### Corinth Man Killed In 4-Wheeler Accident

A Corinth man lost his life Sunday evening as the result of a four-wheeler accident near the Tishomingo County/Alcorn County line in Sharp's Bottom.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, the victim, Earnest Elmer James, 62, of Corinth, died Sunday, May 7, as a result of a trauma suffered during the four-wheeler accident. The accident occurred around 5:30 p.m. in a remote area of the northwest corner of Tishomingo County, about one half mile from the Alcorn County line in Sharp's Bottom.

Apparently James was one of a large group on all-terrain-vehicles traveling down a gravel road (CR 373) in the bottom Sunday. When the

group began down a steep hill, James' four-wheeler apparently made contact with another four-wheeler, causing him to lose control of his vehicle.

James and a passenger, who was riding behind him, were thrown from the four-wheeler and continued down to the bottom of the hill. The four-wheeler came to rest on its side about 40 feet away from James.

James died at the scene, according to Coroner Wilemon. The passenger was transported from the scene by ambulance to Magnolia Hospital for treatment.

No helmet was in use by the victim at the time of the accident, Wilemon stated.

### One-Vehicle Accident Near North Crossroads Claims Lives Of Two

Two Burnsville men tragically lost their lives Monday night when their vehicle left the roadway and crashed into some trees between North Crossroads and Doskie on Hwy. 365.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, the victims, Gregory Curtis Jourdan, 41, and Lanny Paul Broadway, 42, both originally from Burnsville, were pronounced dead at the scene of the accident which occurred at 7:20 p.m. approximately a mile and a half south of North Crossroads on Hwy. 365.

Reports from a witness stated that the vehicle, a Ford Bronco II, appeared to be out of control as it came southbound down Hwy. 365 past the Fitch residence. It then left the roadway on the wrong side of the road and slammed into two pine trees.

The top of the vehicle was crushed in on the driver of the vehicle, Jourdan, and also on the passenger, Broadway. The Jaws of Life had to be used in order to cut through the wreckage and remove the victims. First Responders from North Crossroads and Burnsville Volunteer Fire Departments responded to the accident, according to reports.

Coroner Wilemon stated that the cause of death of the two men was massive multiple traumatic injuries suffered during the accident.

Gregory C. Jourdan, 41, died Monday, May 8, 2006, as a result of a one-vehicle accident. Greg loved sports, especially football.

Survivors include his parents, Curtis and Katherine Jourdan of Burnsville; his wife, Angela Jourdan of Burnsville; one son, Gregory Curtis Jourdan Jr. of Burnsville; three daughters, Ashley Jourdan and Katie Jourdan, both of Iuka and Shelby Jourdan of Kossuth; one step-daughter, Alicia Frady of Burnsville; two sisters, Kathy Baxter of Burnsville and Brenda Blanks of Madison, MS.

Services were Wednesday, May 10, 2006, at 2 p.m. at Cutshall Funeral Home Chapel in Glen with Bro. Jimmy Daniels officiating. Burial was in Temple Cemetery.

Pallbearers were Tim Wright, Kenneth Harville, James Harville, Stevie McAnally, Allen Vandiver and Terry White. Cutshall Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements.

Paul Broadway, 42, died Monday, May 8, 2006, as a result of a one-vehicle accident. Paul loved NASCAR, fishing and Ole Miss football.

Survivors include three brothers, Jerry Lee Clark; Myron Broadway and wife, Dewana; and David Broadway; all of Burnsville; four sisters, Loreath Mcauley and husband, Randy, of Iuka; Sherry Sheffield of Burnsville; Denise Kennedy of Blue Springs, MS; and Carol Crum and husband, David, of Iuka; and two brothers-in-law, W.C. Mann of Burnsville and Wesley Kennedy of Corinth. Paul was also a beloved uncle who leaves a host of nieces and nephews.

Paul was preceded in death by his parents, Millard and Zora Broadway; one sister, Maeoma Mann; and one brother, Billy Clark.

Services will be Thursday, May 11, 2006, at 2 p.m. at Antioch Freewill Baptist Church. Burial will follow at Antioch Cemetery.

