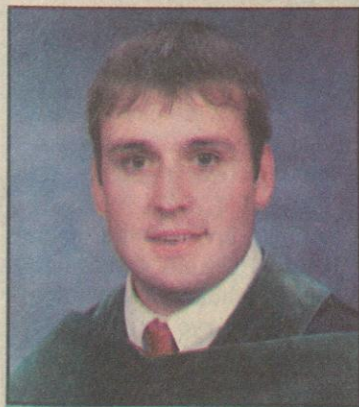
Iuka Resident Pleads Guilty In Federal Court

Two women—one who is an Iuka resident—pleaded guilty to federal charges of aiding and abetting in the possession of methamphetamine with intent to distribute. Candace Turner, 32, of Iuka, along with Amy Butler, 32, of Tiptonville, are scheduled to be sentenced in 45-60 days after their guilty pleas in U.S. district Court, Judge

Michael P. Mills said. A news release stated that their convictions stemmed from a traffic stop made by the Mississippi Highway Patrol in Prentiss County. An officer found marijuana and more than \$2,500 in Butler's purse. Further search of the vehicle turned up methamphetamine hidden in the passenger side door.

Five-Year-Old Goes For Help After 4-Wheeler Accident

A 5-year-old boy walked a quarter to a half mile to get help Friday evening before finding someone home to let them know that he and his grandmother had been involved in a 4-wheeler accident.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff's Deputy Tim Williamson, 52-year-old Connie Bruno of 10 Marina Point, at River Trace near Iuka, had been riding with her 5-year-old grandson, Gerod Lawson of the Memphis, Tenn. area, on her Honda 300 FourTrax 4-wheeler in the River Trace area around

5 p.m. Friday.

It appeared that Bruno had lost control of the all-terrain vehicle, causing it to flip over several times in the roadway. The one-vehicle accident left Bruno unconscious. With his grandmother, lying there in the road, the young child started walking to try and find help.

Deputy Williamson stated that the young boy had to walk approximately a quarter to a half mile before finding someone at home. When he did locate someone, they contacted Tishomingo County 9-1-1 who

sent help immediately to the scene.

Bruno and her grandson were both transported to Iuka Hospital by ambulance. Bruno was flown out by AirEvac due to her severe injuries. Young Lawson was treated at the hospital and released to his parents.

"The little boy was really a hero to have walked so far on his own to get help for his grandmother," Williamson said.

At press-time, no word on Bruno's condition was available.

Early Morning Traffic Stop Leads To Felony Drug Arrest

A drug sting operation being conducted by local lawmen led to the recent arrest of a Corinth man on felony drug charges.

Around 2 a.m. Friday, Tishomingo County South-End Constable Jeff Kemp conducted a routine traffic stop of a 2005 Ford Taurus near Iuka which was occupied by two Corinth residents. After further investigation, the driver of the vehicle, Sheldon Curlee, 26, of 1707 Fraizer Drive, Corinth, was found to be in possession of a considerable amount of cocaine. Also, an undisclosed amount of cash was found on

the suspect and was confiscated.

Curlee was arrested and charged with felony possession of cocaine. Another male passenger in the vehicle was arrested on unrelated misdemeanor charges and was released on bond. Curlee was released on a \$10,000 bond, awaiting his August court date.

Constable Kemp would like to thank Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department Investigator Mike Kemp for his assistance in making the arrests.

Constable Kemp stated that the drug sting is an ongoing operation in which the local of-

ficers hope to have more future arrests in the County's continued war on drugs.

