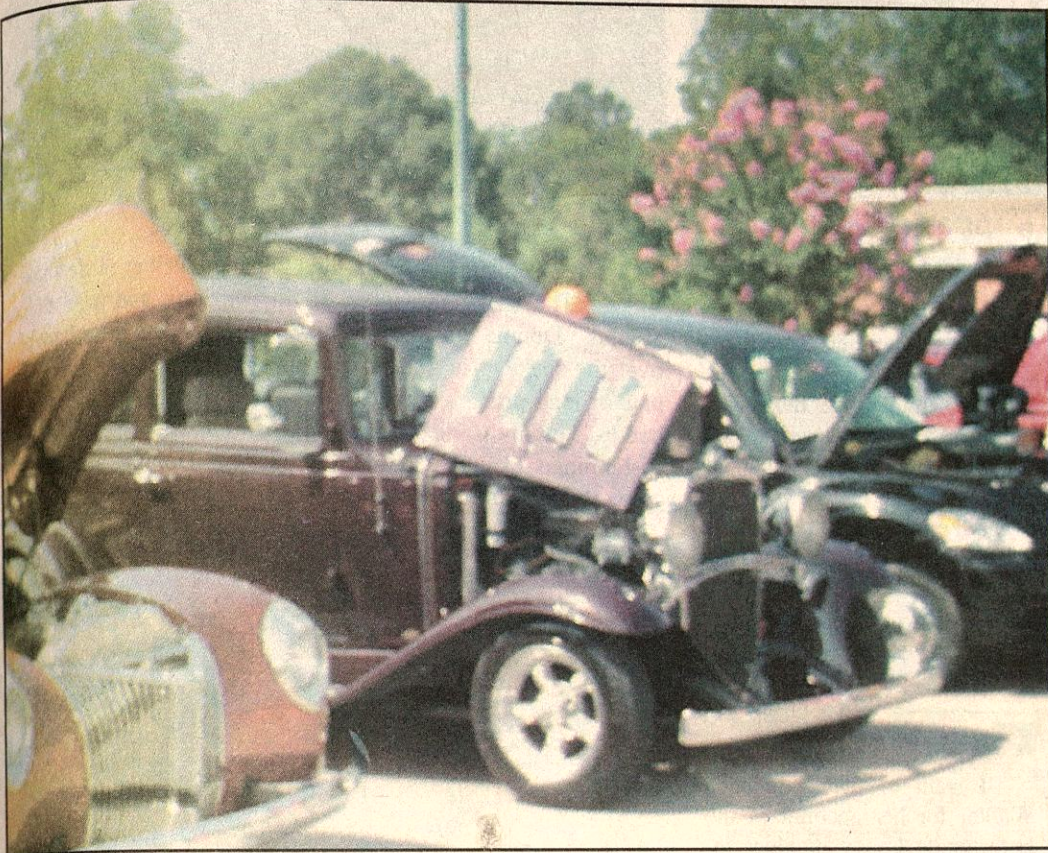

Two Young Men Killed In One-Vehicle Accident Sunday On Coleman Park Rd.

Two Iuka men lost their lives Sunday night in a one-vehicle accident which occurred on Coleman Park Road.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, Randy Linton, 26, and Jason Kaye, 27, both of Iuka, were traveling south on County Road 989 (Coleman Park Road) at about 9:20 Sunday night when the accident occurred.

Apparently Linton, the driver of the Ford pickup truck lost control of the vehicle, traveled approximately 100 yards or more, crossing over into the oncoming lane and then into the roadside right-of-way where the vehicle struck a large pine tree. The truck came to rest at house 82 CR 989, the residence of Mrs. Willie May Carson.

Both men suffered significant traumatic injuries as a result of the accident and both were pronounced dead at the scene, Coroner Wilemon confirmed.

One of the Coleman Park Volunteer First Responders, Danny Holland, was in route to aid with the accident when he flipped his truck after having his vision blurred by some lights of oncoming traffic. He received some injuries, but is recovering, according to sources.

