Burnsville Police Chief Dismissed By Board

The Burnsville City Board of Aldermen held a special session on Thursday, August 3, to discuss the personnel matters concerning the police department, and concluded with the dismissal of the town's police chief by a vote of three to two.

According to reports, Mayor David Nixon requested the dismissal of the town's police chief, Chip Timbes, who had been employed with the town for approximately one year. Mayor Nixon said the board had discussed matters involving the chief of police and other police staff in other meetings prior to the special meeting.

While no specifics were released to the public, Mayor Nixon said that he had given all Board members information about his concerns and it had been discussed.

"I felt that his [Chip Timbes] employment was not in the best interest of the town," Mayor Nixon stated.

After the Mayor's recommendation, Alderman Nicky McRae made the motion

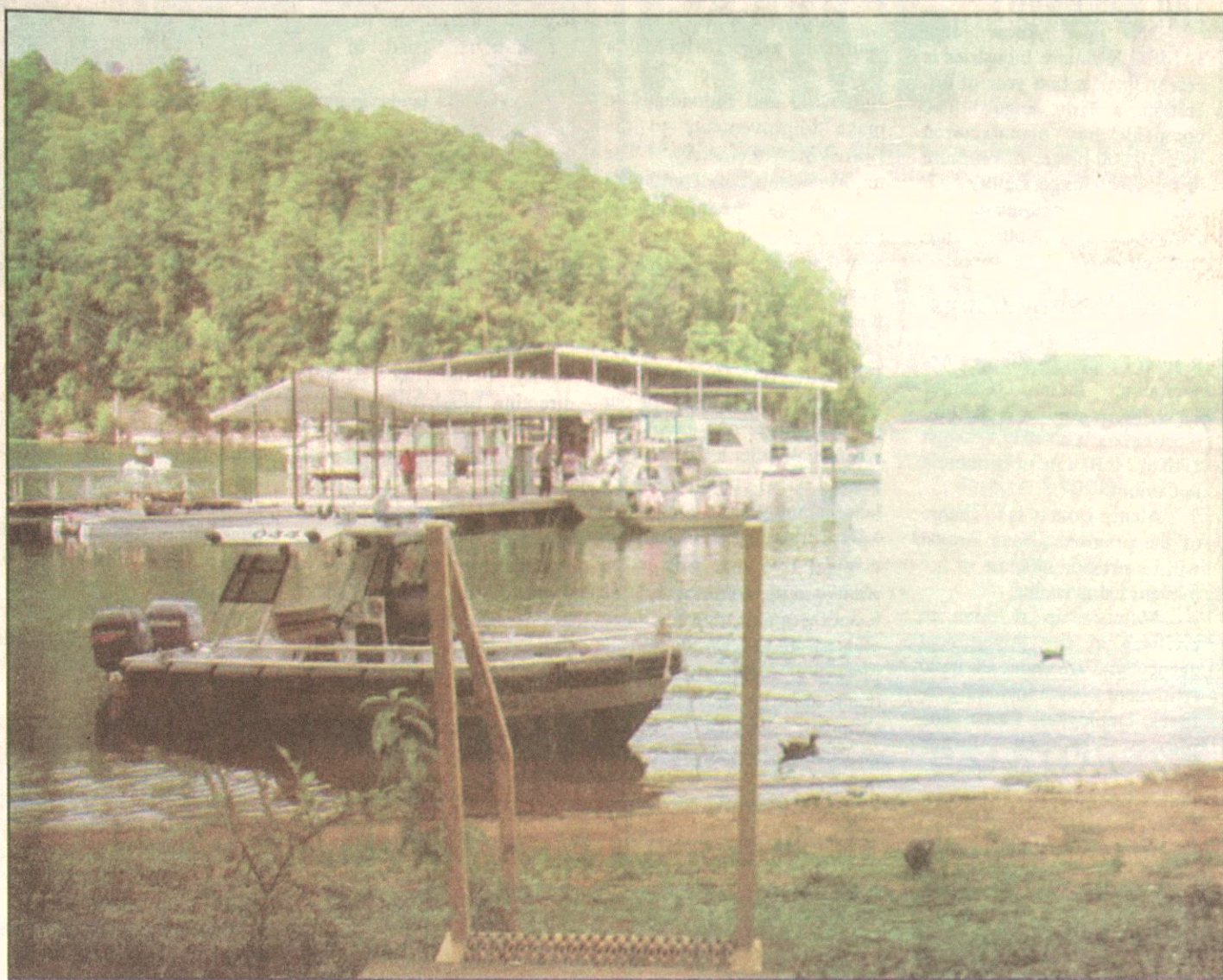
to dismiss Timbes. It was seconded by Alderman John Rorie and was put to a vote. McRae, Rorie and Alderman Bubba Carpenter voted for the motion to dismiss Timbes. Alderman Brad Forsythe and Alderman A.T. Marlar voted against the dismissal.