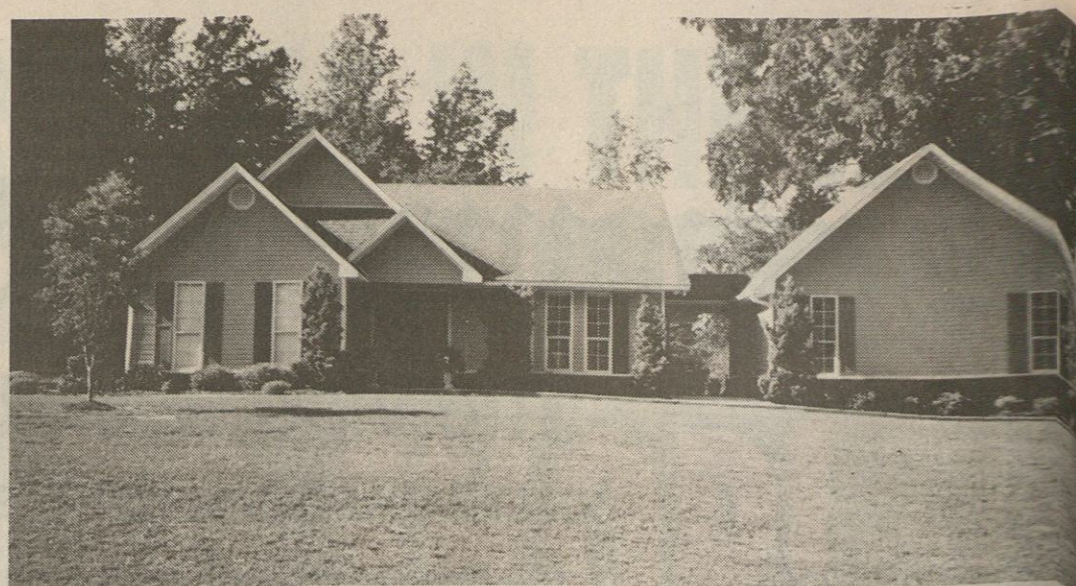

Checking Peripheral Vision

If you're concerned about how good your side (peripheral) vision may be, try this simple experiment. Looking straight ahead of you, fix your line of sight on one particular object in the room. Still looking straight ahead, make a note of all the other surrounding objects in the room that are also visible. If your eyes give you a "full" picture, your side vision may be normal. However, this kind of test is not reliable and may give you a false sense of security. Only through tests made by your eye doctor can you be sure.

Any defective side vision can be hazardous and may also be a sign of advanced stages of glaucoma, an eye disease that can cause blindness if not treated in time. In glaucoma, fluid pressure builds up in the eye, causing serious damage to the delicate structures within the eye. You should have your eye pressure checked at least once a year, especially if you are over forty, are nearsighted, or if there is a history of glaucoma in your family.

INJURED BY A DEFECTIVE PRODUCT?

If you were to be injured by a defective product, the manufacturer and others involved in its sale and distribution could be liable to the injury. Liability may be established if a manufacturer defect in the product caused the injury. In addition, successful product liability case may be conducted on the basis of a design defect in the product that led to injury. Moreover, "inadequate warning" may form the basis of a case. For instance, the product may have been known by the manufacturer to be potentially dangerous yet was still sold without a proper warning to the consumer. If you have suffered injury due to a product defect, consult with an attorney about your right to recovery.

Buyers and users of potentially sue for damages injuries caused by a defective product. If you're been injured or became ill due to a product defect, contact my office to schedule a consultation. RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO FORM THE THREE-COUNTY REGIONAL WATER SUPPLY AND SEWER DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the undersigned understands from reliable expert tests and studies that there are certain areas where water may not be sufficient and predictable quantities of water available to ensure large, potential industrial water users of an adequate sustained quantity of water in large commercial quantities and reasonably assured, extended periods of time considering area's continued population growth, existing industrial development, and the existing water aquifers. Although there is an immediate need for additional large supplies of drinking water, the addition of significant, large industrial water users may create a need for additional drinking water supplies;

WHEREAS, it is therefore useful, necessary, and in the best interest of all the citizens of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Itawamba County, Mississippi, to provide an alternative source of water that would be available in a timely manner, in relatively large quantities, and for sustained, predictable periods of time in order to foster continued growth and continued industrial development, and a continuing adequate water supply for the area for many years to come. It is necessary for the continued health and welfare of the citizens of the area to provide an alternative supply of water;

WHEREAS, furthermore, in order to promote and encourage economic development and the creation of jobs in the region, the undersigned does hereby deem it beneficial and in the best interests of its citizens that adequate and sufficient drinking and waste water services also be planned and developed in conjunction with the alternative water supply to further enhance economic opportunities of this region by making this area of the state more attractive to significant industrial prospects, which would enhance the overall economic health and well being of the area;

WHEREAS, a petition was forwarded to the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District pursuant to Section 11, Mississippi Code of 1972, requesting that the existing district undertake to provide the alternative supply of water to Tishomingo County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Itawamba County, Mississippi and to also plan and develop, in conjunction with the alternative supply of water, adequate and sufficient drinking and waste water services;

WHEREAS, a response to that petition was received from the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District stating that the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District was unable to affirmatively respond to the petition pursuant to

requirements of the statutes;

