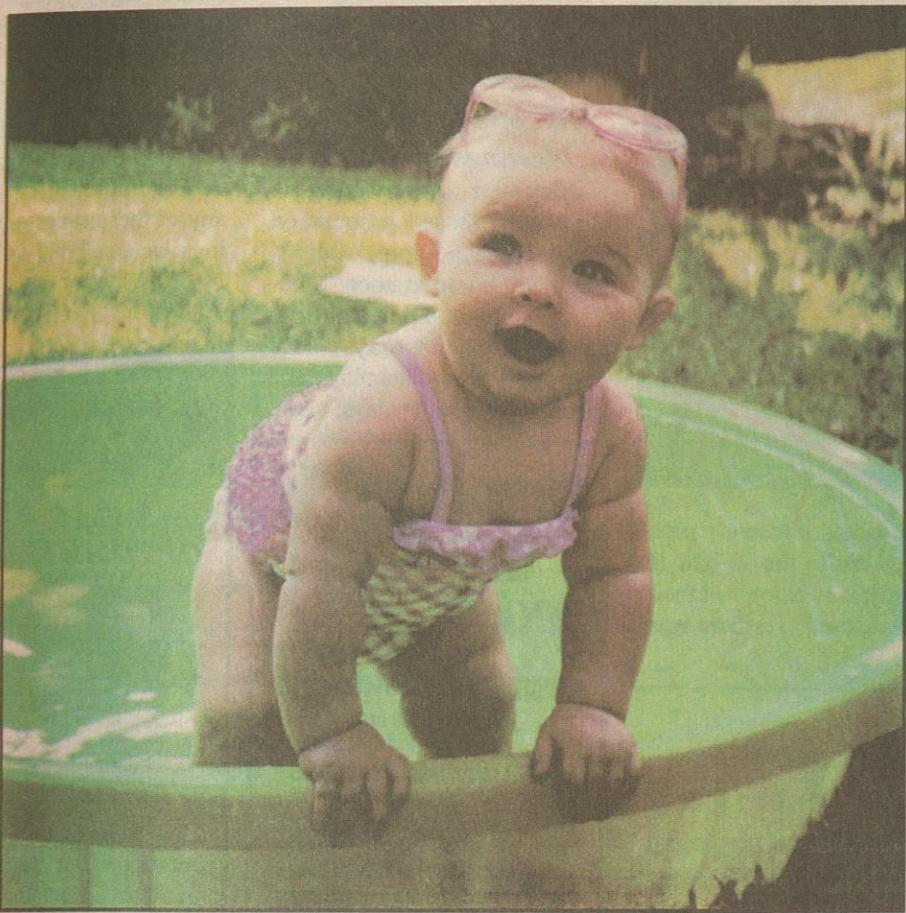

## Shooting-Suicide At Iuka Home Still Under Investigation

### Retired LAPD Officer Shoots Pastor

A 9-1-1 call just after noon Thursday, June 22, led authorities to a Tishomingo County residence where a local minister was suffering from gunshot wounds and the shooter was dead from an apparent suicide.

The 9-1-1 call came from a female teen at 205 County Road 176 (in the Woodall Mountain area.)

According to Tishomingo County Investigator Jamie Reynolds, when authorities arrived at the scene, they found Kim Leonard, 54, who serves as minister of adult education at Iuka Baptist Church, in the home's office room, suffering from two gunshot wounds—one to the arm and one to the back.

The officers were told that the shooter, a former resident of the home, James "Jay" Bryan, 56, had gone around behind the house. When the officers went to the rear of the house, they found Bryan, next to a tree, where he had apparently shot himself once in the chest with a handgun.

Investigator Reynolds said that events leading up to the incident are still under investigation by the Sheriff's Department and also by Greg Box of the Mississippi Bureau of Investigation. At this time, only a limited amount of information can be released.

"Right now, we are releasing that an aggravated assault and suicide occurred at the residence," Reynolds said.

No specific details were available, but apparently Bryan and his wife Denise had divorced recently and Bryan was living in Vero Beach, Fla. with a sister. Denise Bryan and her daughter and son were in the process of moving out of the County Rd. 176 home they had previously shared with Bryan.

Kim Leonard was reportedly at the residence Thursday helping Denise and the children to pack boxes for the move.

