Airport Improvements - Working On Iuka Airport improvements now underway include Tishomingo County Supervisor Arlie South, Supervisor Dale Price, Engineer Tommy Dean, Supervisor Danny Ryan and Airport Commission Chairman Dr. Kelly Segars.

Airport Improvements Underway To Ready County For Industries

Airport Commission Officials, local supervisors and engineers are diligently working on complete new construction at Iuka Airport in order to make Tishomingo County an active site for potential industries.

According to Tishomingo County Airport Commission Chairman Dr. Kelly Segars, in order for industry to locate in the county, an airport which allows their aircraft to take in and out of the county is essential.

Recently, the airport runway was elongated to 4,000 feet, however 5,000 feet is needed to accommodate most corporate jets. Dr. Segars stated that this improvement is presently in the works, but will take some time to complete.

In the meantime, work has begun on widening the existing runway by 15 more feet, also

construction has begun on eight new T-Hangers. These will be added to the already 10 hangers in place. Money from the rental of these T-hangers will go toward new construction projects at the airport. There is presently a waiting list for 10 hangers at the site.

Dale Edmondson, present Iuka airport manager, will be overseeing the installment and upkeep of a fueling facility at the airport and also the rental details of the T-hangers.

One person who has been instrumental in acquiring these improvements to the existing airport is local engineer Tommy Dean.

"We want to recognize Tommy Dean of Dean McRae Engineering in Iuka, for all of his tremendous work in securing funding for the airport improvements through state and federal funding sources," Dr.

Segars stated. "He has done and continues to do a great job."

"Without a fully functional and adequately sized airport in our county, we will not be able to attract the industries which will bring the high paying jobs our county so desperately needs," Dr. Segars stated. "We will fervently work to make these improvements so that these industries will move into our area and we can compete with surrounding counties in the way of jobs for our people and facilities we can be proud of."

Iuka Airport is owned by the first, second and third district Tishomingo County Supervisors. Dr. Segars wishes to express, on behalf of the Airport Commission and himself, his gratitude for all of these supervisors' cooperation and help in continuing this important county project.

Elections For 3rd and 4th Tishomingo County School Board Members To Be Held November 7

Appeals, Circuit, Chancery Judges, US Senators and Representatives Also To Be Elected

People who are interested in seeking the position of Tishomingo County 3rd or 4th District School Board Member should contact the Circuit Clerk's Office. The window to qualify for these offices is August 9, 2006, thru September 8, 2006.

A candidate for these offices must file a petition with the Election Commissioners at the Circuit Clerk's Office. The petition must be signed by at least 50 qualified voters of the supervisory district in which the candidate is running. The signatures must be certified by the Circuit Clerk. Candidates must also file a Statement of Intent for the Office of County School Board. There is no party affiliation for these offices, and there is no primary election.

In the County School Board election, there is NO RUNOFF. A majority of votes is not required. The high vote wins.

The incumbent candidate for 3rd District School Board Member is Bob Wimbish. The incumbent candidate for 4th District School Board member

is Charles South.

IN DEED

Before purchasing a piece of property and taking possession of the deed, which transfers the title of the property to you, have the title insurer check previous sales and transfers of the property. Anyone who purchases property will want to be sure that no defects occurred in prior conveyances and transfers. That way, when the property is transferred, they will have clear title to the property, as did previous purchasers. If any discrepancies occurred in the previous chronological chain of the title, the purchaser will not be able to obtain clear title. As soon as the purchaser does get the deed, he or she should record it with the county recorder in the county in which the property is located.

A professional is expected to use a reasonable degree of skill and care in their work. When a professional fails to do just that, and someone suffers a loss or injury as a result, the injured party may be entitled to compensation for their loss. WHEREAS, notice of said hearing was published April 20, 27, and May 4, 2006, issues of the *Tishomingo County News*, a newspaper having a general circulation in Tishomingo County, Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, said time and place of said public hearing having come and there having been no protests or objections thereto, and the Board having examined the above-mentioned proceedings, doth find that they are all in complete compliance with the requirements of Section 19-5-215, et seq., of the Mississippi Code of 1972, and that it is in order for the Board to proceed in accordance with the above-mentioned statutory authority.

