Fireman's Funeral Held For Local Volunteer

Local volunteer firefighter Robert Smith, 34, a member of the Snowdown/Pleasant Hill Volunteer Fire Department passed away on Wednesday, April 12, 2006 and was honored with a Fireman's Funeral.

The special ceremony, held Saturday, April 15, at his gravesite, was very moving.

After the minister concluded with the commitment portion of the service, members of the Snowdown/Pleasant Hill, Iuka, and Midway Fire Departments and Fire Coordinator Jerry Bonds loaded the casket onto the back of one of their fire trucks and proceeded

to the graveside. After unloading the casket and placing it at graveside, Iuka Fire Department Assistant Chief Brandon Grissom said the Fireman's Prayer. This was followed by a special flag presentation beginning with Iuka Fire Chief Brian Grissom and including seven firefighters. The flag was presented to Robert's oldest son.

Then the crowd listened as Taps was played by James Embrey. The final part of the ceremony was conducted by 9-1-1 Communications Officer Lynn Hester who asked all firefighters to observe a moment

of silence. He then set off the pager call for Snowdown/Pleasant Hill Firefighters and called out, "9-1-1 to 2503 (Robert Smith's badge number). Silence was observed as no answer was made. He repeated this two more times, followed by the silence. Finally, Hester stated, "2503 is out of service—good-bye my brother." Then the fellow firefighters gave their final salute as Smith was lowered into his grave.

We extend our sympathy to the family of Robert Smith who was taken at such a young age.

Accident Claims Life Of One Child, Other Child Now Home

A two-vehicle wreck which took place last Tuesday, April 11, at the intersection of Hwy. 72 and Pleasant Hill Road, claimed the life of 7-year-old Jordan Rafferty of Long Beach, Miss.

A second child in the vehicle involved in the accident, Lauren Mayfield, 9, also of Long Beach, suffered several injuries including broken fingers, and underwent surgery in Memphis, Tenn.'s LeBonheur Children's Hospital. The young girl has now returned to her home in Long Beach.

Services for Jordan Raf-

ferty, a first grader, were at 12 p.m. Saturday, April 15, in Gulfport. He is the son of John Rafferty and Natalie Rafferty, both of the Long Beach/Gulfport area and grandson of Harry and Johnnie Fay Rafferty of Iuka.

The recovering Lauren Mayfield is the daughter of Dennis and Rebecca Mayfield of Long Beach, Miss. and granddaughter of Harry and Johnnie Fay Rafferty of Iuka.

The grandparents, along with the children's great aunt, Bobbie Gene Seago who were also involved in the accident,

have all been released from the hospital and are doing okay, according to family reports.

Burnsville Man Convicted In Alcorn Co. As Sex Offender

A Burnsville man was convicted and sentenced Thursday, April 13, by an Alcorn County jury on fondling charges.

According to court reports, Larry Wayne Miller, Jr., 42, has been convicted of fondling a child. It took the jury about an hour and a half of deliberation on Thursday to come back with a verdict of guilty.

The incident Miller was convicted of took place around March 15, 2004 in Alcorn County and involved an 11-year-old girl, according to the District Attorney's office.

Judge Thomas Gardner

sentenced Miller to 10 years, with five years suspended. The remaining five years must be served in the Mississippi Department of Corrections, day-for-day with no possibility of early release.

Upon Miller's release, he will be on post-release supervision for a total of five additional years and will be required to register with the county in which he resides as a sex offender.

Further, Miller was fined \$1,000 and must pay \$1,000 to the Mississippi Children's Trust Fund.

NMMC-Iuka Hospital To Eliminate Staff Surgeon

It is not cost effective to keep a surgeon on staff in Iuka, according to management at North Mississippi Medical Center who will be eliminating the position of staff surgeon Dr. Douglas Palenschat at the end of May.

Dr. Palenschat has been on staff at Iuka Hospital for approximately 6 1/2 years—since September of 1999—to fill the need for a general surgeon locally, without Tishomingo County residents having to travel to Tupelo or other larger cities in order to have routine and needed surgical procedures. The local surgeon made it much more convenient for those in the area to get the treatment they need here at home—everything from gall bladder surgery, appendectomy, colonoscopy, EGDS, etc. Dr. Palenschat was also very valuable in consultations for surgery, often times saving locals from having to be sent to another facility if surgery was not necessary.

This decision by NMMC is based solely on bottom line costs of keeping a surgeon and his staff and is not in keeping with the needs of our local people, according to sources. This

decision to do away with a surgeon lowers confidence in the hospital overall.

Dr. Palenschat would like to let his patients know that May 1 will be the last day he will be performing any major surgeries and that May 31 will be his last day at Iuka Hospital unless NMMC has a change of heart and decides to keep him on staff.