While Denise Bryan had gone into town to get more boxes, Mr. Leonard remained at the residence with the children. It was at this time that Bryan showed up at the residence, according to reports.

One report stated that Bryan had traveled to Iuka for visitation with his children during the upcoming weekend.

While authorities have not released details as to what went on when Bryan entered the residence, something transpired between the men that led Bryan to shoot Leonard with a .40 caliber handgun.

After this, it appears that Bryan went into the backyard of the residence where he placed a .45 caliber Glock handgun to his chest and pulled the trigger. A .22 caliber revolver was also found near Bryan; however, this gun had not been used, according to authorities. Denise Bryan arrived back at the residence after the incident had taken place, according to authorities.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, he was called to the scene at approximately 2 p.m. where he found Bryan next to a tree in the backyard of the residence, dead of an apparent self-inflicted gunshot wound to the chest. Coroner Wilemon said an autopsy confirmed that the death was from a contact gunshot wound.

Leonard was transported to Iuka Hospital from the scene by ambulance and was then airlifted to North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo where he was recovering from the gunshot wounds at press-time.

Kim Leonard, along with his wife and children, came to Iuka in 2004 when he was employed as minister of adult education at Iuka Baptist Church. According to a bio of Leonard, prior to becoming a minister, he was a police officer in Florida.

Jay Bryan moved here to Tishomingo County with his wife, daughter and son, during the late 1990's, according to friends, after retiring from the Los Angeles Police Force. While an officer with the LAPD, he had worked to bring down the violent, radical Symbionese Liberation Army which kidnapped Patty Hearst in the 1970's.

While Jay Bryan was a rookie cop with the LAPD, he narrowly escaped being blown up by a pipe bomb which was reportedly placed under his patrol car by members of the SLA. The bomb did not detonate because of the severe angle which Bryan pulled out from the parking lot.

Among those who placed the bomb, and is associated with several other violent crimes of the SLA, was Sara Jane Olson. Olsen was wanted and eluded capture by the FBI for more than 20 years. She was located living a suburban, soccer mom-life in June of 1999 in St. Paul, Minnesota. Other than Patty Hearst, Bryan, according to a report from Court TV, was the only eyewitness able to identify Olson in connection with the bombing. Bryan had told friends that he had been placed in a witness protection program in connection with the incident since he was a potential witness in any court proceedings associated with the case. Olsen went to court in October of 2001 and pled guilty.

### Over \$1,000 Worth Of Stolen Goods Recovered By Belmont PD

Belmont Police Officers have recovered over \$1,000 worth of stolen merchandise and arrested one in connection with a recent storage unit theft.

According to Belmont Police Chief Donald Reno, two rental units in Belmont had been burglarized during the last six months with between \$5,000 - \$7,000 worth of merchandise being taken. On June 15, between \$1,000 - \$1,500 worth of that merchandise was recovered by officers and one

Belmont woman was arrested.

Chief Reno, along with Belmont Officers Donald Thomas and Lindsey Timbes, acting on a permission to search, went to Bear Creek Apartments around 9 a.m. where they located several items taken from the storage units.

A 39-year-old female was arrested at the residence; however, the investigation is ongoing and other arrests are expected in the case, according to Chief Reno.