The town's Board of Aldermen held its regular monthly meeting on Tuesday night, August 1. According to Alderman Forsythe, a large turn-out of the town's citizens were in attendance of this regularly scheduled meeting.

Board members were notified by phone Thursday morning about the special board meeting to be held that night, according to Mayor Nixon. They received written notice—which was hand delivered by town personnel—later in the day, he stated.

At press time, a replacement for Timbes had not been named. Applications are being accepted for the position.

Presently, two police officers, Scott Woodruff and Tim Williamson, are working for the town.

Two Tennessee Residents Found Dead In Waters Below "The Falls" Near J.P. Coleman State Park

Bodies of Prominent Memphis Businessman & Friend Found In Pickwick Lake

Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon said he is awaiting the results of autopsies before he can officially release the cause of death of two Tennessee residents—a male and a female—whose bodies were recovered Monday from the waters of the area near J.P. Coleman State Park known locally as "The Falls."

The body of Peggie Stone Sanford, 43, of Bartlett, Tenn., surfaced Monday morning around 9 after rescue workers with the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks and other local agencies had been searching throughout most of Sunday night and into the morning Monday in the waters near the popular recreational boating area.

The body of the second victim, Albert "Big Al" Wesley McAlexander III, 58, of Germantown was located by divers later in the afternoon, around 2 p.m. Monday in the same vicinity as the first victim was found.

According to Conservation Officer Rick Cornelison, he received a call from a boater who had spotted a large pontoon boat idling in the area near "The Falls" Sunday evening around 6. No one appeared to be on the boat; however, a dog—a chocolate lab—was tied on board and the boat was running.

"After receiving the call, we did a welfare check for the persons who had been on the boat," Cornelison stated. "At that point, we did not know if they may have gone ashore or left the area for some reason. No one had reported anyone as missing."

Cornelison went on to explain that as time passed and no one was located around the boat, his department began to diligently search the waters for possible drowning victims. The personal belongings, along with the dog, were on the pontoon. It did not appear that there had

been any foul play; the boaters were just missing.

After finding identification of the boat's occupants on board, Cornelison said they began to try and contact family members or others who could tell them something about the whereabouts of the man and woman. They were finally able to get in touch with some family members who confirmed that they knew that the couple had gone to the Pickwick area where McAlexander had a lake home, but no one had heard from them lately.

"At that point we began to aggressively search the waters around where the boat was found. The approximately 24 ft. Premier Pontoon was moved out and taken to a storage facility just across the Tennessee State Line so that the rescuers could begin the use of sonar and dragging for the victims.

The dragging went on throughout the evening and night Sunday and into the morning hours Monday without success. Finally, around 9 a.m. Monday, the body of Sanford surfaced near the shore of the area where rescuers were searching. She was transported to Coleman Park's boat docks and removed from the waters.

"At this point, we had called in dive teams to aid in the search for Mr. McAlexander," Cornelison said.

After several hours of searching, at approximately 2 p.m., diver Andy Bailey of the Tupelo Fire and Rescue Dive Team located McAlexander's body in the water, not far from where the other victim had been found. At that point, he was also taken to the docks at Coleman Park and removed from the water.

Coroner Mack Wilemon, who was brought out to the site where each victim was found, said both Sanford and McAlexander are having autopsies done and he will release the official cause of death when he gets those results. He said that there did not appear to be any signs of foul play at the scene, but no official conclusion

