Braves Win In Region I-4A Post Season Tournament Action Now Headed to North State Tournament

Tishomingo County High School is serving as the host to the Region I-4A Tournament this week. Teams from Shannon, Tishomingo County, New Albany, Itawamba, Saltillo, West Point, Pontotoc, and Saltillo will be vying for championship status in the games Monday through Friday. Play began on Monday night, February 13, with both the Tishomingo County girls and boys seeing action.

The Tishomingo County High School Braves got their first win in their quest for the post-season Region I-4A title. The Braves defeated New Albany 57-52. The Lady Braves, however, bowed out of post-season play with a disappointing loss to Shannon, 56-49. The Braves got their title hopes off to a good start with their 57-52 win against New Albany. The first round win automatically qualifies the Braves for a spot in next week's first round of the North State Tournament.

(The pairings for next week's games will be determined Saturday.) Tyler Pritchard paced the Braves' attack with 22 points. "For a freshman, he's done a super job all year," Coach Mike Cartwright said. "He's handling the ball, running the offense... and making baskets." Seth Kennedy added another 16 points and helped to seal the victory for the Braves with four clutch free-throws down the stretch. Closing out the scoring for the Braves was

Aaron Kissinger with 8 points, Cody Crum with 6 points, Tyler Walker with 3 points, and Josh McCalmon with 2 points. The victory Monday also allowed the 2005-2006 boys' basketball team to claim their First-Ever-North State Tournament berth. Congratulations! New Program For Landowners In Pickwick Watershed

The United States Department of Agriculture has announced a new program for landowners in the Pickwick Watershed.

The USDA Natural Resource Conservation Service has announced that the Pickwick Watershed, located in northeast Mississippi (Alcorn, Prentiss & Tishomingo Counties) will be included in the Conservation Security Program (CSP) in 2006. The purpose of CSP is to reward the best conservation farmers and motivate others to become better stewards of the land.

Pickwick has been selected in northeast Mississippi to participate in the Conservation Security Program during fiscal 2006: other watersheds will be the focus in coming years. If you live in the Pickwick Watershed, 2006 is your opportunity to participate. This unique program offers contract payment from five (5) to ten (10) year periods. Prior to setting up an appointment with NRCS to sign up for the program interested producers are required to successfully complete a self-assessment workbook to determine eligibility. If CSP interests you, you are encouraged to attend a CSP Producer Meeting. This meeting will be held: February 21, 2006 at the Burnsville Chamber of Commerce. The meeting will begin at 6:00 p.m.

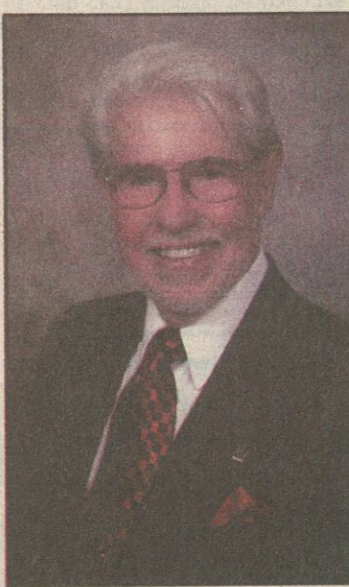
Dr. Kelly Segars, Sr. Appointed To The National Rifle Association Heritage Society

Dr. Kelly Segars, Sr. of Iuka, has been appointed to the National Rifle Association Heritage Society.

Dr. Segars' Heritage Society membership falls on heels of establishing a gift equity in late 2003.

Dr. Segars graduated with honors from pharmacy school at Auburn University, served the army in 1953, spending months in Korea. Because there was a shortage of physicians, he was assigned to a doctor's slot in a battalion station. After he was discharged from the army, he graduated from the University of Mississippi School of Medicine with honors.