Randy Linton, 26, of Iuka, died Sunday, Sept. 3 on Coleman Park Road as the result of an automobile accident.

He loved the lake and spent a lot of time there. His favorite hobbies were boating and fishing.

Services were at 2 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 6, at Cutshall Funeral Home Chapel in Iuka with Bro. Jimmy Daniel and Bro. Denvil Keel presiding. Burial was in Fairview Cemetery.

Cutshall Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements.

Randy was preceded in death by one brother, Tommy Glover.

Survivors included his father, Willie K. Linton of Iuka; his mother, Linda Keele Hall of Tishomingo; one brother, William K. Linton of Iuka; two sisters, Ann Bunch and her husband Jimmy of Iuka; Joy Gray and her husband Tony of Michie, Tenn.; four half-sisters, Diane Jackson of Ashland, Miss., Doris Linton Meeks of Glen, Phyllis Linton Phillips of Glen and Tabitha Linton Pace of Burnsville; two half-brothers, Charles Linton and Eddie Ray Linton, both of Burnsville; two nieces, Destiny and Alyssa Gray; one nephew Randle Heil; and a host of aunts and uncles.

Pallbearers included Bob Faulkner, Hafford Luttrell and Jody Keele. Honorary pallbearers were Randle Heil, Tony Grey and Jimmy Bunch.

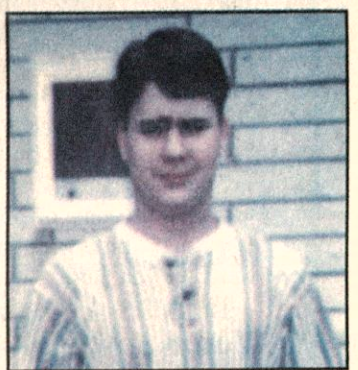

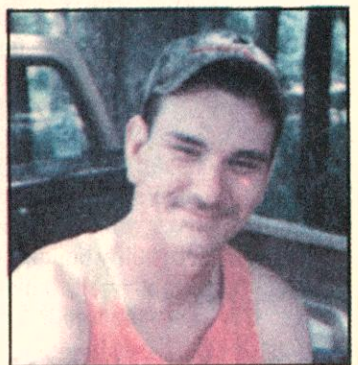
Jason was a member of Southwood Baptist Church and worked for Dynasteel Corporation. He loved to fish and go arrowhead hunting.

Letter To The Editor...