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of all citizens of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Itawamba County, Mississippi, to form a joint water supply and sewer district for the purpose of constructing the necessary facilities to supply the areas of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Itawamba County, Mississippi, with the alternative source of water along with adequate and efficient sewer and waste water services;

WHEREAS, the laws of the State of Mississippi, in particular, Sections 51-8-63 and 51-8-65, Mississippi Code of 1972, require that any efforts by the parties hereto to form an entity to acquire and assume any powers, duties, and responsibilities of a joint water supply and sewer district are subject to the prior approval by the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality upon such terms and conditions as may be acceptable to the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality after the

required parties officially file a petition or petitions as required by law with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality. Through the parties have been in contact with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality, have informed the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality of the efforts, matters, and things contained herein, have briefed the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality of the reasons and justifications for forming the Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District, an have received a tentative and preliminary, unofficial and non-binding, verbal indication from the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality that it will favorably receive the application for the formation of the entity, subject to applicable law, the final approval and approval of this Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District is subject to a favorable ruling by the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality upon the filing of a proper petition or petitions with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality as required by law. However, the entities herein must approve the formation of the subject Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District, as required by law, before any petition or petitions can be officially filed with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality; and

WHEREAS, the laws of the State of Mississippi require that a public hearing be held on the question of whether the public convenience and necessity requires the creation of such a district and whether the creation of such a district is economically sound and feasible.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi ("Tishomingo County") that is their intent to form a joint water supply and sewer district with the Board of Supervisors of Prentiss County, Mississippi ("Prentiss County") and with the Board of Supervisors of Itawamba County, Mississippi ("Itawamba County") pursuant to Section 51-8-1, et. seq. Miss. Code of 1972 as follows:

The name of the newly created water supply and sewer district shall be the Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District ("Three-County District"). The geographic boundary of said newly created water supply and sewer district shall be the geographic boundaries of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Itawamba County, Mississippi. The function of the Three-County District will be to take all actions necessary to construct, erect, maintain, and operate facilities which would provide a source of water along with sewer and waste water services to the geographic areas served and to enter into all cooperatives, agreements, contracts, and other legally binding obligations with any and all other governmental agencies, firms or corporations in order to effectuate the construction, maintenance, and operation of such facilities.

The powers of the Three-County District shall be fixed and exercised by a Board of Commissioners consisting of six (6) voting members. Said voting members shall consist of the following appointees and who otherwise meet the requirements of Section 51-8-25, Miss. Code of 1972, as now enacted or hereafter amended, and other applicable law:

a. Two (2) members appointed by Tishomingo County who shall each be a resident citizen in said county wherein one (1) of said appointees shall, by virtue of his office, be the same person as Tishomingo County's representative and appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District and wherein the other appointee shall be some qualified person selected and appointed by said county, two (2) members appointed by Prentiss County who shall each be a resident citizen in said county wherein one (1) of said appointees shall, by virtue of his office, be the same person as Prentiss County's representative and appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District and wherein the other appointee shall be some qualified person selected and appointed by said county, and two (2) members appointed by Itawamba County who shall each be a resident citizen in said county wherein one (1) of said appointees shall, by virtue of his office, be the same person as Itawamba County's representative and appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District and wherein the other appointee shall be some qualified person selected and appointed by said county;

b. As to the initial term of office regarding each county's appointee to the Board of Commissioners of the Three-County District and who is said appointee by virtue of his appointment by such county to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District, the initial term of such three (3) members shall be for the duration of that person's term of appointment by said county to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District but in no event to exceed the maximum term of office of five (5) years as prescribed in the applicable joint water management districts' statutes being Section 51-8-21, Miss. Code of 1972. Thereafter, the term for each of said three (3) members shall be for a term of four (4) years or until his successor is named and for so long as said person is that respective county's appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District but in no event to exceed the maximum term of office of five (5) years as prescribed in the applicable joint water management districts' statutes being Section 51-8-21, Miss. Code of 1972. It is the intention herein that in the event that the county's representative to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District serves continuously for more than five (5) years that said person's tenure on the Board of Commissioners of the Three-County District shall cease and terminate, and the said county shall take appropriate steps, as soon as practicable, to appoint a person to fill this position who likewise must be the county's appointee to the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District. Furthermore, it is the intention herein that when said county appointee's term of office with Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District terminates and said person is not successively and without interruption reappointed to the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District board, said