THEREFORE, the following Resolution was introduced and its adoption moved by Dale Price, same being seconded by Danny Ryan, and having received the affirmative vote of the supervisors present, it was ordered adopted and entered on the Minutes as follows:

Resolution adjudicating that the personal convenience and necessity requires the annexation of the area described below to the Eastport Millcreek Fire Protection Grading District, Inc. and that this annexation is economically sound and desirable.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF TISHOMINGO COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the public convenience and necessity requires the annexation of the area described below to the Eastport Millcreek Fire Protection Grading District, Inc. and hereby declared to be the intention of the Board of Supervisors to incorporate same as provided by law.

Section 2. That the annexation of the area described below to the Eastport Millcreek Fire Protection Grading District, Inc. is economically sound and is desirable.

Section 3. That the Board of Supervisors annexing said area, and hereby sets the date of the 18th of August, 2006, as the date upon which said annexation is effective.

Section 4. The area to be annexed is described as follows:

Commencing at the Southwest corner of Section 35, Township 2 South, Range 11 East, and thence running East along the southern boundary of said section to a point where said boundary intersects the 423' contour of Pickwick Lake; thence running in a northerly direction along the said 423' contour line to the point where the 423' contour intersects the north right-of-way of CR 262; thence running along said right-of-way in a westerly direction to the intersection of CR 956; thence running along the south right-of-way of CR 956 in a southwesterly direction to the intersection of said right-of-way and the western boundary of Section 26, Township 2 South, Range 11 East; thence running south along said boundary to the southwest corner of Section 26, Township 2 South, Range 11 East; thence continuing to run south along the western boundary of section 35, Township 2 South, Range 11 East to the point of beginning.

The Museum staff will continue to assist those who wish to research in the John Marshall Stone Research Library following the seminar.



Thank you to the town of Glen who has donated a much-needed answering machine to the library.



Appeal Rejected In Moss Case

A former Burnsville resident, Reginald Joe "Reggie" Moss, argued that he did not understand what he was doing when he pleaded guilty to the 2000 murder of his ex-wife, Angel Moss; however, the Mississippi Court of Appeals rejected his argument Tuesday, July 18.

Moss was sentenced to life in prison, plus 10 years, for the 2000 murder of his ex-wife after he pleaded guilty to charges of capital murder, kidnapping, grand larceny and arson.

Moss claimed that his guilty plea was involuntary and that he was under the influence of medication when he entered the plea and did not understand what he was doing.

Appeals Judge Tyree Irving, writing for the court, said the trial judge extensively questioned Moss to make sure he was entering the plea voluntarily. He also asked Moss if he had taken anything which would distort his ability to understand what was going on during the proceedings. This question was answered by Moss to indicate that he had not taken anything,

and was perfectly able to make his statement with a sound mind.

Moss was convicted of killing Angel Moss after she came to his home to visit her two small children of which he had custody. A dispute broke out among the two said witnesses who were at the house. They said that it ended with Reggie Moss beating his ex-wife, then slashing her throat with a knife. She was then loaded into her Jeep Cherokee, taken to a remote location off of Hwy. 350, and the vehicle was set on fire.

The body of Angel Moss, 26, was found in the burning vehicle on Sept. 4, 2000 after the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office received a call about a forest fire. They found her charred remains in the vehicle.

The original murder case was held in 2002 where Reggie Moss was sentenced to life in prison, plus 10 years.





RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO FORM THE THREE-COUNTY REGIONAL WATER SUPPLY AND SEWER DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the undersigned understands from reliable expert tests and studies that there are certain areas where there may not be sufficient and predictable quantities of water available to ensure large, potential industrial water users of an adequate and sustained quantity of water in large commercial quantities and for reasonably assured, extended periods of time considering the area's continued population growth, existing industrial development, and the existing water aquifers. Although there is no immediate need for additional large supplies of drinking water, the addition of significant, large industrial water users may create the need for additional drinking water supplies;

WHEREAS, it is therefore useful, necessary, and in the best interest of all the citizens of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Itawamba County, Mississippi to provide an alternative source of water that would be available in a timely manner, in relatively large quantities, and for sustained and predictable periods of time in order to foster continued growth, continued industrial development, and a continuing adequate water supply for the area for many years to come. It is necessary for the continued health and welfare of the citizens of the area to provide an alternative supply of water;

WHEREAS, furthermore, in order to promote and encourage economic development and the creation of jobs in this region, the undersigned does hereby deem it beneficial and in the best interests of its citizens that adequate and sufficient sewer and waste water services also be planned and developed in conjunction with the alternative water supply to further enhance the economic opportunities of this region by making this area of the state more attractive to significant industrial prospects, which would enhance the overall economic health and well being of this area;

WHEREAS, a petition was forwarded to the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District pursuant to Section 51-8-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, requesting that the existing district undertake to provide the alternative supply of water to Tishomingo County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Itawamba County, Mississippi and to also plan and develop, in conjunction with the alternative supply of water, adequate and sufficient sewer and waste water services;

WHEREAS, a response to that petition was received from the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District stating that the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District was unable to affirmatively respond to the petition pursuant to the requirements of the statutes;

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of all citizens of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Itawamba County, Mississippi to form a joint water supply and sewer district for the purpose of constructing the necessary facilities to supply the areas of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Itawamba County, Mississippi with the alternative source of water along with adequate and sufficient sewer and waste water services;

WHEREAS, the laws of the State of Mississippi, in particular, Sections 51-8-63 and 51-8-65, Mississippi Code of 1972, require that any efforts by the parties hereto to form an entity to acquire and assume any powers, duties, and responsibilities of a joint water supply and sewer district are subject to the prior approval by the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality and upon such terms and conditions as may be acceptable to the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality after the required parties officially file a petition or petitions as required by law with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality. Although the parties have been in contact with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality, have informed the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality of the efforts, matters, and things contained herein, have briefed the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality of the reasons and justifications for forming the Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District, an have received a tentative and preliminary, but unofficial and non-binding, verbal indication from the appropriate personnel with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality that it will favorably receive the application for the formation of the entity, subject to applicable law, the final formation and approval of this Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District is subject to a favorable ruling by the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality upon the filing of a proper petition or petitions with the

Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality as required by law. However, the entities herein must approve the formation of the subject Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District, as required by law, before any petition or petitions can be officially filed with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality; and

WHEREAS, the laws of the State of Mississippi require that a public hearing be held on the question of whether the public convenience and necessity requires the creation of such a district and whether the creation of such a district is economically sound and feasible.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi ("Tishomingo County") that is their intent to form a joint water supply and sewer district with the Board of Supervisors of Prentiss County, Mississippi ("Prentiss County") and with the Board of Supervisors of Itawamba County, Mississippi ("Itawamba County") pursuant to Section 51-8-1, et. seq. Miss. Code of 1972 as follows:

1. The name of the newly created water supply and sewer district shall be the Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District ("Three-County District").
2. The geographic boundary of said newly created water supply and sewer district shall be the geographic boundaries of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Itawamba County, Mississippi.
3. The function of the Three-County District will be to take all actions necessary to construct, erect, maintain, and operate facilities which would provide a source of water along with sewer and waste water services to the geographic areas served and to enter into all cooperatives, agreements, contracts, and other legally binding obligations with any and all other governmental agencies, firms or corporations in order to effectuate the construction, maintenance, and operation of such facilities.
4. The powers of the Three-County District shall be fixed and exercised by a Board of Commissioners consisting of six (6) voting members. Said voting members shall consist of the following appointees and who otherwise meet the requirements of Section 51-8-25, Miss. Code of 1972, as now enacted or hereafter amended, and other applicable law:

