### Services Today For Retired Iuka Businessman, Leon Phillips

Residents of the Iuka area mourning the death of one Iuka's favorite sons, Leon Phillips.

Phillips, a life-long resident at North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo on January 22, 2006, after a two one-half year battle with cancer.

Leon Phillips, the son of "Savage Phillips and Nico-Colas" Lafayette Phillips, born on March 8, 1916, in Iuka, was located near the present location of Fifth Street Baptist Church. A 1934 graduate of Iuka High School, Leon was a member of the last Iuka football team to play before he was suspended for several years. Immediately after graduation from IHS, he attended Business School at Mississippi Green College in Kentucky.

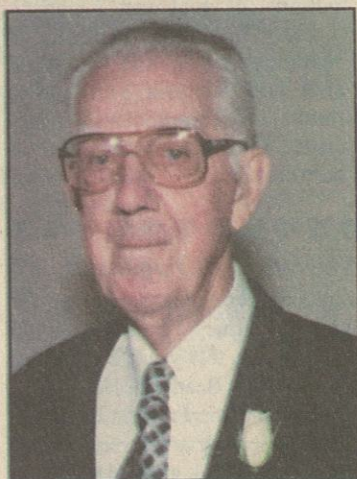
In the late 30's Leon went to work for TVA educating people about the use of electricity and delivering related publications to TVA clearing crews. New-found knowledge of electricity would follow him throughout his life.

When Phillips came back to Iuka after working with TVA, he worked with the power company as a lineman up until he joined the Army Air Corps during

World War II. During his service time, he served in the Signal Corps in Central and South America landing planes at night by instrumentation.

After getting out of the Air Corps, Phillips returned to Iuka where he and his brother-in-law, Mutt Yates, took over Leon's father's hardware business. The business became known as Phillips and Yates Hardware. Leon had married the former Dot Hardin of Alcorn County and in 1951 they bought out Mutt's part of the business. They soon added furniture and televisions to their business. With his prior electrical experience, Leon also learned to repair the sets. He wrote his own repair manual and became one of the first television repairmen in the local area. Taking and passing the National Electric Code exam allowed him to inspect electricity installations in homes across North Alabama to make extra money.

Leon Phillips was a man of multiple civic contributions. He was a member of the Iuka Rotary Club and was selected as a Paul Harris Fellow. He was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the American Legion, and the Mississippi

and Tishomingo County Forestry Associations. He served as the Chairman of the Board of Directors of First American National Bank for many years and also served the City of Iuka as an alderman for two terms. He also supported the Boy Scouts of America at the Council Level and was a member of the Presbyterian Church where he served as an elder. He and Dot attended Iuka United Methodist Church.

Leon Phillips was a "good man," a gentleman, and a friend to all. He was known for his honest business dealings and his keen sense of humor. He often said that if his sense of humor was the last thing he lost, he would be OK. And, thankfully, Leon still had his wonderful sense of humor until his death.

He was a devoted hunter, traveling throughout the U. S. bringing home big trophies of his hunt. He was an avid deer and turkey hunter, enjoyed walking over his many tree farms, playing golf, and telling entertaining stories. He was an avid Atlanta Braves fan and spent many happy hours with Dot watching the games.

During his retirement years, Leon became a "tree farmer." He was honored as Tishomingo County's Pioneer of Forestry in December of 2005. Leon was selected as Tree Farmer of the Year back in October of 1956 and again in 2005; and at age 89 he continued his lifetime goal of leaving the land more enhanced than he found it.

Services for Leon Phillips were held at Iuka United Methodist Church at 2:00 p.m. on January 26 with the Rev. Ed Temple and the Rev. Dr. Frank A. Brooks officiating. Burial was in Oak Grove Cemetery. Cutshall Funeral Home of Iuka was in charge of the arrangements.

Survivors include two sons, Nick Phillips and wife, Adrienne, of Iuka, and Gary Phillips and wife, Cindy of Brandon; one sister, Mary L. Yates of Tampa, FL; three grandchildren, Laura Phillips and Olivia Phillips, both of Brandon and Casey Phillips of Iuka. He was preceded in death by his wife, Dorothy Hardin Phillips.

Pallbearers were R. L. Brown, Jr., Stanley Dexter, Brendix Glasgow, Reuben Grisham, Gene Jourdan, Wendell Phifer, Kirk Rutledge, and Curtis Seago. Honorary pallbearers were Johnny Biggs, Buddy George, Preston Padgett, the Iuka Rotary Club, the 9:35 Coffee Club, and the First American National Bank Board of Directors.

### MS Supreme Court Denies Iuka's Michelle Byrom's Third Appeal

The Mississippi Supreme Court upheld the murder conviction of former Iuka resident, Michelle Byrom, and denied her third petition for retrial on Thursday, January 19, 2006.