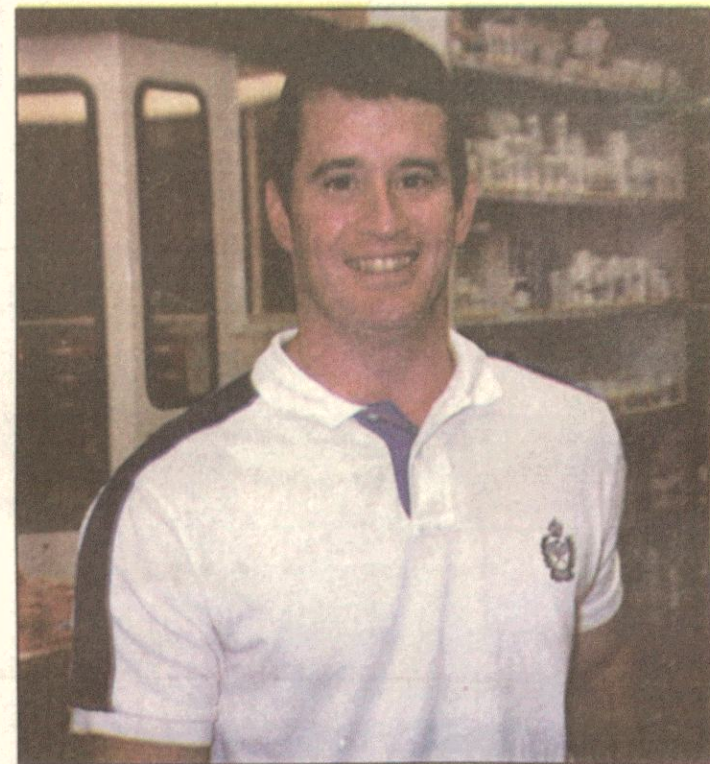
can be drawn without the autopsy findings.

"As far as we know, there were no witnesses in the area when the tragedy occurred," Wilemon said.

In addition to Game and Fish and dive teams, officials with the Tishomingo County Rescue Squad, Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office, TVA

Police and other volunteers assisted with the location of the victims.

Al McAlexander was known in the area for a business he once owned in Pickwick: Al's SeaDoo Too. He was also the owner of Al's Cycle Shop—one of the oldest Honda Dealerships located in Memphis, Tenn.

HCVFD would like to thank Tommy for his dedication to the Harmony-Central Fire Department as well as other Fire Departments in the community surrounding Iuka.

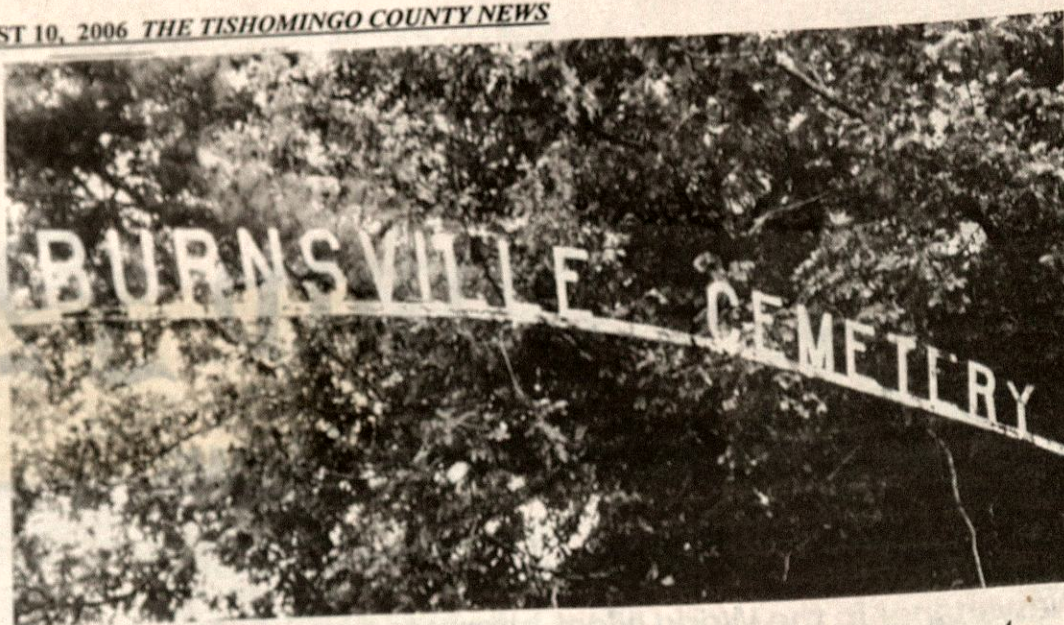

DISCRIMINATION ON THE BASIS OF AGE

Those who believe they have been illegally discriminated against on the basis of their age are advised to file a complaint with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC). In addition, a copy of the complaint should be filed with the local state office of civil rights. Filers will be expected to be able to document their allegations. If necessary, engage the services of a lawyer in this effort. For its part, the EEOC will attempt to bring the matter to resolution informally. While the EEOC may file suit against the employer, this is relatively rare. Thus, those who feel they need to take a more aggressive approach can file their own independent lawsuit with the help of an attorney. If you are a victim of the negligent or intentional actions of another person that causes you emotional distress, you should speak to an attorney immediately to learn more about preserving your rights. A lawyer will be able to explain the merit of your case and help you through the legal process. For further information or to schedule a consultation, call my office.

