Vhen Phillips came back to after working with TVA, v orked with the power comy as a lineman up until he ed the Army Air Corps during World War II. During his service time, he served in the Signal Corps in Central and South America landing planes at night by instrumentation.

After getting out of the Air Corps, Phillips returned to Iuka where he and his brother-inlaw, Mutt Yates, took over Leon's father's hardware business. The business became known as Phillips and Yates Hardware. Leon had married the former Dot Hardin of Alcorn County and in 1951 they bought out Mutt's part of the business. They soon added furniture and televisions to their business. With his prior electrical experience, Leon also learned to repair the sets. He wrote his own repair manual and became one of the first television repairmen in the local area. Taking and passing the National Electric Code exam allowed him to inspect electricity installations in homes across North Alabama to make extra money.

Leon Phillips was a man of multiple civic contributions. He was a member of the Iuka Rotary Club and was selected as a Paul Harris Fellow. He was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the American Legion, and the Mississippi

Tishomingo County Forestry Associations. served as the Chairman of the Board of Directors of First American National Bank for many years and also served the City of Iuka as an alderman for two terms. He also supported the Boy Scouts of America at the Council Level and was a member of the Presbyterian Church where he served as an elder. He and Dot attended Iuka United Methodist Church.

Leon Phillips was a "good man," a gentleman, and a friend to all. He was known for his honest business dealings and his keen sense of humor. He often said that if his sense of humor was the last thing he lost, he would be OK. And, thankfully, Leon still had his wonderful sense of humor until his death

He was a devoted hunter, traveling throughout the U.S. bringing home big trophies of his hunt. He was an avid deer and turkey hunter, enjoyed walking over his many tree farms, playing golf, and telling entertaining stories. He was an avid Atlanta Braves fan and spent many happy hours with Dot watching the games.

During his retirement years, Leon became a "tree farmer." He was honored as Tishomingo County's Pioneer of Forestry in December of 2005. Leon was selected as Tree Farmer of the Year back in October of 1956 and again in 2005; and at age 89 he continued his lifetime goal of leaving the land more enhanced than he found it.

Services for Leon Phillips were held at Iuka United Methodist Church at 2:00 p.m. on January 26 with the Rev. Ed Temple and the Rev. Dr. Frank A. Brooks officiating. Burial was in Oak Grove Cemetery. Cutshall Funeral Home of Iuka was in charge of the arrange-

Survivors include two sons, Nick Phillips and wife, Adrienne, of Iuka, and Gary Phillips and wife, Cindy of Brandon; one sister, Mary L. Yates of Tampa, FL; three grandchildren, Laura Phillips and Olivia Phillips, both of Brandon and Casey Phillips of Iuka. He was preceded in death by his wife, Dorothy Hardin Phillips.

MS Supreme Court Denies luka's Michelle Byrom's Third Appeal

The Mississippi Supreme Court upheld the murder conviction of former Iuka resident, Michelle Byrom, and denied her third petition for retrial on Thursday, January 19, 2006.

Michelle Byrom, convicted in 2000 for the June 4, 1999, murder of her husband, Edward Byrom, Sr., petitioned the Mississippi Supreme Court on the argument that she had new evidence that could win her a new trial. (Inmates can use petitions to claim they have discovered new evidence that would justify a new trial.)

Byrom's third request for a retrial came after the Mississippi Supreme Court had already upheld her conviction and death sentence in 2003 and after a Tishomingo County judge had also turned down a post-conviction petition in 2004. The Supreme Court

rejected Byrom's seven

points to request a new trial. Her seven points were (1) ineffective assistance of trial counsel; (2) denial of her federal and state constitutional rights at the sentencing phase; (3) a fatally defective indictment that did not provide adequate notice of the specific offenses against her; (4) denial of a fundamentally fair trial due to exclusion of relevant evidence; (5) the death sentence was disproportionate; (6) newly discovered evidence which would exonerate her; and (7) the cumulative effect of trial errors denied her federal

and state constitutional rights.

