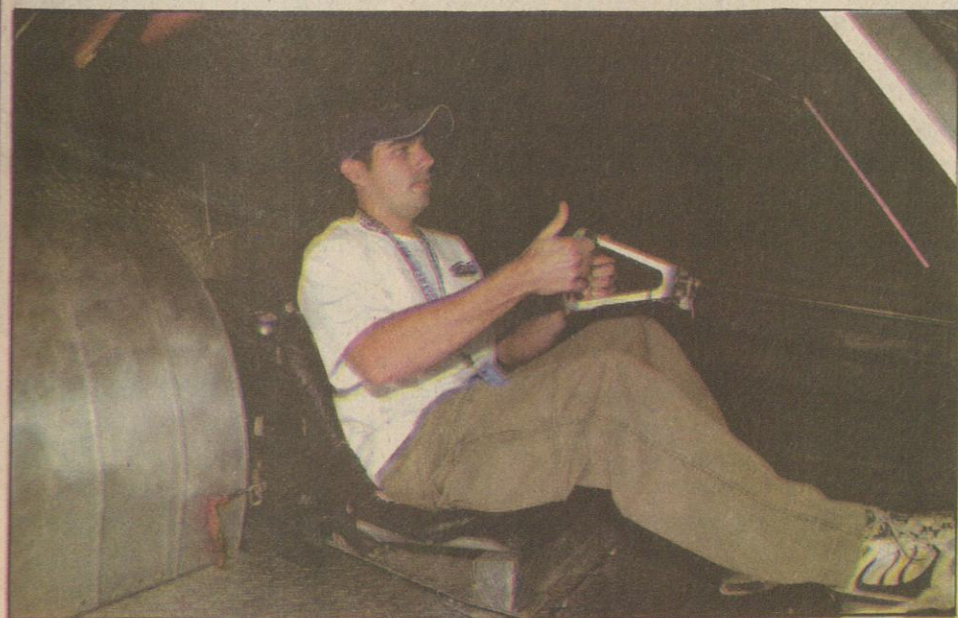
E.R. Warren residence).

Apparently, Pearson was traveling toward Golden on Red Bay Road and came to the sharp curve, where she lost control of the car. The victim's automobile, a Pontiac Grand Prix, struck a tree, flipped over and landed, upside down, in a branch which runs underneath the highway.

The cause of death was from traumatic injuries sustained in the wreck, Wilemon confirmed.

The accident occurred sometime during the early morning hours. There were no witnesses to the wreck so the exact time it happened is unknown. It was reported to emergency officials around 7:30 a.m.

writers, were descendants from a tribe called Chickemilaws. The Pontotoc Treaty between the Government and the Chickasaws, completed October 22, 1832, gave the Chickasaws a reservation west of the Mississippi River. About this time a land office was set up at Pontotoc, and as early as 1833, white settlers

came into the northern part of this territory, making preparations for permanent homes.

Immediately following the Pontotoc Treaty, the greatest enactment the state legislature could have effected at that time for northeastern Mississippi was the one agreed on, February 9, 1936, dividing the lands ceded to the Government by the Chickasaws lying in the state of Mississippi into ten counties. Namely, there were: Tishomingo, Itawamba, DeSoto, Tunica, Panola, Tippah, Pontotoc, Fayette, Marshall, and Chickasaw. Tishomingo was referred to as the Free State of Tishomingo, or sometimes as Old State of Tishomingo, due to its enormous size, which was little less than that of an empire. It embraced all of the present counties of Tishomingo, Alcorn, and Prentiss, the largest ever in the state. The total area was 923,040 acres. The act to organize these counties was approved February 14, 1836, providing as follows: "Be it enacted by the legislature of the state of Mississippi that the following persons be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to organize the county of Tishomingo, to-wit: Peter G. Rives, James Davis, James McMatthews, A. M. Cowan. And full power is hereby given to said commissioners, at any time after the passage of the act, to organize said county in the most speedy manner and according to such regulations as may be prescribed by said commissioners. And be it further enacted, that the board of county police of said county

The Territory of Mississippi was organized April 7, 1798, embracing most of the vast area. In March 1817, this territory was divided, the eastern half being organized into the Alabama Territory, and the western portion later being admitted into the Union as the State of Mississippi on December 10, 1817. As early as 1818, the Chickasaw Indians' rights were under the strict observation of the white settlers, and to avoid a long troublesome controversy, the Indians relinquished their title and claim to all lands within the bounds of Tennessee by the Treaty of 1818. The Choctaws and Chickasaws, according to Adair, one of the earliest

