### Iuka's Adam Gray Awarded Doctor Of Optometry Degree from Southern College of Optometry

Phillip Adam Gray, O.D., of Iuka, MS, was among 117 students recently awarded the Doctor of Optometry degree from Southern College of Optometry (SCO) in Memphis.

Dr. Gray earned a Bachelor's Degree in Microbiology from Mississippi State University. A 1998 graduate of Tishomingo County High School, Adam is the son of Dr. Phillip and Margaret Gray, also of Iuka.

The senior Dr. Gray, a 1978 Southern College of Optometry graduate, had the pleasure of

presenting his son's diploma during the commencement exercises, and he will also have the pleasure of working with Adam. The young Dr. Gray will join his father in the Iuka and Belmont offices. The Grays' will also open a new optometry office in Baldwin, MS.

## Tishomingo Countians Looking Forward To Construction Of New Pickwick Pines Marina

Boaters, full-time residents of Tishomingo County, local businesses and visitors to the lake are eagerly anticipating the beginning of construction of the proposed Pickwick Pines Marina.

The marina will be able to be accessed from Hwy. 25 N., just a short distance from the Mississippi/Tennessee line. It will include a 228-slip marina which will sit on a Yellow Creek tributary of the Tennessee River. In addition to the marina, the project will include a lake-view restaurant, a ships store, fuel dock, dry stack boat storage building, rental villas, pump-out facilities, offices and parking for all facilities.

#### Good For Local Economy

This venture, being undertaken by Pickwick Pines Resort owner David McMeans, will give a boost to Tishomingo County's economy by bringing in jobs and tourism dollars. It will also give local residents a destination within their own county to take a mini vacation near home. With the high price of gasoline, this is beginning to be a popular option for travelers.

According to Tishomingo County Development Foundation Executive Director Gary Matthews, "with the loss of manufacturing jobs to Mexico,

China and other low wage countries, rural communities [including our county] are seeking alternative ways to create jobs. Tourism, outdoor recreation and retiree attraction are well documented as successful job creation activities."

"Tourists and other visitors spend money in Tishomingo County and benefit existing businesses and encourage the creation of other new businesses," Matthews stated.

#### Opens Up Space For Boaters

The marina is also good news for boaters. There is an increased need for larger boat slips on Pickwick Lake. This is due to more people getting involved with boating. Existing marinas in the Pickwick area are at or near full capacity. This new marina will be a state-of-the-art facility with all the amenities.

According to Pickwick Pines Marina General Manager Rodney Lucas, "Pickwick is quickly becoming known as an ideal place to retire, especially for boaters from The Great Lakes and the Upper Mississippi River regions, and more recently from boaters along the coastal states due to the threat of hurricanes."

"The people of Tishomingo County deserve to experience the positive impact from Pickwick

that Hardin County Tennessee has enjoyed for years," Lucas said. "We look forward to the day Pickwick Lake will be a 12-month a year business, as opposed to the six months we currently enjoy."

#### TVA Shows Support For Project

Pickwick Pines Marina project has already received initial support from the Tennessee Valley Authority through its follow-up draft environmental assessment. The report concluded that there will be little, if any adverse environmental impact, while the project will bring significant economic advantages to the area over time. Comments will be taken by TVA on the draft, which can be viewed at the agency's website—[www.tva.gov](http://www.tva.gov)—until this Friday, July 14. Along with TVA, the project must also gain final approval from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality.

One group of landowners, many of whom do not live on their property except during the summer season, are objecting to the marina, stating that it will cause boat congestion in the area and raise safety issues. They have submitted letters of

objection to TVA and to the Corps. While this group does not want the marina, an informal survey of several year-round Tishomingo County natives shows great support for the project. A group of over 320 people gathered at the project site on July 3 as a show of support at a Pickwick Pines function which was open to the public celebrating Independence Day.

"We appreciate the concerns of some of the homeowners near the marina," Matthews stated. "The developer, TVA and the Corps have worked hard and long over the past six years to try to address some of those concerns. We believe that legitimate concerns have been addressed and that Pickwick Lake homeowners will be pleased with the results."