person's term as a member of Three-County District's Board of Commissioners shall likewise terminate. Furthermore, it is the intention herein that each county shall coordinate, to the extent practicable and to the extent allowed by law, the term of said county's appointment to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District as set forth in Section 51-13-105, Miss. Code of 1972, in and for such a term and manner so as to not exceed the statutory maximum term of office of the county's appointment to the board of the Three-County District's Board of Commissioners as set forth in Section 51-8-21, Miss. Code of 1972. Nothing herein shall preclude each respective county, if it so desires, from reappointing the same person to the Board of Commissioners of the Three-County District provided said person is likewise the county's appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District;

c. The initial term of office of the remaining three (3) members of the board of the Three-County District's Board of Commissioners appointed collectively by Tishomingo County, Prentiss County, and Itawamba County shall be determined by random drawing in staggered terms with one (1) member serving a five (5) year term, one (1) member serving a four (4) year term, and one (1) member serving a three (3) year term. Thereafter, all terms shall be for five (5) years for any such members appointed by Tishomingo County, Prentiss County, and Itawamba County to any of these three (3) board positions.

d. In addition to the aforesaid voting members which constitute the Board of Commissioners, the Board of Commissioners shall be, and hereby is, authorized and allowed to appoint one or more persons or representatives to an unofficial, non-voting advisory board as the Board of Commissioners may deem appropriate in the best interests of the Three-County District.

5. The Board of Commissioners shall be responsible for the operation and management of the Three-County District, and it shall be their exclusive authority and they shall be empowered to do all acts necessary, proper, or convenient in the exercise of the powers granted by applicable law to such district, including but not limited to, the power and authority to apply for necessary permits or any other necessary approvals from applicable federal, state, or local agencies or governmental authorities, the power and authority to acquire, construct, reconstruct, improve, better, extend, consolidate, maintain and operate facilities and to contract with any municipality, person, firm, or corporation for services and for a supply and distribution of water, for collection, transportation, treatment and/or disposal of sewage, and for services required incident to the operation and maintenance of such systems, and in addition to other powers, the Three-County District hereby created and acting through its Board of Commissioners shall have, among others, the powers to:

a. To sue and be sued;

b. To acquire by purchase, gift, devise, lease or any other mode of acquisition, and to hold or dispose of, real and personal property of every kind within or without the district;

c. To make and enter into contracts, conveyances, mortgages, deeds of trust, bonds, leases or contracts for financial advisory services;

d. To incur debts, to borrow money, to issue negotiable bonds pursuant to Section 51-8-35 (1), Miss. Code of 1972, and to provide for the rights of the holders thereof as provided therein;

e. To fix, maintain, collect and revise rates and charges for services rendered by or through the facilities of such district, which rates and charges shall not be subject to review or regulation by the Mississippi Public Service Commission except in those instances where a city operating similar services would be subject to regulation and review; however, said district shall obtain a certificate of convenience and necessity from the Mississippi Public Service Commission for operating water and/or sewer systems;

f. To pledge all or any part of its revenues to the payment of its obligations and to exercise all powers authorized pursuant to Section 51-8-47, Miss. Code of 1972;

g. To make such covenants in connection with the issuance of bonds or to secure the payment of bonds that a private business corporation can make under the general laws of the state;

h. To use any right-of-way, public right-of-way, easement, or other similar property or property rights necessary or convenient in connection with the acquisition, improvement, operation or maintenance of the facilities of such district held by the state or any political subdivision thereof which shall or may consent to such use;

i. To enter into agreements with state and federal agencies for loans, grants, grants-in-aid, and other forms of assistance, including, but not limited to, participation in the sale and purchase of bonds and those agreements authorized pursuant to Section 51-8-55, Miss. Code of 1972;

j. To acquire by purchase, lease, gift, or otherwise, any existing works and facilities providing services for which it was created, and any lands, rights, easements, franchises and other property, real and personal, necessary to the completion and operation of such system upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon, and, if necessary as part of the acquisition price, to assume the payment of outstanding notes, bonds or other obligations upon such system; however, if any corporate agency owning such facilities desires to continue providing such services, the corporate agency shall so notify the district not later than ninety (90) days after the effective date of the creation of the district, and the district shall thereupon relinquish its right to provide such services until and unless the corporate agency elects otherwise or fails to adequately provide such services;