If you are a patient or just an interested person who wishes to voice their opinions over the elimination of the position at Iuka, you may contact the Iuka Hospital Administrator Gerald Oliver or NMMC Administrator John Heer either by phone, by mail or through the NMMC webpage. It would be a shame to lose this valuable asset from our local hospital facility.

Also, Dr. Palenschat asks for the prayers of the local people so that God will help him to find the direction his career needs to go in since his position is planned to be done away with here at Iuka. He would like to thank all his patients and friends for their kindness and support over the past 6 1/2 years.

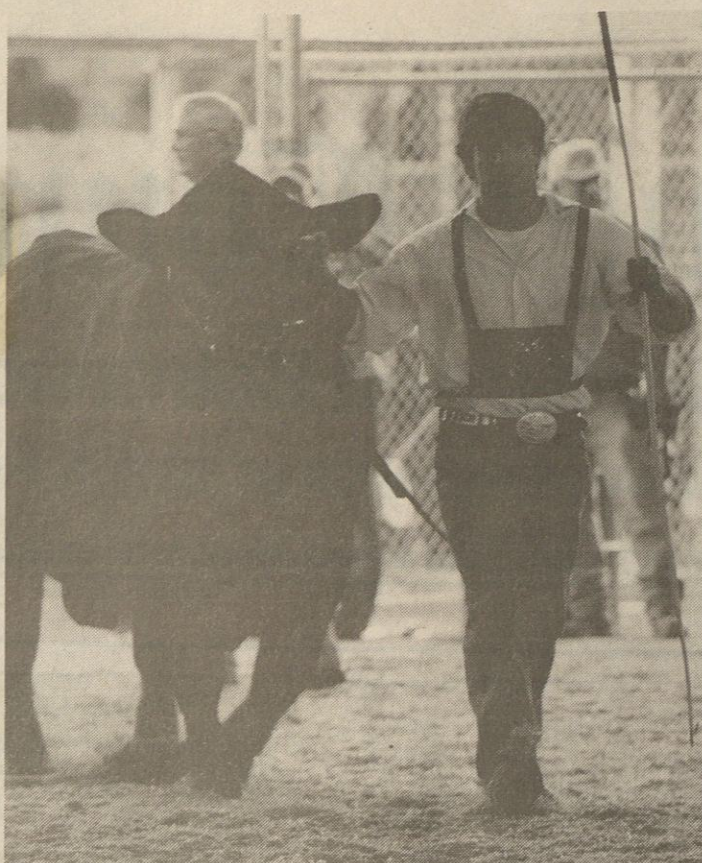

Jon-Paul Whitlock, 18, sees no contradiction in his two hobbies: ballroom dancing and showing prize Angus cattle.

In fact, the senior at Tishomingo County High School believes there is a fundamental similarity between the bovine arena and the ballroom.

"In dancing, the man's job is to show off the lady, to be a picture frame for the picture," Jon-Paul says.

"In showing a heifer, it's the same thing, really, to put her through her positions and make her stand out."

Jon-Paul and others will be dancing for a cause soon, as Iuka Country Club hosts an American Cancer Society Relay for Life Benefit Ball Thursday, April 27, at 7 p.m. Admission is a minimum donation of \$10.

You can imagine this young

Renaissance man in either of his roles — waltzing across a polished floor with his dance partner, Stephanie Betts, or, stomping in sawdust, putting a cow through its paces. Some days, he admits, the line blurs and he practices his dance moves in the barn with a feed bucket for a partner.

Whitlock's chicory eyes and black hair give him movie star looks. His clean white t-shirt, blue jeans and flip flops remind you he's a regular teenager, if a talented and articulate one.

Jon-Paul grew up on a Tishomingo County cattle farm, showing cows, with his father's help, when he was only four years old. He stuck with it, eventually becoming president of the Mississippi Junior Angus Association and dominating the Angus show ring in Jackson's Dixie National Junior Round-

Up. In 2005, Jon-Paul won the cow-calf division at Denver's National Junior Livestock Show.

Ballroom dancing is a more recent passion. When a cousin wanted to take lessons to help her on the beauty pageant circuit, she enlisted Jon-Paul as a partner. The couple enrolled at Tupelo's Dance Quest.

Jon-Paul was hooked. After only months of instruction, he entered a national competition in Memphis, placing first in 10 out of 12 different dance categories with new partner Stephanie.

The former football player and young cattleman had no trouble convincing his female friends and mother Phyllis that learning to dance was a good idea. Some of his male buddies and his father, Tishomingo County Tax Collector, Paul Whitlock, took a little more

work.

"It's really quite an intense physical workout, and it's made me appreciate different kinds of music," Jon-Paul says. He recalls a trip to the store to buy everything from Mozart to light jazz. "I was surprised to find how soothing some music can be."

Jon-Paul's two worlds will converge this summer in Washington, D.C. At a national 4-H meeting he'll receive a silver medal for community service and performing a play based on a children's story written by First Lady Laura Bush. Jon-Paul will play a dancing wolf.