Matthews went on to say that Pickwick Pines Resort was honored last year as one of the finest retirement and vacation developments in the South and this same attention to quality, design and construction will be used with Pickwick Pines Marina.

"We believe that Pickwick Pines Marina will be a development that Tishomingo County can be proud of," Matthews said.

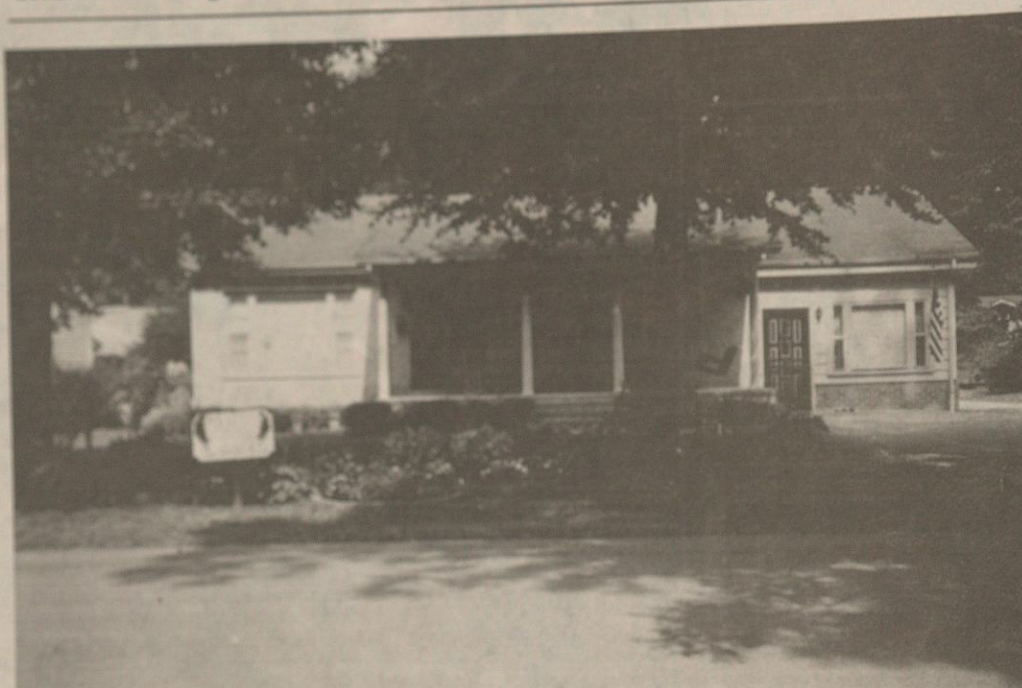


## Class Of 1951 Celebration

## Contact To Eyeglass Wear

Though it's usually not a good idea to retreat to your eyeglasses once you've been fitted for and have adjusted to contact lenses, there are times when you may want to - and when it makes sense. You may want to slip on your glasses first thing in the morning, before you've gotten yourself together; or late at night, after your contacts have been removed. Certainly you would be happy to have a pair of eyeglasses handy (with current prescription) should you lose a contact lens.

With soft contacts, other than the normal distortions from eyeglasses, it is very easy to interchange contacts and spectacles without any visual disturbances. Hard contacts pose a problem. After removing hard lenses, most people have difficulty seeing with glasses. This may last an hour or so. Also, your vision with glasses will vary depending on the time of day you wear them, and how long the contacts were in your eyes.

## RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO FORM THE THREE-COUNTY REGIONAL WATER SUPPLY AND SEWER DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the undersigned understands from reliable expert tests and studies that there are certain areas where there may not be sufficient and predictable quantities of water available to ensure large, potential industrial water users of an adequate and sustained quantity of water in large commercial quantities and for reasonably assured, extended periods of time considering the area's continued population growth, existing industrial development, and the existing water aquifers. Although there is no immediate need for additional large supplies of drinking water, the addition of significant, large industrial water users may create the need for additional drinking water supplies;

WHEREAS, it is therefore useful, necessary, and in the best interest of all the citizens of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Itawamba County, Mississippi to provide an alternative source of water that would be available in a timely manner, in relatively large quantities, and for sustained and predictable periods of time in order to foster continued growth, continued industrial development, and a continuing adequate water supply for the area for many years to come. It is necessary for the continued health and welfare of the citizens of the area to provide an alternative supply of water;