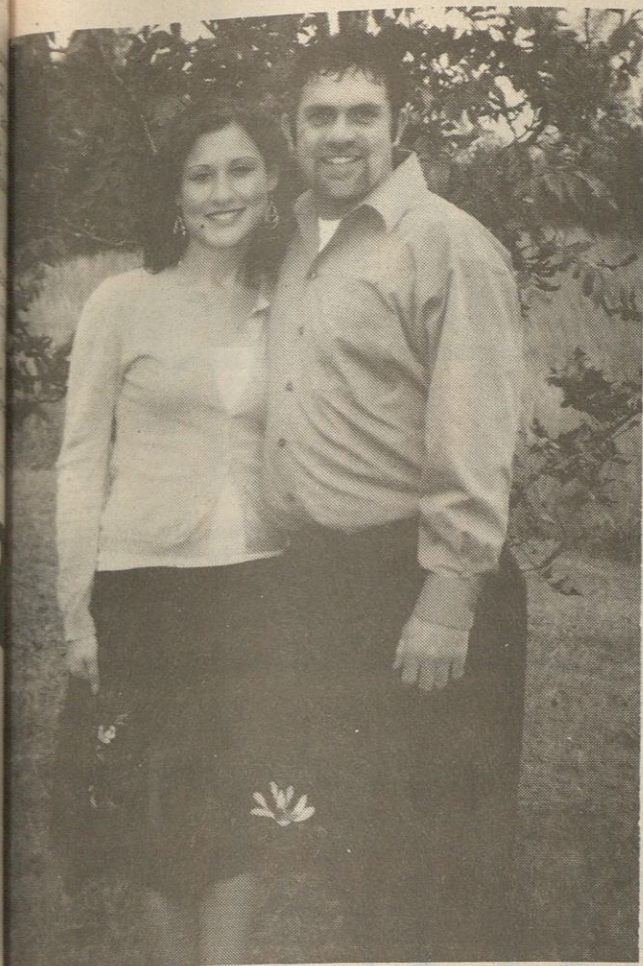

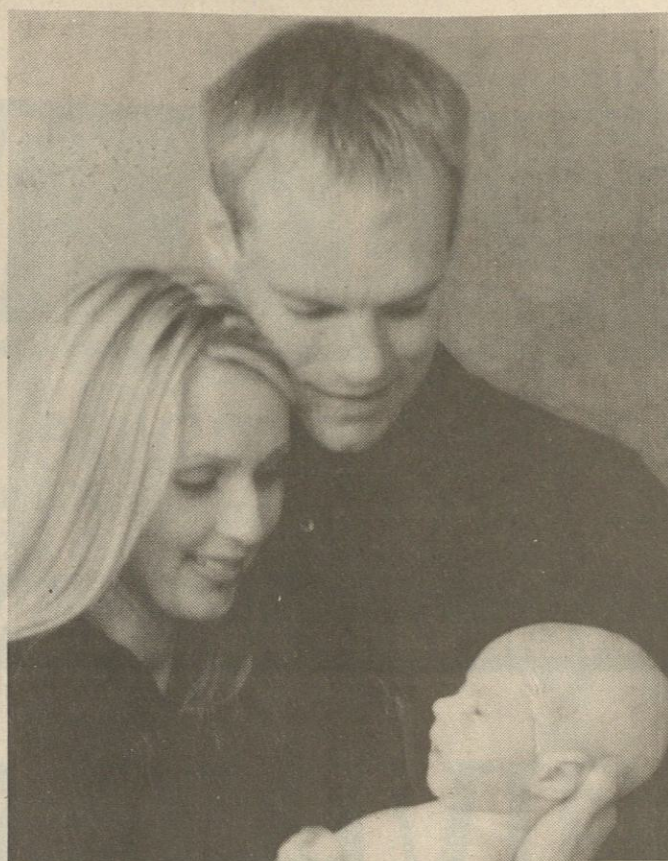
Heart To Heart Hospice Sponsors Breakfast With Santa

See Tony Bullard's Art During November At the Iuka Library

Tony Bullard began drawing "Dukes of Hazzard" when he was in elementary school, and his love for "the Dukes" has continued. Although he draws and paints a variety of media, he says he has and always will love "The Dukes of Hazzard," and he has recently completed a new series of "Dukes" paintings. These are on display at the library.

Tony Bullard is from Corinth, MS, and he is 38 years old. He says, "Art has always been a part of my life." He has been drawing pictures as far back as he can remember. It wasn't until he was around 13 when he began taking art seriously. He began by creating and developing his own original cartoon characters. During his high school years, he would practice drawing five or six hours or more a night. He learned his various techniques on his own. He adds, "For me, I learn best through personal experience."