k. To extend its services to areas beyond but within one (1) mile of the boundaries of such district; however, no such extension shall be made to areas already occupied by another corporate agency rendering the same service so long as such corporate agency desires to continue to serve such areas. Areas outside of the district

desiring to be served which are beyond the one-mile limit must be brought into the district by annexation proceedings. Provided, however, the district's board shall first consider and give preference to the needs of the member counties before agreeing to provide services to any area outside of the district;

l. To be deemed to have the same status as counties and municipalities with respect to payment of sales taxes on purchases made by such districts;

m. To borrow funds for interim financing subject to receipt of funds as outlined in Section 51-8-35;

n. To choose a location within the district as the central office of the district;

o. To adopt a plan for management of the water resources of the district, provided that such plan first be submitted to and approved by the Commission on Natural Resources, now the Commission on Environmental Quality, as consistent with the state water management plan or objectives;

p. To hire such personnel and contract for such legal, technical, or other services as the board of commissioners deems necessary for the operation of the district and fulfillment of its water management objectives;

q. To secure connection to or participation in the services provided by the district, including the power to obtain mandatory or prohibitory injunctive relief; provided, however, that the authority of the board of commissioners shall not be exercised in conflict with the regulatory and enforcement authority of the Commission on Natural Resources, now the Commission on Environmental Quality;

r. To acquire by condemnation all property of any kind, real, personal, or mixed, or any interest therein, within or without the boundaries of the district, necessary for the projects and the exercise of the powers, rights, privileges, and functions conferred upon the district, according to the procedure provided by law for the condemnation of lands or other property taken for rights-of-way or other purposes. This power of eminent domain to acquire any such property

including, but not limited to, lands, rights, rights-of-way, easements, and other property, real or personal or mixed, as may be appropriate wherever and whenever public necessity and convenience so requires is hereby authorized, given to, and vested in said Board of Commissioners of the Three-County District under the option as provided in Section 51-8-33, Miss. Code of 1972. If the power of eminent domain is exercised by the Three-County District and in the name of the Three-County District, it shall be exercised in the manner provided by Sections 11-27-1 through 11-27-51, Miss. Code of 1972, as now enacted or hereafter amended; and

s. To provide such water and/or sewer and related services at such price or charge as may be determined by the board. However, so that no area of the district will receive any preferential treatment, the price or charge for such water and/or sewer and related services shall be the same to all areas of the district. Should the district receive funds, grants, loans, subsidies, or any other similar payments with respect to the providing of such water and/or sewer and related services, the district shall make its best reasonable efforts to apply such in a manner which will decrease the price or charge of such services with it being the intent that the price or charge for such services shall be the same to all areas of the district.

6. In addition, the Board of Commissioners of the Three-County District shall have the power to adopt, promulgate, modify, and repeal such rules and regulations as it may deem appropriate for the management and operation of said district so long as said rules and regulations comply with the laws of the State of Mississippi.

7. The governing bodies of each of the local governmental units of Tishomingo County, Prentiss County, and Itawamba County shall have the separate authority to levy a special tax pursuant to Section 51-8-43, Miss. Code of 1972.

8. Any references herein to any provision(s) of the Mississippi Code of 1972 shall be construed to mean as said provision is now enacted or is hereafter amended; and

9. If any part of the powers or provisions herein is held to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, all other powers and provisions herein, not inconsistent therewith, shall remain in full force and effect.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, adopts this resolution declaring the intent set out above to form the water supply and sewer district and do hereby set the Board Room at the 1008 Battleground Drive, Iuka, Mississippi, at 10 a.m. o'clock, on the 3rd day of July, 2006, as the time and place for a public hearing as to the question of public convenience and necessity and economic feasibility for the forming of such a district and the Clerk is hereby directed to

publish a legal notice of such public hearing pursuant to law.