WHEREAS, furthermore, in order to promote and encourage economic development and the creation of jobs in this region, the undersigned does hereby deem it beneficial and in the best interests of its citizens that adequate and sufficient sewer and waste water services also be planned and developed in conjunction with the alternative water supply to further enhance the economic opportunities of this region by making this area of the state more attractive to significant industrial prospects, which would enhance the overall economic health and well being of this area;

WHEREAS, a petition was forwarded to the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District pursuant to Section 51-8-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, requesting that the existing district undertake to provide the alternative supply of water to Tishomingo County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Itawamba County, Mississippi and to also plan and develop, in conjunction with the alternative supply of water, adequate and sufficient sewer and waste water services;

WHEREAS, a response to that petition was received from the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District stating that the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District was unable to affirmatively respond to the petition pursuant to the requirements of the statutes;

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of all citizens of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Itawamba County, Mississippi to form a joint water supply and sewer district for the purpose of constructing the necessary facilities to supply the areas of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Itawamba County, Mississippi with the alternative source of water along with adequate and sufficient sewer and waste water services;

WHEREAS, the laws of the State of Mississippi, in particular, Sections 51-8-63 and 51-8-65, Mississippi Code of 1972, require that any efforts by the parties hereto to form an entity to acquire and assume any powers, duties, and responsibilities of a joint water supply and sewer district are subject to the prior approval by the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality and upon such terms and conditions as may be acceptable to the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality after the required parties officially file a petition or petitions as required by law with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality. Although the parties have been in contact with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality, have informed the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality of the efforts, matters, and things contained herein, have briefed the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality of the reasons and justifications for forming the Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District, an have received a tentative and preliminary, but unofficial and non-binding, verbal indication from the appropriate personnel with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality that it will favorably receive the application for the formation of the entity, subject to applicable law, the final formation and approval of this Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District is subject to a favorable ruling by the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality upon the filing of a proper petition or petitions with the

Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality as required by law. However, the entities herein must approve the formation of the subject Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District, as required by law, before any petition or petitions can be officially filed with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality; and

WHEREAS, the laws of the State of Mississippi require that a public hearing be held on the question of whether the public convenience and necessity requires the creation of such a district and whether the creation of such a district is economically sound and feasible.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi ("Tishomingo County") that is their intent to form a joint water supply and sewer district with the Board of Supervisors of Prentiss County, Mississippi ("Prentiss County") and with the Board of Supervisors of Itawamba County, Mississippi ("Itawamba County") pursuant to Section 51-8-1, et. seq. Miss. Code of 1972 as follows:

1. The name of the newly created water supply and sewer district shall be the Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District ("Three-County District").
2. The geographic boundary of said newly created water supply and sewer district shall be the geographic boundaries of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Itawamba County, Mississippi.
3. The function of the Three-County District will be to take all actions necessary to construct, erect, maintain, and operate facilities which would provide a source of water along with sewer and waste water services to the geographic areas served and to enter into all cooperatives, agreements, contracts, and other legally binding obligations with any and all other governmental agencies, firms or corporations in order to effectuate the construction, maintenance, and operation of such facilities.
4. The powers of the Three-County District shall be fixed and exercised by a Board of Commissioners consisting of six (6) voting members. Said voting members shall consist of the following appointees and who otherwise meet the requirements of Section 51-8-25, Miss. Code of 1972, as now enacted or hereafter amended, and other applicable law:

a. Two (2) members appointed by Tishomingo County who shall each be a resident citizen in said county wherein one (1) of said appointees shall, by virtue of his office, be the same person as Tishomingo County's representative and appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District and wherein the other appointee shall be some qualified person selected and appointed by said county, two (2) members appointed by Prentiss County who shall each be a resident citizen in said county wherein one (1) of said appointees shall, by virtue of his office, be the same person as Prentiss County's representative and appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District and wherein the other appointee shall be some qualified person selected and appointed by said county, and two (2) members appointed by Itawamba County who shall each be a resident citizen in said county wherein one (1) of said appointees shall, by virtue of his office, be the same person as Itawamba County's representative and appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District and wherein the other appointee shall be some qualified person selected and appointed by said county;