After high school, he attended Northeast Mississippi Community College for two years. During this period he worked mainly with pastels. His choice of subject matter is versatile, but overall he hasn't changed much. He mainly draws cars, city scenes, trains,

portraits, and original cartoons. His background in art carries over into sign painting. He still paints signs from time to time. In 1989, Tony began doing oil

painting for the first time. In 1990, he began having his own art shows in and around the Corinth area. He periodically still has shows. He painted a whole series of oils from 1989 until 1993. After that he shifted his focus to song writing and toy/game invention. In 1997 he attended a Toy and Game Inventors' forum in Las Vegas, NV, where representatives of the major toy companies spoke to inventors giving them an insight into the toy/game invention venture. The two most valuable things Tony got from that seminar—and which he now lives by—are to be patient and persistent because this is a tough field. It will take time, but the payoff will be rewarding.

In 1998, Tony released his first Limited Edition Series Print based on his freight train oil painting titled, "Westbound."

In the summer of 2002, after nine years of not drawing or painting pictures, he began working on a whole new series of art work. Among his new art

is a series of three drawings he did of "Cooter's In the S m o k i e s " a museum/gift shop in Gatlinburg, TN, owned by Ben Jones, who played Cooter on the 1980's TV show, *The Dukes of Hazzard*. Tony especially enjoyed doing drawings of the "General Lee" in front of "Cooter's Place."

Tony's drawings have also been displayed at Cooter's gift shop at one time. Tony also had the privilege of meeting several of the cast members of *The Dukes of Hazzard* in Virginia.

In the past two years, Tony has started doing a whole series of Civil War oil paintings and drawings focusing on Corinth, MS, during the 1862 period. He has also done some current art of how Corinth looks today.

Tony has released 65 Limited Edition Series prints so far. Several gift shops in both Corinth and Tupelo, MS are now carrying his art.

His art has been featured on the WKNO Channel 10 "BMW/Antiques Road Show Gallery 10 Auction" in 1998, 2003, and 2004. He has done numerous shows this year around the North Mississippi area including recent exhibits at the North Mississippi Civil War Museum and the Civil War Trade Show at the Crossroads Arena.

Earlier this year, Tony got to be a part of the "Great American Train Show" in Collinsville, IL, where he focused on his Train/Railroad art.

Tony is currently working on new pencil drawings for a future project.

Home Of Iuka Man Destroyed In Fire

The home of an Iuka man was destroyed late Saturday afternoon by fire.

According to Iuka Fire Chief Brian Grissom, an investigation is underway to find the cause of the fire that destroyed the home of Tad Adcock at 1449 E. Quitman Street in Iuka.

The Iuka Fire Department received the call from Tishomingo County 9-1-1 at approximately 5:43 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 12, 2005 and arrived on the scene approximately three minutes later.

Upon arrival, heavy smoke and flames were visible, the fire chief said. While the cause of the fire is still being investigated, it appeared to

have started in the middle of the house, near the back.

No one was home at the time the fire started. Apparently, Mr. Adcock had left his residence at approximately 5 p.m.

The Adcock house was an older home that had originally been built in the Mill Creek area. It was moved from that location to its present location in Iuka in the 1930s. According to Chief Grissom, the older wood the home was constructed from burned easily and required that the firefighters remain on the scene until approximately 10:08 p.m. to assure it was completely extinguished.

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION

The Board of Supervisors, acting for and on behalf of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "County") and the Iuka Airport Authority (the "Authority") took up for consideration the matter of authorizing and approving a loan on behalf of the County from the Mississippi Development Authority (the "MDA") for the purpose of making improvements to the Iuka Airport Facility and thereby promoting commerce and economic growth.

Thereupon Supervisor Danny Ryan offered and moved the adoption of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF TISHOMINGO COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, TO AUTHORIZE AND APPROVE A LOAN ON BEHALF OF THE COUNTY AND THE AIRPORT AUTHORITY FROM THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY IN A MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED NINETY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$295,000.00) FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING IMPROVEMENTS TO THE AIRPORT FACILITY TO PROMOTE COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC GROWTH.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "Governing Body" of the "County"), does hereby find, determine, adjudicate and declare as follows:

1. The Mississippi Business Investment Act, constituting Section 57-61-1 et. seq. Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "Act"), was enacted for the purpose of promoting business and economic development in the state of Mississippi (the "State") through investment by private companies locating in the State.

2. Pursuant to Section 57-61-41 of the Act, the MDA is authorized to make interest-bearing loans to state, county or municipal airport authorities for the purpose of making improvements to airport facilities.