Pallbearers will be Allen Vandiver, Jonathan Horn, Jeffery Clark, Josh Clark, Justin Clark and Steve Merrill. Cutshall Funeral Home in Glen is in charge of arrangements.

### Hatcher Seeks Chancery Judge Post

Booneville attorney John A. Hatcher has qualified to run for the new post of Chancery Court Judge, Place One, for the First Judicial District in the November General Election. Since this is a newly created judgeship, there is no sitting judge running for this post.

For more than 33 years Hatcher has practiced law in the district accumulating experience as an attorney for several municipalities. He was elected and served 16 years as

Prosecuting Attorney for Prentiss County. He has also served 16 years as city prosecutor for Baldwyn, 16 years as town attorney for Marietta, and almost eight years as city attorney for Farmington.

He is a former public school teacher and earned degrees from Delta State University and the University of Mississippi School of Law.

He has built his law practice by focusing on providing services for the public, forming and representing rural water associations, fire departments, and sewer services. He is an active member of the Prentiss County Farm Bureau Federation.

"My goal has been to prepare myself for our family court, as this position is often called," Hatcher said. "This is the place families come to resolve matters involving wills, child custody, divorce, land and civil disputes among other contests."

Hatcher is a member of state, national, regional and local bar associations, having been elected to a term as presi-

dent of the First Judicial District Bar Association.

Hatcher has long been an advocate of children's services and activities in the community. He was a founder of Booneville-Prentiss County Parks, Inc., which helped fund Kids' Town in Booneville and the recent renovations of Marietta Springs Park. He also served as a member of the Board of Directors of the Yocona Area Council of the Boy Scouts of America, as vice chairman of the Mississippi Council on Children. He has donated legal services in the formation and incorporation of: Prentiss County Law Enforcement Association, Inc.; Habitat for Humanity of Prentiss County, Inc.; the Big V-Hobo Fire Protection District; and the New Site Fire Protection District. He has been active in historic preservation in Prentiss, Lee and Union counties. He has formed and is a member of several hunting clubs. He is currently the chairman of the Booneville Ward

## A Mother's Day Tribute

Mother's Day is a good opportunity to remember all those wonderful mothers who make worthy contributions to their families and communities. By honoring my mother, this is a plea to pay tribute to all mothers.

On March 1st my mother, Irene Hamilton Franks, passed through that portal from her Iuka earthly life to a new and different heavenly experience. Her minister, the Reverend Jim Edwards of Iuka Gospel Chapel, having only known her since her four years of residing in Tishomingo Manor Nursing Home, suggested, instead of a traditional funeral service, we conduct a celebration of her life, which I wholeheartedly supported.

Immediately, I began thinking about what I could say about a woman who was responsible for eight children, ten grandchildren, fourteen great-grandchildren, and one great-great-grandchild, and successful in her guidance and inspiration not only of her family, but also her community. There was so much to be said, and so little time to say it. I made ten pages of notes, but finally cut it to two. A couple sisters adamantly suggested I further edit my remarks. Succumbing to time restraints and to give others an equal opportunity to speak, I complied. To this day I feel that I did not properly eulogize my remarkable mother. In addition, her obituary did not appear in the newspaper until almost a week later and many Iuka residents have told my family they did not attend her funeral because they were unaware of her demise.

Reverend Edwards began the celebration with consoling words of wisdom and praise for a life well lived. Two of my sisters sang a beautiful hymn, accompanied at the piano by Greg Woodruff. Another sister contributed a Reba McEntyre musical selection honoring mother. *Amazing Grace*, Mom's theme song, filled the chapel with its comforting tune and lyrics.

I began my part of the celebration of Irene Franks' life by saying my mother personified amazing grace her entire life. Born near Clifton, Tennessee between WWI and the Great Depression, life was never easy. Mom's nine-year-old sister, Ella, was burned to death while assisting with the family laundry. When her mother contracted malaria, Mom had to drop out of school after the sixth grade to care for her three younger siblings. When she was fourteen, her grandfather injured his back and couldn't work, so she went to work to help support the family. Her older brother, Edgar, lost an arm in



a farm accident.