b. As to the initial term of office regarding each county's appointee to the Board of Commissioners of the Three-County District and who is said appointee by virtue of his appointment by such county to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District, the initial term of such three (3) members shall be for the duration of that person's term of appointment by said county to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District but in no event to exceed the maximum term of office of five (5) years as prescribed in the applicable joint water management districts' statutes being Section 51-8-21, Miss. Code of 1972. Thereafter, the term for each of said three (3) members shall be for a term of four (4) years or until his successor is named and for so long as said person is that respective county's appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District but in no event to exceed the maximum term of office of five (5) years as prescribed in the applicable joint water management districts' statutes being Section 51-8-21, Miss. Code of 1972. It is the intention herein that in the event that the county's representative to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District serves continuously for more than five (5) years that said person's tenure on the Board of Commissioners of the Three-County District shall cease and terminate, and the said county shall take appropriate steps, as soon as practicable, to appoint a person to fill this position who likewise must be the county's appointee to the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District. Furthermore, it is the intention herein that when said county appointee's term of office with Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District terminates and said person is not successively and without interruption reappointed to the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District board, said person's term as a member of Three-County District's Board of Commissioners shall likewise terminate. Furthermore, it is the intention herein that each county shall coordinate, to the extent practicable and to the extent allowed by law, the term of said county's appointment to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District as set forth in Section 51-13-105, Miss. Code of 1972, in and for such a term and manner so as to not exceed the statutory maximum term of office of the county's appointment to the board of the Three-County District's Board of Commissioners as set forth in Section 51-8-21, Miss. Code of 1972. Nothing herein shall preclude each respective county, if it so desires, from reappointing the same person to the Board of Commissioners of the Three-County District provided said person is likewise the county's appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District;

c. The initial term of office of the remaining three (3) members of the board of the Three-County District's Board of Commissioners appointed collectively by Tishomingo County, Prentiss County, and Itawamba County shall be determined by random drawing in staggered terms with one (1) member serving a five (5) year term, one (1) member serving a four (4) year term, and one (1) member serving a three (3) year term. Thereafter, all terms shall be for five (5) years for any such members appointed by Tishomingo County, Prentiss County, and Itawamba County to any of these three (3) board positions.

d. In addition to the aforesaid voting members which constitute the Board of Commissioners, the Board of Commissioners shall be, and hereby is, authorized and allowed to appoint one or more persons or representatives to an unofficial, non-voting advisory board as the Board of Commissioners may deem appropriate in the best interests of the Three-County District.

5. The Board of Commissioners shall be responsible for the operation and management of the Three-County District, and it shall be their exclusive authority and they shall be empowered to do all acts necessary, proper, or convenient in the exercise of the powers granted by applicable law to such district, including but not limited to, the power and authority to apply for necessary permits or any other necessary approvals from applicable federal, state, or local agencies or governmental authorities, the power and authority to acquire, construct, reconstruct, improve, better, extend, consolidate, maintain and operate facilities and to contract with any municipality, person, firm, or corporation for services and for a supply and distribution of water, for collection, transportation, treatment and/or disposal of sewage, and for services required incident to the operation and maintenance of such systems, and in addition to other powers, the Three-County District hereby created and acting through its Board of Commissioners shall have, among others, the powers to:

- a. To sue and be sued;
- b. To acquire by purchase, gift, devise, lease or any other mode of acquisition, and to hold or dispose of, real and personal property of every kind within or without the district;
- c. To make and enter into contracts, conveyances, mortgages, deeds of trust, bonds, leases or contracts for financial advisory services;

d. To incur debts, to borrow money, to issue negotiable bonds pursuant to Section 51-8-35 (1), Miss. Code of 1972, and to provide for the rights of the holders thereof as provided therein;

e. To fix, maintain, collect and revise rates and charges for services rendered by or through the facilities of such district, which rates and charges shall not be subject to review or regulation by the Mississippi Public Service Commission except in those instances where a city operating similar services would be subject to regulation and review; however, said district shall obtain a certificate of convenience and necessity from the Mississippi Public Service Commission for operating water and/or sewer systems;

