### Tishomingo County Mourns Loss Of Leading Citizen, J.O. Southward, Jr.

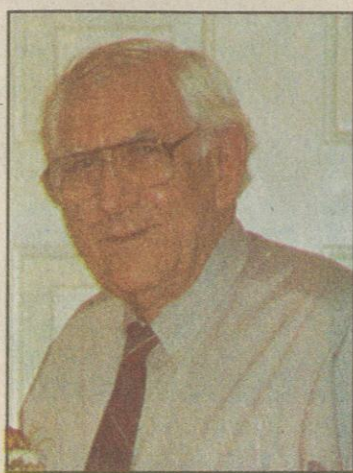
The Town of Tishomingo, Tishomingo County, and Mississippi lost a long-time friend and advocate of the area on Monday, March 17, with the death of J.O. Southward, Jr., at his residence.

Southward, who loved everybody and everything associated with this area had dedicated his life to promoting the town of Tishomingo, Tishomingo County, and the state of Mississippi.

J.O. was born to John and Lucie Southward of Tishomingo, in 1927. His loved ones set an example for him in promoting the area, and continued this quest. As a young man Southward worked for the family mercantile store, Tishomingo Stone Co., and on his family farm, while attending Tishomingo High School. He graduated as Valedictorian of his class in 1945. Southward was drafted and served in World War II; during this time, he worked with radio-controlled planes.

When Southward returned home, he attended Mississippi State University. He graduated from MSU with High Honors in 1950 with a degree in Political Science. While at MSU, he worked as a graduate assistant for two noted professors: John K. Bettersworth, widely known for his book on Mississippi History, and Gordon Bryan.

After graduating from MSU, Southward ran for and was elected to the Mississippi House of Representatives. He was one of the first groups of college graduates to be elected to the Mississippi Legislature. He served from 1952-1956. Southward worked on many legislative bills including the teacher retirement bill, funding Tishomingo State Park, and the Dennis Fire Tower. After leaving office, Southward continued his pursuit to promote this area. Bringing industry to Tishomingo County was one of his commitments. The Blue Bell plants in Tishomingo and Belmont, and the Shirt Factory in Iuka were among his interests. He also continued to work on the establishment of the Appalachian Roadway Corridor that now connects Batesville and Chattanooga. He also

worked to bring the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway through Tishomingo County.

Southward, a member of the Tishomingo County and Mississippi Democratic Committees, loved politics and was involved in many local, regional and state campaigns. Southward was fondly referred to as the "Guv" of Tishomingo. Southward, who served as a Colonel for several Mississippi Governors throughout the years, was recognized and remembered in the Mississippi Legislature on Monday, March 20. Tishomingo County has lost a devoted friend and advocate.

Southward served two terms on the Board of Trustees at Northeast Mississippi Junior College, and he also served as a former member of the Board of Directors of Timber Hills Mental Health Center.

Southward thoroughly enjoyed his association with fellow members of the Scottish Rites and with the members of the Tishomingo Masonic Lodge #522 F&AM. He was also a member of the Woodmen of the World.

Survivors include his fiancée and best friend, Linda Hester, six cousins: Peggy Page and her husband, Willis; Sis Bickerstaff, Mary McNatt, and Fairless Southward, all of Tishomingo; Hal Southward of Saltillo, and Joe Southward of Tunica, and numerous other cousins and friends.

Services were conducted at 2:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 21, at the Cutshall Funeral Home Chapel. Bro. William Burcham and Bro. J. B. Burns officiated. Burial with honors by retired military friends from

all branches was in the Tishomingo Cemetery.

Pallbearers were Jeff Bonds, Stanley Page, Joseph McNatt, Brendix Glasgow, Phillip Cain, and Lance Hollingsworth.

### Thursday Morning Fire Destroys Boat Dock & Boats At Rivercliff On Pickwick Lake

A fire on Thursday morning, March 16, at Rivercliff Marina and Boat Ramp, located on Pickwick Lake, just yards from a Tishomingo County residential community, caused the loss of between 30 to 40 boats and completely destroyed the entire facility.

