

I continued my education at Northeast Community College, where I played tennis, and was a member of the highest scholastic honorary society, Phi Theta Kappa. I graduated from Northeast in 1982, and that fall I enrolled at the University of Mississippi. Where, I earned a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting, a Master's Degree in Business, and a Juris Doctorate. I also earned my Certified Public Accountant certificate in 1985. I was a member of Phi Kappa Phi, the highest honorary society at that time, and graduated in the top ten of my law school class. While I was at Ole Miss, I worked for the Alumni House on campus and in maintenance at Oxford Square Apartments. I was admitted to the Mississippi Bar in

1988. I began my career as an attorney in Columbus, Mississippi with Gholson, Hicks and Nichols where I practiced primarily in civil litigation (plaintiff and defense) and governmental law for area municipalities. In 1990, I began as an associate with Webb, McLaurin & O'Neal, in Tupele, working on civil defense cases where the firm specialized in insurance defense. While in Tupelo, my family and I attended First Presbyterian Church, and I served as a Sunday School teacher.




TCHS Smoke Signals by Jenni Nichols

AVOIDING TROUBLE

When you get behind the wheel of a vehicle, you are required to employ a degree of care that an ordinarily careful and prudent person would use under the same conditions. Road conditions must be taken into account when assessing negligence. For instance, consider the situation in which the driver is suddenly confronted with an emergency situation that was not of his or making. consequence, the driver may be compelled to act instantaneously to avoid injuring both him- or herself and the other passengers in the vehicle. In such cases, if an injury or property damage were to occur to a third party, the driver confronted with the emergency situation would not be considered negligent.