f. To pledge all or any part of its revenues to the payment of its obligations and to exercise all powers authorized pursuant to Section 51-8-47, Miss. Code of 1972;

g. To make such covenants in connection with the issuance of bonds or to secure the payment of bonds that a private business corporation can make under the general laws of the state;

h. To use any right-of-way, public right-of-way, easement, or other similar property or property rights necessary or convenient in connection with the acquisition, improvement, operation or maintenance of the facilities of such district held by the state or any political subdivision thereof which shall or may consent to such use;

i. To enter into agreements with state and federal agencies for loans, grants, grants-in-aid, and other forms of assistance, including, but not limited to, participation in the sale and

purchase of bonds and those agreements authorized pursuant to Section 51-8-55, Miss. Code of 1972;

j. To acquire by purchase, lease, gift, or otherwise existing works and facilities providing services for which was created, and any lands, rights, easements, franchises and other property, real and personal, necessary for the completion and operation of such system upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon, and, if necessary, part of the acquisition price, to assume the payment of outstanding notes, bonds or other obligations upon such system; however, if any corporate agency owning facilities desires to continue providing such services, the corporate agency shall so notify the district not later than ninety (90) days after the effective date of the creation of the district, and the district shall thereupon relinquish its right to provide such services until and unless the corporate agency elects otherwise or fails to adequately provide such services.

k. To extend its services to areas beyond but within one mile of the boundaries of such district; however, no extension shall be made to areas already occupied by another corporate agency rendering the same service so as such corporate agency desires to continue to serve such areas. Areas outside of the district desiring to have which are beyond the one-mile limit must be brought before the district by annexation proceedings. Provided, however, the district's board shall first consider and give preference to the needs of the member counties before agreeing to provide services to any area outside of the district;

l. To be deemed to have the same status as 'counties' municipalities with respect to payment of sales taxes on purchases made by such districts;

m. To borrow funds for interim financing subject to receive funds as outlined in Section 51-8-35;

n. To choose a location within the district as the central office of the district;

o. To adopt a plan for management of the water resources of the district, provided that such plan first be submitted and approved by the Commission on Natural Resources and the Commission on Environmental Quality, as consistent with the state water management plan or objectives;

p. To hire such personnel and contract for such technical, or other services as the board of commissioners deems necessary for the operation of the district in fulfillment of its water management objectives;

q. To secure connection to or participation in the services provided by the district, including the power to obtain mandatory or prohibitory injunctive relief; provided, however, that the authority of the board of commissioners shall not be exercised in conflict with the regulatory enforcement authority of the Commission on Natural Resources, now the Commission on Environmental Quality.

r. To acquire by condemnation all property within or without the boundaries of the district, necessary for projects and the exercise of the powers, rights, privileges and functions conferred upon the district, according to the procedure provided by law for the condemnation of land or other property taken for rights-of-way or other public use. This power of eminent domain to acquire any such property, including, but not limited to, lands, rights, rights-of-way, easements, and other property, real or personal or mineral, may be appropriate wherever and whenever public use, health and convenience so requires is hereby authorized, granted, and vested in said Board of Commissioners of the Three-County District under the option as provided in Section 51-8-33, Miss. Code of 1972. If the power of eminent domain is exercised by the Three-County District and the name of the Three-County District, it shall be exercised in the manner provided by Sections 11-27-1 through 11-27-10, Miss. Code of 1972, as now enacted or hereafter amended.

s. To provide such water and/or sewer and related services at such price or charge as may be determined by the Board. However, so that no area of the district will receive preferential treatment, the price or charge for such water and/or sewer and related services shall be the same for all areas of the district. Should the district receive grants, loans, subsidies, or any other similar payment in respect to the providing of such water and/or sewer and related services, the district shall make its best reasonable efforts to apply such in a manner which will decrease the price or charge of such services with it being the intent that the price or charge for such services shall be the same for all areas of the district.

6. In addition, the Board of Commissioners of the Three-County District shall have the power to adopt, promulgate, modify, and repeal such rules and regulations as it may deem appropriate for the management and operation of said district so long as said rules and regulations are consistent with the laws of the State of Mississippi.