Michelle Byrom, convicted in 2000 for the June 4, 1999, murder of her husband, Edward Byrom, Sr., petitioned the Mississippi Supreme Court on the argument that she had new evidence that could win her a new trial. (Inmates can use petitions to claim they have discovered new evidence that would justify a new trial.)

Byrom's third request for a retrial came after the Mississippi Supreme Court had already upheld her conviction and death sentence in 2003 and after a Tishomingo County judge had also turned down a

post-conviction petition in 2004.

The Supreme Court rejected Byrom's seven points to request a new trial. Her seven points were (1) ineffective assistance of trial counsel; (2) denial of her federal and state constitutional rights at the sentencing phase; (3) a fatally defective indictment that did not provide adequate notice of the specific offenses against her; (4) denial of a fundamentally fair trial due to exclusion of relevant evidence; (5) the death sentence was disproportionate; (6) newly discovered evidence which would exonerate her; and (7) the cumulative effect of trial errors denied her federal

and state constitutional rights.

After being denied her request for a retrial, Michelle Byrom still remains the only woman on Mississippi's death row.

### Tishomingo County Schools BLT Teams Invited To Present Plan At SACS Meeting in Houston, TX

Teachers Tell Others About Local BLT Workings

In December, 2005, representatives from each of the Tishomingo County Schools' Building Leadership Teams (BLT's) were invited to the annual conference in Houston, TX, of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) to present the BLT concept to school administrators, central office personnel and board members from all across the Southeast. While projecting gorgeous pictures of Tishomingo County and its schools, Sonya McRight (IES) painted a word picture of our beautiful county, people, and schools. McRight highlighted various achievements—Level 5 schools, academic achievements, student successes and more, while confessing that none of this "Happens by accident."

The BLT is a research based team mentoring model that connects school improvement and staff development to achieve desired student achievements. Dr. Jane Knight, school improvement coach, told the group about the process Tishomingo County uses to insure good things happen and keep happening. It is called GPS (Growth Process and Structure) and depends heavily on local school leadership. At that point, local school leadership stepped into the spotlight and shared what GPS is like at their schools. Representatives from the schools included Lauren Sparks from Belmont, Sharon Byrd from Burnsville, Teresa Lomenick

and Becky Cobb from Iuka Elementary, D.D. Haines from Iuka Middle, Beth Bray and Katie Crane from Tishomingo Elementary, and Beth James from Tishomingo County High School. ### Iuka Chieftains And Lady Chieftains Finish 2nd In Tri-County Conference Tournament

The Iuka Middle School 8th Grade Chieftains and Lady Chieftains played in the Tri-County Conference Tournament last week hosted by Biggersville. The conference is made up of eight teams from Tishomingo, Alcorn and Tishomingo.

The girls took on Chalybeate in the first round on Monday afternoon. The Lady Chieftains completely out-matched their opponent to go on to a 52-16 win. Iuka was led by Shelby Bonds who scored 19 points, 5 rebounds, 5 steals and 2 assists. Carlee Puckett had 9 points, 3 rebounds, 1 steal and 2 assists. Tiffany Flynt had 9 points, 8 rebounds, 1 steal and 1 blocked shot and Victoria Tait had 4 points, 4 rebounds and 2 assists. Coach Malcolm Brown commented, "We shot

freethrows very well, had a lot of assists and did a very good job of playing defense."

Iuka faced county rival Burnsville in the semi-final game on Thursday night. The Lady Chieftains came out strong in the first quarter leading 15-6. Iuka added another strong fourth quarter and won the game 43-25. Shelby Bonds paced the Lady Chiefs with 13 points, 2 rebounds, 5 steals and 3 assists. Carlee Puckett had 11 points, 3 rebounds, 2 steals and 3 assists. Tiffany Flynt had 7 points, 5 rebounds, 3 steals and 1 assist. Pazlee Walker had 6 points, 6 rebounds, 4 steals and 2 assists. Courtney Tigner had 4 points and 3 rebounds and Ryan Ozment had 3 points.

The championship game was set with Iuka taking on the Alcorn Central Lady Bears. The fans could not have asked for a more exciting game. The game was close throughout with several lead changes and was tied after regulation 27-27 and went into the first overtime. Each team scored two points in the extra two minutes and the game went to overtime number

two. Both teams battled hard but found themselves locked up 32-32 and headed to a third overtime. Iuka led 33-32 with just seconds left when Central shot the ball at the buzzer, the shot missed but a foul was called and with no time on the clock a Central player made two freethrows to give the Lady Bears the win 34-33. Coach Brown said, "Turnovers, missed freethrows and missed shots under the goal were the problem for us". Leading Iuka was Carlee Puckett with 13 points, 1 rebound and 5 steals. Bailey Bullock had 8 points, 4 rebounds and 2 steals. Tiffany Flynt had 5 points, 6 rebounds and 2 steals. Shelby Bonds had 5 points, 12 rebounds and 6 steals and Courtney Tigner had 2 points, 4 rebounds and 2

steals.