After Mom married the late Brodis Lee Franks in 1935, a tornado destroyed her parents' home

further injuring her father and killing her brother, Ernest. In 1945, near the end of WWII, her beloved youngest brother, J. W. was killed in Belgium. Mom seemed to gracefully bear all these tragedies, while consoling other family members. I never knew her to complain or feel sorry for herself.

My earliest memory was of my Dad singing or whistling the tune, *Five-foot-two, eyes of blue, Oh what those five feet can do! Has anybody seen my gal? (Mom was five-two and blue-eyed)*. Before my Dad departed for a WWII Army exam I could hear him singing to Mom at night: *Goodnight Irene, Goodnight Irene, I'll see you in my dreams*. The greatest gifts they gave us children were their love for each other and for us.

My Dad would never let Mom learn to drive; her driving made him nervous. When he died at age 62 in 1976, we convinced Mom, then 58, to sell the family car, and call one of her children when she needed to go someplace. She didn't like imposing upon others, and began calling the local taxi driver, Mr. Hamm, when she needed transportation. She took out-of-town trips on Greyhound or Trailway buses. But she vowed that someday she'd learn to drive.

My sister and her husband soon purchased a second-hand car that was as big and hopefully as safe as a tank. We all gave her driving lessons. She took the driver's test a number of times before she finally passed it. On her next to last attempt, she crashed into the testing patrolman's squad car. He said, "Mrs. Franks, I can't give you a license this time, you'll have to return and take the test again. Her

reply was, "I don't know why, it was just a little bump."

The next week she returned and passed the driving test the same day her 15-year-old granddaughter got hers. She continued driving until she broke her hip at age 83.

Mom was one of the most moral and religious persons I have ever known. Her life's priorities were God, church, home, family, friends, cleanliness, and manners, and likely in that order. Something I cut from my remarks at the funeral, for which I've been sorry, is a story about her priorities. One of the highlights of my life was when I took Mom on a Mediterranean Cruise. I had already taken her to see the Atlantic Ocean for the first time, and to Disneyland in California, and Las Vegas, where she'd asked the question, "How do they ever pay their light bills here?" and a number of other places including New York. But the location that most excited her was the Holy Land. She enjoyed the Acropolis and the Parthenon in Athens, the

ancient temples and ruins on the Green Islands, tolerated the 500 B.C. brothel and topless sunbathers, examined the carvings on the library of Celsus, reluctantly received a hug from our guide Abraham in Turkey, viewed three continents; from the bridge in Istanbul, cruised the Aegean Sea, and waited on board ship while I lunched overlooking the Nile River and rode a camel around the great Pyramid and Sphinx. But it was the Biblical sites that thrilled her, like walking the same streets that the Apostle Paul walked in Ephesus, and almost everything in Israel. When we arrived at the Golden Gate of Jerusalem she was reminded of the Pearly Gate. She touched the tomb of the Virgin, visited the Holy Sepulchre, kneeling at the Tomb of Jesus, and stood by the stone where his body was anointed. We saw the Star of Bethlehem that marked the spot where Jesus was born. She walked the Way of the Cross stopping at each station. She prayed at Jerusalem's wailing wall and gave a blind man \$5 from her last \$50. We visited Bethlehem's Church of the Nativity, where a pickpocket took all my cash and Mom offered me the last of hers. We strolled through the Garden of Gethsemane and dipped holy water from the River Jordan. We stared at the Golan Heights across the Sea of Galilee. When we stood atop the Mount of Olives, Mom said she felt like she was in heaven.

At her funeral, four of Mom's granddaughters stood at the podium and shared stories of how Mom's love and lifestyle so inspired them. One, Lee Ann Robertson, told about the day she and Mom both got their driver's licenses, and about her teenage angst at having to share such an important event with her grandmother, and of the endearment of that memory today. She also related stories of how her dad was quite often called to put up mailboxes that her grandmother had mowed down; how "Mawmaw" picked up her great-granddaughter, Destiny, and a grandson, Jeremy Lambert, from school and took them to the Sonic where she forgot to put the car in park, and it ran away with them. Destiny, in the passenger seat with a broken leg, couldn't help, and Jeremy had to crawl over the seat to stop it. She told another story of

following behind Mom in another car, until Mom parked in her driveway and walked toward the house. Lee Ann's dog, Tiny, clinging to the back seat, stared at her through Mom's car's rear window with a forlorn expression that begged for rescue. The car and Tiny slowly rolled down the hill and finally came to stop when they reached the fenced tree line. Another time Mom was spotted going down the wrong side of the four-lane bypass. But miraculously, she was never hurt and never injured anyone else. In fact, she once drove along through Jackson, Tennessee on her way to Paducah, Kentucky. Her family is convinced she must have had a guardian angel riding alongside her.