7. The governing bodies of each of the local governmental units of Tishomingo County, Prentiss County, and Itawamba County shall have the sole authority to levy a special tax pursuant to Section 51-8-43, Miss. Code of 1972.

8. Any references herein to any provision(s) of the Mississippi Code of 1972 shall be construed to mean as said provision is now enacted or hereafter amended; and

9. If any part of the powers or provisions herein is held to be invalid, unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, all other powers and provisions herein, not inconsistent therewith, shall remain in full force and effect.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, adopts this resolution declaring the intent set out above to form the Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District and do hereby set the Board Room at the Battleground Drive, Iuka, Mississippi, at 10 a.m. o'clock, on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of July, 2006, as the time and place for a public hearing as to the question of whether the public convenience and necessity requires the creation of such a district and the Clerk is hereby directed to publish a legal notice of such hearing pursuant to law.

## FINDING

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi having convened at public hearing pursuant to law on the question of whether the public convenience and necessity requires the creation of a joint water supply and sewer district and whether the creation of the district is economically sound and desirable; and

WHEREAS, said Board has heard and considered all matters and facts presented concerning the public convenience and necessity and the economic desirability of the creation of such a district and after carefully examining, and upon full consideration of the information does hereby find that the public convenience and necessity requires the creation of the Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District and that the creation of such district is economically sound and feasible.

THIS FINDING is made this date following the public hearing hereby directed to publish this Finding together with the Resolution of Intent to Form the Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District as required by law, and further that on Monday, August 7, 2006 at 10:00 o'clock a.m., in the Board Room of the Tishomingo County Courthouse, in Iuka, Mississippi, the Board hereby set as the date, time, and place for a meeting to create the Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District and the Resolution of Intent to Form the Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District are hereby published in accordance with law, and if no petition requiring election be filed on or before the date of said meeting, this Board shall adopt a resolution creating the district.

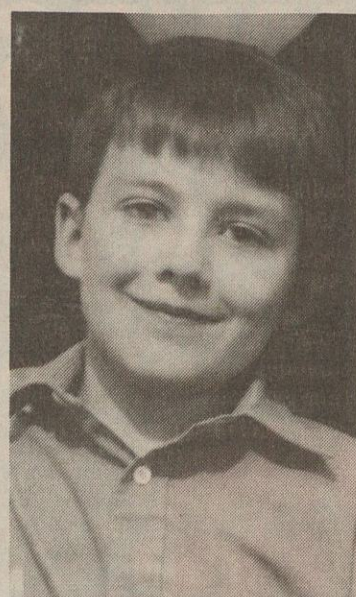

## Tishomingo County School District Senior Athletic Pass Program

What is the Senior Athletic Pass Program? The Senior Athletic Pass Program is designed for senior citizens who are 65 years of age or older. Seniors may purchase a card for \$10.00 which makes them eligible to attend all school-sponsored athletic events in Tishomingo County.

## Democratic Primary Run-Off Results

In the June 27 Democratic Primary Run-Off Election, Ken Hurt and Erik Fleming defeated their opponents and will move forward to the November General Election where they will face the Republican incumbents.

There was a low voter turnout throughout the state for this run-off election, including Tishomingo County where only 225 of the county's over 11,000 registered voters went to the polls.

In the run-off, Ken Hurt of Verona defeated William Bambach of Columbus for the Democratic nomination for U.S. Representative, District 1. In local election results, Hurt

received 142 votes and Bambach received 73 votes.

Hurt will run against Republican incumbent Rep. Roger Wicker in November.

In the run-off for the Democratic spot in the election for U.S. Senator, District 1, the winner was Erick Fleming of Clinton who defeated Bill Bowlin of Hickory Flat. In local election results, Fleming received 54 votes and Bowlin received 166 votes. However, state totals were in favor of Fleming, making him the winner in the race.

Fleming will try and unseat incumbent Sen. Trent Lott in November.

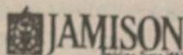

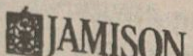
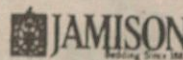