Rivercliff is a private marina operated by the Rivercliff Homeowners Association as a part of the Rivercliff residential development in Hardin County, Tenn. It is less than a mile from Grand Harbor Condominiums and Marina located in Tishomingo County. This section of Tishomingo County can

only be accessed by car by traveling a few miles into Hardin County Tennessee and turning left on to YMCA lane which eventually turns into Tishomingo County Road 380.

Reports from officials indicated that the fire started sometime around 9 a.m. Thursday and by the time the firefighters arrived on the scene, the entire marina was engulfed in flames.

The older marina had 58 boat slips, but was presently housing between 30 and 40 vessels, all of which were lost as a result of the blaze.

The cause of the fire is still

under investigation, according to officials.

A private clean-up company, First Response, was brought in to clean up the debris, as well as any gas or other chemicals which may have leaked out into the water surrounding the marina during the fire.

Assistance was provided to the Counce, Tenn. firemen by neighboring Tishomingo County's North Crossroads Volunteer Fire Department. Authorities from the Environmental Protection Agency and the U.S. Coast Guard were also called to the scene.

### Grant To Fund New Roof At Historic Old Midway School

A Mississippi Community Heritage Preservation Grant has been awarded to the Old Midway School.

Midway School, located just south of Iuka, is on the National Register of Historic Places. The grant is in the amount of \$38,000. A local match of \$9,500 was required from the Midway School Building Museum Committee.

The building is used as a voting precinct, as well as for a community center for events such as family reunions with rental fees being used toward support of the school.

The local homemakers club entered an agreement with the

Tishomingo County special Municipal Separate School District in 1993 for the upkeep of the building.

Midway School served as a two year high school until 1932 when high school students began going to Holcut High School. After that time, the school was used as a grammar school. Only twelve classes graduated from Midway before the school dropped to an eight-year school in early 1945.