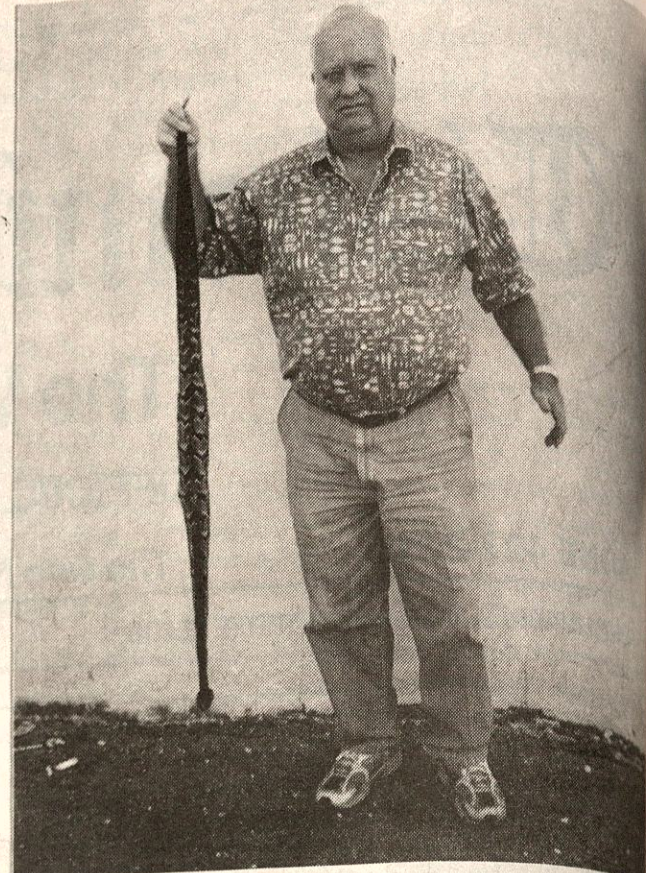

I don't know how difficult this snake will be to find, if snake's are anything like people, the ones with teeth missing tend to smile a lot, so we need to look for a snake with a grin.

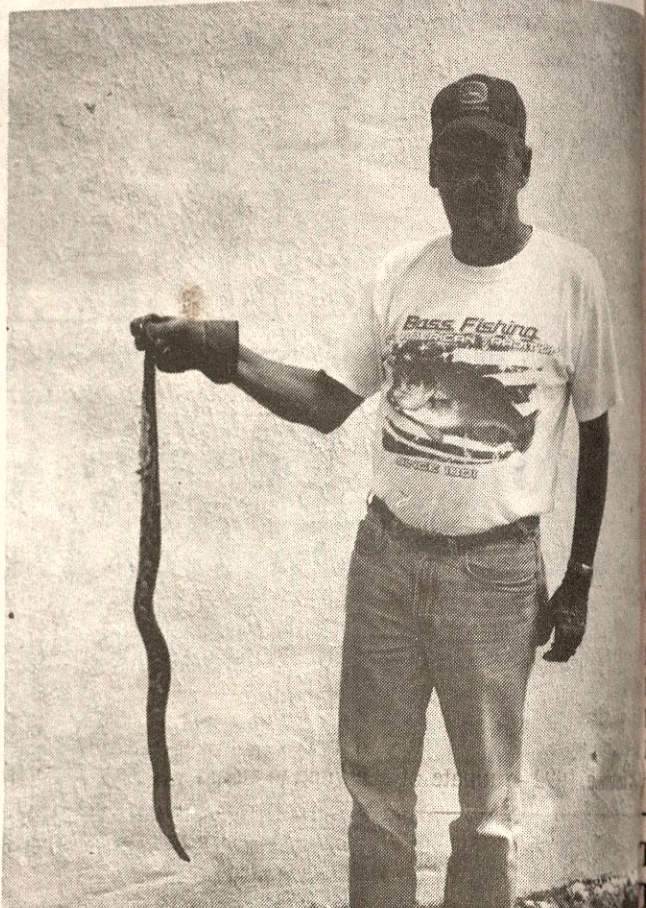

Legal Update

NO HARM? NO FOUL?

What if the driver of another vehicle ran a stop sign and forced you off the road, as a result, but caused neither injury nor damage? Could you sue? Without question, the other driver was negligent, which means that he or she failed to meet a certain duty or standard required for all drivers. Yet, the mere fact that someone was negligent does not automatically give you the right to sue. Aside from showing that the negligent person failed to meet an accepted standard of care, in order to win a legal action you must show that you had measurable injuries or property damage and that the other person's negligence was a substantial cause of those injuries or damages.

When you become involved in an accident, it is not always easy to determine if legal action is warranted. Consulting with an attorney versed in this area of the law will help to answer your questions and provide the legal guidance you need. When you need to hire an attorney, call my office.

HINT: If you are involved in a traffic accident, it is best to ask for a police officer to come to the scene and write up a report that may aid you in any lawsuit.

Lens Protection

If you wear glasses and work in a job environment where extra protection is needed because of dust, noxious fumes, or other hazards, you may want to have the lenses checked more often by your eye doctor to make sure they are kept in good condition.

All glasses made today are shatter resistant and required by federal law. But they're not all the same. Some glass lenses are made from laminated glass which tends to be somewhat thick and heavy, or from case-hardened glass that has been specially treated.