The boys' first matched them against Iuka took complete control of the game early and won an easy win 52-30. Shannon Edmondson said, "This was our first game tournament and we were get the win fairly easily. Hudson had 10 points and Michael Smith points.

Iuka faced Alcorn in the semi-final game. Iuka had a shaky first half but came strong in the second half to win the game 38-28. ## CHILD FIND PUBLICITY CAMPAIGN AND DISTRICT CONFIDENTIALITY LETTER

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is participating in an ongoing statewide effort to identify, locate, and evaluate children, birth through the age of twenty-one, who have a physical, mental, communicative and/or emotional disability.

Early identification of children in need of special education experiences is most important to each child. Furthermore, this information gathered from contacts with parents and other agencies will be used to help determine present and future program needs as progress is made toward the goal of providing a free appropriate public education to all children with a disability.

Information which could identify an individual child will be maintained by this agency and will be provided to other agencies only in accord with the Family Rights and Privacy Act and EHA-B. As a parent, you are guaranteed the right to inspect any such information about your child and to challenge its accuracy. Access to this information is forbidden to any unauthorized person without informed consent.

Please contact Betty Barnes, Child Find Contact Person for the Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District, if you know any children who may have a disability by calling 423-3206 or writing her at the following address: Tishomingo

County Schools, 1620 Paul Edmondson Drive, Iuka, MS 38852.

The Child Find Person implements child identification, location, and evaluation of children birth through twenty-one who have disabilities, regardless of the severity of their disability, and who are in need of special education and/or related services. The Child Find Person works with the local Head Starts, Human Services, Health Department, and Mental Health Agencies, as well as local education agencies, physicians, and other individuals to identify and locate children out of school and in school who may be in need of special education services.

Once a referral is made, it is the responsibility of the Child Find Contact Person to insure that the Referral-to-Placement Procedures are followed. She works with the Local Survey Committee at each school to implement these procedures. The following activities briefly describe the procedures.

As a part of Child Study, parents are invited to attend a Local Survey Committee Meeting to review a child's educational record and performance and determine a need for an evaluation. Prior to an evaluation, copies of the Parent Information Pamphlet and Procedural Safeguards are given to the parents. District personnel explain these copies to the parents

and insure that they understand the Procedural Safeguards. This process will be reviewed at each parent meeting.

After parental consent for testing is obtained, a non-discriminatory evaluation is conducted. Students are evaluated in all areas related to the suspected disability by qualified personnel.

Parents are invited to attend the Eligibility Determination Conference by the Multi-disciplinary Evaluation/Eligibility Team to determine if a disability exists. If the child meets eligibility criteria for special education services and/or related services, an Individualized Education Program is developed and the parents are invited to attend the meeting. Parents must sign permission for placement before a child can receive services. Parents, teachers and students participate in the process. All students receiving special education services are reassessed at least once a year and reevaluated at least once every three years.

We now have twenty-seven special education classes in our district which provide services to students who have a physical, mental, developmental, communicative, and/or emotional disability. It is the goal of the Tishomingo County School District to provide a free appropriate public education to all children with disabilities through age twenty-one.

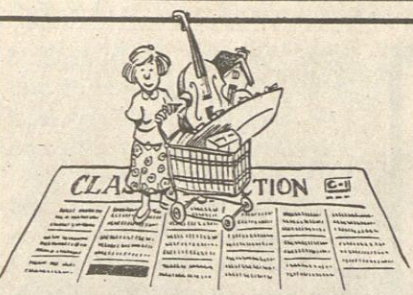

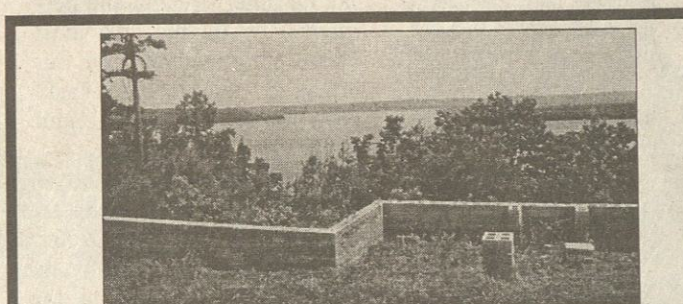

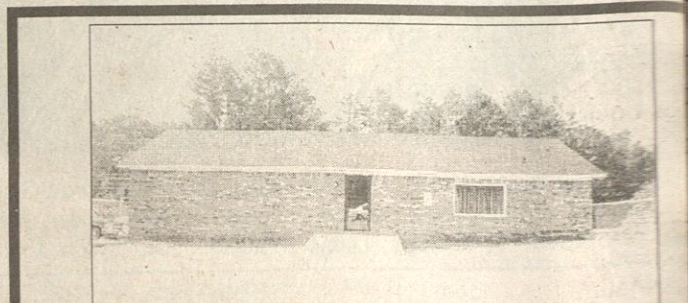