a. Two (2) members appointed by Tishomingo County who shall each be a resident citizen in said county wherein one (1) of said appointees shall, by virtue of his office, be the same person as Tishomingo County's representative and appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District and wherein the other appointee shall be some qualified person selected and appointed by said county, two (2) members appointed by Prentiss County who shall each be a resident citizen in said county wherein one (1) of said appointees shall, by virtue of his office, be the same person as Prentiss County's representative and appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District and wherein the other appointee shall be some qualified person selected and appointed by said county, and two (2) members appointed by Itawamba County who shall each be a resident citizen in said county wherein one (1) of said appointees shall, by virtue of his office, be the same person as Itawamba County's representative and appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District and wherein the other appointee shall be some qualified person selected and appointed by said county;

b. As to the initial term of office regarding each county's appointee to the Board of Commissioners of the Three-County District and who is said appointee by virtue of his appointment by such county to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District, the initial term of such three (3) members shall be for the duration of that person's term of appointment by said county to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District but in no event to exceed the maximum term of office of five (5) years as prescribed in the applicable joint water management districts' statutes being Section 51-8-21, Miss. Code of 1972. Thereafter, the term for each of said three (3) members shall be for a term of four (4) years or until his successor is named and for so long as said person is that respective county's appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District but in no event to exceed the maximum term of office of five (5) years as prescribed in the applicable joint water management districts' statutes being Section 51-8-21, Miss. Code of 1972. It is the intention herein that in the event that the county's representative to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District serves continuously for more than five (5) years that said person's tenure on the Board of Commissioners of the Three-County District shall cease and terminate, and the said county shall take appropriate steps, as soon as practicable, to appoint a person to fill this position who likewise must be the county's appointee to the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District. Furthermore, it is the intention herein that when said county appointee's term of office with Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District terminates and said person is not successively and without interruption reappointed to the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District board, said person's term as a member of Three-County District's Board of Commissioners shall likewise terminate. Furthermore, it is the intention herein that each county shall coordinate, to the extent practicable and to the extent allowed by law, the term of said county's appointment to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District as set forth in Section 51-13-105, Miss. Code of 1972, in and for such a term and manner so as to not exceed the statutory maximum term of office of the county's appointment to the board of Three-County District's Board of Commissioners as set forth in Section 51-8-21, Miss. Code of 1972. Nothing herein shall preclude each respective county, if it so desires, from reappointing the same person to the Board of Commissioners of the Three-County District provided said person is likewise the county's appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District;

c. The initial term of office of the remaining three (3) members of the board of the Three-County District's Board of Commissioners appointed collectively by Tishomingo County, Prentiss County, and Itawamba County shall be determined by random drawing in staggered terms with one (1) member serving a five (5) year term, one (1) member serving a four (4) year term, and one (1) member serving a three (3) year term. Thereafter, all terms shall be for five (5) years for any such members appointed by Tishomingo County, Prentiss County, and Itawamba County to any of these three (3) board positions.

d. In addition to the aforesaid voting members which constitute the Board of Commissioners, the Board of Commissioners shall be, and hereby is, authorized and allowed to appoint one or more persons or representatives to an unofficial, non-voting advisory board as the Board of Commissioners may deem appropriate in the best interests of the Three-County District.

5. The Board of Commissioners shall be responsible for the operation and management of the Three-County District, and it shall be their exclusive authority and they shall be empowered to do all acts necessary, proper, or convenient in the exercise of the powers granted by applicable law to such district, including but not limited to, the power and authority to apply for necessary permits or any other necessary approvals from applicable federal, state, or local agencies or governmental authorities, the power and authority to acquire, construct, reconstruct, improve, better, extend, consolidate, maintain and operate facilities and to contract with any municipality, person, firm, or corporation for services and for a supply and distribution of water, for collection, transportation, treatment and/or disposal of sewage, and for services required incident to the operation and maintenance of such systems, and in addition to other powers, the Three-County District hereby created and acting through its Board of Commissioners shall have, among others, the powers to:

- a. To sue and be sued;
- b. To acquire by purchase, gift, devise, lease or any other mode of acquisition, and to hold or dispose of, real and personal property of every kind within or without the district;
- c. To make and enter into contracts, conveyances, mortgages, deeds of trust, bonds, leases or contracts for financial advisory services;
- d. To incur debts, to borrow money, to issue negotiable bonds pursuant to Section 51-8-35 (1), Miss. Code of 1972, and to provide for the rights of the holders thereof as provided therein;
- e. To fix, maintain, collect and revise rates and charges for services rendered by or through the facilities of such district, which rates and charges shall not be subject to review or regulation by the Mississippi Public Service Commission except in those instances where a city operating similar services would be subject to regulation and review; however, said district shall obtain a certificate of convenience and necessity from the Mississippi Public Service Commission for operating water and/or sewer systems;
- f. To pledge all or any part of its revenues to the payment of its obligations and to exercise all powers authorized pursuant to Section 51-8-47, Miss. Code of 1972;
- g. To make such covenants in connection with the issuance of bonds or to secure the payment of bonds that a private business corporation can make under the general laws of the state;
- h. To use any right-of-way, public right-of-way, easement, or other similar property or property rights necessary or convenient in connection with the acquisition, improvement, operation or maintenance of the facilities of such district held by the state or any political subdivision thereof which shall or may consent to such use;
- i. To enter into agreements with state and federal agencies for loans, grants, grants-in-aid, and other forms of assistance, including, but not limited to, participation in the sale and

purchase of bonds and those agreements pursuant to Section 51-8-55, Miss. Code of 1972.

To acquire by purchase, lease, gift, or otherwise existing works and facilities providing services for the was created, and any lands, rights, easements, franchises and other property, real and personal, necessary for completion and operation of such system upon such and conditions as may be agreed upon, and, if necessary, part of the acquisition price, to assume the payment of outstanding notes, bonds or other obligations upon system; however, if any corporate agency owning facilities desires to continue providing such services, corporate agency shall so notify the district not later than ninety (90) days after the effective date of the creation of the district, and the district shall thereupon relinquish its right to provide such services until and unless the corporate agency elects otherwise or fails to adequately provide such services.

k. To extend its services to areas beyond but within one mile of the boundaries of such district; however, no extension shall be made to areas already occupied by another corporate agency rendering the same services as such corporate agency desires to continue to serve areas. Areas outside of the district desiring to be included which are beyond the one-mile limit must be brought to the district by annexation proceedings. Provided, however, the district's board shall first consider and give priority to the needs of the member counties before agreeing to provide services to any area outside of the district.

l. To be deemed to have the same status as counties and municipalities with respect to payment of sales taxes on purchases made by such districts;

m. To borrow funds for interim financing subject to such funds as outlined in Section 51-8-35;

n. To choose a location within the district as the central office of the district;

o. To adopt a plan for management of the water resources of the district, provided that such plan first be submitted and approved by the Commission on Natural Resources, the Commission on Environmental Quality, as created by the state water management plan or objectives;

p. To hire such personnel and contract for such technical, or other services as the board of commissioners deems necessary for the operation of the district and fulfillment of its water management objectives;

q. To secure connection to or participation in water services provided by the district, including the power to obtain mandatory or prohibitory injunctive relief; provided, however, that the authority of the board of commissioners shall not be exercised in conflict with the regulatory enforcement authority of the Commission on Natural Resources, now the Commission on Environmental Quality.

r. To acquire by condemnation all property, real, kind, real, personal, or mixed, or any interest therein, or without the boundaries of the district, necessary for projects and the exercise of the powers, rights, privileges and functions conferred upon the district, according to the procedure provided by law for the condemnation of land, other property taken for rights-of-way or other public use. This power of eminent domain to acquire any such property, including, but not limited to, lands, rights, interests, easements, and other property, real or personal or mixed, may be appropriate wherever and whenever public necessity and convenience so requires is hereby authorized, granted and vested in said Board of Commissioners of the Three-County District under the option as provided in Section 51-8-33, Miss. Code of 1972. If the power of eminent domain is exercised by the Three-County District and the name of the Three-County District, it shall be exercised in the manner provided by Sections 11-27-1 through 11-27-3, Miss. Code of 1972, as now enacted or hereafter amended.