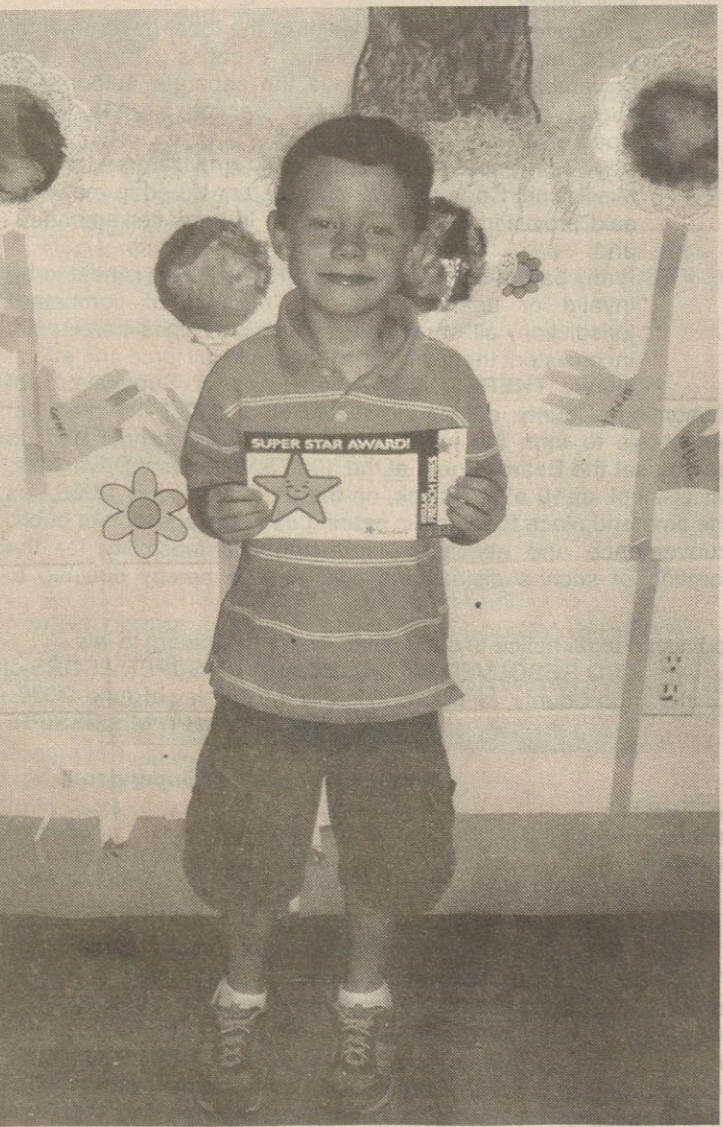
PTA Rewards IES Students With Annual ARC Carnival

Students were awarded tickets based on reading performance throughout this year. The carnival was complete with games, face painting, moonwalk, dunking booth, prizes and refreshments.