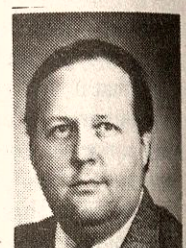

Difficulty In Reading

If you have a child who is not reading as well as his classmates, you may wonder if he has a "reading block". Perhaps he is reacting to too much pressure to make him read as well as his peers. Some children thought to have a reading block are also bright, verbal, interested and out going; but some become sullen and defensive.

This is a difficult situation to deal with, especially when the child has been labeled as a "poor reader" soon after he begins school. He becomes frightened about his inadequacy and faces each reading assignment with dread. Perhaps, like some children, he may be a slow starter and will soon catch up if encouraged to do so, or he might have a vision problem that needs correcting. This may not always be apparent in the simple eye tests performed at school.

Poor vision can cause difficulties in reading including "reading block" as well as other problems. If you think your child may have a vision problem, have his eyes examined without delay.

2006 Commemorative Ornaments Mineral Springs Hotel Newest Addition

The Elizabeth Pyle UMW is taking orders for their 2006 Limited Edition Commemorative Ornament.

The beautiful stained glass ornament features the beloved Iuka landmark, Mineral Spring Hotel. Originally called the Iuka Springs Hotel, it was built in 1859 by R. C. Brinkley and Sam Tate of Memphis. It burned in March 1871, but was quickly rebuilt in 1872 on the previous location. The hotel housed the Iuka Normal Institute for nearly fifteen years. After it closed in 1902, the famous Mineral Springs Hotel with elaborate ballroom and big-time orchestras reopened. It became the gathering spot for local residents and out-of-town guests until it burned February 15, 1945.

Tina Steenerson, of North Carolina, hand crafts each ornament. They are made using traditional stained glass materials and techniques in which an image is transferred onto translucent white glass, hand tinted and kiln fired. The soldered lines have a copper patina.

New Novel Is Set In Tishomingo County, Author Brings First Volume Here To Sign

Broken Spirit, a new inspirational fiction novel by Georgia author John Shivers, sets part of its story in Tishomingo County. The book, which will be available for purchase and signing locally on August 12, is the first of three in the Renew a Right Spirit trilogy.

Local connections in this first book are set in the past, told through the memoirs of a young Tishomingo teenager quarantined to the state tuberculosis sanatorium.

In the second and third volumes, however, the young patient's story will move more to present day in and around the county, as her granddaughter, Saralynn Reilly, begins to trace her family's roots in north Mississippi.

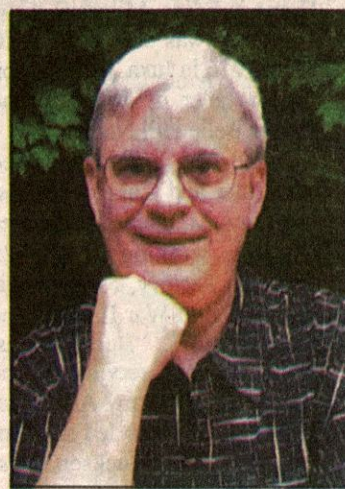
Saralynn, and her grandmother, Sallie McIntire Watson, are both creations of the author's imagination, as is their story. However, book one is set in present day Simpson County, Mississippi, where the former tuberculosis hospital was located.

The author, who has family roots in the Simpson County area, relied on many of those connections and locales in crafting this newest book. The remaining two books will continue that trend in both north and south-central portions of the state.

In Broken Spirit, readers learn the story of a young Boston woman who finds her way out of heart-shattering grief through the diaries her grandmother began many years before, at a time when she feared she might die.

Saralynn Reilly is a 30-something professional who loses her husband and young son in a tragic accident. Lacking the guts to go on with life or to end it, she's wandering in an emotional wilderness, when she comes to Mississippi to settle the estate of a grandmother she barely knew.