s. To provide such water and/or sewer and related services at such price or charge as may be determined by the Board of Commissioners. However, so that no area of the district will receive preferential treatment, the price or charge for such water and/or sewer and related services shall be the same for all areas of the district. Should the district receive grants, loans, subsidies, or any other similar payments with respect to the providing of such water and/or sewer related services, the district shall make its best reasonable efforts to apply such in a manner which will decrease the price or charge of such services with it being the intent that the price or charge for such services shall be the same for all areas of the district.

6. In addition, the Board of Commissioners of the Three-County District shall have the power to adopt, promulgate, modify, and repeal such regulations as it may deem appropriate for the management and operation of said district so long as said rules and regulations are not in conflict with the laws of the State of Mississippi.

7. The governing bodies of each of the local governmental units of Tishomingo County, Prentiss County, and Itawamba County shall have the authority to levy a special tax pursuant to Section 51-8-43, Miss. Code of 1972.

8. Any references herein to any provision(s) of the Mississippi Code of 1972 shall be construed to mean as said provision is now enacted or hereafter amended; and

9. If any part of the powers or provisions herein is held to be unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, all other powers and provisions herein, not inconsistent therewith, shall remain in full force and effect.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, adopts this resolution declaring the intent set out above to form the Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District and to hereby set the Board Room at the Battleground Drive, Iuka, Mississippi, at 10 a.m. o'clock, on the 3rd day of August, 2006, as the time and place for a public hearing as to the question of convenience and necessity and economic feasibility for the formation of the Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District and the Clerk is hereby directed to publish a legal notice of such hearing pursuant to law.

FINDING

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi having convened at public hearing pursuant to law on the question of whether the public convenience and necessity requires the creation of a joint water supply and sewer district and whether the creation of the district is economically sound and desirable; and

WHEREAS, said Board has heard and considered all matters and facts presented concerning the public convenience and necessity and the economic desirability of the creation of such a district and after carefully examining, and upon full consideration of the information does hereby find that the public convenience and necessity requires the creation of the Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District and that the creation of such district is economically sound and feasible.

THIS FINDING is made this date following the public hearing pursuant to Section 51-8-9, Ms. Code of 1972, and the Board hereby directed to publish this Finding together with the Resolution of Intent to Form the Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District as required by law, and further that on Monday, August 7, 2006 at 10:00 o'clock a.m., in the Board Room of the Tishomingo County Courthouse, in Iuka, Mississippi, hereby set as the date, time, and place for a meeting to create the Three-County Regional Water Supply and Sewer District and to publish in accordance with law, and if no petition requesting election be filed on or before the date of said meeting, this finding shall adopt a resolution creating the district.

The Good Earth Pottery

It is a little like Christmas every day at The Good Earth Pottery workshop.

Owner, Richie Del Watts surfs the kiln room looking for work ready to be unveiled, really knowing what surprises are in store under those lids.

It never stops being exciting, no matter how many times I see it. I love it. I know I'm going to be able to have that feeling every day."

Luck is not the only factor in the meteoric rise as one of the potters in the state. This once operation is now distributing all over the country, with sales from California to Virginia. It's a career path that seemed possible 30 years ago. The Enthusiast literature and zoology major had two years of medical school before taking his eye for the retail world. For 11 years, Watts owned a chain of gift shops, then worked in retail and even developed a lamp

But his hobby was collecting. His eye for coloring and attention to detail caught the attention of a friend, who encouraged him to try dinnerware.

"I was doing Magelliana figures at the time, this was in 2000, and I thought I might as well try it," he said. "It would be something a

little different and might be fun. So I gave it a shot. I had no idea at the time it would change my life."

It took several months to perfect the process. Watts went through 5,000 pounds of clay before finding success. The process is highly experimental, a trial and error of sorts, uses different glazes, firing for different amounts of time. It's a science Watts said he's learned more and more about each day.