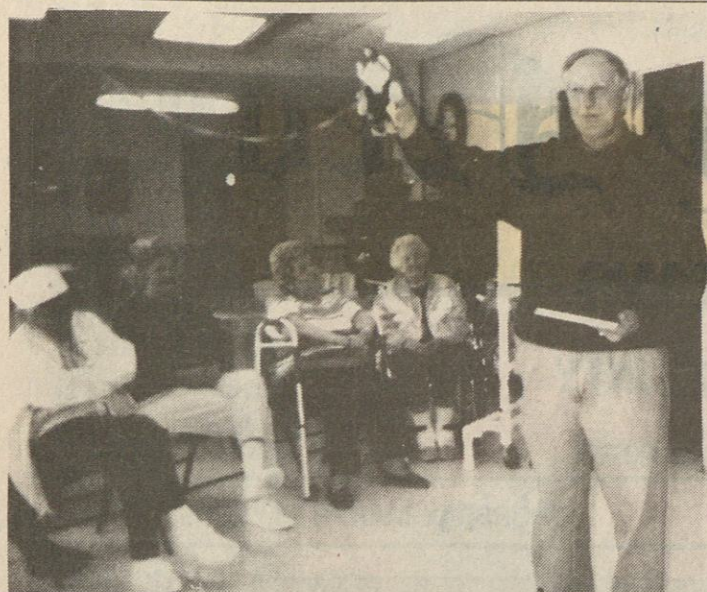

#### IS IT A CRIME?

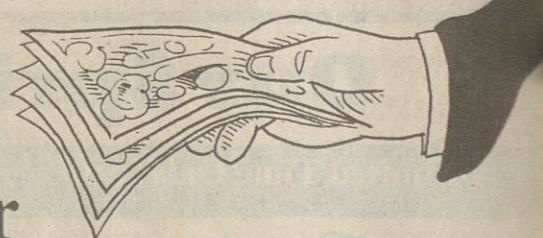

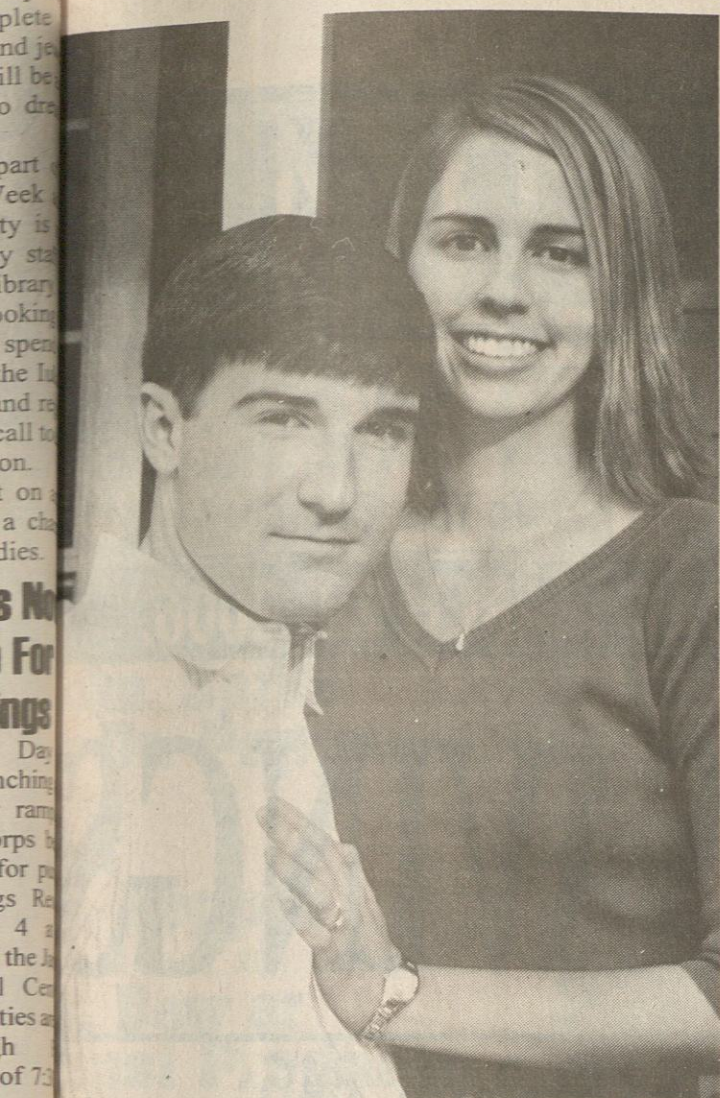
#### Child With Crossed Eyes

Most parents know that any child may be afflicted with "crossed eyes." But they often don't know that this handicap can be diagnosed and corrected at an early age. Recognition of this problem is often possible within a few months and this is an appropriate time for treatment should begin.

The STRABISMUS is a condition that describes eyes that are not properly aligned. One eye may be in (crossed eyes), turn (wall eyes), turn (down). The deviation may be constant or it may come and go. Strabismus affects about 2% of children. About half of this number are born with eyes that cross. Early attention is recommended for another reason - to prevent the presence of a serious disease, such as tumor.

Among the methods used to treat strabismus are glasses, patching, eye drops, eye exercises, surgery. These may be used either alone or in combination.

Homestead signing is soon coming to an end for this year. The last day to file homestead is March 31st. We urge anyone needing to file a homestead for the first time or file on a newly constructed house to do so before March 31st. The applicant will need a copy of the deed to the property, social security numbers for the applicant and the spouse, and vehicle tag numbers. Anyone that wishes to file an over 65 homestead exemption will need proof of their age such as a driver's license. Anyone that wishes to file a disability homestead will need to bring their disability award letter.

New items have been added to the gift shop and new donations have been received at the museum and also a lot of new material is available for research.

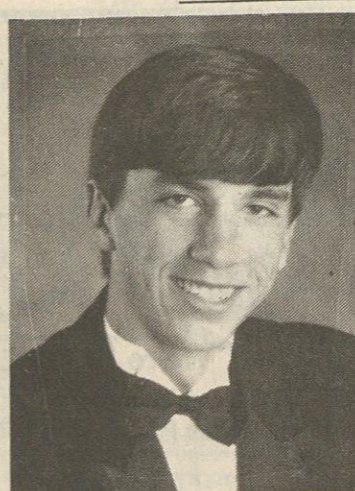