The discovery of old diaries her grandmother began when she was 16 years old introduces Sara-

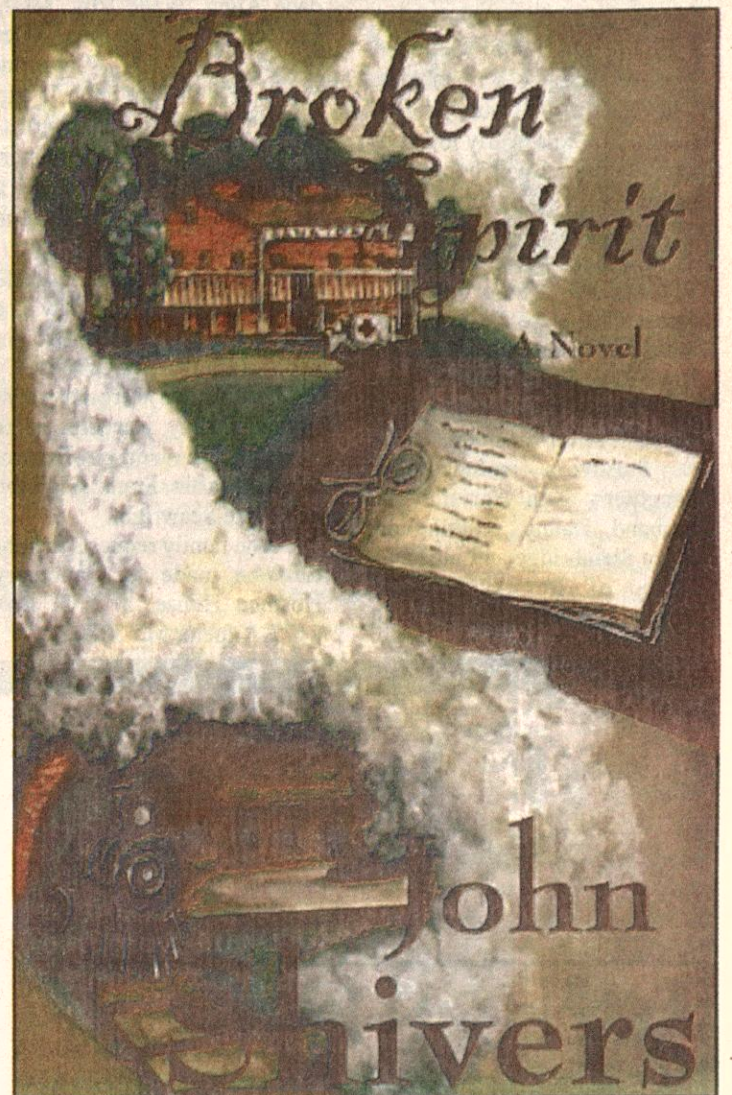
lynn to her distant grandparent, and also provides a way out of the grief-ridden rut into which she has

fallen. Along the way, she finds for herself the faith that sustained her grandmother when medicine along proved inadequate.

The book is written from the premise that faith is nothing more than believing that God will do what he has promised. Further, he often answers prayer using ordinary individuals who often aren't even aware they're being used.

Catherine Ritch Guess, author of 17 novels including the Sandman Series, the Shooting Star Series and Eagle's Wings Trilogy, says of the author, "John Shivers, 'Word Weaver,' has a sense of Southern charm in his writing style that is truly like listening to him spin a tale while he sits at his loom weaving yarn. Shivers is at work now on the research locally for the last two books, and will be in the county on several occasions over the next

The book sells for \$14.98, tax included, and is the author's second book. Hear My Cry, the first volume in the Create My Soul Anew trilogy, was released in 2005. Hear My Cry is the fictional

account of an unlikely domestic violence victim and has received rave reviews from the publishing world and readers alike. The next volume in that first trilogy is entitled Paths of Judgment and will be released in early 2007. Both books will be available for sale on August 12.

Attention Fathers: Do You Want Your Child To Do Well In School?

School year 2006-2007 is underway. Fathers did you know that if you are involved in your child's school work and school events, it will help your child do well in school? National Household Education Survey reveals that children whose fathers participate in classroom activities and school meetings and events receive higher grades, enjoy school more, and are more likely to participate in extracurricular activities than children whose fathers don't participate regardless of maternal participation.

After comparing parental involvement with student achievement and behavior, the researchers concluded that:

- Students in two-parent families were 43 percent more likely to get mostly A's if their fathers were highly involved in their schools.
- Children of highly involved resident fathers were 55 percent more likely to enjoy school than children of uninvolved fathers.
- Students in Middle School and High School were 88 percent more likely to participate

in extracurricular activities if their fathers were highly involved in the school.

- Students whose fathers were highly involved in their schools were less likely to repeat a grade than other students.
- Students were 39 percent less likely to be suspended or expelled if their fathers participated in even one in-school activity.

Research from Oxford University says that strong father-child relationships can reduce the incidence of mental health problems in later life. A survey commissioned by the Department of Education suggest that only 12 percent of men claimed to be more involved than their partner in their children's education, compared with 72 percent of women. But 75 percent of the men with school-aged children said they would like to be more involved.

Iuka Couple Highlighted In Niece's Column