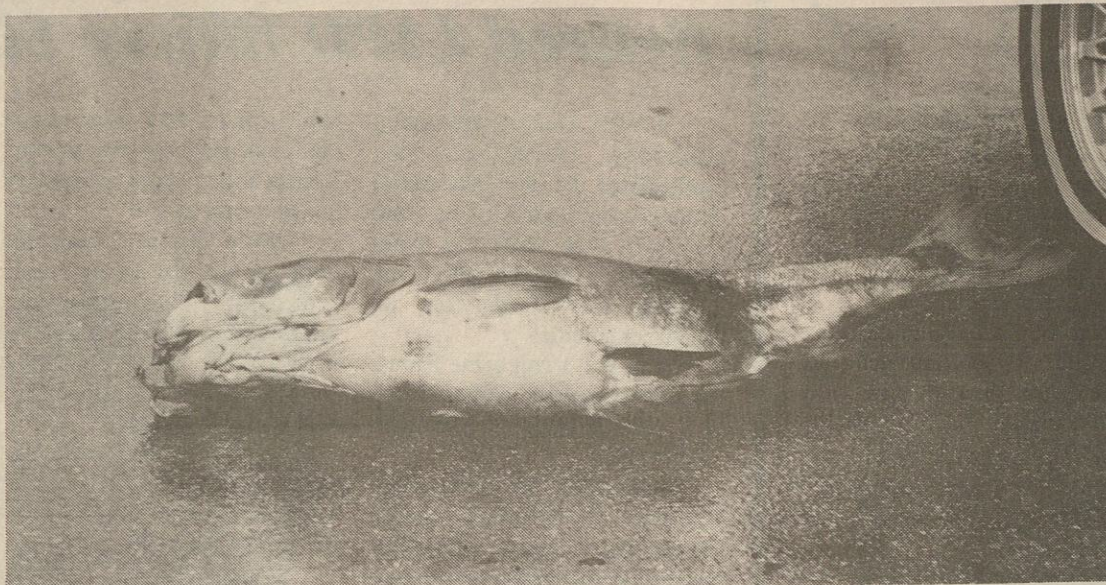

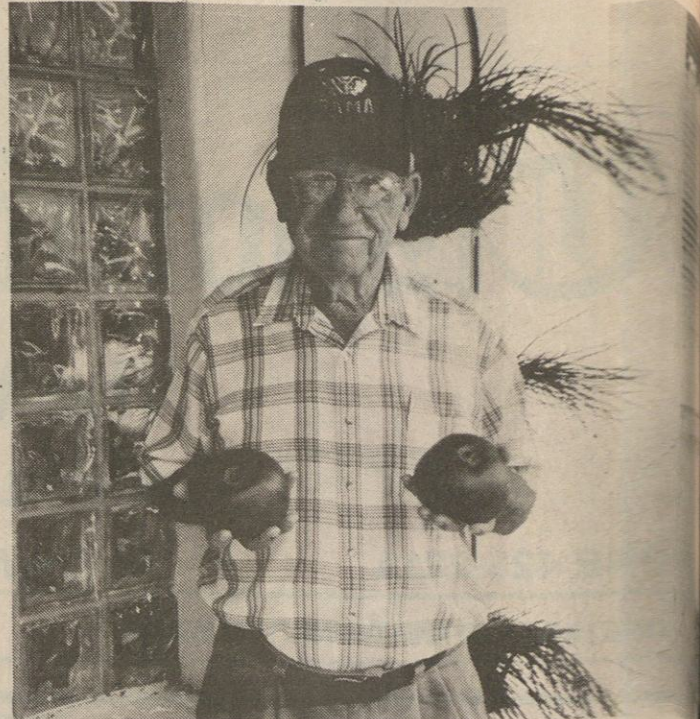
## Local Student In MSU Cooperative Education Program

### DAMAGED REPUTATIONS

If you are defamed by spoken or written words that negatively and falsely damage your reputation, you may seek both actual damages (to recover the harm you have suffered) and punitive damages. The latter punishes the person who made the remark, in an effort to discourage others from doing likewise. "Slander" is the term for a spoken defamation while "libel" is written defamation. In order to prove defamation, the defamed party has to be able to prove that what was said or written about him or her was false. A defamatory action may be brought if the comments are so reprehensible and false that they affect the defamed person's reputation in the community or cast aspersions on him or her.

If you believe you have been a victim of defamation, it is best to see a legal professional versed in this area of the law. You may have legal questions, need advice and representation. For additional information about slander and libel, or to schedule a consultation, call my office. Cases involving personal injury, criminal law and social security are my specialty.

HINT: Insults are generally considered to be outbursts of emotion rather than defamatory remarks.

### Lens Must Be Perfect

The two requirements for a lens are, 1, that it be transparent, and 2, that it is capable of bending - refracting - rays in a predetermined way. It could be defined, be of any material, and made of a variety of materials. For instance, you could undo the shape of a piece of clear plastic that it would act as a lens.

However, ice would be very good for permanent vision correction. No, that, more durable materials are needed. Today's choice is between glass, plastic, both excellent in their own way.

Whichever material is used, it must be manufactured totally free of tiny air bubbles, striations and distortions. It requires very exacting techniques and quality control. That's why many "slightly" imperfect lenses. Unfortunately, some of these reject lenses as "bargain lenses" offered to the public.