After being denied her request for a retrial, Michelle Byrom still remains the only woman on Mississippi's death

While projecting gorgeous pictures of Tishomingo County and its schools, Sonya McRight (IES) painted a word picture of our beautiful county, people, and schools. McRight highlighted various achievements—Level 5 schools, academic achievements, student successes and more, while confessing that none of this "Happens by acci-

The BLT is a research based team mentoring model that connects school improvement and staff development to achieve desired student achievements. Dr. Jane Knight, school improvement coach, told the group about the process Tishomingo County uses to insure good things happen and keep happening. It is called GPS (Growth Process and Structure) and depends heavily on local school leader-

At that point, local school leadership stepped into the spotlight and shared what GPS is like at their schools. Representatives from the schools included Lauren Sparks from Belmont, Sharon Byrd from Burnsville, Teresa Lomenick

and Becky Cobb from luka Elementary, D.D. Haines from Iuka Middle, Beth Bray and Katie Crane from Tishomingo Elementary, and Beth James from Tishomingo County High

Nancy Parker, Assistant Superintendent, who organized and accompanied the group, spoke with pride about the experience. "Actually, to be invited by SACS to do this is a huge honor in and of itself. That really doesn't happen often. Most of the time, schools have to ask to be highlighted at a conference. We didn't; they asked us. And the fact that our Tishomingo County School Board allowed us to go speaks volumes about the kind of support we have for on-going school improvement. We are very fortunate indeed!"

All the children (and many adults, too) in the area became overly excited last Tuesday night when huge snowflakes continued to fall for several hours. This was our first real snow of the new year.



LEGAL ACTION AFTER

DEATH DUE TO

NEGLIGENCE

What if the victim of another

person's negligence were to die as a consequence of the (in) action and therefore could not sue for damages? A wrongful death lawsuit alleges that the decedent was killed as the result of negligence on the part of the defendant. Under wrongful death statutes, the surviving family members or beneficiaries may be entitled to monetary damages as a result of the defendant's conduct. This includes damages for pain and suffering, as well as for reasonable burial expenses. The Child Find Person implements child identification, location, and evaluation of children birth through twenty-one who have disabilities, regardless of the severity of their disability, and who are in need of special education and/or related services. The Child Find Person works with the local Head Starts, Human Services, Health Department, and Mental Health Agencies, as well as local education agencies, physicians, and other individuals to identify and locate children out of school and in school who may be in need of special education ser-

Once a referral is made, it is the responsibility of the Child Find Contact Person to insure that the Referral-to-Placement Procedures are followed. She works with the Local Survey Committee at each school to implement these procedures. The following activities briefly describe the procedures.

As a part of Child Study, parents are invited to attend a Local Survey Committee Meeting to review a child's educational record and performance and determine a need for an evaluation. Prior to an evaluation, copies of the Parent Information Pamphlet and Procedural Safeguards are given to the parents. District personnel explain these copies to the parents

and insure that they understand the Procedural Safeguards. This process will be reviewed at each parent meeting.

After parental consent for testing is obtained, a non-discriminatory evaluation is conducted. Students are evaluated in all areas related to the suspected disability by qualified personnel.

Parents are invited to attend the Eligibility Determination Conference by the Multidisciplinary Evaluation/Eligibility Team to determine if a disability exists. If the child meets eligibility criteria for special education services and/ or related services, an Individualized Education Program is developed and the parents are invited to attend the meeting. Parents must sign permission for placement before a child can receive services. Parents, teachers and students participate in the process. All students receiving special education services are reassessed at least once a year and reevaluated at least once every three

We now have twenty-seven special education classes in our district which provide services to students who have a physical, mental, developmental, communicative, and/or emotional disability. It is the goal of the Tishomingo County School District to provide a free appropriate public education to all children with disabilities through age twenty-one.