Mom and I was shopping one day when she groaned, grimaced and fell to the floor. I caught her just in time to prevent her head from hitting the floor. She was rushed to the hospital where a surgeon repaired her hip. She spent a month in a Germantown Baptist Rehabilitation Hospital where she inspired everyone with her tenacity, spirit and infectious smile. After that, I took her home with me where she stayed a few days. When she learned that my husband and I were preparing to move upstairs and give her our only downstairs bedroom, she said no way was she going to be a burden on her family, and besides it was time for her to get back to Iuka where her church and friends were.

After three months, another sister who lives in Memphis took Mom home with her. After living with her and her family for about a year Mom called me one day and asked if I'd come and get her and take her back to her apartment in Iuka. "But Mom, I thought you were happy there."

"I have been, but I'm ready to move back to Iuka."

"But Mom, they have been so nice to you. We'd better think about this for awhile."

"I've already thought about it, and I'm going back to Iuka. That's my home."

"But Mom," I stalled for time to think of a counter argument.

"If you can't take me back, I guess I'll just have to call a taxi."

"Mom, do you know how much a taxi would charge to take you from Memphis to Iuka?"

"I don't care what it costs. I'm going back. Iuka is my home."

A short time later, Mom said she wanted to go live at Tishomingo Manor, where many of her friends already resided. While there she made many new friends, modeled in a fashion show, entertained by joining other residents in singing *Amazing Grace* and other songs and sat for hours in the lobby or on the front porch smiling and greeting guests with her cheerful "Hi. Welcome. How are you? Y'all come back now" statements. But I think she'll be most remembered for her smile and her genuine love for all those she met.

I could go on forever with tale about my Mom, but I won't. I can understand now why my sisters keep telling me to keep my celebratory remarks brief. Mom was such a unique and wonderful woman. But then, all mothers are so special in their own way.

Mom requested that, at her funeral, I read a thank-you letter I'd written to her on her 80th birthday. I did. And now I'd like to dedicate it to all those mothers who give us all so much, and to wish you the

best of everything this Mother's Day and every Mother's Day!

**WILL POWER**  
While nearly everyone regards a will as a legal document that distributes/transfers property after death, it can have other functions. A will may be used to name a guardian for any minor children or to create a trust and designate a trustee to handle an estate on behalf of children or others. A will may also be used to name a personal representative or "executor" to handle a decedent's property and affairs from the time of death until an estate is settled. A person need not have a large estate to have a will. It is sufficient to be a responsible person who would like to see his or her wishes carried out in accordance with personal beliefs after death.

Though some people opt to create their own will, those who feel uneasy about the process, especially when leaving a large amount of assets, should seek the guidance of an attorney. A will is an important legal document. The assistance of a legal professional will help you create a thorough, legally valid will. ### Caring For Eyeglasses


Maintaining eyeglasses in good condition can have benefits both for your vision and your bank account. Here are some hints on how to keep them in tip-top shape.

When you buy eyeglasses on or off the store, both hands and hold them by the temples. Try not to pull the temples outward.

Never lay glasses on a surface with the lens side down. If you do this, you'll be scratching across the surface of the lenses. Instead, lay them on the temples or the frame.

Dirt can easily collect around the rims of eyeglasses. It's easy to remove them with an old toothbrush and warm, soapy water. With plastic lenses, always wash the dirt and grime off BEFORE wiping with paper or cloth.

Despite your good care, your glasses may become crooked or misaligned. You should return them to the proper frame adjustment (or replacement) to avoid discomfort and visual disturbances.

