Iuka Girls/Belmont Boys Win Tishomingo County Championships

The 2006 Tishomingo County Champs in eighth- and th-grade basketball action decided last Thursday at the IMS gym after a tough elimination play. After fierce competition, the eighth grade Iuka Middle School girls and Belmont boys the rites of County Champs. In seventh grade action the IMS girls and the Belmont boys also claimed the county championships.

NMMC-Iuka Celebrates National "Wear Red Day"

As part of February's American Heart Month, North Mississippi Medical Center-Iuka will join thousands of Americans nationwide in celebrating National Wear Red Day on Friday, Feb. 3rd.

"National Wear Red Day is a great opportunity to reach out to women in our community and alert them to their personal risk factors for heart disease. By wearing red on Feb. 3rd, we can all show our support for women and heart disease awareness," said Jerry Oliver, administrator, NMMC-Iuka.

On this day, NMMC-Iuka staff will perform lipid panels for men and women from 7 to 9 a.m. for a \$25 fee. Area participants wanting to take advantage of the lipid panel should not eat or drink anything after midnight the night before.

A lipid panel is a group of tests that can be a good indicator of whether someone is likely to have a heart attack or

stroke caused by blockage of blood vessels. The tests include total cholesterol, HDL cholesterol (often called good cholesterol), LDL cholesterol (often called bad cholesterol) and triglycerides.

Other screenings available from 7 to 11 a.m. this day include free blood pressure checks and height and weight. Representatives from the NMMC-Iuka Wellness Center will demonstrate exercises in the hospital's front lobby and calculate Body Mass Index, a method using height and weight to determine if a person is overweight or obese.

NMMC-Iuka's National Wear Red Day activities are in partnership with The Heart Truth, a national awareness campaign for women about heart disease sponsored by the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute. The Heart Truth launched the Red Dress as the national symbol for women and heart disease

awareness in February 2003. A simple Red Dress works as a visual red alert to get the message heard loud and clear: "Heart Disease Doesn't Care What You Wear - It's the #1 Killer of Women."

National Wear Red Day is an annual event held on the first Friday in February. The first observance, in February 2004, was announced at the White House. On National Wear Red Day, women and men across the country wear red to unite in the national movement to give women a personal and urgent wake-up call about their risk of heart disease. Everyone can participate in this life-saving awareness movement by showing off a favorite red dress, shirt or tie, or by wearing the Red Dress Pin.

Tishomingo County Archives And History Museum Celebrates Black History Month

The Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society's membership includes all races of people. "We are especially interested in supporting both Native American and African American heritages," says Executive Director, Cindy Nelson.

The development of an African American Council is currently underway. An African American exhibit will be unveiled on February 1st which depicts a sampling of the resources that are currently available for research in the John Marshall Stone Research Library.

According to RaNae Vaughn, Director of Marketing & Research, we currently have many resources available in our library to assist African American researchers. One of the best sources for documenting slave ownership is the County records. Our library has approximately 60 rolls of microfilm and innumerable hardback books of Tishomingo County history.

In the late 1930s, Work Progress Administration (WPA) workers compiled County histories by interviewing residents and studying

newspapers. Information on education, churches, prominent people in the black community, and slaves is frequently included, according to Nelson, who has been transcribing these records for several years now. One of Vaughn's latest projects is the transcriptions of the Enumeration of Educable Children which is scheduled for completion during 2006.

The Archives is open Wednesday-Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and Saturday 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. The library closes 15 minutes earlier each day.

Thinking About Contacts?

If you've been thinking about changing from glasses to contact lenses, probably the first thing that came to mind was the cosmetic advantage of contacts. They fit so closely to your eyes no one would know that you are wearing corrective lenses. However, this is just one of several advantages that contacts offer.

Another advantage is that contacts permit a wider field of vision than eyeglasses. There is no lens frame to get in your line of sight when you look to the left or right, up or down. Because they fit so closely, they also present a less distorted and more realistic size in the objects viewed. A tendency to allow for more efficient eye coordination is still another advantage.

They do require more care than glasses, because they must be kept clean and free of irritants. Your eye doctor will instruct you in proper care. If you think you'd like to wear contacts, ask your eye doctor if he would recommend them for you.

Legal Update

DELIVERING THE GOODS

When a party fails to fulfill its contractual obligations, the contract is breached. It should happen that a party is to deliver the goods, but the party contracted to do so, the party may direct "specific performance" of the breach party. This is done in cases where an award of money damages will not suffice to compensate the injured party. Such may be the case when a contractually obligated party fails to deliver merchandise that the receiving party cannot get anywhere else. Because money will not be an adequate substitute for the actual goods the party in need of the goods may require that the contract demand specific performance. In essence, the party may be ordered to deliver the goods.

An attorney versed in contract law can provide assistance to draft contracts including real estate agreements, business for licensing agreements, employment agreements, and others. Also, he or she assist clients in litigating commonly associated contracts, such as breach of contract suits, fraud contracts and suits to enforce an agreement. 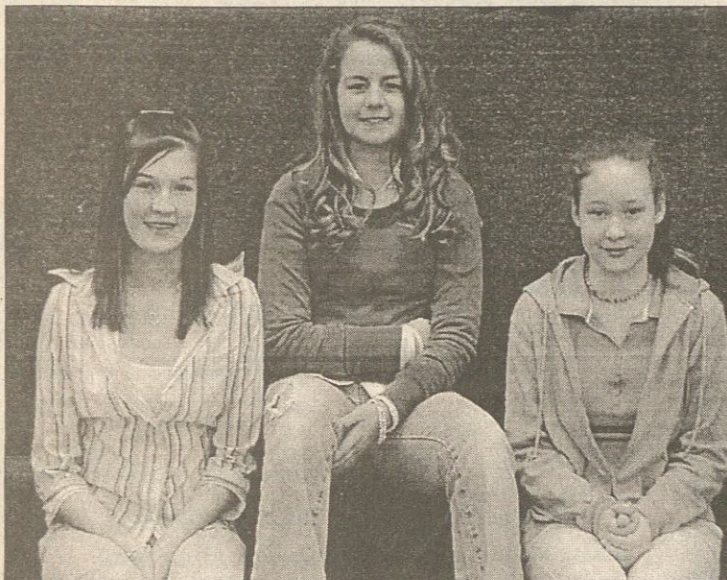