"Take the Bluebird design for example. There is no blue glaze, it just happened through a set of variables that I didn't even record the first time," he said. "It was heart-breaking because I opened that kiln and there was this beautiful piece of pottery and I had no idea how it happened. It took me three months to find the right formula and do it again. From then on, I've taken meticulous notes on everything."

"From the beginning I knew I had created something completely different. There was nothing else like it out there and either they were going to love it or hate it."

Having found his product, he was faced with naming his designs,

a task he was finding little luck in doing until a friend saw a resemblance in an ornament.

"I had thought about using elements or herbs, but nothing really captured what I wanted," he said. "A friend of mine had some of those feather ornaments and she

put one next to a dinner plate. It was a match. That's how we came up with pheasant."

Mockingbird, peacock, ostrich, bluebird and others followed.

Watts put together his samples and hit the road. First stop was Oxford Floral, where owners were so impressed, they bought the samples themselves.

"I didn't know what to do, but I knew if they did well with it, word would spread. I left them the samples on Friday and by Monday they had sold every piece. I think that first order was about \$600, and let me tell you, I thought that was incredible at the time."

But \$600 was just the tip of the iceberg. Soon, Watts was getting orders from small high-end retail shops all over the state, but he needed that first big account to really make an impact on the larger market.

"I knew I needed a presence in Jackson, so I headed over there and stopped by Everyday Gourmet," he said. "They picked it up and they've had a lot of success with it, which opened us up to an entirely new market."

As his lines became more and more popular, Watts added designs. One of his favorites today was actually a recommendation of a client on the Gulf Coast and almost never happened.

"She wanted a Mardi Gras pattern, and I tried to explain that my pottery doesn't work the way ceramic work," he said. "I told her that if I put gold and purple together it was going to be a horrible mess."

He tried to avoid even trying it, but she was persistent.

"I finally did it because I thought I'd just do one piece, show her the disaster and it would be over with. When I opened the kiln, there sat the most beautiful piece of pottery. I was shocked. So I had to call her and give her the good - and bad - news."

The bad news was she still didn't have a Mardi Gras pattern, the good news was he had just designed his next line - bird of paradise.

At the time, it was just Watts and one employee, Mary Smith, who still works by his side. In their 1,000-square-foot workshop they produced every piece, working with just two kilns.

"Mary was cleaning every piece, painting the backgrounds and I was finishing everything. In those first four months, it was just us," Watts said.

In just three years, they've moved to a space 10 times the size of their first home and added 20

more kilns to the workshop. The company makes about 200 pieces per day and had increased the line from 13 pieces to 90.

"I guess we've done more than 150,000 pieces over the course of this very short time," Watts said. "But despite our growth, I won't compromise the quality of what I started with. We set out to make a durable, practical line of dinner ware, and that's what we are doing. I wanted to show you could have a beautiful place setting and still be able to throw it in the dishwasher or microwave because it literally is the strongest pottery around. I won't move away from that, no matter how big we get."

In January 2004, Watts took the next step in growing his business - attending Atlanta's Gift Mart, the largest wholesale gift mart in the country. It was a phenomenal success, so much so, The Good Earth moved into a permanent showroom.

Recognition of his unique line has grown as well, through features in such magazines as Veranda, Southern Living and Southern Accents. He has also expanded his focus to table linens and more serving and accessory pieces.

"I'm constantly looking for new ideas," Watts said. "We'll be introducing a line of vases at market in January, very modern, very different. We'll be showing some square bowls and some really large accessory pieces as well. We'll also have the completed line of Bluejay, our new pattern."

Watts said while he feels lucky to have had this success, he doesn't lose sight of what got him on the path to begin with - his love of clay.

"I guess I'm living out every small-business owners fantasy right now," he said. "But in the end, it comes down to the fact that I love the clay, the pottery. I've been fascinated by it for 30 years and every day, when I go over to open a kiln, I get that excitement in my stomach. That's what is fun about this, that's why all the hard work is worth it in the end."