## Tishomingo Co. Archives & History Museum To Celebrate International Museum Day, May 18th

Museums are an important means of cultural exchange, enrichment of cultures and development of mutual understanding, and co-operation and peace among peoples. Collections at the Tishomingo County Archives & History Museum (TCAHM) are humanities collections interpreting the history and culture of Tishomingo County and its surrounding communities. The collection includes an estimated 9,000 three-dimensional artifacts; approximately 10,000 archival documents, ephemera, and newspapers (clippings and full issues); 2,000 photographs; 100 large format items (maps, blueprints, photographs); 50 paper media items (film, video); and 1,500 books. Most of the collection was donated by private individuals, although some was purchased by the Society and others were transferred from the previous museum committee.

The three-dimensional object collection is made up of about 100 pieces of original courthouse equipment, including typewriters, stamp drawers, pedestals, staplers, chairs, desks, eyeglasses, snuff boxes, and other related items. Two historic bookcases house loose court files, and three office desks are also of great interest. The Medical Office includes artifacts related to

medicine pans, test tubes, over 175 old medicine bottles, medical bags, instruments, and other supplies. Being history minded, the Society has also gained donations of school and home memorabilia. Farming tools, household items, school books, pictures, banners, and school desks are among the collection. Newspapers dating between 1888 and 1927 are in house. The museum maintains records on all display items which include donor name, date received, subject and accession number, condition upon receipt, and its history (if applicable).

The John Marshall Stone Research Center's library collection includes photographs from 1836-2006, about 5,000 books, letters, photographs, manuscripts, journals, scrapbooks, and advertisements that relate to local businesses, families, churches and schools, community organizations, political campaigns, and municipal government. The courthouse houses approximately 250 civil and circuit court case records dating back to the early 1900s. TCAHM is dedicated to the preservation of the documentary and cultural heritage of the County. Our mission encompasses archives and records management, history education, and historic preservation. The archival research room has the best government

records to consult for establishing relationships among people, such as census records, County probate records, and County land records. To help identify resources for research, the library has also acquired an extensive amount of microfilm. These microfilm (most of which are original Tishomingo County Records) save researchers the challenge of searching nearby courthouse basements and attics during short trips to our County. Using our microfilm reader and printer, they can take a copy of the original document home with them with little effort or expense.

Visitors to the Museum on May 18th will receive a 10% discount while shopping in the Museum Gift Shop, where we now accept all major credit cards. Additionally, the 100th visitor to the Museum during the month of May, will receive a 3-piece luggage set.

International Museum Day has been celebrated all over the world since 1977. Each year, a theme is decided on by the Advisory Committee. The event provides the opportunity for museum professionals to meet the public and alert them to the challenges that museums face.

The Museum is open Wednesday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and Saturday, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

main area of interest is U.S. Airborne uniforms, equipment, weapons and personal gear; however, I collect many other items from WWII including pieces from foreign countries."

The focus of Mr. Darby's presentation will be on his cousin, 1st Lt. Waverly W. Wray. Wray was the Executive Officer of D Co. 2nd Battalion 505th Parachute Infantry Regiment 82nd Airborne Division. Wray was nominated for the Medal of Honor for actions on June 7, 1944 at Ste. Mere Eglise France. (D-Day plus one) Th award was downgraded to the Distinguished Service Cross, our country's second highest award for bravery. Ronnie will tell his story and through "show and tell" use weapons and equipment as Wray used them on that day.

Wray made four combat jumps, Sicily, Italy, Normandy and Holland. He has been written about in many books, the most recent being written by the late Stephen Ambrose and entitled "Citizen Soldiers" and "The Victors".

Ronnie Darby is married to the former Leigh Coker of Iuka. They have two children, Billie Claire, age 20 and Hunter, age 18. A graduate of the University of Mississippi with a Bachelor's Degree in Public Administration, Ronnie has owned and operated, an Insurance Agency in Batesville, Mississippi for 21 years.

dence, to work on the gas.

If a gas leak is reported and cannot be located on the town side of the meter, the gas will be locked off until it has been repaired by a qualified person at the expense of the customer. After gas has been locked off customer will have to pressure check line before gas can be

unlocked. New services and services that have not been used for an extensive time must be pressure checked before service can be given.

An excess flow valve is available to any customer that would like to purchase one, this is for protection of excess gas flowing through gas lines.
