Martin Retirement stirs Memories of Historic Iuka, Miss., Agency

Berry L. Martin was the third man to hold the job of station agent at luka. Original agent at this Mississippi point was John Marshall Stone, who served until elected State Senator and who went on to become Mississippi's Governor for 13 years. The second agent Edwin Merrill, grandfather of aviator Dick Merrill.

Voluntarily retiring after 56 years of active railroad service with one company is the unusual record of Brother Berry L. Martin, 75-year-old station agent for the Southern Railway at Iuka, Miss., and since December 9, 1922, a member of the Benefit Association of Railway Employees. Brother Martin's retirement was on account of ill health and is generally regretted by the many close friends he has won in and about Iuka as agent in the town's historic station. Officials of the Southern-are sorry to see him leave the job he has done so well, and have not as yet appointed his successor.

To old timers versed in the lore of the section, the resignation of Berry Martin brings to mind the fact that though the Iuka agency is 81

years old, there have been but three agents, two of whose combined service extends over three quarters of a century, a fact perhaps unequalled and certainly not excelled in the United States. The position Brother Martin held in the Iuka office has come to be looked

upon as a lifelong job. It was in the years before the Civil War that the Memphis and Charleston Railroad, now part of the Southern Railway, was completed at luka, and John Marshall Stone, later hero of the Confederacy and still later Governor of the State of Mississippi, was appointed the first agent.

The Memphis Charleston road was the outgrowth of many roads, namely the Memphis and LaGrange road, built in 1873 and over which the first train was run out of Memphis; the Tuscumbia Courtland and

Decatur road in north Alabama built by slave labor in 1832, one of the first roads in the United States; the South Carolina road; the Western and Atlantic; and the Chattanooga and Nashville road. These roads were built from the east and the west and came together at Iuka, where a great celebration was held and a golden spike driven to

In a few years, the war clouds burst over the nation and Stone, with every other able bodied man in the town, enlisted in the Confederacy. The office was closed. Trains were run at intervals, first by one side, then the other, to transport troops. Following the war, Stone, who was colonel of the regiment he had organized, came back to Iuka and again took up the work of railroading. He served until elected State Senator, from which place he went to the Governor's chair for 13 years.

war, Stone had a clerk in the office who, upon Stone's resignation, took up the work. This was Mr. Edwin Merrill, whose interest in the work is illustrated by the fact that he served 35 years without a vacation. While Merrill was the Iuka agent, Rube Burrows, a notorious desperado of the era, and his gang of outlaws were making the lives of agents guarding the money of the railroad and express companies extremely hazardous. Pinkerton, the great detective, visited Iuka many times in search of the outlaws, who were at last captured.

whose grandson is the noted aviator, Dick Merrill, that he attended to the business of the office so closely that he was not seen on the streets of the town for more than 15 years.

Learning telegraphy in its infancy, when the messages were taken on the old time instruments using ticker tape with the dots and dashes, Merrill never did teach himself to depend on his ears alone. He continued to use the outmoded instruments. Some of these ancient instruments are now treasured for their historical value.

In 1898, Brother Martin, then 35 years old, came to Iuka from Madison, Ala. He was born at Madison and had been agent there for 10 years. At the time he took charge of the luka agency, troops were passing daily for the concentration camps at Fort Oglethrope, Georgia, later to go to Cuba to

take part in the Spanish American War.

luka was at that time the receiving and distributing point for all freight, express, and mail for the County of Tishomingo in Mississippi, the adjoining County of Hardin in Tennessee, and parts of Colbert and Franklin Counties in Alabama. Great caravans of covered wagons bringing cotton, eggs, chickens, furs, and other produce came to luka and carried back merchandise of all kinds for the country stores. A week was allowed for the trip, camping outfits being part of the cargo.

In 1907, the Birmingham Division of the Illinois Central Railroad was built. It passed through the southern part of the County, and Iuka became the distributing point for all the tremendous business incident to that undertaking. Machinery of all kinds was transported over the rough County roads by ox and mule wagons.

With the building of the Pickwick Dam in Tennessee, Iuka, the nearest railroad point, prospered further when most of the machinery for the Dam was billed to this point and carried by truck to the river. Business increased enormously with the growth of freight, express, and almost unbelievably large telegraph tolls. All government business had to be done in triplicate, which required a great amount of painstaking work.