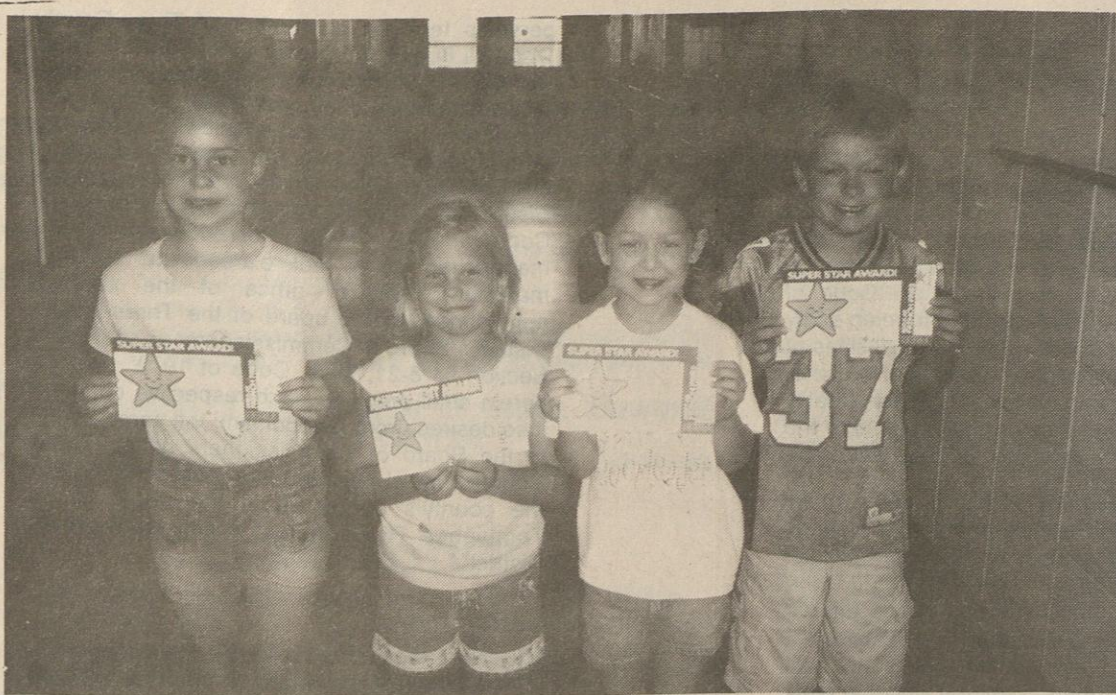

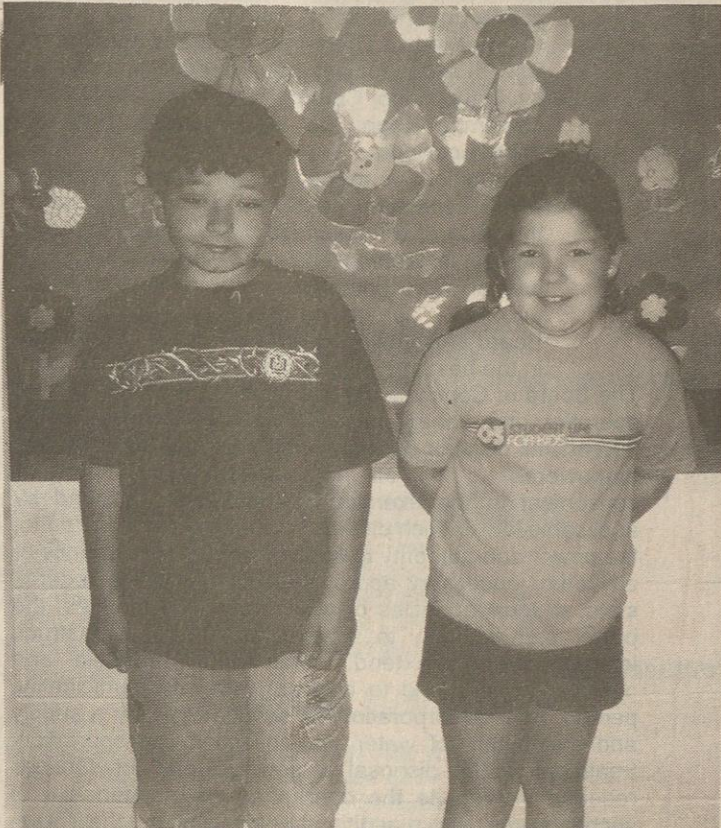

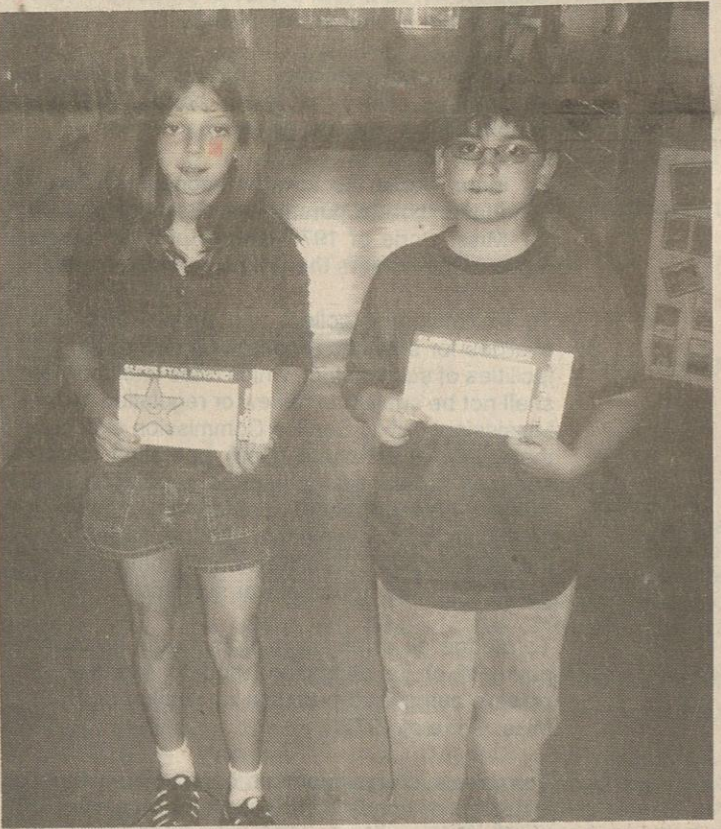