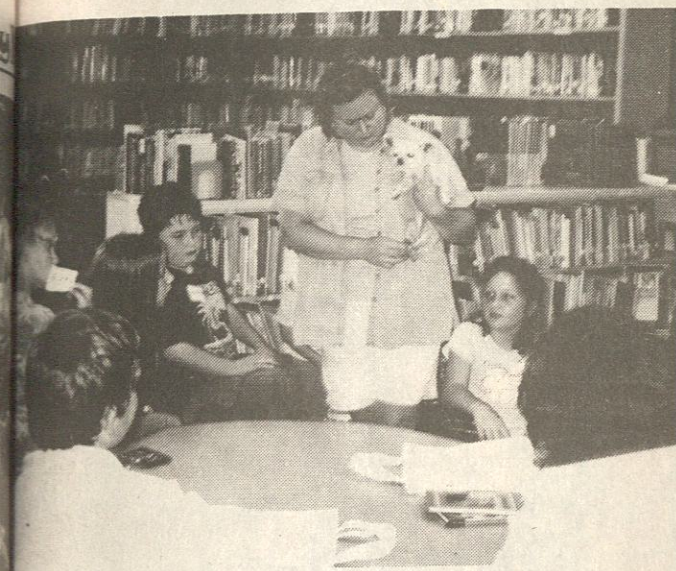

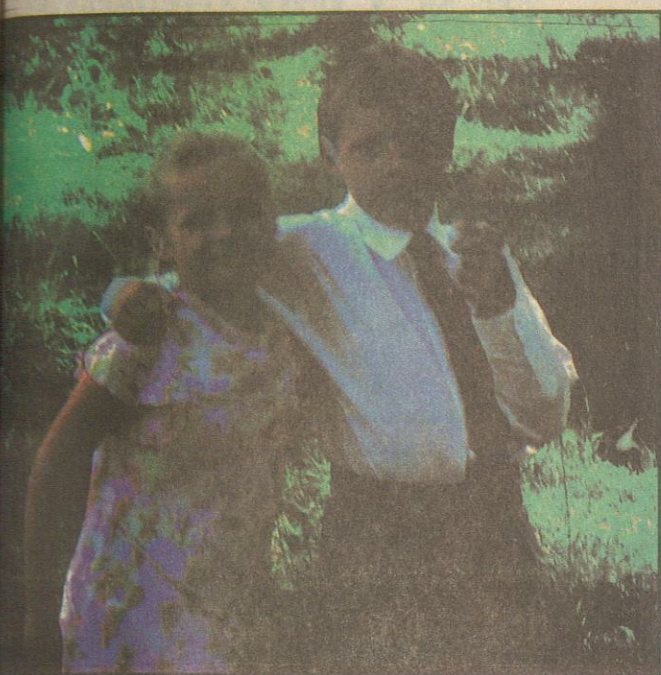

## NEMCC Announces 2007 Spring Break Trip

August 31st is the deadline for registration for Northeast Mississippi Community College's March 12-26 Washington, D.C. and Williamsburg spring break trip.

Led by retired Northeast art instructor Marty McLendon of Corinth, the program includes round trip airfare from Memphis and four overnight stays in secure, nationally recognized hotels. Continental breakfasts will be provided along with a dinner meal daily. Services of a tour director is included.

Participants will arrive in the world's first planned capital city, Washington, D.C., on day one which will include a trip to the Smithsonian museums and Washington by night.

Guided sightseeing of Washington on day 2 will include Arlington National Cemetery, JFK's gravesite and the changing of the guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Next, a visit to the United States Marine Corps War Memorial and a photo stop at the White House and a viewing of the Washington Monument. Then participants will travel through

the Virginia countryside to Mount Vernon, the home of President George Washington. Evening activities may include a ghost tour of haunted homes in Alexandria.

Day 3 will include visits to the U.S. Capitol, the National Archives, the Supreme Court, Ford's Theater and Petersen House. Then tourists will travel on to Williamsburg, where "you will walk through the streets of colonial times in this authentically recreated 18th century village," McLendon said.

Day 4 will include guided sightseeing of Williamsburg and Jamestown with an optional excursion to Busch Gardens. Day 5 will include free time in Washington for visitors to explore the capital city on their own before the return home.