"President Bush stated that he is committed to fully utilizing the 39.2 million-acre enrollment authority under the CRP," said Johanns. "This general sign-up demonstrates the administration's dedication to maintaining the CRP's environmental benefits."

The CRP is a voluntary program that helps farmers, ranchers and other agricultural producers protect their environmentally sensitive land. Producers enrolling in the CRP plant long-term, resource-conserving covers, with the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) providing rental payments, cost-share and technical

assistance.

Conservation Corner

Agriculture Secretary Mike Johanns announced that the USDA will begin notifying

certain landowners with Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) contracts expiring in

2007 that they may extend or re-enroll their contracts. "Approximately 16 million acres in CRP contracts expire in 2007," said Johanns. "Fulfilling President Bush's directive to allow eligible farmers and ranchers to re-enroll or extend their CRP contracts helps ensure that the quality of soil, water, air and wildlife benefits of the CRP continue for future generations."

The Farm Service Agency (FSA) county offices will begin notifying certain CRP participants by mail with expiring contracts in 2007 if they are eligible for re-enrollments or

two - to five - year extensions. Participants eligible for re-enrollment will be offered a 10 - or 15 - year contract provided there are restored wetlands on the original land enrolled in the contract. Fifteen-year contracts expiring September 30, 2007, are not eligible for extension.

The FSA used the Environmental Benefits Index (EBI) to determine eligibility for CRP re-enrollments or extensions. Additional credit was considered for contracts within conservation priority areas. The EBI addresses expected benefits to water quality, erosion, enduring benefits, air quality and wildlife habitat.

Before approving a re-enrollment contract or an extended contract, the FSA will review the contract to ensure that the required cover is maintained and there is compliance with other contract provisions. In addition, to be eligible, participants must be able to show that they meet eligibility requirements for the new enrollment period. In the case of re-enrollments, updated rental rates will apply.

The USDA also announced that a general CRP sign-up is being held this spring. Farmers and ranchers will be able to make offers for CRP's competi-

LIABILITY WAIVERS

If you have rented a bicycle on vacation, you are probably familiar with waiving liability for potential injuries. These releases are quite common, especially with respect to recreational activities due to the fact that some sports have been found to be inherently dangerous. In such instances, the participants are said to have voluntarily waived their right to recover in the event they were to suffer personal injury. If a sport is widely known to cause injuries, anyone participating in the inherently dangerous sport should know the dangers. His or her participation then brings with it an assumption of risk. Even so, the owner of property or equipment can still be held responsible for personal injuries suffered in some circumstances.

"He was from two big families with a lot of cousins, friends and family, people who loved him," his Aunt Frances Spruill of Long Beach said.

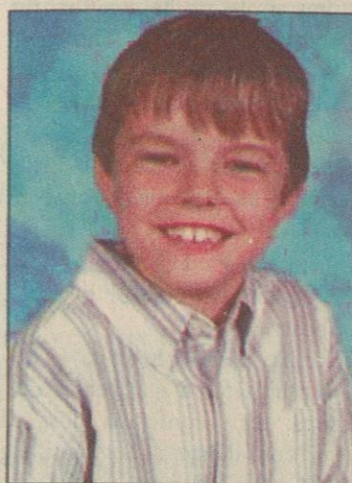

Jordan had talked to his mother the morning before the wreck.

His Aunt Desha LaRosa loved to garden with his grandmother Leslie and he and his two dogs Stormy and Willie. The dogs have been missing for him all week, she said.

Dating Violence: Warning Signs For Parents

Over one third of teenagers in dating relationships have experienced some physical violence. Girls are much more likely than boys to be punched and forced to engage in sexual activity against their will. Among female victims, the most common response to the violence is fear, followed closely by being emotionally hurt. Jealousy is the most frequently noted reason for violence.

Most teenage girls think it won't happen to them, when in reality, one in five female high school students report being physically or sexually abused by a dating partner. Teens believe that dating violence isn't that serious. However, 30% of all women who are

murdered in this country are killed by their husband or boyfriend. Many times, victims are led to believe that the abuse is their fault. This myth is perpetrated by the abuser who believes they have the right to use, abuse and control their partner. They see the victim as less than equal to

themselves. The victim, however, has no control over the abuser.

People stay in abusive relationships for a number of reasons: fear, confusion, loss of self confidence; not recognizing that what's happening is abusive; or that the abuser needs their help or will change. Many teenage girls, interpret jealous behavior as "love". Jealous be-

havior is the use of control over another person. This is not love.

Is the person you are dating jealous of your friends, family, clothes, etc.? Does he spend all of her time with you? Does he want her to be the band, cheerleader, etc.? Does he want her to be the only one of dressing? Does he frequently check up on you? Does he give orders to you? Does he make decisions for you? Does he blame her for everything she does? Does he mistreats her?