3. The County and the Authority will agree to improve the airport facilities and will request the MDA to finance a portion of the cost associated with the development of these improvements (the "Project").

4. Pursuant to the Act and guidelines adopted by the MDA, the County and Authority will file an application with the MDA for a loan to be used for the development of the Project in the amount of Two Hundred Ninety-five Thousand Dollars (\$295,000.00) (the "Loan").

5. The County and the Authority will enter into a Loan Agreement (the "Agreement") with the MDA wherein the County and Authority agree to borrow the proceeds of the Loan subject to and upon the terms and conditions of the Agreement.

6. In order to secure the Loan, the County and the Authority will execute and deliver to the MDA a Promissory Note (the "Note"). Failure of the County to meet its repayment obligations shall result in the forfeiture of sales tax allocation and/or homestead exemption reimbursement in an amount sufficient to repay obligations due

pursuant to Section 57-61-15(7) of the Act. Upon forfeiture of the County of its sales tax allocations and/or homestead exemption reimbursement for twelve (12) months, the County may levy an ad valorem tax on the taxable property therein for the purpose of meeting its repayment obligation in accordance with Section 57-61-15(8) of the Act. The revenue produced from the tax levy shall not be included within the ten percent (10%) growth limitation on ad valorem tax receipts for its general budget.

7. The Loan shall not be deemed indebtedness within the meaning specified in Section 19-9-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE COUNTY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Governing Body of the County does hereby declare its intention to authorize and approve a Loan from the MDA in the principal amount not to exceed Two Hundred Ninety-Five Thousand Dollars (\$295,000.00) for the purpose of making improvements to the Iuka Airport Facility thereby promoting commerce and economic growth.

Section 2. The Loan will be secured by a Note executed and delivered by the County and the Authority to MDA. Pursuant to Section 57-61-15 (7) of the Act, failure of the County to meet its repayment obligations shall result in the forfeiture of sales tax allocation and/or homestead exemption reimbursement in an amount sufficient to repay obligations due until such time as the indebtedness has been discharged or arrangements to discharge such indebtedness satisfactory to the MDA have been made. Upon forfeiture of the County of its sales tax allocations and/or homestead exemption reimbursement for twelve (12) months, the County may levy an ad valorem tax on the taxable property therein for the purpose of meeting its repayment obligation in accordance with Section 57-61-15(8) of the Act. The revenue produced from the tax levy shall not be included within the ten percent (10%) growth limitation on ad valorem tax receipts for its general budget.

Section 3. The Governing Body proposes to authorize and approve the Loan from the MDA in the amount and for the aforesaid purposes at a meeting of the Governing Body to be held at its regular meeting place at the County Courthouse in Iuka, Mississippi at 9:00 a.m. on the 21st day of November, 2005, or at some meeting held subsequent thereto. If twenty percent (20%) or fifteen hundred (1,500), whichever is less, of the qualified electors in the County shall file a written protest with the Clerk of the County against the authorization and approval for the Loan on or before the aforesaid date and hour, then the Loan shall not be entered into unless authorized at an election on the question of authorizing and approving the Loan. Such election shall be called and held as

provided by law. If no protest is filed, then the Loan may be entered into without an election on the question of authorizing and approving the Loan at any time within a period of two (2) years after the date above specified.

Section 4. This Resolution shall be published once a week for at least four (4) consecutive weeks in the Tishomingo County News, a newspaper published in the City of Iuka, Tishomingo County, Mississippi and having a general circulation in the County and qualified under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. The first publication of this Resolution shall be made not less than twenty-one (21) days prior to November 21, 2005, and the last publication shall be made not more than seven (7) days prior to such date, said Resolution to be published on October 27, November 3, 10, and 17, 2005.

Section 5. The Clerk of the County shall be and is hereby directed to procure from the publisher of the aforesaid newspaper the customary proof of said publication of this Resolution and have the same before the Governing Body on the date and hour specified in Section 3 hereof.

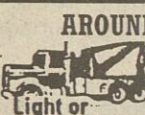

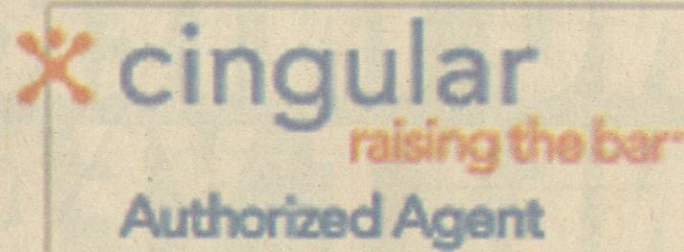