The above information as transcribed from a newspaper clipping contributed by Webb Robertson of luka, MS. This clipping marked "page 3" is dated July 1938, but it is not known whether it was obtained from the Tishomingo County News-Vidette or not. It was transcribed by RaNae Vaughn on November 7, 2005.

Only six percent of the population has O-negative blood, yet at hospital trauma centers, sometimes as much as 12 percent of the blood transfused is O-negative. That's because O-negative blood is the universal blood type.

"It can be given to anyone in an extreme emergency situation when there is no time to crossmatch the donor's blood with the patient's," explained

Roat, United Blood Services. this area's non-profit community blood service provider. "When you do the math, our community needs people who are O-negative to give blood at least twice as often as everyone else!"

Another special need for O-negative blood is in the treatment of babies. Neonatal care facilities require fresh units of O-negative blood each day to treat their tiny patients.

"Every 2-to-3 seconds in this country, someone needs blood. And you never know when you or someone you love will be the one. We all expect blood to be available when we need it, but only a few of those who can give actually roll up their sleeves.





CONSOLIDATED FARM & RURAL DEVELOPMENT ACT AUTHORIZES DESIGNATION OF TISHOMINGO CO. TO RECEIVE FSA DISASTER LOAN APPLICATIONS

Emergency loans for farmers, ranchers, and operators are available through the Prentiss County Office of the Farm Service Agency, Harold Mills, FSA Farm Loan Manager, said today.

Mr. Mills said this authority is pursuant to Secretary Johanns' declaration on October 31, 2005, of a major disaster in Mississippi, caused by Hurricane Katrina that occurred on August 29, 2005, and continuing. As a result of this disaster, Tishomingo County as a primary county in Mississippi is named as an area eligible for Federal Disaster assistance pursuant to Section 321 (a) of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act.

Applications for assistance in the disaster-stricken county will be accepted by FSA

through June 3, 2006. The EM Disaster Designation Number is S2126, Amendment 1.

Farmers qualifying for emergency loans may borrow up to 100 percent of their actual production loss or the amount needed to restore their operation to its pre-disaster condition, whichever is less. The new emergency loan and outstanding principal balance of any existing emergency loan owed by the applicant or any individual member of an entity cannot exceed \$500,000.00.

FSA emergency loans cover losses from designated disasters and are made to qualified farmers who cannot obtain credit from other lenders in the local area.

The Right Of Jesus Christ To Be The Judge

Joel speaks of the judgment that will take place at Armageddon, through the hands of Jesus Christ. He also seems to allude to an actual judgment of the people of the nations that takes place after the war is over. Joel 3:12-15 says, "Let the heathen be wakened, and come up to the valley of Jehoshaphat: for there will I sit to judge all the heathen round about. Put ye in the sickle, for the harvest is ripe: come, get you down: for the press is full the vats overflow; for their wickedness is great. Multitudes, multitudes in the valley of decision: for the day of the LORD is near in the valley of decision. The sun and the moon shall be darkened, and the stars shall withdraw their shining." John 5:22 says, "For the Father judgeth no man, but hath committed all judgment unto the Son." This is probably the case because of what John 5:27 says, "And hath given Him (Jesus) authority to execute judgment, because He is the Son of man." Men will have no excuse before Jesus, because He is the Son of man, meaning that He took a physical body and lived where we live, yet He did not sin, thus He is qualified to judge sinners!

So, the one man who walked on earth without sinning will be the judge of all sinners. Those who have received Him by faith

have had their sins forgiven and will never face those sins in any time of judgment. We will stand before the judgment seat of Christ to be judged for our service as Christians, but we will not be condemned to the lake of fire with the unsaved! In Joel chapter three, Jesus is also the judge, if we accept what is said about Him in the above

Wherefore art Thou red in Thine apparel, and Thy garments like him that treadeth in the winefat? I have trodden the winepress alone; and of the people there was none with Me. For I will tread them in Mine anger, and trample them in My fury; and their blood shall be sprinkled on My raiment. For the day of vengeance is in Mine heart, and the year of My redeemed is come."