Others are made of increasingly popular plastic. It has the same protective qualities as safety glass but it is much lighter in weight and more resistant to fogging. Plastic does have one disadvantage in that it scratches more easily. However, you can avoid this by not laying plastic glasses down on their lenses or polishing them. Wash them in warm water and pat them dry with a cloth or tissue. Carry them in a case that has a lining.

Thomas Lee Bonds - Private Eye To Speak To "Young at Heart" Meeting At Iuka Baptist Church

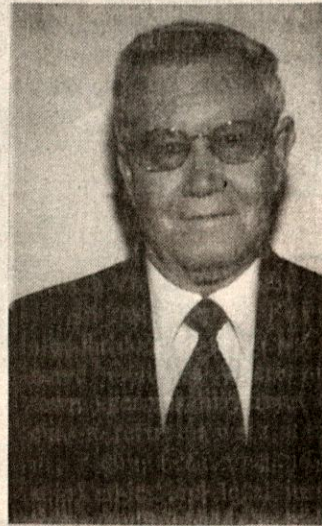

Chief Randy Stringer Attends Second Annual FBI Regional Command College At UM

Chief Stringer joined other law enforcement officials from Mississippi and Louisiana attending the second annual FBI Regional Command College located on the campus of The University of Mississippi from Monday, July 31st, to Friday, August 4th.

The Command College was made possible by a joint collaboration process from the FBI and the Mississippi Association of Chiefs of Police. According to Executing Director of the MACP, Ken Winter, the Command College opened many new doors of communication and training for the 56 state law enforcement attendees from agencies both big and small.

"It gave some small town chiefs and departments that include only 5 or 6 men the opportunity to receive a level of training that they would not otherwise get," Winter said. "You had small departments and large departments along with state police, representatives from the Bureau of Narcotics, and several Sheriffs here. Throughout the week we also gave them the opportunity to have an interchange of ideas and open up the lines of communication."

FBI Special Agent Steven Godfrey, Sr., said the Command College is a form of training much like LEEDS, the Law Enforcement Executive Development Seminars, a two-week

seminar for executives that requires them to travel to Quantico, Virginia, for the training. The seminars only accommodate 30 students at three different times during the year. However, according to the FBI's website, approximately 80 percent of the law enforcement agencies in the United States have fewer than 25 sworn officers. Godfrey said the FBI knew they were leaving many of these agencies out of the mix.

"Several years ago the FBI realized we were not reaching medium and small departments who could not afford to send their chiefs, sheriffs or executives to Virginia," he said.

In response, the FBI created the concept for local Command Colleges where small town agencies may send officials to receive a week of training in three basic areas: leadership, ethics and legal instruction. Godfrey said the instructors of the Command College were from either the local field office or from the FBI Academy in Virginia.

Winter said the University served as a great host and even better learning environment for the Command College.

"Obviously the FBI's teaching the command college gives credibility to the courses, but at the same time, having it here at The University of Mississippi adds credibility to it as well," Winter said.

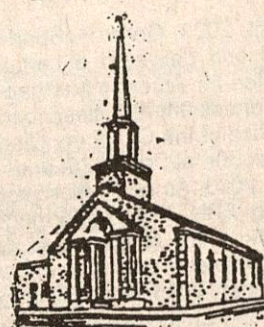

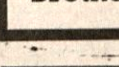

The Snakes

There were snakes

but we didn't see all that many

under every log and in every brushpile

the toad kicking his legs and hopping
making the snake's head jump off the ground
like a snake with hind legs in its head
then when the toad was inside
we killed the snake and cut him open
and the toad hopped away.

But the mean snakes were moccasins
ever the un-poison ones
the brown water snakes at the swimming hole
that come toad you with open mouths hissing
They got a nest here somewhere boys
and we always argued whether they could bite you under water
and we never found out.

After Aunt Callie got bit by the copperhead

with hoes and some shotguns
They turned over logs and whistled at brushpiles

and at the end had killed hundreds of snakes

and some of the boys skinned them for belts.