In 1964 he founded the First American National Bank which now has eight branches in four counties. Dr. Segars states that,

Homestead Notice

Homestead signing is underway and will continue until March 31, 2006. Anyone needing to file a homestead for the first time or file on a newly constructed house will need to do so during this time. The applicant will need a copy of the deed to the property, social security numbers for the applicant and the spouse, and vehicle tag numbers. Anyone who wishes to file an over 65 homestead exemption will need proof of their age such as a driver's license. Anyone that wishes to file a disability homestead exemption will need to bring their disability award letter.

Anyone needing to make a change to their homestead such as becoming over 65 before January 1, 2006, becoming disabled before January 1, 2006, loss of a spouse in 2005 either by death or divorce, or changing their place of residence also need to come in between January 1, 2006 and March 31, 2006. WARRANTED OR NOT?

While the Fourth Amendment gives people the right to be secure in their homes from unreasonable government searches, what "unreasonable" exactly is has often been debated. One thing about which there is no debate is that, except in exigent cases, law enforcement officers cannot search a person's home without a warrant. This is a document that is signed by a judge and describes the place to be searched and the people or object that can be seized. The decision to sign a warrant is made after the judge hears sufficient reason from a law enforcement officer why a warrant should be issued. The rules applying to searches and seizures also apply to vehicles, offices, and people on the street.

If you question the legality of a matter you're involved in, speak to a legal professional about your rights and your options. 24 Billion Images

If your life covers a normal span and you give your eyes proper care, you can expect to see about 24 billion images of the world around you. Your eyes must have the care and protection they need, however, and that should include regular checkups.

Father/Daughter Place Fourth in FL Crappie Tournament Joe Miller and Sonya Walker Win \$2,700

One hundred and seventy teams arrived in Florida during January to enter the Florida State Crappie Championship Tournaments.

To gain entry into the championship tournament, a national event that was first organized by Iuka citizen, Joe Miller, and his daughter Sonya, they had to combine their efforts from two Florida tournaments—the Lake Monroe in Oxford, FL, and the Harris Chain of Lakes at Leesburg,

FL. Only the top 50 teams from these tournaments qualified to enter the Florida State Championship on January 29.

Joe Miller of Dennis and his daughter, Sonya, of Iuka participated as a team in the tournaments, and qualified for the championship round by catching 7 fish at 9.11 lbs. at Lake Monroe for a 39th place finish and 9.54 lbs. of fish at the Harris Chain of Lakes for a 9th place finish in that event.

These two events put Joe and Sonya at 21st place in the top 50 in the Championship Tournaments. As their fishing day

began to break for the big event, teams were allowed to be on their favorite spots and ready to fish beginning at 7 a.m. The father/daughter team had fished for about an hour before they got their first bite, and it was a big one, but the fish broke off before they could get it into the boat. About 10 minutes later, again, they failed to put another big fish in the boat. Both Joe and Sonya were feeling pretty low after losing the two big fish. But, they knew they were at the right spot and knew they had to stay focused because there was still plenty of fishing time left.

After fishing all day and with only two hours of fishing time left, the team had managed to bag 6 nice crappie and 5 very small fish. They felt they would need to catch at least one more nice crappie to finish out the 7-fish limit. As time went by they realized that they just might have to settle for one of the 7 oz. little ones to finish the 7-fish limit at the weigh-in.

"As Joe was culling the fish, he knew they had 3 fish that were in the 1.75 lb. range and 3 in the 1.25 to 1.5 lb. range. They would have to weigh in one of their small fish to complete the limit," according to Joe.

At the scales, Joe and Sonya weighed in 9.54 lbs. and had the "Big Fish" for the tournament with a 1.96 lb. crappie.

The winning weight for the tournament was caught by the team of Joe Meyer and son Mike Meyer from Stoutsville, MO, with a weight of 10.06 lbs, only .52 lbs. ahead of Miller and Walker.

Joe added, "If we could have landed either one of the fish that we had lost early in the morning, we could have won easily, but 4th place is respectable. Plus, we did have the "Big Fish" in the tournament."

The father/daughter team of Joe Miller and Sonya Walker did pick up the 4th-place finish, the "Big Fish" in the tournament, and a nice \$2,700.
